



## Chicago Cubs (36-46) vs. Oakland Athletics (49-36)

**THE END OF THE ROAD:** The Chicago Cubs today conclude their 10-day, nine-game, three-city trip with the finale of their three-game series in Oakland (1-1) ... today's game also wraps up a stretch of 16 of 19 games on the road that began June 14 with a travel manifest of Chicago-New York-St. Louis-Chicago-Milwaukee-Seattle-Oakland-Chicago, an itinerary that translates to more than 6,100 miles traveled.

- Ⓞ The Cubs have gone 10-8 through the first 18 games of this 19-game adventure, guaranteeing a winning record during this stretch ... last night's win also gave the Cubs a 5-3 mark on this trip, guaranteeing a winning record on the trek that began in Milwaukee (2-1) and Seattle (2-1).
- Ⓞ Last night's win also secured a winning record for the Cubs in interleague play this season for the first time since 2007 (8-4) ... the Cubs this year are 11-5 against the American League with four games to play.
- Ⓞ The Cubs have a winning record (28-23) when scoring more than three runs in a game this season and are 23-6 when reaching five runs ... the Cubs are 6-39 when allowing four or more runs.
- Ⓞ The Cubs entered this series in Oakland having won three-straight series for the first time this year and for the first time overall since July 6-19, 2012 ... with a win today, the Cubs would win four series in a row for the first time since August 1-14, 2011.

**HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY!** The Cubs are 117-96-3 (.549) all-time on the Fourth of July ... however, the club has lost 11 of its last 14 games on the holiday ... last year, the Cubs secured a 5-1 win in Atlanta on July 4, snapping a four-game Independence Day losing streak ... the Cubs have been on the road for Independence Day seven of the last nine seasons (only home in 2009 and 2010 during this stretch).

**IT TAKES A VILLAGE:** Right-handed pitchers Matt Guerrier and Pedro Strop were added to the roster yesterday and are poised to become the 40th and 41st players to appear in a game for the Cubs this season ... the Cubs will also have utilized 23 pitchers after both make their team debut.

- Ⓞ The Cubs record for players utilized prior to the All-Star Break is 41, set during the 2000 campaign ... last year, the Cubs utilized 40 players prior to the Break, the only other time in franchise history the club reached at least 40 players at this point in the season ... thanks to Ed Hartig.
- Ⓞ The Cubs have set a new franchise mark by utilizing 21 pitchers prior to the Break ... the club had previously utilized 20 pitchers prior to the Break during four seasons: 2012, 2011, 2008 and 2005.
- Ⓞ The Cubs in 2012 utilized 53 different players, establishing a new single-season club record for players in a single season ... the previous record of 51 players utilized in a single season was set by the 2000 club.
- Ⓞ Only seven players on the current 25-man roster were on the 2012 Opening Day roster: Luis Valbuena, Starlin Castro, Alfonso Soriano, Darwin Barney, James Russell, Jeff Samardzija and Matt Garza.
- Ⓞ At the same time, more than half of the players on the current 25-man roster – 13 – have joined the Cubs organization since the end of the 2012 campaign.
- Ⓞ Finally, nine players on the current 25-man roster were not on the 2013 Opening Day roster.

**IT'S JOB ONE:** Cubs starter Travis Wood enters today's start tied for the major league lead with 15 quality starts with Philadelphia's Cliff Lee and St. Louis' Adam Wainwright ... overall, Cubs pitchers have made 51 quality starts, fourth most in the National League ... Cubs starters have turned in quality starts in 14 of their last 18 games, and have reached at least 6.0 innings pitched in 16 of their last 20 starts.

- Ⓞ In their 51 quality starts, Cubs pitchers have gone 25-10 with 16 no decisions and a 2.12 ERA (82 ER/348.1 IP) ... the team is 11 games over .500 in those 51 starts, posting a 31-20 record ... overall this season, Cubs starters have combined for 26 wins, with the only non-quality start of the season that resulted in a starter's win being Edwin Jackson on May 11 at Washington (2 ER/5.1 IP).

**A COMPARISON THROUGH 82:** As the Cubs surpassed the halfway point of the season last night, the club has a 36-46 record through 82 games, an improvement on the 31-51 record the club had through 82 games last year (32-51 through 83 games) ... this year, the Cubs have a -9 run differential through 82 games compared to a -75 run differential through 82 games in 2012.

**LONG DIVISION:** The Cubs have a winning record against teams outside their division this year at 25-21 while posting an 11-25 mark against the N.L. Central, the lowest winning percentage (.306) by any team against its own division in baseball.

**THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING:** The Cubs this week played their first-ever regular season games at O.co Coliseum, the 121st different ballpark in which the Cubs have played ... the Cubs have now played a regular-season game in every current major league city and a game in every active ballpark except the new Yankee Stadium ... the Cubs are 62-58-1 all-time when playing in a ballpark for the first time.

- Ⓞ The Cubs have played two exhibition games against the A's at what use to be called the Oakland Coliseum ... March 29, 1969, the Cubs defeated the Athletics 10-4 ... on March 30, 1969, the Cubs defeated the A's 8-3 thanks to two home runs and five RBI by Ron Santo ... thanks to Ed Hartig for his research assistance.

**IN THERE BY DESIGN:** Cubs designated hitters are batting .419 (13-for-31) with three doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and a 1.151 OPS in seven games this season ... on Saturday in Seattle, Alfonso Soriano homered as the Cubs DH for the second-straight day, extending his franchise record to six career home runs while at DH ... all told, Soriano is batting .379 (33-for-87) with nine home runs and 25 RBI in 26 career games as a designated hitter.

**HE'S GOLDEN:** Reigning N.L. Gold Glove second baseman Darwin Barney has played 68 errorless games at second base to start this season and enters today riding a 71-game errorless streak (323 TC) dating to September 30 of last year ... last season Barney tied a major league single-season record, playing 141-consecutive games at second base without committing an error.

**LEAGUE SPEAK:** The Cubs are playing the sixth game of a stretch in which they wrap up their interleague schedule with nine of 12 games through July 10 against the American League ... Chicago is 11-5 against the A.L., and owns a 119-132 (.474) all-time record in interleague play dating to 1997.

Houston is lowest with a .224 mark ... injured outfielder David DeJesus (10-for-30) leads the team with a .333 mark with RISP ... outfielder Nate Schierholtz is second with a .316 average (18-for-57).

### HOMER NOTES

Chicago has hit 52 home runs at Wrigley Field, the fifth-most by any team at home this season (Baltimore leads with 56 homers at home) ... the Cubs have hit 36 home runs on the road this season, tied for eighth-fewest in the major leagues (Houston and Kansas City have 29 home runs on the road, fewest in baseball) ... all told, the Cubs 88 homers this season tie for third-most in the N.L.

### About Wood

Travis will make his 17th start of the season (seventh on the road) this afternoon in the finale of a three-game interleague set at Oakland ... was acquired by the Cubs in a four-player deal with the Reds, December 23, 2011 ... made 26 starts for the Cubs last season, and is 22-29 with a 3.91 ERA (204 ER/469.0 IP) in 81 career major league games (77 starts) since making his debut with the Reds in 2010.

- Ⓞ Has allowed only 14 stolen bases in 469.0 big league innings.
- Ⓞ Owns a 45-37 record with a 3.55 ERA (285 ER/723.0 IP) in 139 minor league games, all but three as a starter.
- Ⓞ Was the Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Month for June 2009 (6 GS, 1 CG, 4-0, 1.13 ERA, 40.0 IP, 5 ER, 39 SO, 6 BB) and June 2010 (5 GS, 2-2, 1.26 ERA, 35.2 IP, 5 ER, 37 SO, 6 BB).
- Ⓞ Was a 2010 International League mid-season All-Star, but did not pitch because he was promoted prior to the game.
- Ⓞ Named the Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year and the Southern League's Most Outstanding Pitcher in 2009 ... combined to go 13-5 with a 1.77 ERA (33 ER/167.2 IP) in 27 starts between Double-A Carolina and Triple-A Louisville that season.
- Ⓞ His changeup and control were rated by *Baseball America* as the best in the Southern League in 2009, while his changeup was rated the best in the Reds organization.
- Ⓞ Was selected by the Reds in the second round of the 2005 draft.

### Last Time Out

Received a no-decision in Chicago's 5-4, 10-inning loss June 28 at Seattle ... allowed two runs on three hits and three walks, while fanning six in 6.1 innings (left with a 4-1 lead).

### 2013 Season

Is 0-3 with two no-decisions in his last five outings despite tossing quality starts in each ... began the season with nine-straight quality starts, becoming the first Cubs hurler to accomplish the feat since Mordecai Brown tossed 11-straight — all complete games — to begin the 1908 season ... has recorded quality starts in 15 of 16 outings this season ... owns a 2.85 ERA (33 ER/104.1 IP) with 75 strikeouts and 32 walks in 16 starts.

- Ⓞ Left-handed batters are hitting .122 (11-for-90) against him, while righties are hitting .218 (61-for-280).
- Ⓞ Opposing hitters are just 24-for-184 (.130) against him with a two-strike count.
- Ⓞ Holding the top half of opposing lineups (1-5 hitters) to a .168 batting average (37-for-222) with 51 strikeouts, while the bottom half (6-9 hitters) is batting .234 (35-for-148) against him.
- Ⓞ Is 2-4 with a 2.82 ERA (16 ER/51.0 IP) in eight starts vs. N.L. Central opponents.
- Ⓞ Has allowed just eight home runs in 104.1 innings after surrendering a career-high 25 last season.
- Ⓞ Boasts a 2.85 ERA (33 ER/104.1 IP) through 16 starts after sporting a 4.52 ERA (48 ER/95.2 IP) in his first 16 outings of 2012.

### Notable 2013 Starts

- Ⓞ Earned the victory in his first start April 4 at Pittsburgh ... allowed just one hit while fanning four in 6.0-scoreless innings in a 3-2 Cubs triumph.
- Ⓞ Registered his third-straight quality start April 16 vs. Texas ... suffered the loss despite tossing 7.1 innings of two-run ball in a 4-2 Cubs setback.
- Ⓞ Earned his second victory in Chicago's 3-2 triumph April 27 at Miami ... allowed two runs on three hits while walking one and fanning five in 6.0 innings ... the outing marked his fifth-straight quality start to begin the season.
- Ⓞ Recorded his third victory in a 2-1 Cubs triumph May 7 vs. St. Louis ... allowed one run on five hits while walking two and fanning a season-high eight in 6.2 innings ... became the first Cubs southpaw in 65 years to begin the season with seven-straight quality starts since Johnny Schmitz to commence the 1948 campaign.
- Ⓞ Recorded his fourth victory in a 9-1 Cubs triumph May 13 vs. Colorado ... scattered two hits and three walks while fanning two in 7.0-scoreless innings ... became the second Cubs southpaw to record eight-straight quality starts to begin a campaign since Chicago moved to Wrigley Field in 1916, joining Hippo Vaughn (1919).
- Ⓞ Received a no-decision in the Cubs 4-3 setback May 19 vs. the Mets ... recorded his ninth-straight quality start to begin the season, the first Cubs hurler to accomplish the feat since Mordecai Brown tossed 11-straight — all complete games — to begin the 1908 season ... allowed three runs on five hits, while walking two and fanning three in 7.0 innings.
  - Ⓞ Went 1-for-2, clubbing his first homer of the season, and fourth of his career, a two-run, fifth-inning shot off Dillon Gee that reached Waveland Avenue.
- Ⓞ Earned his fifth win in the Cubs 8-3 victory May 30 vs. the White Sox ... allowed two runs on five hits, while walking two and fanning six in 6.0 innings ... it marks his 10th quality start in 11 outings ... Wood (2-for-3, HR, R, 4 RBI) recorded his second home run of the season, first-career grand slam and fifth-career homer.

### 2012 Season

In his first season with the organization, Travis had two stints with the Cubs and went 6-13 with a 4.27 ERA (74 ER/156.0 IP) in 26 starts ... limited opponents to a .232 batting average (133-for-574) and allowed three or fewer runs in 19 starts.

- Ⓞ Broke camp with Triple-A Iowa and was recalled to Chicago, May 6, for a start vs. the Dodgers ... optioned to Iowa the next day, and was recalled again, May 22.
- Ⓞ Tied his career high with four-straight victories, June 19-July 6 ... recorded a 1.01 ERA (3 ER/26.2 IP) in the four starts.
- Ⓞ Recorded a 19.2-inning scoreless streak from the third inning, June 19 against the White Sox, to the second inning, July 6 against the Mets ... marked the longest scoreless streak for a Cubs lefty starter since Juan Pizarro's 21.0-inning run in 1971.
- Ⓞ With Triple-A Iowa, went 3-3 with a 4.57 ERA (21 ER/41.1 IP) in seven starts, walking 11 and fanning 39 ... surrendered five homers in 41.1 innings.

**Last Time Out:** Received a no-decision in Chicago's 5-3, 11-inning victory June 29 at Seattle ... allowed two runs on six hits and three walks, while fanning five in 7.0 innings.

**Career vs. Pittsburgh:** Is 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA (9 ER/52.0 IP) in 16 games (five starts) ... has struck out 48 hitters compared to 11 walks ... is 1-2 with a 2.14 ERA (5 ER/21.0 IP) in three starts vs. the Pirates this season.

**Season Notes:** Boasts a 2.94-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio (120 SO/35 BB) ... leads the club with 120 strikeouts ... has a 2.71 ERA (19 ER/63.0 IP) on the road, compared to a 4.11 ERA (23 ER/50.1 IP) at home ... right-handed batters are hitting .224 (52-for-232) against him, while lefties are hitting .241 (47-for-195) ... opponents own a .159 batting average (34-for-214) against him with a two-strike count.
