#### A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 17-19...need one more win to win the season series for the fourth time in the last five years...are 24-14 against Kansas City since 2009...all-time, the A's are 303-248 against the Royals...that breaks down to 168-109 in Cakland and 135-139 in Kansas City...including 115-123 at Kauffman Stadium.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 21 for 21 in save opportunities and is the only Major League closer without a blown save...has now converted each of his last 39 save chances, which is the longest active streak in the majors and one short of the Oakland record of 40 set by Dennis Eckersley from Sept. 15, 1991-Aug. 7, 1992.

Josh Donaldson is batting .357 (20 for 56) with five home runs and 13 RBI over his last 16 games...ranks second among American League third baseman in RBI (55) and walks (36), third in doubles (22) and fourth in batting (.314) and home runs (14).

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1989 Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in 1993 Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hopper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in 1994 Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in 1996 the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won six of the last eight games and are a season-high tying 14 games over .500 for the third time this year...are 50-36, which is the second best record in the American League, fourth best in the majors and the best by an A's team after 86 games since the 1992 club also started the year 50-36 (won game 87)...this is the ninth time in Oakland history the A's won their 50<sup>th</sup> game in the 86<sup>th</sup> game or earlier (1971, 1972, 1975, 1981, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992)...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the third consecutive day, ½ game ahead of Texas...have spent 28 days in sole possession of first this year and six days tied for first...the 34 days with at least a share of first are the A's most since 2006 when they had 126...have also spent 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 107-62 (.633) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Cincinnati, 103-67)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 6-2 since June 25...have swept nine series this year after tallying just 11 sweeps all last year.

CLOSE CALLS: Won a 1-0 game without an RBI yesterday for the ninth time in Oakland history...it was the first time the only run scored on a passed ball...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to win a 1-0 game on a passed ball was the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 4, 1993 against Montreal...each of the A's last two wins have been by one run...now have a 16-10 (.615) record in one-run games for the season...rank second in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 12-5 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins...have five "walk-off" wins.

**BEFORE THE BREAK:** The A's have clinched a winning record before the All-Star Break for the first time since 2008 (51-44)...this marks the 14<sup>th</sup> time in Oakland history the A's have won 50 games before the break, the second time in the last 10 years (51 in 2008)...the pitching staff is averaging 2.43 walks per nine innings, which is the best pre-break mark in Oakland history (2.47 in 1972) and second best in Athletics history (2.36 in 1944).

**PITCHING:** The A's tossed a two-hit shutout yesterday, their second two-hit shutout in the last seven games (June 26 vs. Cincinnati)...it was the seventh shutout of the season, their second 1-0 shutout...posted a 3.13 ERA (25 er in 72.0 ip) on the homestand and now have a 3.74 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.297) and have issued the fewest walks (210)...also rank second in opponents batting average (.245) and fourth in slugging percentage (.391).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 34-18 (.654) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Pittsburgh, 32-20)...are 16-18 (.471) during the day, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.55 ERA (186 er in 471.2 ip) at night, which is the lowest mark in the AL...are batting .253 (456 for 1803) with 271 runs scored in night games (5.21 per game) compared to .240 (275 for 1145) with 127 runs during the day (3.74 per game).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a six-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Pittsburgh (three games) tonight...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Texas (1-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 22-22 (.500) on the road...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (2-1) and the Cubs (2-1) and have won 18 of the last 22 home games...are 28-14 (.667) at home for the season, which is the best mark in the American League and third best in the majors.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 22-7 with a 3.08 ERA (98 er in 286.0 ip) and .228 (241 for 1057) opponents batting average over the last 44 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over the first 42 contests...are 36-28 with a 4.00 ERA (234 er in 526.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in innings pitched, are tied for the lead in complete game shutouts (3), tied for second in complete games (3), rank third in wins and seventh in ERA.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have been held to one run in each of the last two games and have nine hits over that stretch, but have split the two games...are batting .260 (138 for 531) with 80 runs scored over the last 16 games (5.00 per game) after hitting .217 with 37 runs over the previous 11 contests (3.36 per game)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (326)...rank third in the AL in doubles (163), tied for third in hit by pitches (28) and fourth in extra base hits (264)...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (104)...are tied for the AL lead in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), rank second in doubles (6), third in walks (9) and tied for third in RBI (68)...A's pinch hitters are batting .118 (9 for 76), which is the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (88), rank second in walks (11) and tied for second in home runs (2) and RBI (9).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have turned 63 double plays, which is the fewest in the American League and second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 60)...sent 10 men to the plate in the second inning a week ago today, the 18<sup>th</sup> time this year they have sent at least nine batters to the plate in an inning...did that just 22 times last year...including yesterday, the A's have gone 57 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL, their longest stretch since May 28-Aug. 30, 2005 (94 days).

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 10-12 against the West since May 10 while going 22-6 against everyone else...are batting .268 (360 for 1345) with 212 runs (38 games, 5.58 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .231 (371 for 1603) with 188 runs (48 games, 3.92 runs per game) against the rest of baseball.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** The A's won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and finished with a winning record each month...now have seven consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...the A's had the lowest opponents batting average (.235) and onbase percentage (.285) in the American League in June, ranked third in ERA (3.43) and opponents slugging (.368) and tied for third in winning percentage (.593)...the offense ranked third in home runs (33).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 18<sup>th</sup> start of the season...the A's are 9-8 (.529) in his starting assignments this year and 29-19 (.604) in his career...his teams are 34-19 (.642) in his 53 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in 12 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

BRIEFLY: Is 1-2 with a 5.96 ERA (15 er in 22.2 ip) and .286 (26 for 91) opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 3-0 with a 3.86 over his first three starts, 0-5 with a 3.62 ERA over his next five and 3-0 with a 3.66 ERA over his next five after that...the five-game losing streak was the longest of his career...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his

winning streak to five games dating back to last year...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed at least one home run in each of his last eight starts (12 home runs total) and now has 19 for the season, which is second most in the American League (Guthrie, KC 20)...those are the most home runs allowed by an A's pitchers before the All-Star Break since Gil Heredia had 21 in 2001...16 have been hit by right-handers, which is the most in the majors...surrendered a home run to Dunn June 8, his first home run allowed to a left-hander since Sept. 14, 2012 (Chris Davis, BAL)...14 of the 19 home runs have been solo shots...10 have come in the first two innings of a game.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .169 (15 for 89) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the American League...opponents are 36 for 105 (.343) with 12 doubles, seven home runs (.343 slugging percentage) and five walks (.373 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage in third highest in the AL, the batting average is fourth highest and the on-base percentage is 10<sup>th</sup> highest...allowed a .319 batting average, .555 slugging percentage and .358 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning last year.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** Is 1-1 with a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams this year...in his career, he is 7-2 with a 1.69 ERA (15 er in 79.2 ip) in 12 career starts against the AL Central compared to 14-15 with a 4.62 ERA (124 er in 242.0 ip) in 41 starts against everyone

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 6-4 with a 3.77 ERA (31 er in 74.0 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in 12 starts at night compared to 1-3 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) and nine home runs allowed in five starts during the day...is tied for sixth in the American League in wins at night...in two seasons with the A's, he is 16-9 with a 3.36 ERA (77 in 206.0 ip) in 33 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 5.12 ERA (51 er in 89.2 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-3 with a 3.20 ERA (18 er in 50.2 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 3-4 with a 5.07 ERA (31 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 11-7 with a 2.89 ERA (48 er in 149.1 ip) and .242 (137 for 566) opponents average in 23 starts in Oakland compared to 9-10 with a 4.92 ERA (80 er in 146.1 ip) and .297 (177 for 595) opponents average in 26 starts on the road...has allowed 27 of his 43 home runs with the A's on the road.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received just eight runs of support in his seven losses this year (44.0 ip, 1.64 RSA)...has received just 20 runs of support in his 17 losses in two seasons with the A's (102.2 ip, 1.75 RSA)...has received no support eight times over the last two years and one run of support eight times...the A's have been shut out five times this year, twice in games started by Milone...is 6-1 with three runs of support or more this year and 15-3 in his career.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 4.76 ERA (18 er in 34.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 1.32 ERA (5 er in 34.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 6.21 ERA (26 er in 37.2) from the fifth inning on.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: Won each of his first three starts: a 6-2 win over Seattle *April 3* in Oakland, an 11-5 win at Los Angeles *April 10* and an 11-2 win over Houston *April 15* in Oakland...then lost each of his next five starts, beginning with an 8-1 loss at Tampa Bay *April 21*...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles *May 1* in Oakland...did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks (Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue)...walked three batters in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career *May 12* Seattle and *May 18* against Kansas City...snapped his five-game losing streak in the A's 2-1 win over the Royals...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago *June 8*...then tossed 113 pitches in his next start, a 3-2 loss to Seattle *June 14*, which was the second highest total of his career...lost his seventh game of the season *June 19* at Texas, which is tied for eighth in the American League...walked a career-high tying four batters a no decision in the A's 7-3 win over Cincinnati *June 25* in Oakland...it was his first four-walk game in over a year (June 13, 2012 at Colorado.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-5 win over St. Louis last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying three home runs (last: June 13, 2012 at Colorado...allowed three runs in the first on a two-run home run by Beltran and a solo shot by Craig...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first, but he allowed two runs, one earned, in the third...Carpenter led off the winning with a home run and Beltran scored on a Lowrie error on a Holliday ground ball...the A's then scored twice in the third and fourth for the win.

MILONE vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 2-1 with a 1.29 ERA (21.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 10 so) in three career starts...including a win in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's victory in Oakland May 18...allowed his only run in the first inning when Gordon doubled with two outs and scored on a Butler single...loaded the bases with no outs in the second but then retired each of the next three batters and 14 of the final 17...made two starts last year...the win came on April 9 in Oakland when he combined with Grant Balfour on a three-hit, 1-0 shutout in his A's debut...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...all three hits were doubles but no one advanced past second base...then took the loss in a 2-0 loss at Kansas City June 3...allowed a leadoff home run to Hosmer in the second inning and a RBI single to Giavotella in the fifth...Mazzaro, Herrera, Holland and Broxton combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (6-6, 4.11 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18<sup>th</sup> start of the season...is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA over his last seven starts, which matches the longest winning streak of his career...has a streak of seven consecutive starts with five hits or fewer and two walks or fewer, which is tied for the longest by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916 (Alan Wirth, May 6-Sept. 15, 1978)...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-1 A's loss to St. Louis last Saturday in Oakland (3.2 ip, 2 h, 3 so)...left early with tightness in his right hamstring...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in two career starts against Kansas City...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's win in Oakland May 17 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so).

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

The A's bullpen allowed one run or fewer in six of its seven games on the past homestand (8 er in 21.0 ip, 3.43 ERA) after yielding two or more runs in five of seven games on the previous road trip (18.2 ip, 7.23 ERA)...now has a 3.21 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has issued the fewest walks (73) in the AL and has the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.294)...first batters faced are 47 for 221 (.213) with 10 walks and two hit by pitches (.250 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors.

- Is a perfect 21 for 21 in save opportunities and is the only Major League closer without a blown save...his streak of 21 consecutive saves to start the season is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...is tied for fifth in the American League in saves.
- Has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 39 save chances, which is the longest active streak in the majors and one behind Dennis Eckersley for the longest streak in Oakland history (see chart)...since 1999, the only AL closer with a longer streak is Jose Valverde (51, Sept. 4, 2010-Sept. 28, 2011).

Oakland record for consecutive starts with a win...is now 8-1 with a 1.50 ERA (11 er in 66.0 ip) and two home runs allowed over his last nine starts after going 3-2 with a 4.56 ERA and seven home runs over his first eight starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Leads the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.11), is tied for second in wins (11), complete games (2) and shutouts (2), tied for third in ERA (2.78) and opponents grounded into double plays (15), tied for fourth in winning percentage (.786), ranks fifth in home runs per nine innings (0.71), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.366) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.36) and ninthin opponents on-base percentage (.282)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning (13.8) and fourth fewest pitches per game (91.8)...has the second highest run support (6.83).

**11-GAME WINNER:** Picked up his 11<sup>th</sup> win of the season June 28 to become the second Oakland pitcher since 1991 to win 11 games before the end of June (Mark Mulder, 2003)...the 11 wins surpass his season total of last year (10) and are his most since 2005 when he went 21-8 for the Angels and won the Cy Young Award...the 11 wins match his personal best before the All-Star Break (11-5 in 2005)...since 1991, the only Oakland pitcher with more wins before the break is Mark Mulder, who had 12 in both 2003 and 2004.

AS A 40-YEAR OLD: His 11 wins are tied with Tom Candiotti (1998) for second most by a 40-year old in Oakland history...the record is 13 by Don Sutton in 1985...is the first Major Leaguer to win 11 games since Jamie Moyer (12) and Tim Wakefield (11) in 2009...won each of his first seven starts after turning 40 on May 24...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher in Major League history to win at least each of his first six starts in his forties...has a 2.78 ERA...since 1952, the only American Leaguer to post an ERA under 3.00 is Nolan Ryan (2.91 in 1991)...has two shutouts, which are the most in a season by an Athletics pitcher since Jack Quinn had four for the Philadelphia A's in 1928...the last AL pitcher with two shutouts is Dennis Martinez (2 in 1995)...the last A's pitcher with two complete games is Tom Candiotti in 1998 (3)...ages are based on a players age as of June 30<sup>th</sup>.

NIGHT AND DAY: Lost for the first time at night this year in his last start, snapping an 11-game winning streak in night games dating back to July 28 of last year...had a 1.55 ERA over that 13-start stretch...it was his first loss at night since July 17, 2012 against Texas...is now 7-1 with a 2.15 ERA (17 er in 71.0 ip) and .230 (59 for 257) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 3.83 ERA (18 er in 42.1 ip) and .308 (52 for 169) opponents average in seven starts during the day...leads the American League in night ERA...in two seasons with the A's, he is 16-6 with a 2.58 ERA (50 er in 174.1 ip) in 26 starts at night compared to 5-6 with a 4.24 ERA (43 er in 91.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is 2-1 with a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) in three interleague starts this year...the ERA is sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with three or more interleague starts...is now 20-14 with a 3.84 ERA (114 er in 267.0 ip) in 42 career interleague appearances, all starts.

**WITH THE BAT:** Went 0 for 3 at Milwaukee June 5 in his only at bats this year...is now 0 for his last 14...his last hit was on June 10, 2005 at New York (NL) while pitching for the Angels...is a .108 (10 for 93) career hitter with five RBI, no walks, a hit by pitch, 55 strikeouts, six sacrifice hits and one sacrifice fly.

**WILD PITCH:** Was charged with his first wild pitch since May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL) in his last start...it snapped a streak of 443.0 innings without a wild pitch...it was his first wild pitch in 40 starts with the A's, which was the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 42 by Catfish Hunter (June 25, 1972-June 27, 1973).

**ACTIVE LEADERS:** Tossed seven innings in his last start to go over the 2500 mark in his career...is the 242<sup>nd</sup> pitcher in Major League history to reach 2500 innings (source: Stats, Inc.)...ranks third among active pitchers in complete games (34), fifth in wins (182), sixth in games started (392) and shutouts (11), seventh in strikeouts (1894) and eighth in innings pitched (2506.2).

**IN JUNE:** Went 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June to win American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the fourth time in his career...led the AL in ERA and tied for second in wins...it marked the third time in his career he won five games in a month (August 1999 and August 2005)...it was the fourth lowest single month ERA of his career (1.13 in May 2002, 1.39 in June 1998 and 1.72 in August 2005)...since 2006, the only other Oakland pitcher to win five games in a month is Gio Gonzalez (Sept., 2011).

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to the Cubs last Wednesday in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the second time this year and ninth time in his career...allowed a RBI single to Soriano in the first and a solo home run to Valbuena in the second...Garza held the A's to a run on four hits and three walks in eight innings.

**COLÓN vs. PITTSBURGH:** Is 2-1 with a 1.50 ERA (30.0 ip, 22 h, 5 r, 5 er, 10 bb, 21 so, 3 hr) in four career starts...is 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA (2 er in 15.0 ip) in two starts in his home ballparks and 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 15.0 ip) in two starts in Pittsburgh...was the losing pitcher in his only career start at PNC Park, a 5-2 decision with the Angels on June 17, 2004...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed solo home runs to Redman and Wilson in the seventh...had a no decision in his last start against the Pirates, a 4-3 Angels win in 10 innings at Anaheim June 24, 2007...had a 2-0 lead when he walked LaRoche with the bases loaded in the fifth...also allowed a Wilson RBI single in the sixth and left after six innings with a 3-2 lead...the Pirates tied the game in the ninth.

- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.

#### JOSH DONALDSON

- Had his first career game-ending RBI April 12 against Detroit, a home run in the bottom of the 12th inning
- Was a perfect 4 for 4 April 27 against Baltimore, matching his career high in hits (August 17, 2012 vs. Cleveland)...also had four-hit games May 14 against Texas and May 25 at Houston.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of April 22-28...it was his first career
  weekly honor...went 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles (.864 slugging percentage), 10
  RBI and seven walks (1 sf, .633 on-base percentage) in seven games.
- Had a career-high seven-game hitting streak from May 11-18 (12 for 26, .462).
- Made his Major League debut at shortstop in the ninth inning May 24 at Houston...had one appearance at shortstop in the minors with Triple-A Sacramento on Aug. 2, 2012.
- Hit his first career grand slam in the sixth inning June 7 at Chicago, turning a 3-0 deficit into a 4-3 win.

#### **SEAN DOOLITTLE**

Had a career-high tying 13.1-inning scoreless streak from April 29 to May 27.

#### **NATE FREIMAN**

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 3 against Seattle and had a RBI single
  off Joe Saunders in the second inning for his first ML hit...added another single in the fourth inning
  for his first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run April 22 against Houston, a three-run shot off Erik Bedard in the first inning...it snapped a 0 for 11 streak.
- Was named American League Rookie of the Month for May after batting .351 with three doubles, one home run and nine RBI in 14 games.
- Had his second career three-hit game June 11 and both have come against the Yankees in games started by Sabathia (also May 3).
- Had his first career "walk-off" hit June 13 against New York, a RBI single in the 18th inning off Rivera.

- Hit his first career pinch hit home run April 9 at Los Angeles, a three-run shot off Jepsen in the seventh to give the A's a 7-5 lead.
- Played first base May 24 at Houston, his second career appearance at first base (Aug. 25, 2010 at Los Angeles-AL).
- Had a career-high 17-game reaching base streak from May 21 to June 18...hit .345 with a .456 onbase percentage during the streak, which included a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25-June 13 (14 for 38, .368).

#### **JED LOWRIE**

- Had a career-high tying four RBI April 15 against Houston (fourth time, last: September 19, 2011 vs. Baltimore).
- Went 4 for 4 April 19 at Tampa, the third four-hit game of his career...added his fourth June 1 agaisnt Chicago (AL).
- Went 2 for 9 in the 19-inning game April 29 against Los Angeles to tie the Oakland record for at bats in a game (11th time, last: Mike Heath at Texas, July 1, 1979).
- Set an Oakland record for hits in the month of April with 34...broke the previous mark of 33 held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...had 11 doubles, which tied the Oakland April record (Mark Ellis, 2003).
- Went a career-high 11 consecutive games without a RBI from June 4 to 15.
- Homered June 21 at Seattle to snap a career-high 62-game homerless streak.

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Matched his career high with five RBI April 10 at Los Angeles (also September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) after driving in four runs the night before.
- Had a career-high four strikeouts April 12 against Detroit...matched that figure April 29 against Los Angeles and May 12 at Seattle.
- Was on the paternity list from April 16 to 18 for the birth of his second son, Brody. (April 16).
- Went 0 for 4 April 21 at Tampa Bay to snap a 15-game road hitting streak dating back to Sept. 20, 2012...hit .463 (25 for 54) during the streak.
- Hit the game-ending home run in the bottom of the 19th inning April 29 against Los Angeles, his third career walk-off home run (last: September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) and fifth career game-ending hit (also a double and single)...also homered in the sixth inning, his second career multi-homer game (June 12, 2012 at Colorado)...had 12 innings between home runs to become the 17th player in Major League history to go at least 12 innings between home runs in one game...is the second Athletic to do it...Reggie Jackson also went 12 innings between home runs June 11, 1969...had four strikeouts to become the second Major Leaguer since 1916 to have at least two home runs and four strikeouts in one game...Evan Longoria did it August 4, 2009 for Tampa Bay against Boston.
- Made his first career appearance in center field May 9 (also May 13).
- Hit the 7000th home run in Oakland history May 13 against Texas off Justin Grimm in the third inning...hit the 12,000th home run in Athletics franchise history June 5 at Milwaukee, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning.

- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his
  career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the
  sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)...
  the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

#### PAT NESHEK

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
  going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
  Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
  1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).
- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

#### SHANE PETERSON

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

#### JOSH REDDICK

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career
  stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases
  during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento
  (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).
- Snapped a career-high 30-game homerless streak with a solo shot in the seventh inning off Quintana June 6 at Chicago (AL).
- · Had his third career four-hit game June 16 against Seattle.

#### CHRIS RESOP

 Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

#### FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

#### ADAM ROSALES

• Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).

#### **SCOTT SIZEMORE**

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with
  a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3...
  according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back
  games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

#### **SETH SMITH**

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.

#### **STEPHEN VOGT**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St.
  Louis off Joe Kelly...the hitless streak was the second longest career-opening hitless streak by a
  non-pitcher since 1973 (Chris Carter, OAK; 33 in 2010).

#### **CHRIS YOUNG**

 Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.

- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).
- His sixth inning double April 11 at Los Angeles was the 200th of his career.
- Had his 11th career regular season multi-homer game April 24 at Boston (also has one in the post-season).
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 30 to May 17 with a strained left quad...it was his second
  career stint on the DL...made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento May 16 and went 1
  for 1 with two walks, a run and a stolen base in a start in center field against Oklahoma City.
- Had back-to-back three-hit games for the second time in his career May 24 and 25 at Houston (Aug. 16-17, 2007).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts June 26 against Cincinnati...it was the fifth four-strikeout game of his career, but his first since May 20, 2009 at Florida.
