LEADER OF THE PACK: At 57-37 (.606), the Sox own the best record in the AL and the 2nd-best mark in the majors behind St. Louis (.611, 55-35).

WINNING WAYS: Boston's 57 wins lead the majors, 2 ahead of St. Louis' 55.

- The Sox' 57 wins match their most ever before the All-Star break...Both the 1978 and 2008 Red Sox also won 57 games before the Midsummer Classic.
- Boston's 57 wins are tied for the most in club history entering play on 7/12 with the 1978 club (57-26).

.500 DAYS: The Sox are the only AL team and 1 of 2 ML clubs whose record has been above .500 all season long (also Atlanta)...The last Red Sox team to go this late into a season without falling to or under .500 was the 1946 club.

HOW IT STANDS: The Red Sox are in 1st place in the AL East, 3.5 games ahead of the Rays.

- Boston has been in 1st place or T-1st for 84 days in 2013, including 46 straight days since reclaiming the division's top spot on 5/27.

RECENT RESULTS: The Red Sox topped the Mariners 8-7 in 10 innings yesterday and now have won 3 in a row following a season-long tying 3-game losing streak.

- Boston has won 12 of their last 16 games, including an 8-1 homestand to begin the stretch from 6/25-7/4.
- Other than a 2-9 stretch from 5/3-14, Boston has played at a .663 clip (55-28) this season...The Sox' 35 wins since 5/15 (.636, 35-20) are 1st in MLB.

ROAD TO THE BREAK: Boston is 4-3 thus far on a 10-game west coast road trip that leads into the All-Star break...The Sox begin the last leg of the trip tonight with the 1st of 3 games in Oakland.

- The Red Sox began the trip by dropping 2 of 3 in Anaheim before taking 3 of 4 tilts in Seattle.
- The 10-game trek is tied for the Sox longest trip this season by games (also 11-days, 10-games, 8/5-15).

SERIES TALK: After taking 3 of 4 games in Seattle, the Red Sox now own an MLB-best 19 series wins.

- If the Sox take this weekend's series in Oakland, they would match their 2012 total of series victories (20) before the 2013 All-Star break.

ON THE ROAD: Boston's 26-21 (.553) road record ranks 4th in MLB and 2nd in the AL behind Texas (.565, 26-20).

- Prior to winning their series in Seattle, the Sox had lost each of previous 3 road series after winning 8 of their 1st 11 sets away from home (8-2-1)...Boston is 6-9 in their last 15 road tilts.
- Red Sox batters top the majors in road OBP (.346) and are 3rd in AVG (.267) and SLG (.423)...The club tops the majors in runs (248) and an AVG of 5.28 runs scored per road game.

SOX AND A'S: Boston and Oakland tonight are playing the 4th of 6 match-ups this year...The Sox took 2 of 3 games from the A's at Fenway Park from 4/22-24.

- Since the beginning of 2012, the Sox are 3-9 vs. the A's and have been outscored 84-41.

20 SOMETHINGS: David Ortiz has a team-high 19 homers and is 1 shy of recording his 12th career 20-HR season, all since 2002...It will mark his 11th 20-HR season with Boston, tied with Dwight Evans and Jim Rice for 2nd-most in club history behind Ted Williams' 16.

WRIGHT STUFF: Steven Wright earned his 1st major league win yesterday with 5.2 innings of scoreless relief in the Sox 8-7, 10-inning victory.

- According to Elias, he is only the 3rd pitcher in the last 20 years (since 1993) to earn his 1st big league win with a relief stint in which he pitched more than 5.0 innings and did not allow a run, joining the Yankees' Brian Boehringer (1996) and the Padres' Josh Banks (2008)...The last Boston pitcher to notch his 1st MLB win in that fashion was Scott Taylor who earned his only career victory with 6.2 scoreless frames out of the pen vs. the Yankees at Fenway Park on 10/3/92.

NAVA IN THE CLUTCH: Daniel Nava drove in the winning run for the Sox in the 10th inning yesterday with a 2-out single...It was his 6th game-winning RBI and 26th RBI in the 7th inning or later, tied for the most in the majors with Baltimore's Chris Davis.

- The game-winning hit extended Nava's hit streak to 7 games, matching his season-long stretch and 1 shy of his career-long 8-game run from 10/3/12-4/13/13...He is hitting .375 (12-for-32) with 3 doubles, 3 RBI, and 6 runs over the current 7-game streak.

NIFTY 19: Jacoby Ellsbury extended his season-long hit streak to 19 games by going 2-for-4 yesterday, including a leadoff homer, his 8th career leadoff HR and 1st since 2011.

- Ellsbury's 19-game streak is the longest active stretch in MLB and the longest in the AL this year...It is tied for the 2nd-longest hit streak of his career (also 19 games, 4/21-5/10/11) behind his 22-game stretch from 5/2-27/09.
- During the streak, he is batting .413 (33-for-80) with 7 doubles, 2 homers, 11 RBI, and 16 runs.

RUN AROUND: Since being shut out on Sunday, the Red Sox have scored 34 runs over their last 4 games...Boston batters leads the major leagues with 492 runs scored, an average of 5.23 runs per game, and 475 RBI.

- The Red Sox have 11 games with at least 10 runs this year, tied for the most in MLB with St. Louis (11).

OFFENSIVE LINE: The Sox top the majors with a .353 OBP, .449 SLG, 912 hits (tied), 1,465 total bases, 333 extra-base hits, 211 doubles, and 352 walks...The club is 2nd in MLB with a .279 AVG and 24 triples (1st in the AL).

WORKING THE COUNT: Red Sox batters lead the majors with 4.05 pitches per plate appearances and have seen a MLB-high 14,985 pitches (Oakland is 2nd at 14,086).

STARS ALIGNED: Clay Buchholz, David Ortiz, and Dustin Pedroia have all been named to the American League roster for MLB's 84th All-Star Game which will take place on 7/16 at Citi Field in NY...Ortiz was elected as the AL's starting DH through fan balloting while Buchholz and Pedroia were elected by the player ballot.

- For Ortiz it marks his 9th overall selection, 6th as a starter, all of which have come with Boston...His 9 All-Star selections are the most among all major leaguers over the last 10 seasons and tied with Bobby Doerr for 3rd-most in franchise history, trailing only Carl Yastrzemski (18) and Ted Williams (17).

- This marks Buchholz's – who is on the DL and will not play but will attend the game – 2nd All-Star selection (also 2010) and Pedroia's 4th (also 2008-10).

PINCH ME: Boston has hit 5 pinch-hit homers this season, 2nd-most in MLB to the Braves (6) and the club's most since 1997 (5)...Boston is 2 shy of the team's single-season record for pinch-hit homers (7 in 1953).

PEDROIA A HALL OF FAMER: The Arizona Fall League announced today that Dustin Pedroia has been selected as a 2013 inductee into the Arizona Fall League Hall of Fame along with former major leaguer Darin Erstad and Oakland manager Bob Melvin.

TONIGHT'S START:

- 🔴 Ranks 5th in the American League with a 2.80 ERA in 2013 (min. 75.0 IP), his best mark through his 1st 15 starts of any season in his career...Is also 11th among that AL group in opponent OBP (.286) and 12th in WHIP (1.15).
- 🔴 Has given up 3 earned runs or less in 13 of his 15 starts this season...Has recorded a quality start in 11 of those contests...9 of his last 10 outings since 5/19 have been quality starts, posting a 2.30 ERA (17 ER/66.2 IP) in that span.
- 🔴 Is walking just 1.83 batters per 9.0 innings in 2013, the 9th-best mark in the AL (min. 75.0 IP)...Has 5 walks in 47.2 IP (0.94) over his last 7 starts since 6/5, the lowest rate in MLB in that span...Has issued 1 walk or fewer in all 6 starts in that stretch, tied for the longest such streak of his career (also 6/29-8/1/11)...It is the longest streak of 5.0 or more innings and no more than 1 walk by a Sox starter since Curt Schilling did it in 9 games from 8/6-9/25/07.
- 🔴 Is averaging 8.49 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (88 K/93.1 IP) in 2013...Has finished a season with a higher rate just once in his career (8.57 in 2005)...Has fanned 8 batters in a game 5 times through his 1st 13 starts...Prior to 2013, had recorded 8+ K's just 3 times since joining the Sox in 2010, a span of 61 starts.
- 🔴 Leads MLB with a 1.32 ERA (6 ER/41.0 IP) in 6 starts at Fenway Park in 2013 (min. 40.0 IP), compared to a 3.96 mark (23 ER/52.1 IP) on the road.
- 🔴 **Last start:** Took the loss as the Sox fell to the Angels, 3-0, on 7/7 in Anaheim... Allowed 2 runs on 5 hits and 1 walk over 7.0 innings...Struck out 9 while tossing a season-high 116 pitches (69 strikes)...Surrendered both runs on solo shots...Gave up those homers to Mike Trout in the 1st and Hank Conger in the 5th...Exited following the 7th with the Sox trailing 2-0.
 - 🔴 It was his most pitches in a game since tossing 119 on 8/30/11 vs. NYY.
 - 🔴 It was his 1st loss since 5/29 at PHI, snapping a 6-game unbeaten streak.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- 🔴 Has a 2.91 ERA (69 ER/213.2 IP) in his career versus OAK...Leads all active hurlers in wins (18), starts (33), and innings (213.2) against the A's...Has the highest winning percentage (.750) vs. OAK among actives (min. 15 decisions).
- 🔴 Last faced OAK on 6/5/11, earning the win after allowing 3 runs over 5.2 innings (3 H, 2 BB, 2 K).

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- 🔴 Struck out 12 without a walk allowed on 6/26 vs. COL, becoming the 6th Sox since 1916 (20th time) to do it (last Pedro Martinez on 5/3/03 vs. MIN , 12 K's).
- 🔴 Recorded a quality start in 4 consecutive outings from 5/19-6/5, his longest such streak as a Red Sox and longest overall since 8/30-9/15/09 with LAA.
- 🔴 Did not allow an ER in back-to-back starts from 5/19-24 (.073 AVG, 3 H/41 AB) for 1st time in a single season since a 3-start stretch from 7/2-14/06 with LAA.
- 🔴 Made his 300th career start (301st appearance) on 5/19 at MIN, becoming 1 of just 3 pitchers with 300 starts in the American League since 2002.
- 🔴 Earned the win on 4/28 vs. HOU, his 1st victory since 8/23/11 at TEX (614 days)...It snapped a career-long stretch of 7 starts without a victory.
- 🔴 Left his 1st start of the season on 4/6 at TOR with a right biceps strain...Was placed on the 15-day DL on 4/10 (retro to 4/7)...Made a rehab start with Double-A Portland on 4/22 vs. Binghamton (3.2 IP, 3 H, 0 R/ER, 2 BB, 5 K)...Activated from the DL on 4/28 and made the start that night vs. HOU.
