THURSDAY, JULY 25, 2013 OAKLAND, CA

LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play Game #100, the first contest of a seven-game road trip to **Oakland** (July 25-28) and **Texas** (July 29-31)...Angels have dropped four of last five on road (won previous seven road affairs)...Club finished 3-3 on six-game homestand vs. **Oakland** (July 19-21; 2-1) and **Minnesota** (July 22-24; 1-2)...Yesterday's 1-0 win marked 8th shutout victory of season and second 1-0 win of 2013...Halos have dropped three of last four games games, are 4-7 in last 11 games, 8-9 this month and 38-35 since a 9-17 April...Club is 3-3 since ASB...With Monday's loss, the club fell into fourth place...Club is five games under .500 this late in a season (thru July 24) for first time since 1999 (42-54 on July 24)...**LAA is 7-3-1 in last 11 series**.

HANDSOME PITCHING: C.J. Wilson is 6-1 with a 1.69 ERA (48 IP – 9 ER) over his last seven starts...He has limited opponents to three earned runs or less in eight of last nine outings...He seeks a career-high fourth consecutive road win tonight...In his last six starts in Oakland, he is 4-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP -10 ER).

TURN BACK CLOCK GAME: The A's are hosting a 60's themed day on Saturday and the two clubs will wear throwback uniforms from 1969 for the afternoon game.

HAMILTON UPDATE: Josh Hamilton underwent Xray and MRI exams Monday (right ankle stiffness). The X-rays were negative while the MRI exam showed inflammation. Hamilton received an anti-inflammatory cortisone injection and is listed as day-to-day.

FAST FACTS: Angels' offense has been limited to 19 runs over last nine games (2.1 per)...Club has scored four runs or fewer in nine straight games, longest streak since April 22-May 1, 2012...Ernesto Frieri has the best save percentage (91%) in Angels history among relievers with at least 45 saves (48/53)... With Friday's win, Mike Scioscia became the 39th skipper (fifth active) in big league history to reach 1200 wins... 23 of the 38 others are Hall-of-Famers...

WEAVER YESTERDAY: Made third career start of at least eight innings and two or fewer hits allowed (all three have come against Minnesota)...Is 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (28.1 IP -- 1 ER) at home in July (0-2 with a 5.00 ERA at home in June)...First pitcher with three straight scoreless starts at Angel Stadium since Mark Gubicza in 1988-90...First Angel pitcher to do so since Nolan Ryan in 1976-77...Retired 19 straight after one-out single by Bernier in first inning (ended by Doumit walk).

LOOKING AHEAD: Seven of Angels' first 10 games out of the break are vs. the Oakland A's...13 of the Halos' first 20 second half contests are vs. A.L. West foes (7 vs. Oak., 6 vs. Tex.)...43 of club's 69 games (62%) in second half are against teams with .500 or better records...Club needs to go 46-23 after the break to reach the 90-win plateau.

DOWNS HOME COOKIN': Scott Downs worked 0.2 scoreless Tuesday night to bring his shutout streak to 29 games, equaling longest in A.L. this season (Jesse Crain) and one shy of Angels record (Francisco Rodriguez)...Downs hasn't allowed an ER in his last 23 games at Angel Stadium (17.2 IP). Only longer scoreless-games streak in Angel Stadium history: Scott Downs with 28 scoreless games (26 IP) from 2010-11.

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2013 series 6-3 (LAA has won three of last four)...Two of the three longest games in Angels' history have come against the A's (April 29, 2013, 19 innings & July 9, 1971, 20 innings)...Halos have lost three straight season series vs. A's (2010-2012)...Halos are 10-11 in last 21 games in Oakland, winning nine of last 14 games here...However, LAA has dropped 11 of last 15 to A's at Angel Stadium.

ALBERT AFTER: Albert Pujols owns a career .334 (1076/3219) average in the second half of the season, tops amongst active Major Leaguers and fifth-best in MLB history (min. 1800 AB).

BETTER BULLPEN: Halo relievers logged a 6-7 mark and a 4.23 ERA with seven saves and six blown saves in their first 41 games...Over last 58 games, Halo bullpen has an 8-5 record and a 3.66 ERA (172.1 IP - 70 ER) with 20 saves and two blown save.

INJURED ANGELS: LHP Sean Burnett (D.L. with a left elbow impingement since May 28) threw from mound Tuesday (20 pitches)...**Peter Bourjos** is on the 15-day D.L. (retro to 6/30) with a right wrist fracture (HBP on 6/29)...Aiming to begin swinging a bat this week...**Jason Vargas** is on the 15-day D.L. (retro to 6/18) as the result of a blood clot found in his left armpit area (surgery on 6/26)...He threw a bullpen Tuesday for first time since procedure (30 pitches).

HOT HALOS: Scott Downs has not allowed an earned run in 37 of his last 38 outings...<u>Each of his last 29 appearances (18 IP)</u> has been scoreless (equals longest scoreless-games streak in A.L. this season – Jesse Crain)...Since June 8 (38 games), Mike Trout is hitting .367 (55/150) with 25 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 6 HRs, 23 RBI and nine SBs...<u>Trout's career-best 15-game hit</u> streak was snapped yesterday...Youngest Angel with a hit streak of 15+ games since Aurelio Rodriguez in 1968 (16-game streak at age 20)...In 28 games since June 12, **Erick Aybar** is 40for-126 (.317) with 15 multi-hit games and 22 RBI.

AS JOSH GOES: Halos are 19-1 in last 20 games when Josh Hamilton has an RBI (13-0 in last 13 games)...He has logged four home runs, four doubles, 12 runs & 16 RBI while hitting safely in 15 of his last 20 games...<u>Halos have an 11-2 record in 2013 when Hamilton hits a HR.</u>

THIS 'N' THAT: Angels have played in a MLB-leading 33 one-run affairs (14-19)...24 of club's 52 losses have come by two runs or less...Mike Trout is one of three Major Leaguers this year with 15 home runs and 20 stolen bases...Angels signed 38 of their 39 2013 draft picks, best % in club history...LAA has committed 73 errors, tied for most in A.L...Halos lead MLB with 100 GIDP, 11 more than any other A.L. team...15 different Halo pitchers have recorded a victory this season, tied for second-most in the Majors...Jered Weaver and wife Kristin welcomed the birth of their first child July 5th - son Aden David Weaver...The spelling of name is in honor of the late Nick Adenhart.

FISH FACTS: Trout ranks second in A.L. with 53 extra-base hits and is on pace for 90 XBH, which would break Garret Anderson's club record of 88 in 2002...Trout reached the 50 HR/50 SB career mark faster than any player in A.L. history (266 games)...Angels are 32-17 this season when Trout scores a run (14-35 when he plays and doesn't score)...Halos have gone 46-7 when Trout scores more than once in his career (13-4 this year)...He has scored 67 runs (4th in A.L.) and ranks 3rd in A.L. with 126 hits and 219 total bases...Tied for MLB lead with 39 multi-hit games...FIRST HALE: Trout's first-half totals rank in the top three in Angels history in: hits (119), doubles (29), triples (8), extra-base hits (52), total bases (209) and times on base (170)...First player in Angels history with 50 extra-base hits and 20 stolen bases in the first half and the first Halo with 55 RBI and 20 stolen bases before the Break...Only Angel ever with 29 doubles, eight triples, 15 HRs and 21 SBs in a season...Youngest player in MLB history with 15 HR and 20 steals in first half and the youngest since 1916 with at least 50 extra-base hits in the first half.

• Makes 21st start of regular season tonight and 11th on the road in 2013...Second consecutive start against Oakland and fourth overall this season.

• Ranks second in the Majors with an average of 109.6 pitches per start this season...Leads all Angels pitchers with 118 strikeouts in 2013.

• LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in finest start of the season Saturday against the A's...Pitched 8.1 shutout innings while allowing three hits and two walks and recording eight strikeouts...Marked longest outing as an Angel and the first time pitching into the ninth inning since complete game shutout for Texas on September 6, 2011 at Tampa Bay.

- Earned 10th win of the season Friday, becoming just third player in MLB history to record four straight seasons with 10 or more wins after logging three consecutive double-digit save seasons (Derek Lowe & Ryan Dempster).
- 15 of 20 starts have been quality starts this season, including 10 of last 13 and each of last four.
- Has allowed 10 unearned runs this season, tied-most in the A.L.

• VS. OAKLAND: OWNS a 9-7 career record with five saves and a 3.41 ERA (126.2 IP – 48 ER) in 44 games (15 starts) vs. A's...This season is 2-0 with a 3.41 ERA (20.2 IP - 6 ER) in first three starts against Athletics.

• AT O.CO COLISEUM: In 20 career games (seven starts) at the Coliseum, owns a 4-3 record with a 2.98 ERA (54.1 IP – 18 ER) and 48 strikeouts...As a starter, is 4-2 with a 2.49 ERA (43.1 IP – 12 ER)...Since joining Angels, is 3-1 with a 2.59 ERA (24.1 IP – 7 ER) in four starts in Oakland.

Opened the 2013 season by pitching exactly six innings in each of his first four starts (ties franchise record).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

• Is 66-51 with six complete games, one shutout, 52 saves and a 3.62 ERA (1,039 IP - 414 ER) in 379 career appearances (127 starts).
