## 2013 SUMMARY

- In his only season with the Mets, appeared in 23 games...Went 11-for-61 (.180) at the plate with two home runs and eight RBI...Hit a grand slam on Opening Day off the Padres' Brad Brach in the Mets' 11-2 win.
- Appeared in 32 games for the triple-A Las Vegas 51s from May 4 to June 9, hitting .268 (33/123) with four stolen bases, five home runs and 12 RBI.

## CAREER SUMMARY

- Originally signed by the Arizona Diamondbacks as their fifth-round pick of the 2008 amateur draft.
- After three full years in the minor leagues, had a breakthrough 2011 season at triple-A Reno...Hit .354 for the Aces, stealing 30 bases on 33 attempts on his way to making the Pacific Coast League and Baseball America Triple-A All-Star teams...Hit for the cycle on June 7 vs. Salt Lake, going 5-for-6 with four RBI.
- Made his Major League debut for the D'backs on July 26, 2011, starting in left field against the Padres...First Major League hit was a pinch-hit single off the Dodgers' Scott Elbert on July 30...Best Major League game was a 4-for-4 outing with a double and his first Major League home run on August 28.
- Appeared in two postseason games for the Diamondbacks in the NLDS, delivering a two-run, pinch-hit single off Randy Wolf in Game 4 in his only playoff at-bat.
- Acquired by Oakland along with right-handed pitchers Ryan Cook and Jarrod Parker in exchange for left-handed pitcher Craig Breslow, right-handed pitcher Trevor Cahill and cash on December 9, 2011.
- Appeared in 38 games for the Athletics in 2012, hitting .269 in three different stints with the club...Went on the disabled list for the first time in his career on June 22 with a sprained left ankle...Played 60 games for triple-A Sacramento, making at least 14 appearances at each of the three outfield positions.
- Traded to the Mets for minor league infielder Jefry Marte on December 18, 2012.

- Full name is Collin Brennan Cowgill...Voted Mr. Baseball for the state of Kentucky in 2004 as a senior at Henry Clay High School in Lexington.

- Had Tommy John surgery in September 2011.
- Signed with Kansas City prior to the 2012 season but did not pitch until July following rehab from Tommy John surgery...Made 19 appearances in Royals minor league system, pitching to a 0-2 record and 10.45 ERA (20.2 IP – 24 ER).
- Current streak of 113.1 IP (111 games) without a win is the longest active streak in the Majors...Last win (Majors or minors) was with the Diamondbacks on September 9, 2009 vs. LAD.

## 2013 SUMMARY

- After being released by the Pittsburgh Pirates on March 23rd, signed a minor league deal with the Angels on April 10th and was assigned to Triple-A Salt Lake from extended spring training on April 17th.
- Hit .305 (40-for-131) with six home runs, eight doubles and 28 RBI in 37 games for Salt Lake.
- His six home runs and 28 RBI both rank second amongst Salt Lake players this season.
- Has appeared at first base (five games), right field (nine games) and DH (23 games) for the Bees.
- In spring training for the Pirates, batted .139 (5-for-36) with one home run and six RBI.

## CAREER SUMMARY

- Last appeared in a Major League contest on June 18, 2011 while playing with the San Diego Padres...Is one home run shy of 125 and 10 RBI shy of 500 in his Big League career.
- Owns two career multi-home run games (April 10, 2010 vs. San Diego and May 16, 2007 vs. Arizona) and three career grand slams (June 16, 2007 vs. Tampa Bay, June 7, 2008 vs. Milwaukee and September 11, 2010 @ Toronto)...Has also homered three times as a pinch hitter (September 13, 2004 @ Arizona, September 24, 2006 vs. Atlanta and July 29, 2010 vs. Pittsburgh).
- Has made 755 appearances (722 starts) in right field, 53 appearances (40 starts) at first base and two appearances in left field (one start on September 17, 2004) during his Major League career.
- Made his Major League debut on May 1, 2004 as part of a doubleheader vs. Atlanta, where he went a combined 4-for-5 with a triple, home run, two RBI and two runs scored...Collected a pinch hit single off Atlanta's Kevin Gryboski in the first game of the twin bill for his first career hit...Started the second game of the doubleheader, going 3-for-4 with a two-run HR off John Thompson for his first career HR.
- Spent first full big league season with Colorado in 2005; ranked third in walks, fourth in RBI and on-base percentage and 10th in slugging percentage among N.L. rookies.
- Became one of four left-handed hitters in Rockies history to surpass 20 home runs in a season in 2006, joining Todd Helton, Larry Walker and Jeromy Burnitz...Recorded 16 outfield assists in 2006, which ranked second in Majors behind Alfonso Soriano (22).

- A part of 2007 National League Championship Colorado Rockies club that won 14 of last 15 regular season games including the dramatic 9-8, 13-inning win over San Diego in game 163.
- Established career highs in most offensive categories for the 2007 National League Champion Rockies, where he was twice named the National League Player-of-the-Week.
- Was named to the National League All-Star team in 2009...Hit his 100th career home run on June 27, 2009 off Oakland's Trevor Cahill.

- In 2007, appeared in 13 post-season games for the National League Champion Rockies, posting a .256 (11-for-43) batting average with one home run, one triple, four runs scored and four RBI.
