LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play Game #102, the third contest of a seven-game road trip (1-1) to Oakland (July 25-28; 1-1) and Texas (July 29-31)...Angels have dropped five of last seven on road (won previous seven road affairs)...Club is 5-8 in last 13 games, 9-10 this month and 39-36 since a 9-17 April...Club is 4-4 since ASB...With Monday's loss, the club fell into fourth place...Club is five games under .500 this late in a season (thru July 26) for first time since 1999 (42-56 on July 25)...**LAA is 7-3-1 in last 11 series...**43 of club's 69 games (62%) in second half are against teams with .500 or better records...Club needs to go 46-23 after the break to reach the 90-win plateau.

SUCCESS vs. MILONE: Several Angels have found success facing Tommy Milone: Josh Hamilton (6/14), Howie Kendrick (6/14), Erick Aybar (5/11) and Albert Pujols (7/14; six doubles).

GROOVY GAME: The A's are hosting a 60's themed day today and the two clubs will wear throwback uniforms from 1969...The '69 Angels roster featured the likes of SS Jim Fregosi, 2B Sandy Alomar, RHP Andy Messersmith and LHP Clyde Wright.

HI, MY NAME IS: With J.C. Gutierrez's appearance in Thursday's game, the club has used 41 different players (22 pitchers) this season...Halo record for pitchers used in a season is 29 in 1996.

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2013 series 7-4 (LAA has won four of last six)...Two of the three longest games in Angels' history have come against the A's (April 29, 2013, 19 innings & July 9, 1971, 20 innings)...Halos have lost three straight season series vs. A's (2010-2012)...**Halos are 11-12 in last 23 games in Oakland, winning 10 of last 16 games here...**However, LAA has dropped 11 of last 15 to A's at Angel Stadium.

UP NEXT - @ TEXAS: These two teams meet for first time since late April...Rangers lead 2013 series 4-2...Halos have dropped three of last four in Arlington...Angels claimed the 2012 season series (10-9)...**Angels have outscored the Rangers 70-34 in last nine victories...**From 2005-08, Angels held a 48-28 advantage over Texas...Since 2009, Rangers lead series 45-35...Since start of 2012, Mike Trout hit .338 with six HR and 17 RBI last season while Albert Pujols posted a .324 clip with five HR and 17 RBI.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS: On Wednesday, the Angels claimed RHP J.C. Gutierrez off of waivers from the Royals...Thursday, the club designated RHP Billy Buckner for assignment to add Gutierrez to 25-man roster...The Mets and Angels completed a minor trade Thursday...Mets received an international slot bonus amount in exchange for minor league OF Julio Concepcion and minor league RHP Andres Perez...Concepcion will be assigned to Orem and Perez will report to the AZL.

FAST FACTS: Seven of the Halos' last eight home runs have been solo shots...**Angels offense has been limited to 31 runs over previous 11 games (2.8 per)**...Club has scored four runs or fewer in 10 of last 11 games...Ernesto Frieri has the best save percentage (91%) in Angels history among relievers with at least 45 saves (48/53)...With the July 19 win, Mike Scioscia became the 39th skipper (fifth active) in big league history to reach 1200 wins...23 of the 38 others are Hall-of-Famers.

GREAT SCOTT: Scott Downs worked 0.2 scoreless Tuesday night to bring his shutout streak to 29 games, equaling longest in A.L. this season (Jesse Crain) and one shy of Angels record (Francisco Rodriguez)...Downs hasn't allowed an ER in his last 23 games at Angel Stadium (17.2 IP)...Only longer scoreless-games streak in Angel Stadium history: Scott Downs with 28 scoreless games (26 IP) from 2010-11.

BETTER BULLPEN: Halo relievers logged a 6-7 mark and a 4.23 ERA with seven saves and six blown saves in their first 41 games...Over last 60 games, Halo bullpen has an 8-5 record and a 3.65 ERA (177.1 IP – 72 ER) with 20 saves and two blown saves.

INJURED ANGELS: LHP Sean Burnett (D.L. with a left elbow impingement since May 28) threw from mound Tuesday (20 pitches)...Peter Bourjos is on the 15-day D.L. (retro to 6/30) with a right wrist fracture (HBP on 6/29)...Aiming to begin swinging a bat this week...Jason Vargas is on the 15-day D.L. (retro to 6/18) as the result of a blood clot found in his left armpit area (surgery on 6/26)...He threw a bullpen Tuesday for first time since procedure (30 pitches) and continues to throw off the mound every three days.

HOT HALOS: C.J. Wilson is 7-1 with a 1.96 ERA (55 IP – 12 ER) over his last eight starts...His 1.97 ERA in the span leads the A.L. (min. 7 starts)...Scott Downs has not allowed an earned run in 37 of his last 38 outings...Each of his last 29 appearances (18 IP) has been scoreless (equals longest scoreless-games streak in A.L. this season – Jesse Crain)...Since June 8 (38 games), Mike Trout is hitting .371 (59/159) with 26 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HRs, 27 RBI and nine SBs...Trout's career-best 15-game hit streak was snapped Wednesday...In 30 games since June 12, Erick Aybar is 42-for-133 (.316) with 16 multi-hit games and 22 RBI...Over his last 13 games, Albert Pujols is batting .333 (17/51) with four HRs and 13 RBI.

AS JOSH GOES: Halos are 20-1 in last 21 games when Josh Hamilton has an RBI (14-0 in last 14 such games)...He has logged four home runs, five doubles, 13 runs & 17 RBI while hitting safely in 17 of his last 22 games...Halos have an 11-2 record in 2013 when Hamilton hits a HR.

THIS 'N' THAT: Albert Pujols owns a career .334 (1080/3228) average in the second half of the season, tops amongst active Major Leaguers and fifth-best in MLB history (min. 1800 AB)...Angels have played in a MLB-leading 33 one-run affairs (14-19)...25 of club's 53 losses have come by two runs or less...Mike Trout is one of three Major Leaguers this year with 15 home runs and 20 stolen bases...**Angels signed 38 of their 39 2013 draft picks, best % in club history...**LAA has committed 74 errors, second most in A.L...Halos lead MLB with 101 GDP, 10 more than any other A.L. team...15 different Halo pitchers have recorded a victory this season, tied for second-most in the Majors...Jered Weaver and wife Kristin welcomed the birth of their first child July 5th - son Aden David Weaver...The spelling of name is in honor of the late Nick Adenhardt...**Since July 3rd, Halos have struggled with RISP batting at a .200 clip (24/120).**

FISH FACTS: Trout ranks second in A.L. with 54 extra-base hits and is on pace for 87 XBH...Club record for XBH in a season is 88 by Garret Anderson in 2002...Trout reached the 50 HR/50 SB career mark faster than any player in A.L. history (266 games)...Angels are 32-18 this season when Trout scores a run (15-35 when he plays and doesn't score)...Halos have gone 46-7 when Trout scores more than once in his career (13-4 this year)...He has scored 68 runs (4th in A.L.) and ranks 3rd in A.L. with 130 hits and 226 total bases...**Leads American League with 40 multi-hit games...FIRST HALE: Trout's** first-half totals rank in the top three in Angels history in: hits (119), doubles (29), triples (8), extra-base hits (52), total bases (209) and times on base (170)...**First player in Angels history with 50 extra-base hits and 20 stolen bases in the first half and the first Halo with 55 RBI and 20 stolen bases before the Break...** Only Angel ever with 29 doubles, eight triples, 15 HRs and 21 SBs in a season...Youngest player in MLB history with 15 HR and 20 steals in first half and the youngest since 1916 with at least 50 extra-base hits in the first half.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 27
(1994) 22 year-old Garret Anderson makes his ML debut at Anaheim Stadium vs. Oakland and finished 2-for-4 with both hits coming off Ron Darling; **(1995)** Jim Edmonds posted three RBI in the Angels' 9-3 win in Milwaukee, giving him 34 RBI for the month of July, tying Don Baylor's club-record for RBI in a month **(2011)** Ervin Santana throws a no-hitter at Cleveland, the eighth individual no-hitter (9th overall) in Angels' history and first since Mike Witt's perfect game in 1984.

- Making return to rotation for fifth start of the season...Joined the bullpen in May and has made last 26 appearances this season in relief.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed a scoreless inning in relief in last relief appearance on July 23 vs. Minnesota...Has pitched three scoreless innings in his two appearances since the All-Star Break.
- **LAST START:** Allowed a season-high seven earned runs on eight hits in 5.2 innings pitched on April 30 at Oakland.
- In four starts this season, has a 1-2 record and 5.54 ERA (26 IP – 16 ER) with 18 strikeouts...As a reliever, has gone 1-2 with one save and a 4.10 ERA (41.2 IP – 19 ER) and 30 strikeouts.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In five career appearances (one start) against the Athletics, owns an 0-1 record and 6.10 ERA (10.1 IP – 7 ER) with 10 strikeouts...All seven earned runs came in start earlier this season on April 30...Has pitched 4.2 scoreless innings in his career as a reliever against Oakland.
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** In three career appearances at the Coliseum, has an 0-1 record and 9.00 ERA (7 IP – 7 ER) with seven strikeouts...Pitched 1.1 scoreless innings in relief in Oakland last season before allowing seven runs in start at the Coliseum earlier this year.
- According to FanGraphs, leads the A.L. with an average fastball velocity of 95.2 MPH (min. 60 IP).

Making 11th start of 2013 and second since returning from disabled list...Second start vs. A's in 2013...Allowed two runs (one earned) on four hits in six innings pitched on April 29 at Oakland in only career game vs. A's...Is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA in three road starts this season.

IN THE 'PEN

#55 JOE BLANTON (RHP) 2013: .309 vs. LH, .327 vs. RH AGE: 32

- Joins the bullpen after first 20 outings of season came as a starting pitcher.
- In his 20 starts, has a 2-13 record and 5.66 ERA...Leads the American League in losses, hits (157), earned runs (73) and home runs allowed (24).
- Has made just nine career appearances out of the bullpen in 257 career outings...His teams have a 0-9 record in those games.
- Only career game vs. A's was earlier this season on April 10...Was the losing pitcher after allowing six earned runs on 10 hits in five innings pitched.
- Owns a 24-24 record and 3.78 ERA in 61 career games (60 starts) at the Coliseum.
- Played for A's for five seasons and had a 47-46 record and 4.25 ERA from 2004-08.

#65 DANE DE LA ROSA (RHP) 2013: .238 vs. LH, .227 vs. RH AGE: 30

- Pitched a perfect inning Thursday night, retiring every batter for first time since July 10 at Wrigley Field.
- Ranks second among American League relievers with 44 strikeouts.
- Led the Angels relief corps with 42 appearances and four wins in the first half.
- Was the winning pitcher in three of 10 Angels games from June 26 to July 6.
- In six career appearances vs. A's (all in 2013) has allowed two runs in 5.1 innings pitched (3.38 ERA).
- Has not allowed a run in eight of last 10 games at home.
- Owns a 1.42 ERA (19 IP – 3 ER) on the road this season and a 4.76 ERA (28.1 IP – 15 ER) at Angel Stadium.

- Compiled a 2-2 record and 1.33 ERA in 39 appearances in the first half.
- Has not allowed an earned run in 37 of last 38 outings...Each of last 29 appearances (18 IP) has been scoreless (tied-longest streak in A.L. this season).
- Hasn't allowed an earned run in last 23 games at Angel Stadium (17.2 IP).
- Eight of 30 inherited runners have scored this season.
- Since start of 2007 season, his 2.22 ERA ranks second-best among all MLB pitchers (min. 350 IP)...Only Mariano Rivera has a lower ERA in that span.

- Batting .331 (59/178) in 50 career games at the Coliseum...The .331 clip in Oakland ranks third by a Major Leaguer since the start of the 2006 season (min. 150 AB).
- Collected first multi-hit game Thursday since July 14...Has posted a .320 (40/125) average with 19 RBI over last 34 games.
