A's vs. ROYALS

The A's lead the season series, 4-0...won their first game in Kansas City last night after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 17-19...have now won the season series four times in the last five years...are 25-14 against Kansas City since 2009...all-time, the A's are 304-248 against the Royals...that breaks down to 168-109 in Oakland and 136-139 in Kansas City...including 116-123 at Kauffman Stadium.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is a perfect 22 for 22 in save opportunities and is the only Major League closer without a blown save...has now converted each of his last 40 save chances, which is the longest active streak in the majors and tied with Dennis Eckersley for the longest streak in Oakland history...Eckersley saved 40 in a row from Sept. 15, 1991-Aug. 7, 1992.

Josh Donaldson is batting .350 (21 for 60) with five home runs and 13 RBI over his last 17 games...ranks second among American League third baseman in RBI (55) and walks (36), third in doubles (22) and fourth in batting (.313) and home runs (14)...has 99 hits and needs one more to become the 14th player in Oakland history with 100 hits before the All-Star Break...the last is Miguel Tejada in 2002 (106).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1990 the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians, 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in 2001 Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in 2009 Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven of the last nine games to improve to a season-high 15 games over .500...are 51-36, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...this is the ninth time in Oakland history the A's won their 50th game in the 86th game or earlier (1971, 1972, 1975, 1981, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992)...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day, ½ game ahead of Texas...have spent 29 days in sole possession of first this year and six days tied for first...the 35 days with at least a share of first are the A's most since 2006 when they had 126...have also spent 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 108-62 (.635) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Cincinnati, 103-68)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 over the next 21 contests (tied for the worst in the majors from April 19 to May 10), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 7-2 since June 25...have swept nine series this year after tallying just 11 sweeps all last year.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have clinched a winning record before the All-Star Break for the first time since 2008 (51-44)...this marks the 14th time in Oakland history the A's have won 50 games before the break, the second time in the last 10 years (51 in 2008)...the pitching staff is averaging 2.40 walks per nine innings, which is the best pre-break mark in Oakland history (2.47 in 1972) and second best in Athletics history (2.36 in 1944).

PITCHING: The A's have posted a 3.11 ERA (28 er in 81.0 ip) and .236 (71 for 301) opponents batting average over the past nine games...now have a 3.73 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.296) and have issued the fewest walks (210)...also rank second in opponents batting average (.244) and fourth in slugging percentage (.390)...tossed a two-hit shutout Thursday afternoon, their second two-hit shutout in the last eight games (June 26 vs. Cincinnati)...it was the seventh shutout of the season, their second 1-0 shutout.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 23-7 with a 3.09 ERA (101 er in 294.1 ip) and .227 (247 for 1089) opponents batting average over the last 45 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over the first 42 contests...are 37-28 with a 3.99 ERA (237 er in 534.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in innings pitched, are tied for the lead in complete game shutouts (3), tied for second in complete games (3), rank third in wins and sixth in ERA.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 35-18 (.660) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Pittsburgh, 32-20)...are 16-18 (.471) during the day, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.54 ERA (189 er in 480.2 ip) at night, which is the second lowest mark in the AL...are batting .253 (465 for 1838) with 277 runs scored in night games (5.23 per game) compared to .240 (275 for 1145) with 127 runs during the day (3.74 per game).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game road trip to Kansas City (1-0) and Pittsburgh (three games) tonight...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Texas (1-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 23-22 (.511) on the road...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (2-1) and the Cubs (2-1) and have won 18 of the last 22 home games...are 28-14 (.667) at home for the season, which is the best mark in the American League and second best in the majors (Atlanta, 29-13).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .260 (147 for 566) with 86 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.06 per game) after hitting .217 with 37 runs over the previous 11 contests (3.36 per game)...for the season, the A's lead the majors in walks (327)...are tied for third in the AL in hit by pitches (28), are fourth in doubles (164) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (266)...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (104)...are tied for the AL lead in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), rank second in doubles (6), tied for third in walks (9) and fourth in RBI (68)...A's pinch hitters are batting .118 (9 for 76), which is the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (88), rank second in walks (11), tied for second in home runs (2) and tied for third in RBI (9).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have a 16-10 (.615) record in one-run games for the season...rank second in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...won a 1-0 game without an RBI Thursday afternoon for the ninth time in Oakland history...it was the first time the only run scored on a passed ball...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last team to win a 1-0 game on a passed ball was the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 4, 1993 against Montreal...are 12-5 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins...have five "walk-off" wins.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have turned 63 double plays, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...have sent 10 men to the plate 18 times this year...did that just 22 times last year...are 43-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of three AL teams that has not lost in that situation (Texas and Toronto)...including yesterday, the A's have gone 58 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL, their longest stretch since May 28-Aug. 30, 2005 (94 days).

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 10-12 against the West since May 10 while going 23-6 against everyone else...are batting .268 (360 for 1345) with 212 runs (38 games, 5.58 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .232 (380 for 1638) with 194 runs (49 games, 3.96 runs per game) against the rest of baseball.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The A's won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and finished with a winning record each month...now have seven consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...the A's had the lowest opponents batting average (.235) and onbase percentage (.285) in the American League in June, ranked third in ERA (3.43) and opponents slugging (.368) and tied for third in winning percentage (.593)...the offense ranked third in home runs (33).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season...the A's are 9-8 (.529) in his starting assignments this year and 26-20 (.565) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 11 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (11 er in 46.0 ip) over his last seven starts...the winning streak matches his career high from Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of the seven starts for a .174 (27 for 155) opponents batting average...has allowed two walks or fewer in all seven starts and his streak of seven consecutive starts with five hits or fewer and two walks or fewer is tied for the longest by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916 (Alan Wirth, May 6-Sept. 15. 1978).

LAST 10, FIRST SEVEN: Is 5-1 with a 2.44 ERA (18 er in 66.1 ip) and .179 (40 for 224) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .164 (21 for 128) average over his last 10 starts after surrendering a .397 mark over his first seven starts.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of June...had the lowest opponents batting average in the American League in June and ranked third in ERA...was 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA and .216 opponents average in five starts in May...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on six days rest today...is 1-3 with a 3.18 ERA (16 er in 45.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-3 with a 4.88 ERA (30 er in 55.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 3.67 ERA (20 er in 49.0 ip) and 11 home runs allowed in eight starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 4.53 ERA (26 er in 51.2 ip) and four home runs allowed in nine starts in Oakland...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in nine of the 11 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision (16 rs in 61.0 ip, 2.36 RSA)...has four runs of support or more in five of his six wips

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 15 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...11 of the 15 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for second in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have grounded into 13 double plays, which is tied for seventh most in the American League...yielded a .375 average with runners in scoring position over his first five starts but opponents are 6 for 43 (.140) in 11 starts since then...has a .224 (15 for 67) opponents average with RISP overall, which ranks eighth in the American League...has allowed a .326 (28 for 86) opponents batting average to the first two hitters in the order compared to .219 (62 for 283) against the three through nine hitters.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles April 9...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit April 14 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 10-2 loss to Baltimore April 25...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles April 30 in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...surrendered a career-high four home runs...had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two...combined with Blevins, Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Chicago June 2 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 18-inning win over New York June 13 in Oakland...matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings (fifth time, third time against New York).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-1 loss to St. Louis a week ago today in Oakland...left the game after 3.2 innings with tightness in his right hamstring...retired each of the first eight batters before Descalso singled with two outs in the third...was removed from the game after allowing a two-out double to Craig in the fourth.

PARKER vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (11.2 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 0 hr) in two career starts...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's win in Oakland May 17...allowed just one run in 7.0 innings...Perez double with one out in the third inning and scored one out later on a Lough RBI double...Shields shut out the A's on four hits over the first six innings before Donaldson tied the game with a solo home run in the seventh...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth and Rosales homered in the bottom of the inning for the win...the loss came in a 5-0 loss at Kansas City last year on August 14...blanked the Royals on two hits over the first four innings but then allowed five runs in the fifth inning...Hosmer had a RBI single, Getz a sacrifice fly and Gordon a RBI single...a Weeks error allowed another run to score and Butler added a sacrifice fly to complete the scoring...Guthrie, Collins and Holland combined to shutout the A's on three hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (6-6, 3.95 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season...allowed seven runs in 5.2 innings in his first start in July last Tuesday...has seen his ERA decrease each month...went 2-2 with a 4.65 ERA in five starts in April, 3-2 with a 3.55 ERA in six starts in May and 1-2 with a 2.60 ERA in five starts in June...had the seventh lowest June ERA in the American League and also ranked third with a .190 opponents batting average...ranks eighth in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.281)...is 4-1 with a 3.26 ERA (16 er in 44.0 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 2-5 with a 4.41 ERA (32 er in 65.1 ip) in 10 starts against everyone else...had a no decision in his only career start against Kansas City, a 4-3 A's win in Oakland earlier this year on May 19...allowed single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings, the only runs he would allow in six innings.

The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in seven of the past eight games (8 er in 21.2 ip, 3.32 ERA) after yielding two or more runs in five of the previous seven games (18.2 ip, 7.23 ERA)...now has a 3.20 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has issued the fewest walks (73) in the AL and is tied for the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.294)...first batters faced are 48 for 222 (.216) with 10 walks and two hit by pitches (.253 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors.

- Is a perfect 22 for 22 in save opportunities and is the only Major League closer without a blown save...his streak of 22 consecutive saves to start the season is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...is tied for fourth in the American League in saves.
- Has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore and has now converted each of his last 40 save chances, which is the longest active streak in the majors and tied with Dennis Eckersley for the longest streak in Oakland history (see chart)...since 1999, the only AL closer with a longer streak is Jose Valverde (51, Sept. 4, 2010-Sept. 28, 2011).

- Has allowed seven runs in his last nine games (8.0 ip, 7.88 ERA) after posting a 1.61 ERA over his first 29 contests.
- Is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (5)...the five wins match his career high (also 2012).
- His opponents have a .227 batting average...that includes .197 (15 for 76) against right-handers compared to .268 (15 for 56) against lefties.
