THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1932** Jimmie Foxx ties the American League record for most total bases in a game with 16...he hits three home runs and adds a double and two singles in the A's 18-17, 18 inning win at Cleveland...in **1990** five Oakland A's play in the All-Star Game at Wrigley Field...Bob Welch starts the game and pitches two innings and Dennis Eckersley pitches a scoreless ninth to save the American League's 2-0 victory.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last six games, seven of the last nine and 10 of the last 13 games to improve to a season-high 17 games over .500 at 54-37...that is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...have now won five straight series, the first time they have won five or more straight series since Aug. 17-Sept. 2, 2008 when they also won five straight...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day, ½ game ahead of Texas...the A's and Rangers have been separated by ½ game or fewer for 15 consecutive days...have spent 33 days in sole possession of first this year and six days tied for first...the 39 days with at least a share of first are the A's most since 2006 when they had 126...have also spent 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 111-63 (.638) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Atlanta, 105-70)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 10-3 since June 25 (tied for third best in the majors)...have swept nine series this year after tallying just 11 sweeps all last year.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have the fourth best interleague record in the majors at 13-4 (Tampa Bay, 9-1; New York-NL, 8-2; Boston, 7-2)...have clinched a winning record against the National League for the second consecutive year and 10th time in 17 seasons...the only time the A's have won more than 13 interleague games was in 2002 when they went 16-2...are 167-134 (.555) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best...rank sixth this year with a 2.83 ERA (48 er in 152.2 ip)...the A's offense ranks first in walks (64), tied for second in runs (80) and is seventh in home runs (18)...after this series with the Pirates, the A's conclude interleague play with a two-game series at Cincinnati Aug. 6-7.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 2 for 18 (.111) with two runs, one RBI, two walks and nine strikeouts after going a combined 2 for 54 over the previous three seasons...now have a .085 (26 for 305) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 139 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (Detroit, .094)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on August 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on September 4, 1972 against California.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's have clinched a winning record before the All-Star Break for the first time since 2008 (51-44)...the 54 wins match the most by an A's team over the last 25 years (also 2003)...the pitching staff is averaging 2.44 walks per nine innings, which is the best pre-break mark in Oakland history (2.47 in 1972) and second best in Athletics history (2.36 in 1944).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 37-18 (.673) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Texas, 39-25)...are 17-19 (.472) during the day, which is the fourth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.45 ERA (191 er in 498.2 ip) at night, which is the lowest mark in the AL...are batting .249 (473 for 1896) with 281 runs scored in night games (5.11 per game) compared to .244 (298 for 1219) with 140 runs during the day (3.89 per game).

PITCHING: The A's have posted a 2.79 ERA (36 er in 116.0 ip) over the past 13 games and now have an American League leading 3.66 ERA for the season...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.295) and have issued the fewest walks (223)...rank second in opponents batting average (.243) and third in slugging percentage (.387).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in eight of the last 12 games and are 8-1 with a 2.61 ERA (23 er in 79.1 ip) over that span...are 26-7 with a 3.02 ERA (107 er in 319.0 ip) and .227 (264 for 1163) opponents batting average over the last 49 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents batting average over the first 42 contests...are 40-28 with a 3.91 ERA (243 er in 559.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in innings pitched, are tied for the lead in complete game shutouts (3), are second in wins, tied for third in complete games (3) and rank fourth in ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored two runs or fewer in five of the last 10 games but have won three of those five games...including each of the past two games...lead the majors in walks (339) and rank fourth in the American League in doubles (170)...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (107)...are tied for the AL lead in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), rank second in doubles (6), third in walks (10) and fourth in RBI (69)...A's pinch hitters are batting .114 (9 for 79), which is the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (91), rank second in walks (11), tied for third in home runs (2) and fourth in RBI (9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this six-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Pittsburgh (2-0)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to Texas (1-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 26-23 (.531) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...return home following the game tonight for a three-game series with Boston before the All-Star Break...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (2-1) and the Cubs (2-1) and have won 18 of the last 22 home games...are 28-14 (.667) at home for the season, which is the best mark in the AL and second best in the majors.

ALL-STAR: Bartolo Colón was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team Saturday...it is his third career All-Star selection (1998, 2005)...he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history (Dennis Eckersley, 37 in 1992)...Yoenis Céspedes was named to the AL team for the Home Run Derby yesterday...he will be the first Athletic to compete in the Derby since 2001 (Jason Giambi).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-11 (.621) in one-run games...are tied for the American League lead in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have five "walk-off" wins.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have turned 65 double plays, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...have sent 10 men to the plate 19 times this year...did that just 22 times last year...including yesterday, the A's have gone 62 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL, their longest stretch since May 28-Aug. 30, 2005 (94 days).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...the A's are 10-8 (.556) in his starting assignments this year and 30-19 (.612) in his career...his teams are 35-19 (.648) in his 54 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in 13 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

BRIEFLY: Is 2-2 with a 5.23 ERA (18 er in 31.0 ip) and .262 (32 for 122) opponents batting average over his last five starts...went 3-0 with a 3.86 over his first three starts, 0-5 with a 3.62 ERA over his next five and 3-0 with a 3.66 ERA over his next five after that...the five-game losing streak was the longest of his career...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to last year...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 3-0 despite a 5.16 ERA (13 er in 22.2 ip) in four interleague starts this year...is tied for the Major League lead in interleague wins...is now 4-0 with a 5.75 ERA (26 er in 40.2 ip) in seven career interleague starts...has allowed 12 home runs in 40.2 career interleague innings.

WITH THE BAT: Is 2 for 7 (.286) with two runs, one RBI, one strikeout and a grounded into double play as a hitter...including 2 for 4 with two runs and a RBI June 3 at Milwaukee...is one of two A's pitchers with two hits in a game since the start of interleague play (Edgar Gonzalez, June 19, 2009 at San Diego)...is also one of two A's pitchers to score two runs in an interleague game (Mark Mulder, July 4, 2004 at San Francisco)...is the first A's pitcher with at least two hits and a RBI since Blue Moon Odom went 2 for 2 with a RBI on Aug. 22, 1972 at Detroit...no A's pitcher has collected more than two hits in a season in the designated hitter era (since 1973)...is 4 for 18 (.222) with a home run, six RBI, four runs scored, three strikeouts and a grounded into double play in his career...had two RBI June 8, 2012 against Arizona to become just the third A's pitcher since interleague play began in 1997 with two RBI in a game (Dan Haren, June 10, 2005 vs. Atlanta; Joe Kennedy, June 12, 2007 vs. Houston)...hit a three-run home run off Dillon Gee on the first pitch of his first big league at bat in the second inning September 3, 2011 against New York (NL)...batted .273 with a double and four RBI in his minor league career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .187 (17 for 91) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the American League...opponents are 36 for 114 (.316) with 12 doubles, seven home runs (.605 slugging percentage) and five walks (.345 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is eighth highest in the AL and the batting average is 10th highest...allowed a .319 batting average, .555 slugging percentage and .358 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning last year.

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run in his last start, snapping a streak of eight consecutive starts with a home run (12 home runs total)...has allowed 19 home runs for the season, which is tied for fifth most in the American League...those are the most home runs allowed by an A's pitcher before the All-Star Break since Gil Heredia had 21 in 2001...16 have been hit by right-handers, which is the most in the majors...surrendered a home run to Dunn June 8, his first home run allowed to a left-hander since Sept. 14, 2012 (Chris Davis, BAL)...14 of the 19 home runs have been solo shots...10 have come in the first two innings of a game.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 7-4 with a 3.72 ERA (34 er in 82.1 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in 13 starts at night compared to 1-3 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) and nine home runs allowed in five starts during the day...is tied for fourth in the American League in wins at night...in two seasons with the A's, he is 17-9 with a 3.36 ERA (80 in 214.1 ip) in 34 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 5.12 ERA (51 er in 89.2 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 3.20 ERA (18 er in 50.2 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 4.83 ERA (34 er in 63.1 ip) in 10 starts on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 11-7 with a 2.89 ERA (48 er in 149.1 ip) and .242 (137 for 566) opponents average in 23 starts in Oakland compared to 10-10 with a 4.83 ERA (83 er in 154.2 ip) and .292 (183 for 626) opponents average in 26 starts on the road...has allowed 27 of his 43 home runs with the A's on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received just eight runs of support in his seven losses this year (44.0 ip, 1.64 RSA)...has received just 20 runs of support in his 17 losses in two seasons with the A's (102.2 ip, 1.75 RSA)...has received no support eight times over the last two years and one run of support eight times...the A's have been shut out five times this year, twice in games started by Milone...is 7-1 with three runs of support or more this year and 16-3 in his career.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.50 ERA (18 er in 36.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 6.21 ERA (29 er in 42.0) from the fifth inning on.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts **May 1** against Los Angeles...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks (Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue)...walked three batters in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career **May 12** Seattle and **May 18** against Kansas City...snapped his five-game losing streak in the A's 2-1 win over the Royals...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago **June 8**...walked a career-high tying four batters a no decision in the A's 7-3 win over Cincinnati **June 25** in Oakland...it was his first four-walk game in over a year (June 13, 2012 at Colorado...allowed a career-high tying three home runs but picked up the win in a 7-5 decision against St. Louis **June 30** in Oakland

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win at Kansas City last Friday...it was his eighth win of the season, which is tied for 10th in the American League...shutout the Royals on two hits and no walks over the first eight innings and retired Dyson to start the ninth...then allowed four straight hits, including an Escobar RBI double and a Hosmer RBI single.

MILONE vs. PITTSBURGH: Has never faced the Pirates in his career.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (6-6, 4.04 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...is 4-0 with a 2.24 ERA (13 er in 52.1 ip) over his last eight starts...the winning streak matches his career high from Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of the eight starts for a .179 (32 for 179) opponents batting average...is now 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (20 er in 72.2 ip) and .181 (45 for 248) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...opponents are 0 for 10 with runners in scoring position over his last three starts...has allowed a .203 (15 for 74) average with RISP overall, which ranks sixth in the American League...is 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (13.1 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 7 so, 0 hr) in two career starts against Boston, both last year.

The A's bullpen is 1-1 with seven saves, one blown save, a 1.27 ERA (3 er in 21.1 ip) and .222 (18 for 81) opponents batting average over the past nine games...was 1-5 with one save, three blown saves, a 6.75 ERA and .309 opponents average in its previous 10 games...now has a 3.14 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has issued the fewest walks (78) in the AL and is tied for the second lowest opponents on-base percentage (.295)...has recorded the fewest strikeouts (221) and is tied for the second fewest losses (9)...first batters faced are 51 for 231 (.221) with 11 walks and two hit by pitches (.259 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against first batters is the lowest in the majors.

- Is a perfect 24 for 24 in save opportunities and is the only Major League closer without a blown save...his streak of 24 consecutive saves to start the season is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since Dennis Eckersley set the record by converting each of his first 36 saves in 1992...ranks fourth in the American League in saves.
- Has now converted each of his last 42 save chances, which is an ongoing **Oakland record** (see chart) and the longest active streak in the majors...since 1999, the only AL closer with a longer streak is Jose Valverde (51, Sept. 4, 2010-Sept. 28, 2011)...has not blown a save since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore.
- Has not allowed a run in his past six games and 5.2 innings...has not yielded a run in 16 of his past 17 appearances (3 er in 15.1 ip, 1.76 ERA).
- Opponents are 4 for 28 (.143) with runners in scoring position, including 1 for 17 with RISP and two outs.
- Has a 0.71 ERA (2 er in 25.1 ip) in 26 games at night compared to 4.35 (5 er in 10.1 ip) in 11 day games.
- Has a save in three career games against the Pirates (4.1 ip, 1 h, 5 so)...his appearance Monday night was his first against Pittsburgh since June 27, 2008.
- Has 50 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is 11 away from tying Jay Howell for seventh place with 61 saves.
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
