TODAY'S TILT... the Mariners continue a 7-game, 2-city roadtrip to the Golden State with the final of three games against the Oakland Athletics (2-0) today...will begin a 4-game set vs. the Angles tomorrow...went 5-5 on the recently completed 10-game homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1), New York-AL (1-3) and Houston (2-1)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT Sports** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS... have won 4 of last 5 games...9-7 over last 16, and 11-9 over last 20 games...after going 5-0-1 in 6-series stretch from April 25-May 16, are 3-3-4 in last 10 series...are 16-18 vs. the AL West, 7-6 vs. AL East, 5-11 vs. AL Central and 3-3 in Interleague play...29 of the Mariners first 69 games have been decided by 2-or-fewer runs (14-15), and featured 8 extra-inning affairs (2-6).

- **Frequent Flyer Miles** – Mariners will travel 52,509 miles this season, most in baseball.
- **Quality** – Mariners are T2nd in the AL with 42 quality starts (Iwakuma - 12, Felix - 11).
- **Secret to Success** – Seattle is 20-6 when scoring 4+ runs; 13-4 with 5+ runs.
- **Stop Right There** – Mariners relievers have stranded 75 of 102 inherited runners (73.5%) to lead AL.
- **GW-Morales** – **Kendrys Morales** is 3rd in the AL with 8 GWRBI.
- **Southpaws** – Mariners are 12-11 in games vs. LH starters, compared to 19-27 vs. RHP.
- **Endy Hits** – **Endy Chavez** has recorded a hit in 28 of his 32 starts this season.
- **Age Defying** – **Raul Ibanez** is one of just 11 players in MLB history to hit 13 or more home runs in their age 41 season (computed 6/30 each season).

THANKS DADS... the Mariners are 23-12 all-time on Father's Day, including winning four straight, and 8 of last 10...Seattle is 16-4 at home on Father's Day, but only 7-8 on the road...have not appeared on the road on Father's Day since June 17, 2007 at PIT in 10-3 win.

STARTERS ROLLING... the Mariners starting pitchers have recorded a quality starts in each of their last 8 games, including allowing 1 run or less in 7 of those starts...the 8 consecutive quality starts are tied for the 7th-longest consecutive streak in franchise history and most since recording 8 straight quality starts from Sept. 18-27, 2012...since June 7, the starters are 5-1 (team is 5-3) with a 0.94 ERA (6 ER, 57.1 IP), lowering their combined ERA from 4.32 to current mark of 3.86 (0.46 points).

AND ROLLING... the starting pitching staff has also recorded 6 consecutive starts tossing at least 7.0 innings while limiting opponents to 1 earned run or less, allowing only 2 earned runs combined in 45.0 innings during this stretch (0.40 ERA) from June 9-15...it is the longest such stretch in franchise history (previous: 5, May 18-22, 2011).

A DEBUT TO REMEMBER... At age 41 years, 290 days, **Henry Blanco** became the oldest Mariner ever to hit a grand slam yesterday, surpassing **Raul Ibanez** who did it on May 15 at NYY at 40 years 347 days...prior to this season the previous record was held by Edgar Martinez (38 years 220 days on Aug. 10, 2001 vs. CWS)...since 1994 only Julio Franco has hit a grand slam at an age older than Blanco (2x: 46 years 308 days on 6/27/05 w/ATL and 45 year 285 days on 6/3/04 w/ATL).

ADD IT TO THE LIST... Henry Blanco has homered for 10 different franchises in his career (LAD, COL, MIL, ATL, MIN, CHC, SD, NYM, ARI, and SEA)...he is one of only six players (only active player) in the modern era (1900) to do so...Matt Stairs and Todd Zeile hold the record both going deep in 11 different uniforms...the only others who did 10 are Russell Branyan, Jose Guillen, and Kenny Lofton.

ODDS OF FEW WALKS... today's starting pitchers, **Hisashi Iwakuma** & Bartolo Colon, have combined to allow only 24 walks this season in 178.2 innings pitched...Colon leads the AL with 1.08 BB/9.0 IP, while Iwakuma ranks 4th with 1.32...Iwakuma leads the AL with a 6.21 strikeout-walk-ratio (Colon is 6th at 4.90).

THAT'S A SEASONS WORTH... since joining the Mariners rotation on July 2, 2012, **Hisashi Iwakuma** has combined to go 15-5 with a 2.22 ERA (47 ER, 190.1 IP) in 30 starts...in comparison, only two pitchers in club history have recorded a season with at least 15 wins, 30 starts, 190.0 innings pitched and a sub 2.50 ERA: Felix Hernandez in 2009 (19-5, 2.49 ERA, 34 GS, 238.2 IP) and Randy Johnson in 1995 (18-2, 2.48 ERA, 214.1 IP, 30 GS).

ALL-STAR RESUMES... **Hisashi Iwakuma** leads the Majors with a 0.82 WHIP and ranks 2nd in the American League with a 1.79 ERA...Kuma is also listed among the AL leaders in fewest baserunners/9.0 IP (1st, 7.46), SO/BB ratio (1st, 6.21), quality starts (T1st, 12), wins (T8th, 7), winning percentage (3rd, .875) and opp avg (4th, .190)...**Felix Hernandez** ranks 3rd in the AL in ERA (2.32), 2nd in strikeouts (110), T3rd in wins (8) and 1st in innings pitched (104.2).

EARN IT... **Hisashi Iwakuma** allowed an un-earned run in the 3rd inning Monday night, snapping his scoreless innings streak at 23.2 innings, the 8th-longest scoreless streak in Mariners history (5th longest by a starter)...however, he extended his streak of not allowing an EARNED run to 28.2 IP; that's tied for the 5th longest streak in Mariners history (see sidebar at left)...Kuma has not allowed an earned run since the 2nd inning of his start May 26 vs. Rangers.

AS YOU MIGHT KNOW... Henry Blanco hit the 170th grand slam in Mariners history yesterday in the Mariners 4-0 win at Oakland...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?...** Blanco is the first player to hit a grand slam which accounted for all the runs in a game for both teams since Brad Davis on Sept. 20, 2010 when the Marlins beat the Cardinals 4-0...Blanco is the 2nd player in club history to hit a grand slam in their Mariners debut, joining Leon Roberts on April 9, 1978 at MIN (the 2nd grand slam in club history).

ABOUT IWAKUMA...

- Pronounced: he-sash-ee ee-wah-ku-mah
- Making his 15th start this season and 45th career MLB appearance/31st start today vs. the A's.
- Had a career record of 107-69 with a 3.25 ERA (557 ER, 1,541.0 IP) in 226 G/225 GS with Kintetsu (2001-04) and Rakuten (2005-2011) in the Japan League.
- Pitched in the 2004 Athens Olympics as a member of the Japan national team (bronze medal)...also part of gold medal-winning Japan squad in the 2009 WBC.
- Named 2008 Pacific League MVP & winner of Eiji Sawamura Award (Cy Young equivalent) going 21-4, 1.87 ERA (42ER, 201.2 IP) in 28 GS.
- Signed by Seattle as a free agent Jan. 5, 2012.
- 1 of 5 Mariners pitchers born in Japan, but is only the 2nd to make a start...the only other Japan-born pitcher to make a start for the Mariners was Mac Suzuki (9 GS, last: 5/17/99 vs. MIN).

AL LEADERS...heads into today's start ranked 2nd in the American League with a 1.79 ERA (19 ER, 95.1 IP), 1st in home ERA (0.92), 1st in WHIP (0.82), T1st in quality starts (12), 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.21), 3rd in winning percentage (7-1/.875), 4th in walks per 9.0 innings (1.32), 4th with a .190 opponent average (64x336), T2nd in games started (14), T4th in innings pitched (95.1) and T8th in strikeouts (87).

LAST OUTING...earned W#7 in his last start June 10 vs. Houston, a 3-2 victory at Safeco Field...allowed 1 unearned run in 7.0 innings, scattering 4 hits, walked 1 and struck out 8.

SCORELESS STREAK...had his consecutive innings scoreless streak snapped at 23.2 innings (8th-longest in club history) in his last start (3rd inning vs. the Astros), but has still not allowed an earned run over his last 28.2 innings...here is a look at the longest scoreless streaks in Mariners history:

STILL A GOOD STREAK...has not allowed an **Earned Run** in 28.2 consecutive innings, dating back to the 2nd inning of his start May 26 vs. the Texas Rangers...the streak without allowing an ER is tied for 4th-longest in club history.

WIN STREAK...has a current 5-game winning streak, tying his career-high (9/21/12-4/12/13)...since April 28, is 4-0, 1.70 in 9 starts (63.2 IP, 12 ER); allowed season-high 5 ER in 1 GS (a ND) 5/20 at CLE...the streak is tied for the 3rd-longest active win streak in the AL (Buchholz - 9, Scherzer - 9, Blevins - 5, Colon - 5, Iwakuma - 5).

BIT BY THE HR...has allowed 10 home runs this season, tying Joe Saunders, Aaron Harang and Brandon Maurer for the team lead...13 of 22 runs allowed this season (59.1%), including 7 of 10 runs in last 6 starts...8 of 10 home runs allowed have come on the road.

ONE OF THE BEST...since the All-Star break last season, Iwakuma has the best ERA amongst AL starting pitchers (min. 15 GS)...his 2.14 mark (44 ER, 185.1 IP) in 29 starts ranks ahead of teammate Felix Hernandez (2.66)...it is the 3rd-best mark in the Majors since last year's ASG, trailing Kris Medlen (1.95) and Clayton Kershaw (1.97).

PRETTY GOOD NUMBERS...since moving into the starting rotation on July 2, 2012 vs. Baltimore, Iwakuma has gone 15-5 with a 2.22 ERA (47 ER, 190.1 IP) in 30 starts...he has averaged over 6.1 innings per start and recorded 21 quality starts...by comparison, only two pitchers in club history have recorded a season with 190.0 or more innings, 30 or more starts and a sub 2.50 ERA: Randy Johnson in 1995) and Felix Hernandez (2009, 2010).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP AARON HARANG (3-6, 5.60)

34-year-old right-hander will be making his 11th start of the season tomorrow vs. the Angels, and the 304th of his career...tossed a CG 2-hitter in his last start 6/11 vs. Houston (2nd shutout this season to tie for MLB lead)...7th career ShO May 27 vs. Padres (9.0,4,0,0,2,8); first shutout since 4/12/09 vs. Pittsburgh (with CIN)...acquired by Seattle from the Colorado Rockies in exchange for minor league RHP Steven Hensley on April 11...went to camp this spring with the Los Angeles Dodgers...traded to Colorado on April 6 (for C Ramon Hernandez) and designated for assignment by the Rockies the same day...**CAREER:** Owns a career record of 108-110 with a 4.15 ERA in 309 games (303 GS)...earned his 100th career win on June 7, 2012 at PHI (w/LAD)...pitched for 5 different organizations throughout his 11-year career: OAK (2002-03), CIN (2003-10), SD (2011), LA-NL (2012) and Seattle (2013-c)...**vs. LAA:** Is 0-3 with a 8.02 ERA (19 ER, 21.1 IP) in 5 career starts vs. the Angels...0-2, 16.20 in 2 starts this season.
