A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 6-3...are 4-2 in Los Angeles and 2-1 in Oakland...have scored 59 runs in nine games this year...last year, the A's scored 60 runs in 19 games against the Angels the entire season...are 23-1 against the Angels over the last three years when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in six of their last 12 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in four of those games...have won the season series from Los Angeles in each of the previous two seasons and are 27-20 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 392-316 against the Angels...that includes 201-150 in Oakland and 191-166 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 441-393 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour was charged with his first blown save since April 29, 2012 Tuesday...it snapped an Oakland record streak of 44 consecutive saves...it was the sixth longest streak in ML history.

Yoenis Céspedes has hit safely in each of his six games against Los Angeles this year and is 9 for 28 (.321) with seven runs and seven RBI.

Coco Crisp hit the game-winning two-run homer yesterday...seven of his 10 home runs this year have put the A's ahead.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1930** the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in **1936** Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time, it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games and are 3-3 since the All-Star Break...are 59-42 for the season, which is the third best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 101 games over the last 21 years (2002...lost game 102)...a win today would give the A's their best 102-game record since 1992 (60-42)...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day...those are the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...lead Texas by a season-high tying three games for the fourth consecutive day...have not had a larger lead since Oct. 1, 2006 when they finished the season with a four-game lead...the last time the A's lost ground in the West because of a loss was June 23...have spent 44 days in sole possession of first this year, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 15-8 since June 25 (third best in the majors)...are 116-68 (.630) since July 1 of last year, which is the **best mark in the majors** over that span (Cincinnati, 112-75)...lost two of three to Los Angeles last weekend to snap a six-series winning streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 27-Aug. 16, 2006 when they also won six straight...it was the first time the A's lost a series since they dropped two of three at Seattle, June 21-23.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's three games at Houston were decided by one run and the A's won two of those contests...are now 21-12 (.636) in one-run games for the season...are tied with Arizona for the Major League lead in one-run wins...have the second best one-run record in the American League and are tied for the third most games...are 7-3 (.700) in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 13-7 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...have six "walk-off" wins, which is tied for second most in the AL...lost Tuesday night when leading after eight innings for the first time since Aug. 4, 2012 against Toronto.

OFFENSE: The A's had 23 hits in the three-game series at Houston, 14 of which were for extra bases (eight doubles, one triple, five home runs)...are now batting .187 (71 for 380) with 31 runs scored over the last 12 games (2.58 runs per game)...however, are 7-5 over that span...are batting .243 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the majors in walks (376)...A's pinch hitters are batting .129 (11 for 85), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (100), are tied for the lead in walks (14) and tied for third in home runs (2).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.67 ERA (58 er in 195.1 ip) over the last 22 games...have four shutouts over that span, including two in the last eight games...now have a 3.56 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League...also lead the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.293) and fewest walks (240), rank second in opponents batting average (.241), third in opponents slugging percentage (.382) and fourth in shutouts (9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 29-10 with a 2.96 ERA (126 er in 383.1 ip) and .227 (324 for 1428) opponents batting average over the last 59 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 43-31 with a 3.78 ERA (262 er in 623.2 ip) for the season...lead the AL in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in ERA and innings pitched, tied for second in complete games (4) and tied for third in wins...the four complete game shutouts are the most by an A's team since 2003 (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors in back-to-back games on Monday and Tuesday...it was the first time they posted back-to-back games of three or more errors since Sept. 23-24, 2009...have three unearned runs in the last three games after tallying just three over the previous 35 contests...have just 24 unearned runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...have made 16 errors in the last 14 games...have turned just 71 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: Tonight, the A's begin a stretch where they will play 19 of their next 25 games and 29 of their next 42 at home...it starts with this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (four games), Toronto (three games) and Texas (three games) and also features a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Boston and have won 20 of the last 25 home games...are 30-15 (.667) at home for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (Atlanta, 31-15)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 13-15 against the West since May 10 while going 28-9 against everyone else...are batting .261 (402 for 1543) with 231 runs (44 games, 5.25 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .229 (433 for 1894) with 217 runs (57 games, 3.81 runs per game) against the rest of baseball.

THIS AND THAT: Including yesterday, the A's have gone 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...nine of the A's last 10 home runs have either tied the game or put the A's ahead...five of those home runs have come in the seventh inning or later...the A's are 39-23 (.629) in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Pittsburgh, 38-23)...are 20-19 (.513) during the day...are 11-7 in the month of July...have seven consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003.

AT THE BREAK: The A's went into the All-Star Break with a 56-39 record and a two-game lead in the American League West...the 56 wins matched the most in Athletics history prior to the break...it marked the first time the A's have been in sole possession of first place in the AL West at the break since 1990...it was the eighth time in Athletics history (excludes 1981) and the A's have gone on to win the West each of the previous seven times (1971-75, 88, 90).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season, his second since being recalled from Sacramento July 20...the A's are 10-5 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and are 15-7 (.682) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in nine of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his winning streak snapped at a career-high five games in his last start...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 9...is now 5-1 with a 2.80 ERA (19 er in 61.0 ip) and .208 (46 for 221) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead among rookies with 70 strikeouts (Tepesch, TEX)...ranks second in wins (6) and innings pitched (87.0) and third in games started (15).

IN JULY: Is 2-1 with a 1.33 ERA (3 er in 20.1 ip) and .167 (11 for 66) opponents batting average in three starts in July...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents batting in July and is sixth in ERA

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .224 opponents batting average and a .345 slugging percentage...the slugging percentage is seventh lowest in the American League among pitchers with 80 or more innings and the batting average is ninth lowest...has yielded a .190 (24 for 126) batting average the first time through the lineup, .228 (28 for 123) the second time and .274 (20 for 73) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 80 or more innings...opponents are batting .317 (19 for 60) with runners in scoring position, including .393 (11 for 28) with RISP and two outs...has issued 17 of his 26 walks to left-handed hitters.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-3 with a 5.91 ERA (28 er in 42.2 ip) in eight starts against American League West competition compared to 4-0 with a 2.44 ERA (12 er in 44.1 ip) in seven starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 3-3 with a 5.54 ERA (40 er in 65.0 ip) in 12 starts against the West, 5-1 with a 2.49 ERA (17 er in 61.1 ip) in 10 starts against everyone else.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-2 with a 4.78 ERA (31 er in 58.1 ip) and .240 (53 for 221) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .188 (19 for 101) opponents average in five starts during the day...has allowed all eight of his home runs at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-1 with a 2.86 ERA (16 er in 50.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-2 with a 5.89 ERA (24 er in 36.2 ip) in seven starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA (21 er in 76.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-3 with a 6.44 ERA (36 er in 50.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in his last five starts, snapping a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has surrendered eight home runs for the season...six have come on the road, six have been solo shots and five have come in the first two innings of a game.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento last Saturday for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 0-1 with a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in one start since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento June 23 as the A's had three days off over an eight-day stretch...returned July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Los Angeles last Saturday...matched his career-high with 7.0 innings and eight hits...allowed a sacrifice fly to Hamilton in the first inning but then blanked the Angels on five hits over the next five innings...Callaspo homered to lead off the sixth...the A's were shutout on three hits by Wilson (8.1 ip) and Frieri (0.2 ip).

STRAILY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-1 with a 6.26 ERA (23.0 ip, 30 h, 16 r, 16 er, 3 bb, 23 so, 9 hr) in four career starts...is 0-0 with a 10.60 ERA (11 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (5 er in 13.2 ip) in two starts in Anaheim...is 0-1 with a 6.17 ERA (11.2 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 1 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in two starts this year...had a no decision in a 10-8 A's win in 19 innings on April 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in the 19th in a 6 hour and 32 minute game, the longest by time in Oakland history...the loss came in a 2-0 decision last Saturday at Anaheim (see last start above).

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16 for 73) by right-handers...has allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...the A's are 11-9 (.550) in his starting assignments this year and 31-20 (.608) in his career...his teams are 36-20 (.643) in his 56 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in 14 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

BRIEFLY: Is 2-3 with a 5.22 ERA (23 er in 39.2 ip) and .275 (44 for 160) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 3-0 with a 3.86 over his first three starts, 0-5 with a 3.62 ERA over his next five and 3-0 with a 3.66 ERA over his next five after that...the five-game losing streak was the longest of his career...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to last year...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .202 (21 for 104) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is **sixth** lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .333 (41 for 123) with 14 doubles, seven home runs (.618 slugging percentage) and five walks (.359 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage in **fourth** highest in the AL and the batting average is **eighth** highest...allowed a .319 batting average, .555 slugging percentage and .358 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning last year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 3.20 ERA (18 er in 50.2 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-5 with a 4.88 ERA (39 er in 72.0 ip) in 12 starts on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 11-7 with a 2.89 ERA (48 er in 149.1 ip) and .242 (137 for 566) opponents average in 23 starts in Oakland compared to 10-11 with a 4.85 ERA (88 er in 163.1 ip) and .294 (195 for 664) opponents average in 28 starts on the road...has allowed 27 of his 43 home runs with the A's on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 7-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 er in 91.0 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in 15 starts at night compared to 1-3 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) and nine home runs allowed in five starts during the day...is **tied for fifth** in the American League in wins at night...in two seasons with the A's, he is 17-10 with a 3.43 ERA (85 in 223.0 ip) in 36 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 5.12 ERA (51 er in 89.2 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received just eight runs of support in his eight losses this year (46.2 ip, 1.54 RSA)...has received just 20 runs of support in his 18 losses in two seasons with the A's (105.1 ip, 1.71 RSA)...has received no support nine times over the last two years and one run of support eight times...the A's have been shut out **seven** times this year, three times in games started by Milone...is 7-1 with three runs of support or more this year and 16-3 in his career.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Became the A's 14th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 14 years April 1 against Seattle.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 13 with a strained muscle in his left hand...it was his second career stint on the DL as he was out from May 7-31 last year with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) with a home run and four RBI on a three-game rehab assignment with Sacramento...was reinstated April 28.
- Had his first career four-strikeout game April 29 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Had his first career four-RBI game April 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...matched that mark June 21 at Seattle.
- Was hit by a pitch twice May 1 against Los Angeles (AL), tying the Oakland record (32nd time, last: Josh Willingham at Seattle, April 24, 2011).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 16 streak with his third inning single May 12 at Seattle.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from May 18 to 30...went 15 for 50 (.300) with five doubles, a triple, two home runs and nine RBI during the hitting streak.

- Tossed 5.2 innings June 13 against New York (AL), which was the longest relief appearance of his career.
- Recorded a career-high tying seven strikeouts June 13 against New York (AL).

BARTOLO COLÓN

- Did not walk a batter over his first three starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 to start the season with three consecutive games of five or more innings and no walks...had a four-game streak with no walks and at least five innings pitched dating back to 2012, which was the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 seven-inning win at Boston April 23...it was his 10th career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...the seven-inning shutout was third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip).

- Walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, snapping a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.
- Did not strike out a batter May 14 against Texas, his eighth career start without a strikeout...it was the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings.
- Walked two batters May 20 at Texas, snapping a season-opening streak of eight consecutive starts with one walk or fewer and two innings or more...that was the longest season-opening streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Had an 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 20 to 31.
- Struck out nine batters May 26 at Houston in his first start after turning 40 to set an Athletics record for strikeouts by a 40-year old...the previous high was seven by Tom Candiotti (July 31, 1998 vs. Cleveland) and Don Sutton (April 22, 1985 vs. California)...is just the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to start a game at age 40...the other three are Tommy John (last start at 42 years, 126 days), Candiotti (last start at 41 years, 275 days) and Sutton (last start at 40 years, 155 days)
- Tossed a five-hit shutout May 31 against Chicago (AL) to become the second 40-year old in Oakland history with a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago).
- Had his career-high tying eight-game winning streak snapped July 3 by Chicago (NL)...also won eight straight from July 21-Sept. 10, 2005...had a 1.37 ERA and surrendered just one home run in 59.0 innings during the streak, which spanned eight starts...it was the longest winning streak by an Athletic since Dan Haren had a 10-game winning streak from April 18-July 1, 2007...fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive starts with a win.
- The loss to the Cubs was his first home loss of the season, snapping an eight-game winning streak in the Coliseum dating back to Aug. 2, 2012...that was the longest home winning streak by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder won 10 straight from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...posted a 1.85 ERA during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts, and walked just seven batters (0.81 per nine innings).
- Was charged with a wild pitch July 3 against Chicago (NL), his first since May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL)...it snapped a streak of 443.0 innings without a wild pitch...it was his first wild pitch in 40 starts with the A's, which was the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 42 by Catfish Hunter (June 25, 1972-June 27, 1973).
- Went 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June to win American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the fourth time in his career...led the AL in ERA and tied for second in wins...it marked the third time in his career he won five games in a month (August 1999 and August 2005)...it was the fourth lowest single month ERA of his career (1.13 in May 2002, 1.39 in June 1998 and 1.72 in August 2005)...since 2006, the only other Oakland pitcher to win five games in a month is Gio Gonzalez (Sept., 2011).
- Was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005)...at the age of 40 years and 53 days, he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history...Dennis Eckersley, at age 37 in 1992, is second oldest...pitched the Sunday before the game and was replaced on the active roster.

RYAN COOK

- Allowed his first run of the season on the road May 26 at Houston, snapping a 22.2-inning scoreless streak on the road dating back to Aug. 11, 2012...the road scoreless streak is third longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...added two more on June 3 at Milwaukee and June 11 against New York (AL)...in Oakland history, only Rickey Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more...is tied for fourth in Athletics history with Max Bishop behind Henderson, Eddie Joost (19) and Campaneris (13).
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).

- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.
- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.
- His seventh inning RBI single July 13 against Boston was the 500th RBI of his career.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had his first career game-ending RBI April 12 against Detroit, a home run in the bottom of the 12th inning...his second was a RBI single in the 11th inning July 14 against Boston.
- Was a perfect 4 for 4 April 27 against Baltimore, matching his career high in hits (August 17, 2012 vs. Cleveland)...also had four-hit games May 14 against Texas and May 25 at Houston.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of April 22-28...it was his first career weekly honor...went 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles (.864 slugging percentage), 10 RBI and seven walks (1 sf, .633 on-base percentage) in seven games.

- Hit the 7000th home run in Oakland history May 13 against Texas off Justin Grimm in the third inning...hit the 12,000th home run in Athletics franchise history June 5 at Milwaukee, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning.
- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)...the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

PAT NESHEK

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

DEREK NORRIS

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).

- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

JARROD PARKER

- Began the season with a career-high four-game losing streak...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned five starts from April 2 to 25.
- Allowed a career-high four home runs in a 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...prior to that, had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two.
- Matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings June 13 against New York (fifth time, third time against New York)...had a no decision in the 3-2, 18-inning win.
- Left his June 29 start against St. Louis after 3.2 innings with tightness in his right hamstring.

SHANE PETERSON

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

JOSH REDDICK

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).
- Snapped a career-high 30-game homerless streak with a solo shot in the seventh inning off Quintana June 6 at Chicago (AL).
- Had his third career four-hit game June 16 against Seattle.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 19 consecutive games from June 18 to July 13...hit .262 (17 for 65) with a .329 on-base percentage (7 bb, 1 sf) during the streak.
- Struck out a career-high tying four times July 14 against Boston.

CHRIS RESOP

- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

ADAM ROSALES

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.
- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).

SCOTT SIZEMORE

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

SETH SMITH

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.
- Homered July 7 at Kansas City to snap a career-high 90-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since April 27, 2012.

DAN STRAILY

- Struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in 6.2 innings (sixth time, last: Tim Hudson, Sept. 10, 1999 at Tampa Bay) in an 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St. Louis off Joe Kelly...the hitless streak was the second longest career-opening hitless streak by a non-pitcher since 1973 (Chris Carter, OAK; 33 in 2010).

CHRIS YOUNG

- Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.

- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).

- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 30 to May 17 with a strained left quad...it was his second career stint on the DL...made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento May 16 and went 1 for 1 with two walks, a run and a stolen base in a start in center field against Oklahoma City.
- Had back-to-back three-hit games for the second time in his career May 24 and 25 at Houston (Aug. 16-17, 2007).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts June 26 against Cincinnati...it was the fifth four-strikeout game of his career, but his first since May 20, 2009 at Florida.
