



## Chicago Cubs (35-46) vs. Oakland Athletics (49-35)

**RHP Matt Garza (3-1, 3.83) vs. RHP Bartolo Colon (11-2, 2.79)**

**THE A'S HAVE IT:** The Chicago Cubs this week play their first-ever regular season games in Oakland, the third and final stop of their 10-day, nine-game, three-city trip that began in Milwaukee (2-1) and Seattle (2-1) ... Oakland won the series opener last night by a score of 8-7 ... after tomorrow's Fourth of July series finale, the Cubs return to Chicago for a 10-game stay leading up to the All-Star Break, beginning with a three-game series against Pittsburgh starting Friday.

- © The Cubs are 18-24 through their first 42 games on the road this season, already just five wins shy of their final road win total last season.
- © The Cubs have a winning record (28-23) when scoring more than three runs in a game this season and are 23-6 when reaching five runs ... the Cubs are 6-39 when allowing four or more runs.

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING:** The Cubs entered this series in Oakland having won three-straight series for the first time this year and for the first time overall since July 6-19, 2012 (won two of three games at New York, swept Arizona in a three-game series at home, won two of three games from Miami at home).

**WHOA, WE'RE HALFWAY THERE:** As the Cubs reached the halfway point of the season last night, the club has a 35-46 record through 81 games, an improvement on the 31-50 record the club had through 81 games last year (31-51 through 82 games) ... this year, the Cubs have a -11 run differential through 81 games compared to a -71 run differential through 81 games in 2012.

- © Chicago's team OPS of .707 this year is a slight improvement on last year's .684 mark through 81 games ... the Cubs have hit 20 more home runs at this point compared to last year (87 vs. 67) and have scored 39 more runs (337 to 298).
- © The Cubs team ERA of 3.97 is nearly a half run lower than last year's 4.37 ERA through 81 games ... Cubs starting pitchers have a 3.82 ERA through 81 games this season after posting a 4.32 ERA at this point last year, while the bullpen has a 4.32 ERA through 81 games this year, lower than the 4.47 ERA through 81 games last year.

**LONG DIVISION:** The Cubs have a winning record against teams outside their division this year at 24-21 while posting an 11-25 mark against the N.L. Central, the lowest winning percentage (.306) by any team against its own division in baseball.

**THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING:** The Cubs this week play their first-ever regular season games at O.co Coliseum, the 121st different ballpark in which the Cubs have played ... the Cubs have now played a regular-season game in every current major league city and a game in every active ballpark except the new Yankee Stadium.

- © The Cubs are 62-58-1 all-time when playing in a ballpark for the first time ... the Cubs have gone 11-13 in their last 24 ballpark debuts since 2000, dropping eight of their last nine ... last year the Cubs played in two new ballparks: Marlins Stadium and Target Field, losing both first contests.
- © The Cubs have played two exhibition games against the A's at what use to be called the Oakland Coliseum ... March 29, 1969, the Cubs defeated the Athletics 10-4 ... on March 30, 1969, the Cubs defeated the A's 8-3 thanks to two home runs and five RBI by Ron Santo ... thanks to Ed Hartig.

**THE HOT CORNER:** Combined, Cubs third basemen have 12 homers this season, already matching the 12 homers hit by Cubs third basemen last season ... Chicago's 12 homers from third basemen are tied for second-most in the N.L. and tied for seventh-most in the majors.

- © Cubs third basemen have combined to record a .758 OPS, the sixth-best mark in the National League by third basemen.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Cubs this week wind down a three-week stretch in which they play 16 of 19 games on the road through July 4 ... this run began June 14 and has the club making the following trip: Chicago-New York-St. Louis-Chicago-Milwaukee-Seattle-Oakland-Chicago ... overall, the Cubs will have played eight consecutive series in eight different cities, an itinerary that translates to more than 6,100 miles traveled.

**IN THERE BY DESIGN:** Cubs designated hitters are batting .444 (12-for-27) with three doubles, two home runs, six RBI and a 1.244 OPS in seven games this season ... on Saturday in Seattle, Alfonso Soriano homered as the Cubs DH for the second-straight day, extending his franchise record to six career home runs while at DH ... all told, Soriano is batting .386 (32-for-83) with nine home runs and 24 RBI in 25 career games as a designated hitter.

**IT'S JOB ONE:** Cubs starting pitchers have thrown 50 quality starts this season, fourth-most in the National League ... Cubs starters have turned in quality starts in 13 of their last 17 games, and have reached at least 6.0 innings pitched in 15 of their last 19 starts.

- © In their 50 quality starts, Cubs pitchers have gone 24-10 with 16 no decisions and a 2.17 ERA (82 ER/340.1 IP) ... the team is 10 games over .500 in those 50 starts, posting a 30-20 record ... overall this season, Cubs starters have combined for 25 wins, with the only non-quality start of the season that resulted in a starter's win being Edwin Jackson on May 11 at Washington (2 ER/5.1 IP).
- © Individually, Travis Wood (5-6, 2.85) is tied for the major league lead with 15 quality starts, joining Philadelphia's Cliff Lee (9-2) and St. Louis' Adam Wainwright (11-5).

**HE'S GOLDEN:** Reigning N.L. Gold Glove second baseman Darwin Barney has played 67 errorless games at second base to start this season and enters today riding a 70-game errorless streak (319 TC) dating to September 30 of last year ... last season Barney tied a major league single-season record, playing 141 consecutive games at second base without committing an error.

**LEAGUE SPEAK:** The Cubs are in playing the fifth game of a stretch in which they wrap up their interleague schedule with nine of 12 games through July 10 against the American League ... Chicago is 10-5 against the A.L., and owns a 118-132 (.472) all-time record in interleague play dating to 1997 ... Chicago's most recent winning season against the A.L. was in 2007 (8-4).

**THE RIGHT STUFF:** Nate Schierholtz (11 homers) and Scott Hairston (six homers) have combined to record 17 homers from right field this season, tied with Toronto for fourth-most by any team in the majors (St. Louis, 22 homers; Texas, 21 homers; Cincinnati, 18 homers from their right fielders).

### HOMER NOTES

Chicago has hit 52 home runs at Wrigley Field, the fourth-most by any team at home this season (Baltimore leads with 56 homers at home) ... the Cubs have hit 35 home runs on the road this season, tied for seventh-fewest in the major leagues (three teams have 28 home runs on the road, fewest in baseball) ... all told, the Cubs 87 homers this season tie for third-most in the N.L.

### About Garza

Matt, 29, will make his ninth start of the season (sixth on the road) tonight in the middle game of a three-game interleague set at Oakland ... is in his third season with Chicago after he was acquired in an eight-player deal from Tampa Bay, January 8, 2011 ... is 60-62 with a 3.84 ERA (459 ER/1,076.1 IP) in 178 games (175 starts) with Minnesota (2006-07), Tampa Bay (2008-10) and Chicago (2011-13).

- ⊙ Is 33-28 with a 3.69 ERA (228 ER/555.2 IP) and five complete games in 90 games (89 starts) dating to 2010.
- ⊙ Made 30 starts in four-straight seasons 2008-11 ... twice has reached the 200.0-inning mark, in 2009 (203.0) and 2010 (204.2) with Tampa Bay.
- ⊙ With Tampa Bay from 2008-10, went 34-31 with one save and a 3.86 ERA (254 ER/592.1 IP) in 95 appearances, all but one as a starter.
- ⊙ Was a member of the 2008 and 2010 Tampa Bay post-season clubs, going 2-1 with a 3.48 ERA (12 ER/31.0 IP) in five playoff starts.
- ⊙ Faced the minimum 27 batters in his no-hitter against the Tigers, July 26, 2010 ... issued a second-inning walk to Brennan Boesch before erasing the free pass with an inning-ending double play ... retired the final 22 batters he faced.
- ⊙ Attended Fresno State (Calif.) University where he was named Most Outstanding Pitcher and Second Team All-Western Athletic Conference in 2004 ... named WAC Pitcher of the Year and First Team All-WAC in 2005.

### Last Time Out

Earned his second-straight win in Chicago's 7-2 triumph June 27 at Milwaukee ... tossed 7.0 innings of one-run, eight-hit ball, while walking one and fanning a season-high 10 ... went 2-for-3 with a run scored at the dish ... the two hits tied a career high (also done, August 30, 2011 at San Francisco).

### 2013 Season

The Cubs are 5-3 in his eight starts ... made his first start of the season May 21 at Pittsburgh after starting the season on the disabled list with a left lat strain suffered February 17 at Fitch Park in Mesa, Ariz.

- ⊙ Has fanned 47 while walking 15 in 49.1 innings.
- ⊙ Nine of his 21 earned runs allowed came in one start, June 11 vs. Cincinnati.
- ⊙ Holding right-handed hitters to a .226 batting average (21-for-93) with 21 strikeouts, while lefties are hitting .233 (21-for-90) with 26 strikeouts against him.
- ⊙ Opponents are just 8-for-90 (.089) against him with a two-strike count.
- ⊙ Has a 2.76 ERA (9 ER/29.1 IP) in five road starts, compared to a 5.40 ERA (12 ER/20.0 IP) at home.
- ⊙ Is 2-0 with a 0.83 ERA (2 ER/22.0 IP) and 23 strikeouts in his last three starts.
- ⊙ Made four starts (two with Triple-A Iowa & two with Double-A Tennessee) as part of a rehabilitation assignment, going 1-1 with a 1.17 ERA (2 ER/15.1 IP), 11 strikeouts and four walks.

### Notable 2013 Starts

- ⊙ Received a no-decision in his season debut, May 21 at Pittsburgh, despite leaving with a 3-0 lead ... allowed just one hit while walking three and fanning five in 5.0-scoreless innings in the Cubs 5-4 setback ... threw first-pitch strikes to 14 of the 19 batters he faced (82 total pitches) ... went 1-for-2 with a double and a career-high two RBI at the plate.
- ⊙ Earned his first victory of the season in Chicago's 7-2 triumph May 31 vs. Arizona ... allowed two runs on six hits, while walking none and fanning four in a season-high 7.0 innings ... it marks his first victory since beating Arizona July 15, 2012.
- ⊙ Tossed 7.0-scoreless innings June 15 at the Mets, receiving a no-decision in the Cubs 4-3 setback (left with a 3-0 lead) ... allowed three hits and two walks, while fanning five in his longest scoreless outing of the season.
- ⊙ Earned his second win, tossing a season-high 8.0 innings in Chicago's 3-1 victory June 21 vs. Houston ... allowed one run on four hits while walking two and fanning eight.

### 2012 Season

Matt went 5-7 with a 3.91 ERA (45 ER/103.2 IP) in 18 starts for Chicago ... missed the last two months of the season with a stress reaction in his right elbow – was placed on the 15-day disabled list, August 7 (retroactive to July 28), and transferred to the 60-day D.L., August 21.

- ⊙ Went 3-1 with a 2.12 ERA (11 ER/46.2 IP) in seven home starts ... was 2-6 with a 5.37 ERA (34 ER/57.0 IP) in 11 road starts.
- ⊙ His season ended having gone 18-straight home starts with three or fewer earned runs allowed dating to June 27, 2011 ... that's the longest stretch for a Cubs starting pitcher since Kerry Wood went 22-straight home starts having allowed three or fewer earned runs from 2000-02.
- ⊙ Held the opponent to a .236 batting average (90-for-382), including a .224 mark (43-for-192) by right-handed hitters.
- ⊙ Struck out 96 batters in 103.2 innings ... walked just 32.
- ⊙ Recorded a career-high, five-game winning streak dating to 2011 thanks to his first victory of the season, April 12 vs. Milwaukee, in which he tossed 8.2-shutout innings before he was pulled following 119 pitches.
- ⊙ Struck out 10 Phillies, April 29 at Philadelphia ... was his 10th-career, double-digit strikeout effort.
- ⊙ Left July 21's start in St. Louis after 3.0-scoreless innings due to a stress reaction in his right elbow.
- ⊙ Committed three errors and logged an .842 fielding percentage (19 TC).

Travis will make his 17th start of the season (seventh on the road) tomorrow afternoon in the finale of a three-game interleague set at Oakland.

**Last Time Out:** Received a no-decision in Chicago's 5-4, 10-inning loss June 28 at Seattle ... allowed two runs on three hits and three walks, while fanning six in 6.1 innings (left with a 4-1 lead).

**Career vs. Oakland:** Will be making his first-career start vs. Oakland.

**Season Notes:** Is 0-3 with two no-decisions in his last five outings despite tossing quality starts in each ... has recorded quality starts in 15 of 16 outings this season ... has allowed eight home runs (104.1 IP) after surrendering a career-high 25 in 2012 ... holding left-handed batters to a .122 average (11-for-90), while righties are hitting .218 (61-for-280) against him.
