THE END OF THE ROAD: The Chicago Cubs today conclude their 10-day, nine-game, three-city trip with the finale of their three-game series in Oakland (1-1) ... today's game also wraps up a stretch of 16 of 19 games on the road that began June 14 with a travel manifest of Chicago-New York-St. Louis-Chicago-Milwaukee-Seattle-Oakland-Chicago, an itinerary that translates to more than 6,100 miles traveled.

- The Cubs have gone 10-8 through the first 18 games of this 19-game adventure, guaranteeing a winning record during this stretch ... last night's win also gave the Cubs a 5-3 mark on this trip, guaranteeing a winning record on the trek that began in Milwaukee (2-1) and Seattle (2-1).
- Cast night's win also secured a winning record for the Cubs in interleague play this season for the first time since 2007 (8-4) ... the Cubs this year are 11-5 against the American League with four games to play.
- The Cubs have a winning record (28-23) when scoring more than three runs in a game this season and are 23-6 when reaching five runs ... the Cubs are 6-39 when allowing four or more runs.
- The Cubs entered this series in Oakland having won three-straight series for the first time this year and for the first time overall since July 6-19, 2012 ... with a win today, the Cubs would win four series in a row for the first time since August 1-14, 2011.

HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAYI: The Cubs are 117-96-3 (.549) all-time on the Fourth of July ... however, the club has lost 11 of its last 14 games on the holiday ... last year, the Cubs secured a 5-1 win in Atlanta on July 4, snapping a four-game Independence Day losing streak ... the Cubs have been on the road for Independence Day seven of the last nine seasons (only home in 2009 and 2010 during this stretch).

IT TAKES A VILLAGE: Right-handed pitchers Matt Guerrier and Pedro Strop were added to the roster yesterday and are poised to become the 40th and 41st players to appear in a game for the Cubs this season ... the Cubs will also have utilized 23 pitchers after both make their team debut.

- The Cubs record for players utilized prior to the All-Star Break is 41, set during the 2000 campaign ... last year, the Cubs utilized 40 players prior to the Break, the only other time in franchise history the club reached at least 40 players at this point in the season ... thanks to Ed Hartig.
- The Cubs have set a new franchise mark by utilizing 21 pitchers prior to the Break ... the club had previously utilized 20 pitchers prior to the Break during four seasons: 2012, 2011, 2008 and 2005.
- The Cubs in 2012 utilized 53 different players, establishing a new single-season club record for players in a single season ... the previous record of 51 players utilized in a single season was set by the 2000 club.
- Only seven players on the current 25-man roster were on the 2012 Opening Day roster: Luis Valbuena, Starlin Castro, Alfonso Soriano, Darwin Barney, James Russell, Jeff Samardzija and Matt Garza.
- At the same time, more than half of the players on the current 25-man roster 13 have joined the Cubs organization since the end of the 2012 campaign.
- © Finally, nine players on the current 25-man roster were not on the 2013 Opening Day roster.

IT'S JOB ONE: Cubs starter Travis Wood enters today's start tied for the major league lead with 15 quality starts with Philadelphia's Cliff Lee and St. Louis' Adam Wainwright ... overall, Cubs pitchers have made 51 quality starts, fourth most in the National League ... Cubs starters have turned in quality starts in 14 of their last 18 games, and have reached at least 6.0 innings pitched in 16 of their last 20 starts.

In their 51 quality starts, Cubs pitchers have gone 25-10 with 16 no decisions and a 2.12 ERA (82 ER/348.1 IP) ... the team is 11 games over .500 in those 51 starts, posting a 31-20 record ... overall this season, Cubs starters have combined for 26 wins, with the only non-quality start of the season that resulted in a starter's win being Edwin Jackson on May 11 at Washington (2 ER/5.1 IP).

<u>A COMPARISON THROUGH 82:</u> As the Cubs surpassed the halfway point of the season last night, the club has a 36-46 record through 82 games, an improvement on the 31-51 record the club had through 82 games last year (32-51 through 83 games) ... this year, the Cubs have a -9 run differential through 82 games compared to a -75 run differential through 82 games in 2012.

LONG DIVISION: The Cubs have a winning record against teams outside their division this year at 25-21 while posting an 11-25 mark against the N.L. Central, the lowest winning percentage (.306) by any team against its own division in baseball.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: The Cubs this week played their first-ever regular season games at O.co Coliseum, the 121st different ballpark in which the Cubs have played ... the Cubs have now played a regular-season game in every current major league city and a game in every active ballpark except the new Yankee Stadium ... the Cubs are 62-58-1 all-time when playing in a ballpark for the first time.

The Cubs have played two exhibition games against the A's at what use to be called the Oakland Coliseum ... March 29, 1969, the Cubs defeated the Athletics 10-4 ... on March 30, 1969, the Cubs defeated the A's 8-3 thanks to two home runs and five RBI by Ron Santo ... thanks to Ed Hartig for his research assistance.

IN THERE BY DESIGN: Cubs designated hitters are batting .419 (13-for-31) with three doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and a 1.151 OPS in seven games this season ... on Saturday in Seattle, Alfonso Soriano homered as the Cubs DH for the second-straight day, extending his franchise record to six career home runs while at DH ... all told, Soriano is batting .379 (33-for-87) with nine home runs and 25 RBI in 26 career games as a designated hitter.

<u>HE'S GOLDEN</u>: Reigning N.L. Gold Glove second baseman Darwin Barney has played 68 errorless games at second base to start this season and enters today riding a 71-game errorless streak (323 TC) dating to September 30 of last year ... last season Barney tied a major league single-season record, playing 141-consecutive games at second base without committing an error.

LEAGUE SPEAK: The Cubs are playing the sixth game of a stretch in which they wrap up their interleague schedule with nine of 12 games through July 10 against the American League ... Chicago is 11-5 against the A.L., and owns a 119-132 (.474) all-time record in interleague play dating to 1997.

© Has allowed only 14 stolen bases in 469.0 big league inning

- © Owns a 45-37 record with a 3.55 ERA (285 ER/723.0 IP) in 139 minor league games, all but three as a starter.


