#### A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 7-4...are 4-2 in Los Angeles and 3-2 in Oakland...have scored 68 runs in 11 games this year...last year, the A's scored 60 runs in 19 games against the Angels the entire season...are 24-1 against the Angels over the last three years when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in six of their last 13 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in four of those games...have won the season series from Los Angeles in each of the prev two seasons and are 28-21 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 393-317 against the Angels...that includes 202-151 in Oakland and 191-166 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 442-394 against the Angels

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jed Lowrie** had his 13<sup>th</sup> game of three or more hits yesterday, which is one more than Crisp's team leading total from 2012.

Derek Norris is hitting .308 in July after batting a combined .163 in May and June...has three home runs in 14 games in July after hitting three in 58 games over the first three months of the season.

Eric Sogard is batting .350 (7 for 20) since the All-Star Break...9 of his last 14 hits are for extra bases (seven doubles, two home runs).

## THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1956 Hector Lopez and Vic Power have five hits each but the A's lose 10-9 to New York in 14 innings...in 1996 Geronimo Berroa and Matt Stairs homer in the A's 6-4 loss at Toronto...it is the 23<sup>rd</sup> consecutive game in which the A's hit a homer, a club record which ended the following day...in 2008 Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings to extend his career opening scoreless streak to a Major League record 27.0 innings, breaking the previous mark of 25 set by George McQuillian of the 1907 Philadelphia Phillies...the streak would reach 39.0 innings before he allowed his first run.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's increased their lead in the American League West to a season-high four games with the win last night...that is the A's largest lead in the West since they finished the 2006 season with a four-game lead...have not led by five games since Sept. 28, 2006...are 4-4 since the All-Star Break and are a season-high tying 17 games over .500 for the fifth time this year at 60-43...that is the third best record in the AL and fifth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 103 games since the 1992 club was also 60-43 (won game 104)...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 21<sup>st</sup> consecutive day...those are the A's lost ground in the West because of a loss was June 23...have spent 46 days in sole possession of first this year, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 16-9 since June 25 (third best in the majors)...are 117-69 (.629) since July 1 of last year, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (Cincinnati, 113-76)...are 154-111 (.581) since the start of the 2012 season, which is the best record in the AL and second best in the majors (Cincinnati, 156-110)...lost two of three to Los Angeles last weekend to snap a six-series winning streak, which was the A's longest such streak since July 27-Aug. 16, 2006 when they also won six straight...it was the first time the A's lost a series since they dropped two of three at Seattle, June 21-23.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.95 ERA (70 er in 213.1 ip) over the last 24 games and now have a 3.60 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League...also lead the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.294) and fewest walks (246), rank second in opponents batting average (.242), third in opponents slugging percentage (.381) and fourth in shutouts (9)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 80 consecutive games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 30-11 with a 3.04 ERA (133 er in 393.2 ip) and .230 (338 for 1471) opponents batting average over the last 61 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 44-32 with a 3.82 ERA (269 er in 634.0 ip) for the season...lead the AL in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in ERA and innings pitched, tied for second in complete games (4) and third in wins...the four complete game shutouts are the most by an A's team since 2003 (5).

**OFFENSE:** The A's reached double figures in hits last night (10) for the first time since July y at Kansas City (15)...are now batting .195 (87 for 447) with 40 runs scored over the last 14 games (2.86 runs per game)...however, are 8-6 over that span...are batting .243 for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...lead the majors in walks (381)...A's pinch hitters are batting .128 (11 for 86), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (101), are tied for the lead in walks (14) and tied for third in home runs (2).

**IN JULY:** The A's are 12-8 in the month of July, which is the fourth best record in the American League...need one more win to clinch a winning record in the month...currently have seven consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...rank last in the majors in batting (.214, 139 for 649) and doubles (23) in July and last in the AL in runs (69)...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .226 in 1977...have the second lowest ERA in the AL (2.94, 58 er in 177.1 ip) and are tied for the fewest walks (42) and home runs (14).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (1-1), Toronto (three games) and Texas (three games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of their next 25 games and 29 of their next 42 at home...also have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Boston and have won 21 of the last 27 home games...are 31-16 (.660) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Atlanta, 32-15)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 14-16 against the West since May 10 while going 28-9 against everyone else...are batting .260 (418 for 1610) with 240 runs (46 games, 5.22 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .229 (433 for 1894) with 217 runs (57 games, 3.81 runs per game) against the rest of baseball.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 21-12 (.636) in one-run games...are tied with Arizona for the Major League lead in one-run wins...have the second best one-run record in the American League and are tied for the third most games...are 7-3 (.700) in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 13-7 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...have six "walk-off" wins, which is tied for third most in the AL...lost Tuesday night when leading after eight innings for the first time since Aug. 4, 2012 against Toronto.

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list Thursday, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...the A's are 40-24 (.625) in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Detroit, 37-23)...are 20-19 (.513) during the day...nine of the A's last 13 home runs have either tied the game or put the A's ahead...have turned just 73 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...have been charged with 24 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21<sup>st</sup> start of the season...the A's are 11-9 (.550) in his starting assignments this year and 31-20 (.608) in his career...his teams are 36-20 (.643) in his 56 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in 14 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

BRIEFLY: Is 2-3 with a 5.22 ERA (23 er in 39.2 ip) and .275 (44 for 160) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...went 3-0 with a 3.86 over his first three starts, 0-5 with a 3.62 ERA over his next five and 3-0 with a 3.66 ERA over his next five after that...the five-game losing streak was the longest of his career...was the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to last year...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .202 (21 for 104) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the American League...opponents are batting .333 (41 for 123) with 14 doubles, seven home runs (.618 slugging percentage) and five walks (.359 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average and slugging percentage are fifth highest in the AL and the on-base percentage is 10<sup>th</sup> highest...allowed a .319 batting average, .555 slugging percentage and .358 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning last year.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-3 with a 3.20 ERA (18 er in 50.2 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-5 with a 4.88 ERA (39 er in 72.0 ip) in 12 starts on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 11-7 with a 2.89 ERA (48 er in 149.1 ip) and .242 (137 for 566) opponents average in 23 starts in Oakland compared to 10-11 with a 4.85 ERA (88 er in 163.1 ip) and .294 (195 for 664) opponents average in 28 starts on the road...has allowed 27 of his 43 home runs with the A's on the road.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last three starts after surrendering at least one home run in eight consecutive starts from May 24 to June 30 (12 home runs total)...has allowed 19 home runs for the season, which is tied for ninth most in the American League...16 have been hit by right-handers, which is second most in the majors (Sabathia, NYY 18)...surrendered a home run to Dunn June 8, his first home run allowed to a left-hander since Sept. 14, 2012 (Chris Davis, BAL)...14 of the 19 home runs have been solo shots...10 have come in the first two innings of a game.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 7-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 er in 91.0 ip) and 10 home runs allowed in 15 starts at night compared to 1-3 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) and nine home runs allowed in five starts during the day...is tied for eighth in the American League in wins at night...in two seasons with the A's, he is 17-10 with a 3.43 ERA (85 in 223.0 ip) in 36 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 5.12 ERA (51 er in 89.2 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received just eight runs of support in his eight losses this year (46.2 ip, 1.54 RSA)...has received just 20 runs of support in his 18 losses in two seasons with the A's (105.1 ip, 1.71 RSA)...has received no support nine times over the last two years and one run of support eight times...the A's have been shut out seven times this year, three times in games started by Milone...is 7-1 with three runs of support or more this year and 16-3 in his career.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 4.28 ERA (19 er in 40.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 2.09 ERA (9 er in 38.2 ip) in innings three and four and a 5.93 ERA (29 er in 44.0) from the fifth inning on.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: Did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts *May 1* against Los Angeles...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks (Catfish Hunter, Vida Blue)...walked three batters in back-to-back starts for the first time in his career *May 12* Seattle and *May 18* against Kansas City...snapped his five-game losing streak in the A's 2-1 win over the Royals...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago *June 8*...walked a career-high tying four batters a no decision in the A's 7-3 win over Cincinnati *June 25* in Oakland...it was his first four-walk game in over a year (June 13, 2012 at Colorado...allowed a career-high tying three home runs but picked up the win in a 7-5 decision against St. Louis *June 30* in Oakland...tossed a career-low 2.2 innings in a 5-0 loss at Pittsburgh *July 10* 

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Houston on Monday...the A's committed an error in each of the first three innings and he was charged with three runs, two earned, over that stretch...Maxwell doubled, stole third and scored on a Lowrie error in the second...Carter had a RBI single in the third and he scored from first on the next play on a Green error...left trailing 3-2.

MILONE vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 3-2 with a 5.33 ERA (27.0 ip, 36 h, 16 r, 16 er, 5 bb, 22 so, 5 hr) in five career starts...is 1-2 with a 5.29 ERA (10 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts in Anaheim...is 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in an 11-5 A's victory at Los Angeles April 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a Hamilton sacrifice fly in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more in the third before he allowed another run in the third...had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Callaspo in the fifth...then took the loss in a 5-4 decision at Oakland May 1...did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced, with the lone exception being a two-out solo home run by Kendrick in the second...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Shuck in the fifth and a pair of solo home runs to Trout and Trumbo in the sixth.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (6-6, 3.79 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 21<sup>st</sup> start of the season...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his last 10 starts while tossing at least three innings in each start...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history (11, Rich Harden)...has held the opposition to a .175 batting average during this stretch...is 4-0 with a 2.17 ERA over his last 10 starts...the winning streak matches his career high...has five consecutive no decisions, which is one short of the Oakland record of six...is 5-1 with a 2.39 ERA over his last 13 starts (since May 11)...the ERA is second lowest in the American League over that span to Colón (1.70)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at Houston last Tuesday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 2-2 with a 3.16 ERA in six career starts against Los Angeles...including 1-0 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 5 so) in two starts this year.

The A's bullpen has allowed eight runs in its past four games (7 er in 11.2 ip, 5.40 ERA) after tossing 12.2 scoreless innings over its previous five contests...has a 3.14 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the fewest walks (89) and strikeouts (253) in the AL, is tied for first in opponents on-base percentage (.294) and has allowed the second fewest home runs (23)...first batters faced are 60 for 260 (.231) with 13 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, 270 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL and have the third lowest on-base percentage.

#### **CAREER HIGHLIGHTS**

Made his Major League debut with Tampa Bay in 2012 and went 0 for 25 in 18 games...was originally drafted by the Rays in the 12th round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft and hit .299 with 44 home runs and 300 RBI in 521 games over six seasons in the Rays farm system...was named Rays Minor League Player of the Year in 2011 after batting a combined .298 with 35 doubles, 17 home runs and 105 RBI in 128 games with Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham...led the Florida State League in batting in 2010 (.345) and was a midseason and postseason All-Star.

#### 2012 HIGHLIGHTS

Saw his first Major League action over three stints with the Rays and made the Opening Day roster... appeared in 18 games, including four starts (three at designated hitter, one at catcher)...also appeared in two games in left field...spent the remainder of the season with Triple-A Durham...went hitless in 25 at bats with the Rays, the longest hitless streak to start a major league career in franchise history... is one of two players since 1990 to go hitless through his first 25 career at-bats, joining Oakland's Chris Carter in 2010 (0-for-33)...since 1900, the longest hitless streak to begin a career by a position player is 0-for-43 by shortstop Chub Aubrey of the Boston Beaneaters in 1903...optioned to Durham April 20 as B.J. Upton was activated from the disabled list...joined the Rays again May 14 when Desmond Jennings went on the DL, but was returned to Durham May 29 when Hideki Matsui was added to the roster... promoted again on Sept. 5...threw out the only base runner who attempted to steal, Jacoby Ellsbury on Sept. 17 vs. Boston...drew a pair of walks, both as a pinch-hitter in the ninth inning in September...on Sept. 15 at New York (AL) received a free pass from Rafael Soriano...on Sept. 20 vs. Boston, walked against Andrew Bailey to load the bases during a 6-run rally en route to a 7-4 walk-off victory, capped by B.J. Upton's walk-off, 3-run homer...named the winner of the 2012 Al Lopez Award as the Rays most outstanding rookie in spring...hit .323 while appearing at four positions; catcher, first base, left field and right field as well as designated hitter...hit .272 with nine home runs and 43 RBI in 94 games for Durham...split time between catcher (37 games), left field (23), first base (16), right field (12) and designated hitter (12)...batted .303 against right-handed pitchers compared to .209 against left-handers... named Rays Minor League Hitter of the Month in June after hitting .364 with six doubles, five home runs. 19 RBI and 24 runs scored

- Had successful arthroscopic surgery on his right knee Feb. 14...the surgery, a lateral meniscectomy, was performed by Dr. Douglas Freedberg in Scottsdale, Ariz.
- Did not pitch in a Spring Training game until March 21.
- Is on his fifth consecutive Opening Day roster (2011-13 with Oakland, 2009-10 with Tampa Bay)
- Made his 400th career appearance April 6 at Houston.
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched a scoreless sixth inning in the
  game at Citi Field July 16 (1 bb, 1 so)...at the age of 35 years, 198 days, he was the fifth oldest AllStar in Athletics history...he was the first Australian pitcher named to the Midsummer Classic, the
  second overall (Dave Nilsson, MIL 1999).

#### **JERRY BLEVINS**

• Was on the A's Opening Day roster for the fifth consecutive season.

#### **YOENIS CÉSPEDES**

- Became the A's 14th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 14 years April 1 against Seattle.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 13 with a strained muscle in his left hand...it was his
  second career stint on the DL as he was out from May 7-31 last year with a muscle strain in his left
  hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) with a home run and four RBI on a three-game rehab assignment with
  Sacramento...was reinstated April 28.
- Had his first career four-strikeout game April 29 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Had his first career four-RBI game April 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...matched that mark June 21
  at Seattle.
- Was hit by a pitch twice May 1 against Los Angeles (AL), tying the Oakland record (32nd time, last: Josh Willingham at Seattle, April 24, 2011).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 16 streak with his third inning single May 12 at Seattle.
- Had a career-high 12-game hitting streak from May 18 to 30...went 15 for 50 (.300) with five
  doubles, a triple, two home runs and nine RBI during the hitting streak.
- Had the first two two-homer games of his career June 4 at Milwaukee and June 6 at Chicago...
  became the first Athletic with two multi-homer games over a three-game stretch since John Jaha did
  it in back-to-back games June 19-20, 1999 at Detroit...added his third two-homer game June 21 at
  Seattle.
- Went 0 for 4 June 29 against St. Louis to snap a 12-game interleague hitting streak dating back to 2012 (15 for 50, .300)...the streak tied for the third longest interleague hitting streak in Oakland history.
- Stole two bases July 12 against Boston for the second time in his career...the other time was also against the Red Sox (Sept. 1, 2012).

#### **JESSE CHAVEZ**

- Tossed 5.2 innings June 13 against New York (AL), which was the longest relief appearance of his
  career.
- Recorded a career-high tying seven strikeouts June 13 against New York (AL).

#### BARTOLO COLÓN

- Did not walk a batter over his first three starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 to start the season with three consecutive games of five or more innings and no walks...had a four-game streak with no walks and at least five innings pitched dating back to 2012, which was the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 seven-inning win at Boston April 23...it was his 10th career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...the seven-inning shutout was third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip).

- Walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, snapping a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.
- Did not strike out a batter May 14 against Texas, his eighth career start without a strikeout...it was
  the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings.
- Walked two batters May 20 at Texas, snapping a season-opening streak of eight consecutive starts
  with one walk or fewer and two innings or more...that was the longest season-opening streak by an
  Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Had an 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 20 to 31.
- Struck out nine batters May 26 at Houston in his first start after turning 40 to set an Athletics record
  for strikeouts by a 40-year old...the previous high was seven by Tom Candiotti (July 31, 1998 vs.
  Cleveland) and Don Sutton (April 22, 1985 vs. California)...is just the fourth pitcher in Oakland
  history to start a game at age 40...the other three are Tommy John (last start at 42 years, 126 days),
  Candiotti (last start at 41 years, 275 days) and Sutton (last start at 40 years, 155 days)
- Tossed a five-hit shutout May 31 against Chicago (AL) to become the second 40-year old in Oakland history with a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago).
- Had his career-high tying eight-game winning streak snapped July 3 by Chicago (NL)...also won
  eight straight from July 21-Sept. 10, 2005...had a 1.37 ERA and surrendered just one home run in
  59.0 innings during the streak, which spanned eight starts...it was the longest winning streak by an
  Athletic since Dan Haren had a 10-game winning streak from April 18-July 1, 2007...fell one short
  of the Oakland record for consecutive starts with a win.
- The loss to the Cubs was his first home loss of the season, snapping an eight-game winning streak
  in the Coliseum dating back to Aug. 2, 2012...that was the longest home winning streak by an A's
  pitcher since Mark Mulder won 10 straight from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...posted a 1.85 ERA
  during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts, and walked just seven batters (0.81 per nine
  innings).
- Was charged with a wild pitch July 3 against Chicago (NL), his first since May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL)...it snapped a streak of 443.0 innings without a wild pitch...it was his first wild pitch in 40 starts with the A's, which was the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 42 by Catfish Hunter (June 25, 1972-June 27, 1973).
- Went 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June to win American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the fourth time in his career...led the AL in ERA and tied for second in wins...it marked the third time in his career he won five games in a month (August 1999 and August 2005)...it was the fourth lowest single month ERA of his career (1.13 in May 2002, 1.39 in June 1998 and 1.72 in August 2005)...since 2006, the only other Oakland pitcher to win five games in a month is Gio Gonzalez (Sept., 2011).
- Was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005)...
  at the age of 40 years and 53 days, he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history...Dennis Eckersley,
  at age 37 in 1992, is second oldest...pitched the Sunday before the game and was replaced on the
  active roster.

#### RYAN COOK

 Allowed his first run of the season on the road May 26 at Houston, snapping a 22.2-inning scoreless streak on the road dating back to Aug. 11, 2012...the road scoreless streak is third longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

#### COCO CRISP

- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his
  eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...added two more
  on June 3 at Milwaukee and June 11 against New York (AL)...in Oakland history, only Rickey
  Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more...is tied for fourth in Athletics history with
  Max Bishop behind Henderson, Eddie Joost (19) and Campaneris (13).
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).

- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.
- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.
- · His seventh inning RBI single July 13 against Boston was the 500th RBI of his career.

#### JOSH DONALDSON

- Had his first career game-ending RBI April 12 against Detroit, a home run in the bottom of the 12th inning...his second was a RBI single in the 11th inning July 14 against Boston.
- Was a perfect 4 for 4 April 27 against Baltimore, matching his career high in hits (August 17, 2012 vs. Cleveland)...also had four-hit games May 14 against Texas and May 25 at Houston.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of April 22-28...it was his first career
  weekly honor...went 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles (.864 slugging percentage), 10
  RBI and seven walks (1 sf, .633 on-base percentage) in seven games.
- Had a career-high seven-game hitting streak from May 11-18 (12 for 26, .462).
- Made his Major League debut at shortstop in the ninth inning May 24 at Houston...had one appearance at shortstop in the minors with Triple-A Sacramento on Aug. 2, 2012.
- Hit his first career grand slam in the sixth inning June 7 at Chicago, turning a 3-0 deficit into a 4-3 win.

#### **SEAN DOOLITTLE**

Had a career-high tying 13.1-inning scoreless streak from April 29 to May 27.

#### NATE FREIMAN

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 3 against Seattle and had a RBI single
  off Joe Saunders in the second inning for his first ML hit...added another single in the fourth inning
  for his first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run April 22 against Houston, a three-run shot off Erik Bedard in the first inning...it snapped a 0 for 11 streak.
- Was named American League Rookie of the Month for May after batting .351 with three doubles, one home run and nine RBI in 14 games.
- Had his second career three-hit game June 11 and both have come against the Yankees in games started by Sabathia (also May 3).
- Had his first career "walk-off" hit June 13 against New York, a RBI single in the 18th inning off Rivera.

#### **JOHN JASO**

- Is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2011; Seattle, 2012).
- Hit his first career pinch hit home run April 9 at Los Angeles, a three-run shot off Jepsen in the seventh to give the A's a 7-5 lead.
- Played first base May 24 at Houston, his second career appearance at first base (Aug. 25, 2010 at Los Angeles-AL).
- Had a career-high 17-game reaching base streak from May 21 to June 18...hit .345 with a .456 on-base percentage during the streak, which included a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25-June 13 (14 for 38, .368).

#### **JED LOWRIE**

- Had a career-high tying four RBI April 15 against Houston (fourth time, last: September 19, 2011 vs. Baltimore).
- Went 4 for 4 April 19 at Tampa, the third four-hit game of his career...added his fourth June 1 agaisnt Chicago (AL).
- Went 2 for 9 in the 19-inning game April 29 against Los Angeles to tie the Oakland record for at bats in a game (11th time, last: Mike Heath at Texas, July 1, 1979).
- Set an Oakland record for hits in the month of April with 34...broke the previous mark of 33 held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...had 11 doubles, which tied the Oakland April record (Mark Ellis, 2003).
- Went a career-high 11 consecutive games without a RBI from June 4 to 15.
- Homered June 21 at Seattle to snap a career-high 62-game homerless streak.
- Hit safely in each of his first 12 interleague games, which tied for the third longest interleague hitting streak in Oakland history...had a 14-game interleague hitting streak dating back to last year.
- Had a career-high tying nine-game hitting streak from June 20 to 30 (also Aug. 4-21, 2010 and April 27-May 6, 2012)...hit .457 (16 for 35) during the streak.

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Matched his career high with five RBI April 10 at Los Angeles (also September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) after driving in four runs the night before.
- Had a career-high four strikeouts April 12 against Detroit...matched that figure April 29 against Los Angeles and May 12 at Seattle.
- Was on the paternity list from April 16 to 18 for the birth of his second son, Brody. (April 16).
- Went 0 for 4 April 21 at Tampa Bay to snap a 15-game road hitting streak dating back to Sept. 20, 2012...hit .463 (25 for 54) during the streak.
- Hit the game-ending home run in the bottom of the 19th inning April 29 against Los Angeles, his third career walk-off home run (last: September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) and fifth career game-ending hit (also a double and single)...also homered in the sixth inning, his second career multi-homer game (June 12, 2012 at Colorado)...had 12 innings between home runs to become the 17th player in Major League history to go at least 12 innings between home runs in one game...is the second Athletic to do it...Reggie Jackson also went 12 innings between home runs June 11, 1969...had four strikeouts to become the second Major Leaguer since 1916 to have at least two home runs and four strikeouts in one game...Evan Longoria did it August 4, 2009 for Tampa Bay against Boston.
- Made his first career appearance in center field May 9 (also May 13).
- Hit the 7000th home run in Oakland history May 13 against Texas off Justin Grimm in the third inning...hit the 12,000th home run in Athletics franchise history June 5 at Milwaukee, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning.
- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the
  other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base
  in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his
  career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the
  sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)...
  the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

#### **PAT NESHEK**

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
  going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
  Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
  1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).

 Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

#### JARROD PARKER

- Began the season with a career-high four-game losing streak...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned five starts from April 2 to 25.
- Allowed a career-high four home runs in a 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...prior to that, had allowed
  more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two.
- Matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings June 13 against New York (fifth time, third time against New York)...had a no decision in the 3-2, 18-inning win.
- Left his June 29 start against St. Louis after 3.2 innings with tightness in his right hamstring.

#### **SHANE PETERSON**

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

#### **JOSH REDDICK**

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career
  stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases
  during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento
  (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).
- Snapped a career-high 30-game homerless streak with a solo shot in the seventh inning off Quintana June 6 at Chicago (AL).
- · Had his third career four-hit game June 16 against Seattle.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 19 consecutive games from June 18 to July 13... hit .262 (17 for 65) with a .329 on-base percentage (7 bb, 1 sf) during the streak.
- Struck out a career-high tying four times July 14 against Boston.

#### CHRIS RESOP

 Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

#### FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

#### **ADAM ROSALES**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.
- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up
  going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by
  a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).
- Drew his first two walks of the season April 30 against Los Angeles, snapping a 28-game streak without a walk...his last walk prior to that was August 4, 2012.
- Started in the leadoff spot for the first time in his career May 3 at New York and hit Sabathia's first pitch of the game for his first career leadoff home run.
- Snapped a 0 for 24 streak with his eighth inning home run May 28 against San Francisco.

Struck out as a pinch hitter in the 10th inning June 13 against New York (AL) and ended up going 0 for 4 with a career-high four strikeouts...is the first player in Oakland history to strikeout four times in a game that he didn't start.

#### **SCOTT SIZEMORE**

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with
  a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3...
  according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back
  games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

#### **SETH SMITH**

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.
- Homered July 7 at Kansas City to snap a career-high 90-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since April 27, 2012.

#### **DAN STRAILY**

 Struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in 6.2 innings (sixth time, last: Tim Hudson, Sept. 10, 1999 at Tampa Bay) in an 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter.

#### **STEPHEN VOGT**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St.
  Louis off Joe Kelly...the hitless streak was the second longest career-opening hitless streak by a
  non-pitcher since 1973 (Chris Carter, OAK; 33 in 2010).

#### **CHRIS YOUNG**

 Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.

- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).
- His sixth inning double April 11 at Los Angeles was the 200th of his career.
- Had his 11th career regular season multi-homer game April 24 at Boston (also has one in the post-season).
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 30 to May 17 with a strained left quad...it was his second
  career stint on the DL...made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento May 16 and went 1
  for 1 with two walks, a run and a stolen base in a start in center field against Oklahoma City.
- Had back-to-back three-hit games for the second time in his career May 24 and 25 at Houston (Aug. 16-17, 2007).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts June 26 against Cincinnati...it was the fifth four-strikeout game of his career, but his first since May 20, 2009 at Florida.
