A's vs. CARDINALS

The A's and Cardinals meet in the Coliseum for the second time as the A's lost two of three here in 2007...are 2-7 against the Cardinals all-time...were swept in a three-game series in St. Louis in 2004 and lost two of three in 2010.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 18 for 18 in save opportunities and is one of three Major League closers without a blown save...has converted each of his last 36 save chances, which is the longest active streak in the majors and four short of the Oakland record of 40...has 44 saves with the A's, which is tied with Koch and Foulke for eighth in Oakland history.

Yoenis Céspedes has hit safely in all nine interleague games this year (12 for 38, .316) and now has an 11-game interleague hitting streak (14 for 46, .304).

Josh Donaldson is batting .429 (15 for 35) with three home runs and 10 RBI in nine interleague games...has the fifth best interleague average in the majors.

Jed Lowrie is 12 for 25 (.480) with seven runs scored over his last six games...has hit safely in all nine interleague games (13 for 34, .382).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a two-hit shutout and Gus Zernial homers twice and drives in five runs in the A's 12-0 win at New York...in **1994** Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a two-game series from Cincinnati to start the homestand and now have nine sweeps for the season...had 11 all last year...are 46-34, which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...it matches the best start by an A's team over the last 21 years (2000, 2003, 2004)...a win tonight would give the A's their best record after 81 games since 1992 (48-33)...the 46 wins are already the A's most before the All-Star Break since 2008 (51-44)...are in second place in the AL West and trail Texas by ½ game...have spent 14 of the last 17 days and 16 of the last 21 with at least a share of first...overall, have spent 25 days in sole possession of first, six days tied for first, 49 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 8-9 over the last 17 games...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10) and 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors)...are 2-0 in this eight-day stretch where they have three days off (June 24-July 1)...that follows a 31-day stretch from May 24-June 23 where they played 30 games...went 19-11 (.633) over that span, which was the second best record in the majors (Toronto, 18-9)...are 103-60 (.632) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Cincinnati, 99-65).

THE HALF-WAY MARK: The A's will play their 81st game of the season tonight, which is the statistical half way point of the season...A's pitchers have issued just 200 walks and are on pace for 405, which would be the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (415 in 1976)...opponents have a .297 on-base percentage, which is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history...it is the lowest since 1972 (.284).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have swept five of the last six home series and have now won 14 of the last 16 home games...are 24-12 (.667) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Atlanta, 25-11)...are 2-0 on this eight-game homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (three games) and the Cubs (three games)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Texas (1-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 22-22 (.500) on the road.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have the fourth best interleague record in the majors at 7-2 (3-1 vs. San Francisco, 2-1 vs. Milwaukee, 2-0 vs. Cincinnati)...have a 2.68 ERA (24 er in 80.2 ip), which ranks third, and a .271 (83 for 306) batting average, which is tied for ninth...after this three-game series with the Cardinals, the A's host Chicago for a three-game series...also have a three-game series at Pittsburgh July 8-10 and a two-game series at Cincinnati Aug. 6-7...went 10-8 against the National League last year, snapping a streak of three consecutive seasons with a losing interleague record...it was the ninth time in 16 seasons the A's had a winning interleague record...the A's are now 161-132 (.549) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's have clinched a winning record in the month of June as they are 14-10 with three games remaining...this marks the A's seventh consecutive month with a winning record dating back to last June...that is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...have hit 30 home runs this month, which is tied for second in the American League (Toronto, 31).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 32-17 (.653) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Texas, 34-21)...are 14-17 (.452) during the day, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.54 ERA (175 er in 444.2 ip) at night compared to 4.08 (127 er in 280.1 ip) during the day...have the lowest night ERA in the AL and the fifth highest day ERA...are batting .254 (433 for 1707) with 258 runs scored in night games (5.27 per game) compared to .241 (253 for 1051) with 118 runs during the day (3.81 per game).

STARTING PITCHING: A.J. Griffin tossed the A's third complete game shutout of the season Wednesday, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (St. Louis, 4)...A's starters are now 19-6 with a 3.04 ERA (84 er in 248.2 ip) and .225 (206 for 917) opponents batting average over the last 38 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over the first 42 contests...are 33-27 with a 4.05 ERA (220 er in 489.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League in innings pitched, are tied for second in complete games (3), rank third in wins and eighth in ERA...are tied for the third most home runs (63)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.10 ERA (119 er in 346.0 ip) in 38 games since May 17...that includes a 1.87 ERA (32 er in 154.0 ip) in 16 home games...logged a 4.35 ERA over the first 32 contests and have a 3.75 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.297), rank third in opponents batting average (.244) and fourth in slugging percentage (.388)...have the second fewest walks (200).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .273 (93 for 341) with 56 runs scored and 14 home runs over the last 10 games...hit a season-high tying four home runs a week ago tonight in Seattle...it was their third four-homer game of the season and all have come this month (6th at Chicago, 16th vs. Seattle)...lead the majors in walks (307)...rank second in the AL in hit by pitches (28), third in doubles (155) and extra base hits (249) and fourth in runs scored (374) and on-base percentage (.327).

CLOSE CALLS: Have lost each of their last three one-run games after winning nine of the previous 10...are 14-10 (.583) in one-run games for the season...rank second in the American League lead in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins...are 11-5 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the AL...have five "walk-off" wins, which is tied for third in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (102)...lead the American League in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), rank second in doubles (6), tied for second in RBI (66) and third in walks (9)...A's pinch hitters are batting .125 (9 for 72), which is second lowest in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (83), rank second in walks (10) and tied for second in home runs (2) and RBI (9)...are 38-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of three AL teams that has not lost in that situation (Texas and Toronto)...have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of the last 11 games after facing a lefty 12 times over the previous 19 contests.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season...the A's are 12-3 (.800) in his starting assignments this year and 26-13 (.667) over the last two years...his teams are 223-167 (.572) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 13 of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times...including nine games with no walks.

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 7-0 with a 1.41 ERA (8 er in 51.0 ip), .249 (46 for 185) opponents batting average and one home run allowed in 51.0 innings over his last seven starts...the winning streak is an A's season high and the third longest active streak in the American League...it is one short of his career high

of eight from July 21-Sept. 10, 2005...it is the first time in his career he has won seven consecutive starts...is the first Athletic to win seven or more consecutive starts since Barry Zito won eight straight from June 28-Aug. 4, 2005.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.10), is tied for the lead in complete games (2) and shutouts (2), tied for second in wins (10), ranks third in winning percentage (.833), tied for sixth in strikeout to walk ratio (4.67), tied for eighth in grounded into double plays (12), ninth in ERA (2.93) and 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.281)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning (13.8) and second fewest pitches per game (90.2)...has the second highest run support (7.23).

10-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start to become the second 10-game winner in the American League (Scherzer, DET)...also won 10 games last year and with one more win he will have his most wins since 2005 when he went 21-8 for the Angels and won the Cy Young Award...this is the fourth time since 1991 that an A's pitcher has won 10 games before the end of June...joins Barry Zito (10 in 2002) and Mark Mulder (11 in 2003 and 10 in 2004)...it is the third time in his career he has won 10 games before the All-Star Break (11-5 in 2005, 10-4 in 2002).

40-YEAR OLD: Has won each of his six starts since turning 40 on May 24...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher in Major League history to win each of his first six starts in his forties...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to win 10 games in his 40-year old season...Don Sutton had 13 wins in 1985 at age 40 and Tom Candiotti had 11 wins in 1998 at age 40...is the first Major Leaguer to win 10 games as a 40-year old since Jamie Moyer (12) and Tim Wakefield (11) in 2009...has two shutouts, which are the most in a season by an Athletics 40-year old since Jack Quinn had four for the Philadelphia A's in 1928...the last American League pitcher with two shutouts as a 40-year old is Dennis Martinez, who had two in 1995 for Cleveland at age 41...the last A's 40-year old with two complete games is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (3)...ages are based on a players age as of June 30th.

IN JUNE: Is 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts in June...ranks second in the American League in June ERA (Santana, KC 1.56) and tied for second in wins...this marks the first time he has won four games in a month since Sept., 2005...has won five games in a month twice in his career, both times in August (1999 and 2005)...since 2006, the only Oakland pitcher to win five games in a month is Gio Gonzalez (Sept., 2011).

ACTIVE LEADERS: Has 2491.2 innings pitched and needs 8.1 more to become the 242nd pitcher in Major League history to reach 2500 innings (source: Stats, Inc.)...ranks eighth among active pitchers in innings...also ranks third in complete games (34), fifth in wins (181), sixth in games started (390) and shutouts (11) and seventh in strikeouts (1889).

AT HOME: Is 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA (14 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts at home and ranks ninth in the AL in home ERA...now has a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum dating back to Aug. 2 of last year, which is the longest home winning streak by an A's pitcher since Justin Duchscherer also had a seven-game streak from Sept. 13, 2004-Aug. 11, 2005...the last A's pitcher with a longer home winning streak is Mark Mulder, who won 10 straight from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...has a 1.93 ERA (15 er in 70.0 ip) and .221 (57 for 258) opponents batting average during his current winning streak, which spans 10 starts...has walked just six batters (0.77 per nine innings)...has not lost in Oakland since July 17, 2012 against Texas.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-0 with a 2.25 ERA (14 er in 56.0 ip) and .220 (44 for 200) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 3.83 ERA (18 er in 42.1 ip) and .308 (52 for 169) opponents average in seven starts during the day...ranks second in the American League in night ERA...now has a 10-game winning streak in night games dating back to July 28 of last year...has a 1.59 ERA (15 er in 84.2 ip) over that 12-start stretch...his last loss at night was July 17, 2012 against Texas...in two seasons with the A's, he is 15-5 with a 2.65 ERA (47 er in 159.1 ip) in 24 starts at night compared to 5-6 with a 4.24 ERA (43 er in 91.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

NOT WILD: Does not have a wild pitch in two seasons with the A's, a stretch of 39 starts and 250.2 innings pitched...the 39 consecutive starts without a wild pitch is the second longest streak in Oakland history to the record of 42 held by Catfish Hunter (June 25, 1972-June 27, 1973)...now has a streak of 435.0 innings pitched since his last wild pitch on May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL), which is the longest active streak in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Was the winning pitcher in his only interleague start this year at Milwaukee June 5 (1 er in 7.0 ip, 1.29 ERA)...is now 19-13 with a 4.04 ERA (111 er in 252.0 ip) in 40 career interleague appearances, all starts.

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 181 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martinez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (390), innings pitched (2491.2) and strikeouts (1889).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win at Seattle a week ago today...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Franklin in the third inning...those were the only runs he would allow in eight innings...retired each of the final six batters he faced.

COLÓN vs. ST. LOUIS: Is 1-0 with a 5.06 ERA (16.0 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in three career appearances, all starts and all at St. Louis...including one start in the new Busch Stadium, his last start on June 8, 2007...had a no decision in a 10-6 Angels win...tossed just four innings and allowed one run in each inning on a Duncan home run, a Stinnett home run, a Pujols home run and a Stinnett RBI single...his other two starts came in the previous Busch Stadium.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (6-6, 4.27 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season...is 4-0 with a 2.34 ERA and .176 opponents batting average over his last six starts...the winning streak matches his career high...is 3-0 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts in June and is 6-1 with a 2.24 ERA in 10 career starts in the month...has never won four game in a month...is 5-1 with a 2.59 ERA and .180 opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss in 10 innings at Seattle last Sunday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced St. Louis in his career.





- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

ADAM ROSALES

- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.
