THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1971, after 19 scoreless innings, Angel Mangual delivers a RBI single in the bottom of the 20th inning as the A's defeat the 20th inning as the A's defeat the Angels 1-0...Vida Blue strikes out a club record (extra innings) 17 batters in 11 innings of work, Rollie Fingers adds seven in seven innings of relief and the A's pitching staff finishes with a club record 26 strikeouts in the five hour and five minute game that hour and five minute game that finishes at 1:08 a.m.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won nine of the last 12 games to improve to a season high 16 games over .500 at 53-37...that is the second best record in the American League, fourth best in the majors and tied for sixth best in Oakland history after 90 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 57-33 (won game 91)...have won four straight series for the second time this year (May 17-28)...since 2008, the only time the A's have won more than four straight series was last year from Aug. 17 to Sept. 2 when they won five straight...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day, ½ game ahead of Texas...the A's and Rangers have been separated by ½ game or fewer for 14 consecutive days...have spent 32 days in sole possession of first this year and six days tied for first...the 38 days with at least a share of first are the A's most since 2006 when they had 126...have also spent 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 110-63 (.636) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark** in the majors over that span (Atlanta and Cincinnati, 104-70)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 9-3 since June 25 (fourth best in the majors)...have swept nine series this year after tallying just 11 sweeps all last

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have the fourth best interleague record in the majors at 12-4 (Tampa Bay, 9-1) New York-NL, 8-2; Boston, 7-2)...have clinched a winning record against the National League for the second consecutive year and 10th time in 17 seasons...the only time the A's have won more than 12 interleague games was in 2002 when they went 16-2...are 166-134 (.553) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best...rank seventh this year with a 2.94 ERA (47 er in 143.2 ip)...the A's offense is second in walks (61) and runs (78), and tied for seventh in home runs (17)...after this series with the Pirates, the A's conclude interleague play with a two-game series at Cincinnati Aug. 6-7.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2 for 17 (.118) with two runs, one RBI, one walk and eight strikeouts after going a combined 2 for 54 over the previous three seasons...now have a .086 (26 for 304) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, nine walks and 138 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (Detroit, .094)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have clinched a winning record before the All-Star Break for the first time since 2008 (51-44)...the 53 wins are second most by an A's team over the last 25 years (54 in 2003)...the pitching staff is averaging 2.43 walks per nine innings, which is the best pre-break mark in Oakland history (2.47 in 1972) and second best in Athletics history (2.36 in 1944).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 36-18 (.667) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Detroit, 31-19)...are 17-19 (.472) during the day, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.49 ERA (190 er in 489.2 ip) at night, which is the lowest mark in the AL...are batting .251 (468 for 1866) with 279 runs scored in night games (5.17 per game) compared to .244 (298 for 1219) with 140 runs during the day (3.89 per game).

PITCHING: The A's have posted a 2.94 ERA (35 er in 107.0 ip) over the past 12 games and now have an American League leading 3.69 ERA for the season...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.296) and have issued the fewest walks (220)...rank second in opponents batting average (.244) and third in slugging percentage (.388).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last 11 games and are 7-1 with a 2.71 ERA (22 er in 73.0 ip) over that span...are 25-7 with a 3.05 ERA (106 er in 312.2 ip) and .227 (264 for 1163) opponents batting average over the last 48 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over the first 42 contests...are 39-28 with a 3.94 ERA (242 er in 553.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League in innings pitched, are tied for the lead in complete game shutouts (3), tied for second in wins and complete games (3) and rank fourth in ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's were held to a season-low tying three hits last night for the seventh time this year, the first time since April 26...have scored two runs or fewer in four of the last nine games but have won two of those four games...the A's lead the majors in walks (336) and rank fourth in the American League in doubles (169)...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (106)...are tied for the AL lead in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), rank second in doubles (6), third in walks (10) and fourth in RBI (69)...A's pinch hitters are batting .115 (9 for 78), which is the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (90), rank second in walks (11), tied for third in home runs (2) and fourth in RBI (9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Pittsburgh (1-0)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Texas (1-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 25-23 (.521) on the road, which is the fourth best road record in the American League...return home following the game tomorrow for a three-game series with Boston before the All-Star Break...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (2-1) and the Cubs (2-1) and have won 18 of the last 22 home games...are 28-14 (.667) at home for the season, which is the best mark in the AL and second best in the majors.

ALL-STAR: Bartolo Colón was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team Saturday...it is his third career All-Star selection (1998, 2005)...he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history (Eckersley, 37 in 1992).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 17-11 (.607) in one-run games...rank second in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...have five "walk-off" wins.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have turned 64 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 65)...have sent 10 men to the plate 19 times this year...did that just 22 times last year...including yesterday, the A's have gone 61 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL, their longest stretch since May 28-Aug. 30, 2005 (94 days).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season, his second since he was recalled from Sacramento last Thursday...the A's are 9-4 (.692) in his starting assignments this year and are 14-6 (.700) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in seven of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer eight times.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 3.02 ERA (16 er in 47.2 ip) and .206 (36 for 175) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the winning streak is a career high and the longest by an American League rookie this year...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in wins (5) and third in strikeouts (59), innings pitched (73.2) and games started (13).

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento last Thursday for his fourth stint with the A's this year and tossed 7.0 shutout innings that day against the Cubs for the win...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento June 23 as the A's had three days off over an eight-day stretch.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made two career interleague starts, both this year...is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) and .119 (5 for 42) opponents batting average.

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .191 (21 for 110) batting average the first time through the lineup, .234 (25 for 107) the second time and .271 (16 for 59) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is fourth lowest among American League pitchers with 70 or more innings...has allowed a .197 (14 for 71) batting average to hitters leading off an inning, which is ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 70 or more innings...opponents are batting .339 (19 for 56) with runners in scoring position, including .440 (11 for 25) with RISP and two outs...has allowed three home runs in his last three starts, snapping a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has issued 16 of his 23 walks to left-handed hitters...has allowed a .343 (12 for 35) batting average to the opponents number three hitter but the cleanup hitter is batting just .147 (5 for 34).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 5.60 ERA (28 er in 45.0 ip) and .246 (43 for 175) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .188 (19 for 101) opponents average in five starts during the day...has allowed all six of his home runs at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-0 with a 2.91 ERA (14 er in 43.1 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-2 with a 6.82 ERA (23 er in 30.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-0 with a 2.48 ERA (19 er in 69.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-3 with a 7.16 ERA (35 er in 44.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory at Houston *April* 5...struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in 6.2 innings (sixth time, last: Tim Hudson, Sept. 10, 1999 at Tampa Bay)...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings in a no decision in the A's 10-8, 19-inning win over Los Angeles *April* 29 in Oakland ...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at New York *May* 5...left a 4-1 lead in the sixth inning but Blevins allowed two inherited runners to score plus one of his own for the blown save...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings in a 6-3 loss at Seattle *May* 10...combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Texas *May* 21...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...did not walk a batter to become just the second visiting pitcher at Rangers Ballpark to toss seven or more innings and allow two or fewer baserunners (Erik Bedard, July 7, 2007)...won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over San Francisco *May* 27...blanked the Giants on three hits over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Chicago *June* 1 in Oakland...left with a 3-1 lead but Doolittle allowed two runs for the blown save...matched his career-high typing eight hits in 4.2 innings in a no decision at Texas *June* 17...tossed a career-low 3.1 innings in a no decision at Seattle June 22

LAST START: He combined with Cook and Balfour on a two-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over the Cubs last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed one of the hits...retired nine of the first 10 batters before walking Castro to start the fourth...he went to second on a ground out and Soriano then singled to left...Castro was thrown out at the plate by Céspedes and Soriano was caught stealing...Straily then retired nine of the final 10 batters...the A's scored the winning run in the bottom of the seventh when Norris scored on a passed ball.

STRAILY vs. PITTSBURGH: Has never faced the Pirates in his career.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Is 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA in four starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .211 opponents batting average, including .143 (5 for 35) by left-handed hitters compared to .250 (15 for

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (8-7, 4.11 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...is 2-2 with a 5.23 ERA and .262 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is 3-0 despite a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.2 ip) in four interleague starts this year...is tied for the Major League lead in interleague wins...is 2 for 7 (.286) with two runs, one RBI, one strikeout and a grounded into double play as a hitter this year and 4 for 18 (.222) with a home run and six RBI in his career...has allowed a .187 batting average with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the American League...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 win at Kansas City last Friday (8.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...has never faced the Pirates in his career.

The A's bullpen is 1-1 with six saves, one blown save, a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) and .236 (17 for 72) opponents batting average over the past eight games...was 1-5 with one save, three blown saves, a 6.75 ERA and .309 opponents average in its previous 10 games...now has a 3.17 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has issued the fewest walks (78) in the AL and is tied for the second lowest opponents on-base percentage (.296)...has recorded the fewest strikeouts (218) and is tied for the second fewest losses (9)...first batters faced are 50 for 228 (.219) with 11 walks and two hit by pitches (.258 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors.

Is a perfect 23 for 23 in save opportunities and is the only Major League closer without a blown save...his streak of 23 consecutive saves to start the season is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...ranks fourth in the American League in saves.

Has now converted each of his last 41 save chances, which is a new **Oakland record** (see chart) and the longest active streak in the majors...since 1999, the only AL closer with a longer streak is Jose
