#### A's vs. RANGERS

The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...have split four game in Texas and lost two of three in Oakland...have lost the season series five times over the previous seven seasons and are 65-75 (.464) against the Rangers since 2006...are 306-319 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 165-148 in Oakland and 142-171 in Texas...including 75-83 at Rangers Ballpark...have an alltime record of 403-401 against the Rangers/Senators.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 17 for 17 in save opportunities...has converted each of his last 35 save chances, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...has 43 saves with the A's and needs one more to tie Billy Koch and Keith Foulke for eighth place in Oakland history.

**Coco Crisp** is tied for the American League lead and tied for second in the majors in home runs batting leadoff (8)...is tied for seventh among all AL players in stolen bases (13) and ranks ninth in on-base percentage (.382).

John Jaso has reached base safely via hit or walk in a careerhigh and A's season-high tying 16 consecutive games...is 18 for 51 (.353) with 11 walks (1 sf, .460 onbase percentage) over that span.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1984** Davey Lopes hits an inside-the park home run in the A's 10-2 win over the Kansas City Royals...in **1993** the A's overcome a then club record eight-run deficit to defeat the Kansas City Royals 10-9...trailing 8-0 entering the bottom of the second, the A's score twice in the second and six times in the fifth before Craig Paquette's two-run seventh inning homer puts the A's ahead for good...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the fifth inning of the A's 8-5 win at Detroit to extend his Oakland record streak of consecutive games reaching base to 62.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Scored seven runs and lost last night for the first time since Sept. 27, 2012, also at Texas...have now lost three of the last four games and are 4-5 over the last nine games...however, have gained 1½ games in the standings over that nine-game stretch as Texas has gone 3-7...remain in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and eighth time in the last 11 days...are 42-30, which is the second best record in the AL and sixth best in the majors...it is the best record by an A's team over the first 71 games since the 2003 club also started the year 42-30 (won game 73)...have won 22 of the last 30 games...are 24-11 (.686) since May 11, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (Cincinnati, 23-12)...are 99-56 (.639) since July 1 of last year, which is also the best mark in the majors over that stretch (Cincinnati, 97-59)...are 102-60 over the last 162 games...for the season, have spent 21 days in sole possession of first, three days tied for first, 46 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 16-5 with a 2.85 ERA (63 er in 199.0 ip) and .225 (166 for 737) opponents batting average over the last 30 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over the first 42 contests...have tossed seven or more innings in 17 of the 30 games allowed two runs or fewer 19 times...are 30-26 with a 4.08 ERA (199 er in 439.1 ip) for the season...lead the AL in innings pitched, rank third in wins, fourth in fewest walks (113) and eighth in ERA...have issued the third most home runs (56).

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has compiled a 2.77 ERA (85 er in 276.2 ip) and .227 (233 for 1025) opponents batting average over the last 30 games (since May 17) after logging a 4.35 ERA and .255 opponents average over the first 42 contests...for the season, ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.297), third in ERA (3.68), opponents batting average (.244) and fewest walks (182) and fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.389).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored 17 runs on 25 hits over the last two games after hitting .206 with 19 runs scored over the previous seven contests...have hit a season-high four home runs twice this year, both in the month of June (6<sup>th</sup> at Chicago, Sunday vs. Seattle)...have 20 home runs this month, which is second most in the American League to Boston (23)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (279)...are tied for the AL lead in hit by pitches (27), rank third in doubles (144) and extra base hits (227) and fourth in runs scored (335) and intentional walks (17).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** The A's have a 29-15 (.659) record in night games, which is tied with St. Louis for the best record in the majors...are 13-15 (.464) during the day, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.38 ERA (151 er in 401.2 ip) at night compared to 4.15 (117 er in 254.0 ip) during the day...have the second lowest night ERA in the AL and the fifth highest day ERA...are batting .255 (393 for 1542) with 228 runs scored in night games (5.18 per game) compared to .238 (225 for 947) with 107 runs during the day (3.82 per game).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 21-11 (.656) against American League West competition compared to 21-19 (.525) against everyone else...have the second best intra-division record in the AL (Texas, 20-9)...are batting .270 (307 for 1136) with 185 runs (5.97 per game) in 32 games against the AL West compared to .230 (311 for 1353) with 150 runs (3.75 per game) in 40 games against the rest of baseball...are 1-3 in this 10-game stretch against divisional foes that runs through Sunday (1-2 vs. Seattle, 0-1 at Texas, 0-0 at Seattle).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game road trip to Texas (0-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Milwaukee (2-1) and Chicago-AL (2-2) and have won 10 of the last 16 road games...are 20-18 (.526) on the road overall, which is the fourth best road record in the American League...went 4-2 on the last homestand against New York (3-0) and Seattle (1-2) and are 22-12 (.647) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL...had their 11-game home winning streak snapped by Seattle last Friday night...it was the third longest home winning streak in Oakland history and was the longest since a 12-game streak from Aug. 13-Sept. 14, 2002.

**SERIES NOTES:** Have lost the first game of each of the last two series after winning 10 straight...that tied for the second longest winning streak in series openers in Oakland history to a 12-game streak from July 2-Aug. 10, 2001...are now 16-8 in the first game of a series...that includes 0-3 against Seattle and 16-5 against everyone else...lost two of three to the Mariners over the weekend, snapping a nine series unbeaten streak (7-0-2)...it was the A's first series loss since May 13-15 against Texas...have now swept eight series this year...last year, the A's did not record their first sweep until June 12-14 at Colorado.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Have lost each of their last two one-run games after winning nine of the previous 10...are 14-9 (.609) in one-run games for the season...lead the American League in one-run wins, are tied for third in most games (23) and have the fourth best record...are 6-2 (.750) in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 11-3 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for second in the AL in last at bat wins...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the AL...have five "walk-off" wins.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's sent 10 men to the plate in the fourth inning yesterday, the 17<sup>th</sup> time this year they sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning...did that just 22 times last year...last night was the first time the A's batted around and lost in 2013...the A's are 4 for 4 with a home run, walk and two sacrifice flies in their last seven plate appearances with the bases loaded...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (94) and are tied for the lead in doubles (6) and grounded into double plays (7)...are tied for the American League lead in sacrifice flies (7), rank second in RBI (62) and third in walks (8)...A's pinch hitters went 1 for 3 yesterday and are now 8 for 68 (.118) for the season...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (78), rank second in walks (9) and tied for second in home runs (2) and RBI (7)...however, are tied for the second lowest batting average...are 34-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of three AL teams that has not lost in that situation (Texas and Toronto)...have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of the last three games after facing a lefty 12 times over the previous 19 contests...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher 26 times this year, which is tied with the Dodgers and Brewers for the most in the majors.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his team leading 15<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 8-6 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and 25-18 (.581) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in nine of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

LATELY: Is 3-0 with a 1.91 ERA (6 er in 28.1 ip) and .179 (17 for 95) opponents batting average over his last four starts...the three-game winning streak is one short of his career high of four (Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012)...is now 4-1 with a 2.40 ERA (13 er in 48.2 ip) and .183 (30 for 164) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...started the year 1-5 with

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received two runs of support in his last start, a no decision...has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of the nine games in which he took the loss or had a no decision (13 rs in 50.1 ip, 2.32 RSA)...has four runs of support or more in four of his five wins...his season run support average is 3.90 (36 rs in 83.0 ip)

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed his 13<sup>th</sup> home run of the season in his last start, which is an on-going careerhigh...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors...eight of the 13 home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots as were eight of the 11 home runs he allowed last year.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-3 with a 4.88 ERA (26 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts in Oakland compared to 2-3 with a 3.86 ERA (15 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts on the road...has allowed nine of his 13 home runs on the road...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (4 er in 21.1 ip) in three starts in June and is 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA (12 er in 54.1 ip) in eight career starts in the month...was 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA and .216 opponents average in five starts in May...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12<sup>th</sup> time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents have grounded into 12 double plays, which is tied for fifth most in the American League...yielded a .375 average with runners in scoring position over his first five starts but opponents are 5 for 36 (.139) in nine starts since then...has a .233 (14 for 60) opponents average with RISP overall...has allowed a .356 (26 for 73) opponents batting average to the first two hitters in the order compared to .229 (54 for 236) against the three through nine hitters

2013 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss to Seattle April 2 in Oakland...allowed a three-run home run to Morse in the third inning and a RBI single to Morales in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles April 9...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...also walked three batters but yielded just two runs...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit April 14 in Oakland ... allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...lost his third consecutive decision in the A's 1-0 loss at Tampa Bay April 20...allowed a leadoff home run to Joyce in the second inning, but that was the only run he would allow in 6.1 innings...Hellickson, Peralta and Rodney combined to shutout the A's on three hits and a walk...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 10-2 loss to Baltimore April 25...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles April 30 in Oakland ... allowed four runs in six innings but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the fifth and four more in the sixth to take the lead for good...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...surrendered a career-high four home runs...had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two...all four home runs were solo shots...was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 win at Seattle **May 11**...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Shoppach in the fifth inning...had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Kansas City May 17 in Oakland ... allowed just one run in 7.0 innings ... Perez double with one out in the third inning and scored one out later on a Lough RBI double...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Texas **May 22**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run home run by Murphy and a solo home run by Beltre...the A's were held to a run on four hits by Wolf and the Rangers bullpen...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 victory over San Francisco May 28 ... tossed 7.0 innings for the third consecutive start...allowed a RBI single to Pence in the first inning but retired 12 of the next 14 batters after that...combined with Blevins, Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Chicago June 2 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two of the hits...won his third consecutive start in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago June 7 ... allowed singles runs in the third, fourth and fifth to give the White Sox a 3-0 lead but Donaldson hit a grand slam in the sixth inning for the win.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 18-inning win over New York last Thursday in Oakland...matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings (fifth time, third time against New York)...allowed a two run home run to Cano in the first inning but then shutout the Yankees on three hits and two walks over his final seven innings.

**PARKER vs. TEXAS:** Is 3-1 with a 3.00 ERA (27.0 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 9 er, 9 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in four career starts...the three wins are his most against any team...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-1 loss at Texas May 22...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run home run by Murphy and a solo home run by Beltre...then shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's were held to a run on four hits by Wolf and the Rangers bullpen...went 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA in three starts last year.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (6-6, 3.61 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 15<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 3-1 with a 3.49 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over his last six starts...went 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA and .260 opponents average over his first three starts and 0-5 with a 3.62 ERA and .254 opponents average in five starts in between... has issued 19 walks in 89.2 innings, an average of 1.91 per nine innings...that is the 10<sup>th</sup> lowest mark in the American League...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 loss to Seattle last Friday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...has received just five runs of support in his six losses this year (38.2 ip, 1.16 RSA)...has received just 17 runs of support in his 16 losses in two seasons with the A's (97.1 ip, 1.57 RSA)...is 0-2 with a 2.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 21 h, 12 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 13 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against the Rangers, all last year and all at Texas.

The A's bullpen has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) over its past six games and a 2.87 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...is also second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.290) and fourth in opponents batting average (.228)...is fourth in save percentage (75.0%)...has the fewest losses (4) and is tied for the fewest walks (69)...first batters faced are 39 for 188 (.199) with nine walks and a hit by pitch (.244 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors and the batting average is tied for fourth...the bullpen tossed 10.0 innings last Thursday against New York and did not allow a run...it was only the third time in Oakland history that A's relievers tossed 10 or more innings without allowing a run (also Sept. 20, 1997 vs. Seattle, 10.0 ip; June 12, 1992 vs. Texas, 12.0 ip)

- Opponents are 2 for 23 (.087) with runners in scoring position, including 1 for 15 with RISP and two outs.
- Has a save in two appearances against Texas this year (2.0 ip, 1 h, 4 so).
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10<sup>th</sup> in saves.

the longest of his career...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to last year...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received just one run of support in his last start, a 3-2 loss to Seattle...has received just five runs of support in his six losses this year (38.2 ip, 1.16 RSA)...has received just 17 runs of support in his 16 losses in two seasons with the A's (97.1 ip, 1.57 RSA)...has received no support eight times over the last two years and one run of support eight times...the A's have been shutout four times this year, twice in games started by Milone...is 5-0 with three runs of support or more this year and 14-2 in his career.

**BASES ON BALLS:** Walked a season-high three batters in his last start for the fifth time this year...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his other nine starts, including five starts without a walk...has issued 19 walks in 89.2 innings, an average of 1.91 per nine innings...that is the 10<sup>th</sup> lowest mark in the American League...walked three batters in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career May 12-18...did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts May 1 against Los Angeles...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks (Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 6-3 with a 3.09 ERA (22 er in 64.0 ip) and eight home runs allowed in 10 starts at night compared to 0-3 with a 4.91 ERA (14 er in 25.2 ip) and six home runs allowed in four starts during the day...is tied for second in the American League in wins at night...in two seasons with the A's, he is 16-8 with a 3.12 ERA (68 in 196.0 ip) in 31 starts at night compared to 3-8 with a 5.06 ERA (47 er in 83.2 ip) in 14 starts during the day.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-3 with a 2.48 ERA (11 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 4.53 ERA (25 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts on the road...has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League...in two seasons with the A's, he is 10-7 with a 2.66 ERA (41 er in 138.2 ip) and .237 (124 for 523) opponents average in 21 starts in Oakland compared to 9-9 with a 4.72 ERA (74 er in 141.0 ip) and .296 (169 for 571) opponents average in 25 starts on the road...has allowed 26 of his 38 home runs with the A's on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .173 (13 for 75) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the American League...opponents are 30 for 88 (.341) with 10 doubles, five home runs (.625 slugging percentage) and five walks (.376 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average is fourth highest in the AL, the on-base percentage is sixth highest and the slugging percentage is eighth highest...allowed a .319 batting average, .555 slugging percentage and .358 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning last year.





is tied for the second longest winning streak of his career and is his longest since his career-high eightgame winning streak from July 21-Sept. 10, 2005...it is the second time in his career he has won six consecutive starts (July 9-Aug. 7, 2004)...is the first A's pitcher to win six consecutive starts since Dan Haren (July 26-Aug. 21, 2006)...the last A's pitcher to win seven or more consecutive starts is Barry Zito (8, June 28-Aug. 4, 2005)

**NINE-GAME WINNER:** Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start to become the third nine-game winner in the American League...is tied for the AL lead in wins...those are his most wins before the All-Star Break since 2005 when he was 11-5 at the break in his Cy Young season with Los Angeles (AL)...the last A's pitcher to win his ninth game on or before June 16 was Mark Mulder in 2003 (June 13)...since 1991, the only times the A's had a 10-game winner before the end of June was in 2002 (Zito, 10), 2003 (Mulder 11) and 2004 (Mulder, 10)

**40-YEAR OLD:** Is attempting to become the third pitcher in Oakland history to win 10 games as a 40-year old...Don Sutton had 13 wins in 1985 at age 40 and Tom Candiotti had 11 wins in 1998 at age 40...has two shutouts, which are the most in a season by an Athletics 40-year old since Jack Quinn had four for the Philadelphia A's in 1928...the last American League pitcher with two shutouts as a 40-year old is Dennis Martinez, who had two in 1995 for Cleveland at age 41...the last A's 40-year old with two complete games is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (3)...ages are based on a players age as of June 30<sup>th</sup>.

**IN JUNE:** Is 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA (3 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts in June...is one of three American League pitchers with three wins in June...has not won four games in a month since going 4-2 in September, 2005.

**ACTIVE LEADERS:** Tossed the 34<sup>th</sup> complete game of his career May 31...among active pitchers, only Roy Halladay (67) and CC Sabathia (36) have more...also ranks fifth among active pitchers in wins (180), sixth in games started (389) and shutouts (11), seventh in strikeouts (1885) and eighth in innings pitched (2483.2).

**DOMINICAN LEADERS:** His 180 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (389), innings pitched (2483.2) and strikeouts (1885.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to six games in the A's 10-2 win over Seattle last Sunday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Chavez...Franklin followed with a single, the Mariners seventh hit of the day, but Colón would retire 16 of the final 17 hitters he faced, including 12 straight at one point.

**COLÓN vs. SEATTLE:** Is 17-12 with a 3.92 ERA (215.2 ip, 213 h, 104 r, 94 er, 47 bb, 145 so, 18 hr) in 34 career appearances, all starts...the 17 wins are the most among active pitchers against the Mariners...the 12 losses and 34 starts are his most against any team...is 10-1 with a 1.91 ERA (18 er in 84.2 ip) in 12 career starts at Safeco Field...the .909 winning percentage is the best by any pitcher at Safeco Field with seven or more decisions and the ERA is second best among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched (lwakuma, 1.88)...is 8-0 with a 1.66 ERA (12 er in 65.0 ip) over his last in his home ballparks and 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (1 er in 8.0 ip) in one start in Tokyo...was 0-2 with a 19.29 ERA (10 er in 4.2 ip) in two starts in the Kingdome...was

- Did not strike out a batter May 14 against Texas, his eighth career start without a strikeout...it was the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings.
