A's vs. RED SOX

The A's trail in the season series 2-3 entering the final game today...have split the first two games in Oakland after losing two of three in Boston in April...have won 10 of the last 13 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eight...have won seven of the last eight games in the Coliseum...are 37-32 against the Red Sox since 2006...that includes 24-10 in Oakland, 12-21 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 229-278 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 136-115 in Oakland, 92-162 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 871-1059 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have drawn 1,012,998 fans over the first 44 home dates...that is the earliest the A's surpassed 1,000,000 fans since 2007 when they reached it in home date 41.

Grant Balfour is the only Major League closer without a blown save as he has converted each of his 25 save opportunities...now has a streak of 43 consecutive saves dating back to last year, which is an Oakland record (previous: 40, Dennis Eckersley).

Josh Donaldson ranks eighth in the American League in on-base percentage (.378) and 10th in slugging (.515)...is also tied for fifth in go-ahead RBI (17) and ranks seventh in multiple hit games (33).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1987 Oakland hosts its only All-Star game, a game the National League wins 2-0 on Tim Raines' two-run triple off A's reliever Jay Howell in the top of the 13th inning...A's rookie Mark McGwire is 0 for 3 in his first All-Star game...in 1991 the A's defeat the Baltimore Orioles 3-2 in 11 innings as Tony La Russa becomes the 40th manager in Major League history win 1000 games...Baltimore scores a run in the top of the 11th but the A's win in the bottom of the inning on Jose Canseco's two-run single.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won 11 of the last 16 games and are 55-39 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...it matches the best 94-game record by an A's team over the last 23 years (also 2002)...a win today would give the A's their best record after 95 games since 1990 (60-35)...have won each of the previous five series and with a win today will have six consecutive series wins for the first time since July 27-Aug. 16, 2006 when they won six straight...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day...lead Texas by one game for the third consecutive day...the A's and Rangers have been separated by one game or fewer for 24 consecutive days...are 112-65 (.633) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Atlanta, 107-72)...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 11-5 since June 25 (tied for fourth best in the majors)...have swept nine series this year after tallying just 11 sweeps all last year...have spent 37 days in sole possession of first this year, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the first time since 2008 (51-44)...the 55 wins are the most by an A's team before the break since 1975 when they also had 55...the Athletics record for wins before the All-Star Break is 56 (1971, 1972, 1973)...the A's .585 winning percentage is currently 10th best in Athletics history at the break (a win today makes it ninth, a loss makes it 11th)...currently have a one-game lead in the American League West...over the last 23 years, the only time the A's have been in first place at the All-Star Break was in 2006 when they were tied for first with Texas...have not been in sole possession of first at the break since 1990...the pitching staff is averaging 2.42 walks per nine innings, which is the best pre-break mark in Oakland history (2.47 in 1972) and second best in Athletics history (2.36 in 1944)...has 641 strikeouts, which is the most in Athletics history at the break (635 in 2008)...the offense has struck out 708 times, which is also the most in Athletics history (703 in 2008)...has 172 doubles, which is third best (185 in 2003, 183 in 2004).

BREAK TO BREAK: The A's are 106-64 (.624) since the 2012 All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors ahead of Atlanta (102-69) and Cincinnati (102-69)...have issued the fewest walks over that span (415), rank third in opponents on-base percentage (.299), fifth in saves (52), eighth in ERA (3.62) and ninth in opponents slugging (.386)...the offense is first in runs (820), tied for first in fewest grounded into double plays (106), second in walks (603) and extra base hits (553), tied for second in home runs (209), fourth in strikeouts (1412) and tied for sixth in doubles (314)...individually, Bartolo Colón is 16-5 with a 2.67 ERA (50 er in 168.1 ip) in 25 starts, A.J. Griffin is 15-7 with a 3.57 ERA in 31 starts and Grant Balfour is 42 for 42 in saves with a 1.69 ERA (13 er in 69.1 ip) in 72 games...Josh Donaldson is batting .302 (156 for 516) with 23 home runs and 84 RBI in 139 games and Yoenis Céspedes tops the A's with 29 home runs and 89 RBI in 153 games.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their third shutout in the last 15 games last night and have a 2.84 ERA (42 er in 133.0 ip) over that span...it was their eighth shutout of the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...now have a 3.65 ERA, which is the lowest in the AL...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.295) and have issued the fewest walks (228)...rank second in opponents batting average (.243) and third in slugging percentage (.384).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in each of the last 10 games and are 6-2 with a 2.23 ERA (16 er in 64.2 ip) and .212 (51 for 241) opponents batting average over that span...are 27-8 with a 2.99 ERA (112 er in 336.2 ip) and .226 (282 for 1250) opponents batting average over the last 52 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 41-29 with a 3.87 ERA (248 er in 577.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the American League lead in complete game shutouts (3), rank second in innings pitched, tied for second in wins, third in ERA and tied for third in complete games (3).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in each of the last five games and are batting .162 (24 for 148) with nine runs scored over that span...have won three of those five games...have 348 walks this year, which is second most in the majors to Boston (354)...are tied for the AL lead in bases loaded grounded into double plays (7), rank second in plate appearances (107), tied for second in doubles (6) and third in walks (10)...A's pinch hitters are batting .123 (10 for 81), which is the lowest mark in the AL...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (93), rank second in walks (11), tied for third in home runs (2) and fourth in RBI (9).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's have a 38-20 (.655) record in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Pittsburgh, 35-22)...are 17-19 (.472) during the day, which is the fifth worst mark in the American League...have a 3.43 ERA (200 er in 524.2 ip) at night, which is the lowest mark in the AL...are averaging 4.93 runs per night game (286 runs in 58 games) compared to 3.89 per day game (140 in 36).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this brief three-game homestand against Boston...went 6-2 on the last homestand against Cincinnati (2-0), St. Louis (2-1) and the Cubs (2-1) and have won 19 of the last 24 home games...are 29-15 (.659) at home for the season, which is the second best mark in the American League (Boston, 31-16)...are 26-24 (.520) on the road...have the fourth best road record in the AL...these three games with the Red Sox are the A's only home games over a 15-game stretch from July 5-24...open up post All-Star Break play with a six-game road trip to Los Angeles (three games) and Houston (three games)...after that, the A's will play 19 of their next 25 games at home from July 25-August 21.

ALL-STAR: Bartolo Colón was named as the A's lone representative to the American League All-Star team last week...it is his third career All-Star selection (1998, 2005)...he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history (Dennis Eckersley, 37 in 1992)...Yoenis Céspedes was named to the AL Home Run Derby team Tuesday...he will be the first Athletic to compete in the Derby since 2001 (Jason Giambi).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-11 (.621) in one-run games...are tied for the AL lead in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 12-6 in games decided in the last at bat...have five "walk-off" wins.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season...it will be the 400th appearance of his career...the A's are 14-4 (.778) in his starting assignments this year and 28-14 (.667) over the last two years...his teams are 225-168 (.573) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 11 of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 17 times...including nine games with no walks.

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed six or more innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 11 starts, which is tied for the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the only longer streak is a 14-game streak by Dan Haren from April 18-June 26, 2007...Colon is 9-1 with a 1.71 ERA (15 er in 79.0 ip) during this 11-start stretch...has surrendered just three

home runs and issued 14 walks in 79.0 innings while allowing a .247 (72 for 292) opponents batting average...went 3-2 with a 4.57 ERA over his first seven starts.

ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005)...at the age of 40, he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history...Dennis Eckersley, at age 37 in 1992, is second oldest.

12-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 12th win of the season in his last start, which matches the most by an A's pitcher before the break since 1991 (Mulder 12 in 2004 and 2003)...since 1975, only two Oakland pitchers have won 13 games before the break (Stewart, 13 in 1989; Welch, 13 in 1990)...the 12 wins surpass his season total of last year (10) and are his most since 2005 when he went 21-8 for the Angels and won the Cy Young Award...the 12 wins are his most ever before the All-Star Break (11-5 in 2005).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.12), is tied for second in complete games (2) and shutouts (2), ranks third in wins (12) and ERA (2.69), fourth in winning percentage (.800), fifth in strikeout to walk ratio (4.40), tied for sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.67) and opponents grounded into double plays (15) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.281) and opponents slugging percentage (.360)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning (13.9) and seventh fewest pitches per game (92.7)...has the second highest run support (6.58).

AS A 40-YEAR OLD: His 12 wins are second most in Oakland history to the record of 13 by Don Sutton in 1985...is the first Major Leaguer to win 12 games since Jamie Moyer in 2009 (12)...the last American Leaguer to win more than 12 is Tim Wakefield in 2007 (17)...has a 2.69 ERA...since 1952, the only AL pitcher with an ERA under 3.00 is Nolan Ryan (2.91 in 1991)...won each of his first seven starts after turning 40 on May 24...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher in Major League history to win at least each of his first six starts in his forties...ages are based on a players age as of June 30th.

AT HOME: Was charged with his first home loss of the season in his last home start July 3 against Chicago (NL), snapping an eight-game winning streak in the Coliseum dating back to Aug. 2 of last year...that was the longest home winning streak by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder won 10 straight from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...posted a 1.85 ERA during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts, and walked just seven batters (0.81 per nine innings)..is now 5-1 with a 2.47 ERA (17 er in 62.0 ip) in nine starts at home for the season...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League.

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks third among active pitchers in complete games (34), fifth in wins (183), sixth in games started (393) and shutouts (11), seventh in strikeouts (1899) and eighth in innings pitched (2513.2).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 8-1 with a 2.08 ERA (18 er in 78.0 ip) and .231 (66 for 286) opponents batting average in 11 starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 3.83 ERA (18 er in 42.1 ip) and .308 (52 for 169) opponents average in seven starts during the day...leads the American League in night ERA...his one night loss came on July 3 against Chicago (NL), snapping an 11-game winning streak in night games dating back to July 28 of last year...in two seasons with the A's, he is 17-6 with a 2.53 ERA (51 er in 181.1 ip) in 27 starts at night compared to 5-6 with a 4.24 ERA (43 er in 91.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

 hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) with a home run and four RBI on a three-game rehab assignment with
 Sacramento...was reinstated April 28.
- Had his first career four-strikeout game April 29 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Had his first career four-RBI game April 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...matched that mark June 21
 at Seattle.
- Was hit by a pitch twice May 1 against Los Angeles (AL), tying the Oakland record (32nd time, last: Josh Willingham at Seattle, April 24, 2011).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 16 streak with his third inning single May 12 at Seattle.

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Did not walk a batter over his first three starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 to start the season with three consecutive games of five or more innings and no walks...had a four-game streak with no walks and at least five innings pitched dating back to 2012, which was the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 seven-inning win at Boston April 23...it was his 10th career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...the seven-inning shutout was third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip).
- Walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, snapping a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.
- Did not strike out a batter May 14 against Texas, his eighth career start without a strikeout...it was
 the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings.

- Walked two batters May 20 at Texas, snapping a season-opening streak of eight consecutive starts
 with one walk or fewer and two innings or more...that was the longest season-opening streak by an
 Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Had an 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 20 to 31.
- Struck out nine batters May 26 at Houston in his first start after turning 40 to set an Athletics record
 for strikeouts by a 40-year old...the previous high was seven by Tom Candiotti (July 31, 1998 vs.
 Cleveland) and Don Sutton (April 22, 1985 vs. California)...is just the fourth pitcher in Oakland
 history to start a game at age 40...the other three are Tommy John (last start at 42 years, 126 days),
 Candiotti (last start at 41 years, 275 days) and Sutton (last start at 40 years, 155 days)
- Tossed a five-hit shutout May 31 against Chicago (AL) to become the second 40-year old in Oakland history with a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago).

RYAN COOK

 Allowed his first run of the season on the road May 26 at Houston, snapping a 22.2-inning scoreless streak on the road dating back to Aug. 11, 2012...the road scoreless streak is third longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his
 eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...added two more
 on June 3 at Milwaukee and June 11 against New York (AL)...in Oakland history, only Rickey
 Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more...is tied for fourth in Athletics history with
 Max Bishop behind Henderson, Eddie Joost (19) and Campaneris (13).
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).
- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.
- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.

- Made his Major League debut at shortstop in the ninth inning May 24 at Houston...had one appearance at shortstop in the minors with Triple-A Sacramento on Aug. 2, 2012.
- Hit his first career grand slam in the sixth inning June 7 at Chicago, turning a 3-0 deficit into a 4-3 win.

Had a career-high tying 13.1-inning scoreless streak from April 29 to May 27.

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 3 against Seattle and had a RBI single

 for his first multiple hit game.

- Had a career-high 17-game reaching base streak from May 21 to June 18...hit .345 with a .456 onbase percentage during the streak, which included a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25-June 13 (14 for 38, .368).

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying four RBI April 15 against Houston (fourth time, last: September 19, 2011 vs. Baltimore).
- Went 4 for 4 April 19 at Tampa, the third four-hit game of his career...added his fourth June 1 agaisnt Chicago (AL).
- Went 2 for 9 in the 19-inning game April 29 against Los Angeles to tie the Oakland record for at bats in a game (11th time, last: Mike Heath at Texas, July 1, 1979).
- Set an Oakland record for hits in the month of April with 34...broke the previous mark of 33 held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...had 11 doubles, which tied the Oakland April record (Mark Ellis, 2003).
- Went a career-high 11 consecutive games without a RBI from June 4 to 15.
- Homered June 21 at Seattle to snap a career-high 62-game homerless streak.
- Hit safely in each of his first 12 interleague games, which tied for the third longest interleague hitting streak in Oakland history...had a 14-game interleague hitting streak dating back to last year.
- Had a career-high tying nine-game hitting streak from June 20 to 30 (also Aug. 4-21, 2010 and April 27-May 6, 2012)...hit .457 (16 for 35) during the streak.

BRANDON MOSS

- Matched his career high with five RBI April 10 at Los Angeles (also September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) after driving in four runs the night before.
- Had a career-high four strikeouts April 12 against Detroit...matched that figure April 29 against Los Angeles and May 12 at Seattle.

- Made his first career appearance in center field May 9 (also May 13).
- Hit the 7000th home run in Oakland history May 13 against Texas off Justin Grimm in the third inning...hit the 12,000th home run in Athletics franchise history June 5 at Milwaukee, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning.
- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the
 other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base
 in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)... the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

DEREK NORRIS

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
 going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
 Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
 1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).
- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

SHANE PETERSON

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

JOSH REDDICK

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career
 stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases
 during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento
 (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).

 Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

ADAM ROSALES

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.
- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up
 going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with
 a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3...
 according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back
 games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

SETH SMITH

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St.
