ROSTER MOVE: The Red Sox today recalled LHP Drake Britton from Triple-A Pawtucket...To make room for him on the 25-man roster, OF Jackie Bradley Jr. was optioned to Triple-A Pawtucket.

LEADER OF THE PACK: At 58-38 (.604), the Sox own the best record in the AL and the 3rd-best mark in the majors behind Pittsburgh and St. Louis (both .609, 56-36).

WINNING WAYS: Boston's 58 wins lead MLB, 2 ahead of the next-most in the majors (Pittsburgh and St. Louis at 56)...No other AL club has more than 55 wins.

• Boston's 58 wins are the most in club history entering play on 7/14.

BREAK FACTS: The Sox' 58 wins are their most ever before the All-Star break...The club's previous mark for wins before the Midsummer Classic was 57 in 1978 and 2008.

• Since 2004, the only ML team with as many as 58 wins by the All-Star break was the 2006 Tigers (59).

.500 DAYS: The Sox are the only AL team and 1 of 2 ML clubs whose record has been above .500 all season long (also Atlanta)...The last Red Sox team to go this late into a season without falling to or under .500 was the 1946 club.

HOW IT STANDS: The Red Sox are in 1st place in the AL East, 3.5 games ahead of the 2nd-place Rays.

• Boston has been in 1st place or T-1st for 86 days in 2013, including 48 straight days since reclaiming the division's top spot on 5/27.

RECENT RESULTS: The Red Sox had a 4-game winning streak snapped with a 3-0 loss to the Athletics last night.

• Boston has won 13 of its last 18 games, including an 8-1 homestand to begin the stretch from 6/25-7/4.

• Other than a 2-9 stretch from 5/3-14, Boston has played at a .659 clip (56-29) this season...The Sox' 36 wins since 5/15 (.643, 36-20) rank 1st in MLB.

ROAD TO THE BREAK: Today Boston concludes a 10-game west coast road trip that leads into the All-Star break...Boston is 5-4 thus far on the trip...They began the trip dropping 2 of 3 in Anaheim before taking 3 of 4 in Seattle...The Sox and A's have split the 1st 2 games of the current set.

• A victory today would give Boston its 1st winning record on a road trip since 5/29-6/2 (3-2)...Boston last posted a winning mark on a road trip of 10+ games with a 6-4 mark on a west coast trip, 7/19-28/10.

• This 10-game trek is tied for the Sox' longest trip this season by games (also 11-days, 10-games, 8/5-15).

AFTER THE BREAK: Today's game is the last before the All-Star break, which runs through Thursday...The Sox kick off their 2nd-half schedule with a 7-game homestand beginning with the 1st of 3 contests against the Yankees on Friday -- New York's 1st trip to Fenway this year -- followed by 4 games against the Rays.

• 13 of the Sox' 1st 16 games immediately following the break will be played at Fenway Park.

HISTORIC PACE: Boston pitchers have already fanned 811 batters this season, over 100 more than the previous club record before the All-Star break (708 in 2008)...The Sox have fanned 8.5 batters per 9 IP (854.2 IP), their best-ever mark in the 1st half (2001 ranks 2nd at 7.8).

SERIES TALK: The Red Sox have won 4 of their last 5 series and own an MLB-best 19 series wins overall in 2013.

• With a win today, Boston would match its total of 2012 series victories (20) by the 2013 All-Star break.

RUBBER GAMES: This season Boston is 8-4 in rubber games of a series...The Sox lost their last rubber game to the Angels on 7/7 after winning their previous 5 rubber games beginning 5/16.

ON THE ROAD: The Red Sox are 27-22 (.551) on the road this season, the 4th-best road record in the majors and 2nd best in the AL behind only Texas (.563, 27-21).

• Prior to winning their last series in Seattle, the Sox had lost each of previous 3 road series after winning 8 of their 1st 11 sets away from home (8-2-1)...Boston is 7-10 in its last 17 road contests.

• Red Sox batters top the majors in road OBP (.343), rank 2nd in OPS (.759) and are 4th in AVG (.264) on the road...The club ranks 2nd in the majors in road runs (252) and an average of 5.14 runs scored per road game, trailing St. Louis (254 R, 5.18 R/G).

SOX AND A'S: Boston and Oakland today conclude their 6-game season series, with the Sox on top 3-2 thus far... Boston took 2 of 3 from the A's at Fenway from 4/22-24 and leads the series 3-2...With a win today the Sox would secure the season series after losing 8 of 9 to the A's in 2012.

• Boston is looking for its 1st road series win against the Athletics since taking 3 of 4 to open the 2008 season (1-1 in Tokyo, 3/25-26; 2-0 in Oakland, 4/1-2)...The Sox last won a road series of at least 3 games, all played in Oakland, from 7/24-26/06 (2-1).

MORE HIGH FIVES: On Friday night Koji Uehara fanned all 3 batters faced in the 9th inning to earn his 8th save of the season...His 7 saves since 6/26 are tied for the ML lead...Uehara has given up 1 ER over his last 17 outings since 6/10 (0.56 ERA, 16.0 IP, 24 SO).

YOUTH STARTS: Brandon Workman's 1st career ML start today will be the 7th start by a Red Sox rookie pitcher in 2013 (Allen Webster, 6)...It marks the club's most in a season since 2008 (28, led by Clay Buchholz's 15).

LIGHT OF DAY: Boston leads the majors with a 19-9 record (.679) in day games this season...Sox pitchers own a 3.38 ERA in day games compared to a 4.16 mark at night.

RUN AROUND: Red Sox batters were held without a run last night but lead the major leagues with 496 runs scored, an average of 5.17 runs per game, and 479 RBI.

OFFENSIVE LINE: The Sox top the majors with a .351 OBP, a .795 OPS, 1,481 total bases, 335 extra-base hits, 212 doubles, and 354 walks...The club is 2nd in MLB with a .278 AVG, a .445 SLG, 925 hits, and 25 triples (1st in the AL).

NAVA IN THE CLUTCH: Daniel Nava has driven in 26 runs in the 7th inning or later, tied for the most in the majors with Baltimore's Chris Davis.

WORKING THE COUNT: Red Sox batters lead the majors with 4.05 pitches per plate appearances and have seen a MLB-high 15,255 pitches (Oakland is 2nd at 14,361)...Mike Napoli is averaging an ML-high 4.52 pitches per PA.

20 SOMETHINGS: David Ortiz has a team-high 19 homers and is 1 shy of recording his 12th career 20-HR season, all since 2002...It will mark his 11th 20-HR season with Boston, tied with Dwight Evans and Jim Rice for 2nd-most in club history behind Ted Williams' 16.

FUTURE IS HERE: The 2013 MLB All-Star Futures Game takes place today at 2:00 p.m. ET at Citi Field...3 Sox prospects are on this year's Futures rosters: RHP Anthony Ranaudo and 3B Garin Cecchini for the U.S. Team and INF Xander Bogaerts for World Team.

STARS ALIGNED: Clay Buchholz, David Ortiz, and Dustin Pedroia have all been named to the American League roster for MLB's 84th All-Star Game which will take place on 7/16 at Citi Field in NY...Ortiz was elected as the AL's starting DH through fan balloting while Buchholz and Pedroia were elected by the player ballot.

• For Ortiz it marks his 9th overall selection, 6th as a starter, all of which have come with Boston...His 9 All-Star selections are the most among all major leaguers over the last 10 seasons and tied with Bobby Doerr for 3rd-most in franchise history, trailing only Carl Yastrzemski (18) and Ted Williams (17).

• This marks Pedroia's 4th All-Star selection (also 2008-10) and Buchholz's 2nd (also 2010)...Buchholz is on the DL and will not play but will attend the game.

1977: Carl Yastrzemski (2-for-3, HR) passed Ted Williams (2,654) on the Red Sox all-time hits list in a 7-4 win vs. CLE.

TOMORROW IN RED SOX HISTORY

1986: Pitching in his hometown at the Houston Astrodome, Roger Clemens became the 1st Red Sox pitcher to earn the win in an All-Star Game with 3.0 perfect innings as the AL beat the NL, 3-2.

TODAY'S START:

- ✦ Is making his 1st career ML start and 2nd career appearance (also 7/10 at SEA)...Was the 5th Boston pitcher to make his major league debut this season, along with Alex Wilson (4/11 vs. BAL), Allen Webster (4/21-G2 vs. KC), Steven Wright (4/23 vs. OAK), and Jose De La Torre (5/12/13 vs. TOR)...Joins Webster as the only rookie hurler to make a start for the Sox in 2013.
- ✦ Made his major league debut on 7/10 at SEA in relief after being activated from Pawtucket by Boston the night before...Allowed 3 runs on 4 hits, including a home run, over 2.0 innings...Struck out 4 and did not walk a batter...Surrendered a solo homer to Brendan Ryan, the 1st batter he faced...Gave up all 3 runs in his 1st inning of action and then retired the side in order in his final frame.
- ✦ Has combined to go 8-2 with a 3.21 ERA (36 ER/101.0 IP), 30 walks, and 108 strikeouts in 17 games (16 starts) this season between Double-A Portland and Triple-A Pawtucket...Was promoted to the PawSox in early June after starting the year with the Sea Dogs.
- ✦ Leads Red Sox minor leaguers in 2013 in strikeouts and wins (tied) and ranks 2nd in ERA among full-season pitchers in Boston's farm system.
- ✦ **Last minor league start:** Did not factor in the decision as Pawtucket fell to Rochester, 1-0, on 7/5 on the road...Tossed 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing 5 hits and 2 walks...Struck out 5 while tossing 99 pitches (58 strikes).

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- ✦ Is making his 1st career appearance against the A's.

RECENT MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✦ Struck out 9 over 6.1 innings on 6/15 vs. Buffalo in his 2nd start with Pawtucket...Fanned at least 5 in 5 of his 6 games at Triple-A...Tallied 6 or more K's in 9 of his 10 starts with Portland, totaling 74 strikeouts in 65.2 innings.
- ✦ Has tossed 6.0+ scoreless innings in 2 starts with the PawSox since his promotion (7.0 IP on 6/20 at Columbus, 6.1 IP on 7/5 at Rochester).

- ✦ Is 24-17 with a 3.50 ERA (144 ER/370.2 IP), 88 walks, and 353 strikeouts in 68 career minor league games (67 starts).
- ✦ Named the Red Sox Pitcher of the Year in 2012 after going 10-8 with a 3.50 ERA (54 ER/138.2 IP) and 130 strikeouts in 25 starts between High-A Salem and Double A-Portland...Ranked among organizational minor league leaders in strikeouts (T-2nd) and wins (4th)...Placed among Carolina League qualifiers in ERA (4th, 3.40), WHIP (2nd, 1.09), opponent AVG (2nd, .244), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (2nd, 8.47), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.58) and fewest base runners per 9.0 innings (1st, 9.90).
- ✦ Following the 2012 season, rated by Baseball America as having the best curveball and best control in the Red Sox system.
- ✦ Was a 2nd-round selection (57th overall) by Boston in the 2010 June Draft out of the University of Texas Austin.
