A's vs. RED SOX

The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in Boston in April...have won nine of the last 11 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eight...have a six-game winning streak against Boston in the Coliseum...are 36-31 against the Red Sox since 2006...that includes 23-9 in Oakland, 12-21 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 228-277 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 135-114 in Oakland, 92-162 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 870-1058 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour is the only Major League closer without a blown save as he has converted each of his 24 save opportunities...now has a streak of 42 consecutive saves dating back to last year, which is an Oakland record (previous: 40, Dennis Eckersley).

Josh Donaldson ranks second among American League third basemen in RBI (58) and walks (40), tied for second in doubles (23) and fourth in batting (.313) and home runs (15).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1913 A's starter Carroll "Boardwalk" Brown walks 15 batters in 7 2/3 innings but the A's defeat Detroit 16-9...in 1972 A's catcher and future pitching coach Dave Duncan is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 7-6 loss to Boston...in 1988 Terry Steinbach is named All-Star Game MVP after driving in all the American League's runs with a home run and a sacrifice fly in a 2-1 win.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Were outscored in the three-game series at Pittsburgh 7-4 but took two of three from the Pirates...have won five of the last seven games, seven of the last 10 and 10 of the last 14...are 54-38 overall, which is the second best record in the American League, fourth best in the majors and tied for sixth best in Oakland history after 92 games...it is the best since the 1990 club started the year 58-34...have won five straight series for just the second time since 2008 (also Aug. 17-Sept. 2, 2012)...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day...lead Texas by one game...the A's and Rangers have been separated by one game or fewer for 22 consecutive days...have spent 35 days in sole possession of first this year and six days tied for first...the 41 days with at least a share of first are the A's most since 2006 when they had 126...have also spent 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 111-64 (.634) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Atlanta, 106-71)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 10-4 since June 25 (fifth best in the majors)...have swept nine series this year after tallying just 11 sweeps all last year.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the first time since 2008 (51-44)...the 54 wins match the most by an A's team over the last 38 years (also 1988 and 2003)...have not won more than 54 games before the break since 1975 (55)...currently have a one-game lead in the AL West...over the last 23 years, the only time the A's have been in first place at the All-Star Break was in 2006 when they were tied for first with Texas...have not been in sole possession of first at the break since 1990...the pitching staff is averaging 2.45 walks per nine innings, which is the best pre-break mark in Oakland history (2.47 in 1972) and second best in Athletics history (2.36 in 1944)...has 633 strikeouts, which is two short of the most in Oakland history at the break (635 in 2008)...the offense has struck out 692 times, which is 11 short of the most in Oakland history (703 in 2008)...has 171 doubles, which is third best (185 in 2003, 183 in 2004).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 37-19 (.661) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Detroit 32-20)...are 17-19 (.472) during the day, which is the fifth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.48 ERA (196 er in 506.2 ip) at night, which is the lowest mark in the AL...are averaging 5.02 runs per night game (281 runs in 56 games) compared to 3.89 per day game (140 in 36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a brief three-game homestand against Boston before returning to the road after the All-Star Break...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (2-1) and the Cubs (2-1) and have won 18 of the last 22 home games...are 28-14 (.667) at home for the season, which is the best mark in the American League and second best in the majors (Atlanta, 30-13)...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Pittsburgh (2-1) and are 26-24 (.520) on the road...have the fourth best road record in the AL...these three games with the Red Sox are the A's only home games over a 15-game stretch from July 5-24...open up post All-Star Break play with a six-game road trip to Los Angeles (three games) and Houston (three games)...after that, the A's will play 19 of their next 25 games at home from July 25-August 21.

PITCHING: The A's have posted a 2.97 ERA (38 er in 115.0 ip) over the past 14 games and now have an American League leading 3.68 ERA for the season...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.296) and have issued the fewest walks (226)...rank second in opponents batting average (.244) and third in slugging percentage (.387).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in each of the last eight games and are 5-2 with a 2.54 ERA (14 er in 49.2 ip) and .225 (42 for 187) opponents batting average over that span...are 26-8 with a 3.08 ERA (110 er in 321.2 ip) and .228 (273 for 1196) opponents batting average over the last 50 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 40-29 with a 3.94 ERA (246 er in 562.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the American League lead in complete game shutouts (3), tied for second in wins, rank third in ERA (3.94), tied for third in complete games (3) and fourth in innings pitched.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the sixth time this year on Wednesday and have now scored two runs or fewer in six of the last 11 games...have won three of those six games...were held to 13 hits in the three-game series at Pittsburgh and are now batting .223 (65 for 291) in July...for the season, the A's rank second in the American League in walks (340) to Boston (352)...are fourth in the AL in doubles (171)...lead the majors in plate appearances with the bases loaded (107)...are tied for the AL lead in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), tied for second in doubles (6), rank third in walks (10) and fourth in RBI (69)...A's pinch hitters are batting .123 (10 for 81), which is the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (93), rank second in walks (11), tied for third in home runs (2) and fourth in RBI (9).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-11 (.621) in one-run games...are tied for the American League lead in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have five "walk-off" wins.

ALL-STAR: Bartolo Colón was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team last Saturday...it is his third career All-Star selection (1998, 2005)...he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history (Dennis Eckersley, 37 in 1992)...Yoenis Céspedes was named to the AL team for the Home Run Derby yesterday...he will be the first Athletic to compete in the Derby since 2001 (Jason Giambi).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have turned 65 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...including yesterday, the A's have gone 64 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL, their longest stretch since May 28-Aug. 30, 2005 (94 days)...have sent nine men to the plate 19 times this year...did that just 22 times last year...are 46-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of three AL teams that has not lost in that situation (Texas and Toronto)...the A's have seven consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...the A's are 9-9 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and 26-21 (.553) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 12 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.24 ERA (13 er in 52.1 ip) over his last eight starts...the winning streak matches his career high from Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of the eight starts for a .179 (32 for 179) opponents batting average...allowed two walks or fewer in the first seven starts during the streak and his streak of seven consecutive starts with five hits or fewer and two walks or fewer tied for the longest by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916 (Alan Wirth, May 6-Sept. 15, 1978).

LAST 11, FIRST SEVEN: Is 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (20 er in 72.2 ip) and .181 (45 for 248) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .175 (25 for 143) average over his last 10 starts after surrendering a .397 mark over his first seven starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 0 for 10 with runners in scoring position over his last three starts...has allowed a .203 (15 for 74) average with RISP overall, which ranks fourth in the American League...opponents have grounded into 14 double plays, which is eighth most in the AL...has allowed a .294 (40 for 136) opponents batting average to the first three hitters in the order compared to .214 (55 for 257) against the four through nine hitters.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 16 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...11 of the 15 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for second in the AL.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 1-3 with a 3.14 ERA (18 er in 51.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-3 with a 4.88 ERA (30 er in 55.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 3.58 ERA (22 er in 55.1 ip) and 12 home runs allowed in nine starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 4.53 ERA (26 er in 51.2 ip) and four home runs allowed in nine starts in Oakland...last year, he was 6-5 with a 2.61 ERA at home compared to 7-3 with a 4.54 ERA on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in nine of the 12 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision (19 rs in 67.1 ip, 2.54 RSA)...has four runs of support or more in five of his six wins.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of June...had the lowest opponents batting average in the American League in June and ranked third in ERA...was 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA and .216 opponents average in five starts in May...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: Had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles **April 9**...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss to Detroit **April 14** in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs on a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...extended his losing streak to four games in the A's 10-2 loss to Baltimore **April 25**...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which was the longest of his career...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles **April 30** in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Cleveland **May 6**...surrendered a career-high four home runs...had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two...combined with Blevins, Cook and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Chicago **June 2** in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two of the hits...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 18-inning win over New York **June 13** in Oakland...matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings (fifth time, third time against New York)...had a no decision in the A's 7-1 loss to St. Louis **June 29** in Oakland...left the game after 3.2 innings with tightness in his right hamstring.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Kansas City last Saturday...had a 2-0 lead before allowing a run in the third when Dyson scored on a Butler ground out...Moustakas hit a solo home run in the fourth to tie the game but the A's scored a run in the sixth to take a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Blevins with runners on first and second and one out in the seventh but Blevins allowed one of those runs to score for the blown save...Cook allowed a run in the eighth for the loss.

PARKER vs. BOSTON: Is 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (13.1 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 7 so, 0 hr) in two career starts, both last year...the first win was his first Major League win in a 5-3 victory at Boston May 1...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fourth inning...Pedroia led off with single, went to second on wild pitch, third on a ground out and then scored on an Ortiz ground out...Norberto recorded the save, marking the first time A's pitchers recorded their first win and save in the same game since Joe Klink saved Steve Chitren's victory Sept. 30, 1990 at Texas...also picked up the win in a 6-1 decision in Oakland July 2...Nava doubled to lead off the game and Pedroia followed with a RBI single but that was the only run he would allow in 6.2 innings.

- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)...the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

PAT NESHEK

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

DEREK NORRIS

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).
- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

SHANE PETERSON

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

JOSH REDDICK

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).
- Snapped a career-high 30-game homerless streak with a solo shot in the seventh inning off Quintana June 6 at Chicago (AL).
- Had his third career four-hit game June 16 against Seattle.

CHRIS RESOP

- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

ADAM ROSALES

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

SETH SMITH

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St. Louis off Joe Kelly...the hitless streak was the second longest career-opening hitless streak by a non-pitcher since 1973 (Chris Carter, OAK; 33 in 2010).

CHRIS YOUNG

- Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.
- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).
- His sixth inning double April 11 at Los Angeles was the 200th of his career.
- Had his 11th career regular season multi-homer game April 24 at Boston (also has one in the post-season).
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 30 to May 17 with a strained left quad...it was his second career stint on the DL...made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento May 16 and went 1 for 1 with two walks, a run and a stolen base in a start in center field against Oklahoma City.
- Had back-to-back three-hit games for the second time in his career May 24 and 25 at Houston (Aug. 16-17, 2007).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts June 26 against Cincinnati...it was the fifth four-strikeout game of his career, but his first since May 20, 2009 at Florida.
