

# CHICAGO CUBS SUPPLEMENTAL PLAYER BIOS

CAREER: Borbon (pronounced bor-BONE) spent a full season at the minor league level for the first time since 2008 last season with Triple-A Round Rock...after missing over half of the 2011 campaign with an ankle injury, returned to the field and played in 126 games for the Express...belted 10 home runs with the Express, surpassing his career total of 9 in 264 minor league games entering the campaign...appeared in 215 games with the Rangers from 2009-11, batting .284 with 40 stolen bases in 53 attempts...was selected as a supplemental 1st-round pick (35th overall) by Texas in the 2007 June draft and is entering his 6th full professional season.

2012: Spent entire campaign with Round Rock...ranked among the Pacific Coast leaders in hits (2nd, 162), triples (T9th, 8), runs (T15th, 78), and stolen bases (T16th, 20)...set an Express franchise record in hits...hit career-high 10 home runs after totaling 9 home runs in 264 games over previous 4 minor league seasons...batted .305 (50-164) with 15 extra-base hits (6 2B, 3 3B, 6 HR) against left-handed pitching and .304 (112-369) with 26 extra-base hits (17 2B, 5 3B, 4 HR) versus right-handers. batted .389 (7-18) with the bases loaded and .274 (32-117) with RISP...appeared primarily in centerfield (89 G), while also logging time in left field (40 G)...compiled a .993 fielding percentage (2 E/292 TC) along with 6 outfield assists...opened the season batting just .186 (16-86) over first 21 games with Round Rock... homered in first game of the season on April 5 at Iowa, going deep for the first time at any level since July 4, 2010 vs. CWS off Mark Buehrle...batted .390 (46-118) with 6 doubles, 3 triples, 4 home runs, and 16 RBI over next 27 games before landing on the disabled list...hit 2 home runs on May 17 vs. Fresno, first game at the minor league level and second as a professional... was on disabled list May 28-June 6 with right groin strain...compiled a 21-game hit streak from May 12-June 12 (.435, 40-92, 18 R, 8 2B, 3B, 4 HR, 15 RBI), T4th-longest in PCL in 2012... batted .445 (20-44) over first 10 games upon activation from the disabled list, but hit .197 (15-76) over final 19 games leading to the All-Star break...compiled a .311 average (65-209) over final 49 games following the break.

2011: Opened the season with the Rangers and started 28 games in center...was just 7-for-39 (.179) in season's 1st 15 games before hitting .340 (17-50) in final 17 contests...had a 10-game hitting streak from April 30-May 10 at .353 (12-34), one game shy of a career high...batted .300 (9-30) vs. left-handers and .450 (9-20) with RISP...drove in 3 runs on May 7 vs. New York-AL...had one error in 72 total chances...suffered a strained left hamstring on May 13 vs. the Los Angeles Angels while running down Hank Conger's fly out in the top of the 7th and was placed on the 15-day disabled list the following day... was sent to Frisco (AA) on rehab assignment on May 30 before being assigned to Round Rock the next day...was activated from the disabled list and officially optioned to the Express on June 3...started 32 games (31 in CF; 1 at DH) for Round Rock...ranked 2nd on the club in steals (16) despite appearing

in just 32 games...batted .434 (23-53) in final 13 contests with the Express...had 4 hits on June 30 vs. Nashville and July 4 vs. Albuquerque...had 88 errorless chances...sustained a left ankle injury on July 8 vs. Memphis while sliding into second base and underwent season-ending ulnar ligament repair surgery on July 18...the procedure was performed by Dr. John M. Crates in Plano, Texas...participated in the Arizona Instructional League and then played for Escogido in the Dominican Winter League, batting .193 with one homer, 7 RBI, and 5 steals in 29 regular season games...batted .357 in DWL playoffs...Escogido won the Caribbean Series title ... 2010: Spent the entire season with the Rangers, starting 121 games in center and one in left...led club in triples (4), was 2nd in sacrifice bunts (8), tied for 3rd in steals (15), and placed 5th in games (137) and at bats (438)... tied the Angels Erick Aybar for the major league lead in bunt hits (17) and ranked 2nd in majors behind Ichiro Suzuki (59) in infield hits (39), most by a Ranger since Otis Nixon (51) in 1995... opened year as the club's leadoff hitter, but went 3-for-36 (.083) while starting 9 of 1st 11 in leadoff slot before being taken out of that spot on April 18...batting .356 in June, 7th best in A.L. for the month...posted career-long 11-game hit streak, June 2-13... stole home on July 18 at Boston...connected for all 3 homers in 15-game span, June 16-July 4...started 39 of final 48 games (47 in CF; one in LF) beginning August 15...had a .988 fielding pct. (4 E/343 TC) in 133 games in the outfield...stole potential grand slam from Juan Rivera on Sept. 20 at Los Angeles (AL) to end the 3rd inning...was on all 3 playoff rosters in postseason, going 1-for-9 in 8 total games...went 0-for-4 in only start (LF) in Game 2 of ALDS at Tampa Bay...was 1-for-4 as a pinch-hitter with lone hit of playoffs coming in Game 1 of the World Series at San Francisco...2009: Appeared in 46 games for Texas in 1st 2 major league stints, June 29-July 6 and Aug. 7-end of the season...started 21 games at DH, 14 in left, and 3 in center with Texas...ranked among club leaders in sac bunts (2nd, 6), bunt singles (T2nd, 5/T10th in A.L.), 3-hit games (T4th, 7), and infield hits (T5th, 9)...had 19 steals in 23 attempts (82.6%), 4thmost among A.L. rookies...ranked 3rd in the A.L. and 4th in the majors with the 19 SB beginning August 9...batted .440 (28-70) at Rangers Ballpark, .333 (47-141) against right-handers, and .325 (13-40) with runners in scoring position...made ML debut on June 29 vs. LAA with 1st major league hit and RBI coming as pinch-hitter on July 1 off Angels' Jered Weaver...batted .485 (16-33) over his 1st 10 games, 3rd-highest average in the last 76 years for a player in 1st 10 career games with at least 30 at-bats: White Sox' Craig Wilson in 1988 (.500, 20-40) and San Diego's Luis Salazar in 1980 (.486, 17-35)...ranked 2nd in the A.L. in batting (.388) and steals (11) in August, the latter sharing the team lead...matched the 2nd-highest single-game total in team history with 4 steals on August 15 vs. Boston...swiped 3 more bags Aug. 18 vs. Minnesota to become the only player over the past 57 seasons (1954-2010) to have multiple games of 3-plus steals in his 1st 8 games...hit 1st ML home run on Aug. 20 vs. Minnesota with 1st pro multi-homer game on Sept. 8 at Cleveland (G1)...opened at Oklahoma City (AAA), batting

.307 over 96 games, 95 as leadoff hitter...started 80 games in CF and 16 in LF with 25 steals, 2nd on the RedHawks...had a .263 average in 23 games for Aguilas in the DWL...2008: Combined for a .321 (175-546) average with 87 runs, 32 doubles, 7 homers, 58 RBI, and 53 stolen bases in 126 games as CF and leadoff hitter at Bakersfield (High-A) and Frisco (AA)...ranked 2nd among Rangers minor leaguers in hits and steals and had 4th highest average...among all minor leaguers, placed 6th in hits and 10th in steals...opened at Bakersfield and led California League with 36 steals at the time of promotion in June...posted a 17-game hitting streak, April 23-May 12...joined the RoughRiders on June 28...hit safely in final 21 regular season contests at .409 (36-88)...rated as 8th-best prospect in the Texas League by Baseball America following the season...played for the Surprise Rafters in the Arizona Fall League, batting .287 (25-87) with one homer and 8 RBI in 24 games...tied for 6th in AFL with 7 steals in 8 tries...was 3-for-3 in AFL Rising Stars Game...at conclusion of AFL season in November, joined Aguilas in the DWL and batted .366 (26-71) with 2 HR, 15 RBI, and 4 steals in 19 regular season games...2007: Made his professional debut with Spokane on Aug. 21 at Everett, going 0-for-3 with a walk...recorded 1st pro hit in next game on Aug. 22 at Everett...all games came in center field as leadoff batter...was 3-for-4 in steal attempts... was sent to Surprise to finish out season in Arizona League... participated in instructional league after the season.

COLLEGE: Played 3 seasons at the University of Tennessee... had .355 career average and ranks 3rd in school history in triples (13) and 9th in hits (223)...as a junior, led the Vols with a .345 batting average and 6 triples, posting 28 RBI with 3 home runs and 10 stolen bases...earned 2nd team all-SEC honors... missed almost the entire non-conference schedule after suffering a broken left ankle while sliding into 2nd base during practice on Jan. 17, 2007...returned to the field on March 20...after sophomore season, played for the 2006 USA Baseball National Team that won a gold medal at the FISU World Championship Tournament in Havana, Cuba...led Team USA, which went 28-2-1, in hits (44), triples (4), and stolen bases (15), while ranking 2nd on the club with a .364 average...named to the FISU All-Tournament Team, a tournament which used wood bats...as a freshman, helped lead Vols to the 2005 College World Series...majored in sport management.

2011: Spent the majority of the season with Triple-A Reno in the Diamondbacks organization, hitting .317 (118-for-372) with 29 doubles, 27 home runs and 92 RBI in 101 games...also appeared in 12 games with the Big League club.

- Named a Pacific Coast League mid-season and post-season All Star.
- ◆ Ranked among PCL leaders in slugging percentage (3rd, .629), on-base percentage (7th, .405), home runs (7th) and RBI (12th).
- ◆ Earned PCL Player of the Week honors for 6/20-26, batting .462 (12-for-26) with 4 home runs and 13 RBI.
- ◆ Selected by the D-backs on 7/21…led all Minor Leaguers with 89 RBI at the time of his promotion and ranked second with 57 extra-base hits.

2010: Spent the season in the Phillies organization, playing in 110 games for Triple-A Lehigh Valley and 22 games for the Major League club.

◆ Named an International League mid-season All-Star.

2009: Made his first career Opening Day start at third base for the Yankees before splitting the season between the Big League club and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

- ♣ Hit .270 (107-for-397) with 10 homers and 47 RBI in 105 games with the Knights...Made 46 appearances in CF, 36 in RF, and 29 in LF...Did not commit an error and led International League outfielders with 13 assists.

# **HOW THEY BECAME THE RED SOX**

As 1 of 8 clubs to enter into the newly formed American League in 1901, the Red Sox were initially called the Boston Americans. Other nicknames for the club at that time were the Somersets, after original owner Charles W. Somers; Plymouth Rocks; Speed Boys; Puritans; and Pilgrims, but they were officially called the Americans. These various names were applied until 12/18/1907, when the current name "Red Sox" was adopted. The origin of this name is traced to the Boston Red Stockings of the powerful National League in the 1870's and 1880's. In 1907 the Red Stockings (who later became the Braves) abandoned the red hosiery they customarily wore. Manager Fred Tenney believed that the red dye in the socks could possibly cause infection in spike wounds. Red Sox Owner John I. Taylor stated, "From now on we'll wear red stockings, and I'm grabbing that name Red Sox!"
