A's vs. ANGELS

The A's lead the season series, 8-4...are 4-2 in Los Angeles and 4-2 in Oakland...have scored 71 runs in 12 games this year...last year, the A's scored 60 runs in 19 games against the Angels the entire season...are 24-1 against the Angels over the last three years when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in six of their last 13 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in four of those games...have won the season series from Los Angeles in each of the prev two seasons and are 29-21 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 394-317 against the Angels...that includes 203-151 in Oakland and 191-166 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 443-394 against the Angels

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has not allowed a home run in 46.0 innings...the innings pitched are the most in the majors among pitchers with no home runs...has a 72.0 inning homerless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

Derek Norris is hitting .333 (9 for 27) in July after batting a combined .163 in May and June...has four home runs in 15 games in July after hitting three in 58 games over the first three months of the season.

Eric Sogard extended his hitting streak to six games yesterday, which is a new career high (8 for 23..348).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1989, after both teams score a run in the 10th inning, Carney Lansford's 11th inning single scores Stan Javier with the winning run in the A's 8-7 victory over Seattle...in 2002 Miguel Tejada has six RBI and the A's score 11 times in their final two at bats to win at Texas, 12-2...in 2009 Adam Kennedy goes 5 for 7 in the A's 9-8 win at Boston...it is the first of two five-hit games for Kennedy in 2009.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and five of the last seven games to improve to a season-high 18 games over .500...that has also increased the A's lead in the American League West to a season-high five games, which is their largest lead since Sept. 28, 2006 when they also led by five games...have not led by more than five game since Sept. 27, 2006 when they led by six games...it marks the first time the A's have led by five games before the end of July since May 11, 1990 when they had a 5½ game lead...are 5-4 since the All-Star Break and 61-43 for the season, which is the third best record in the AL and fifth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 104 games since the 1992 club was also 61-43 (won game 105)...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 22nd consecutive day...those are the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...the last time the A's lost ground in the West because of a loss was June 23...have spent 47 days in sole possession of first this year, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...went 12-4 over the first 16 games (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors) and 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in majors)...are 17-9 since June 25 (third best in the majors)...are 118-69 (.631) since July 1 of last year, which is the best mark in the majors over that span (Cincinnati, 113-77)...are 155-111 (.583) since the start of the 2012 season, which is the best record in the AL and second best in the majors (Cincinnati, 156-111).

IN JULY: The A's are 13-8 in the month of July, which is the fourth best record in the American League...with four games remaining this month, the A's have clinched a winning record for the eighth consecutive month dating back to last June, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...rank last in the majors in batting (.215, 146 for 679) and doubles (24) in July and last in the AL in runs (72)...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .226 in 1977...have the second lowest ERA in the AL (2.85, 59 er in 186.1 ip), the second fewest walks (46) and third fewest home runs (15).

CLUTCH HOME RUNS: Derek Norris hit the go-ahead home run in the seventh inning yesterday, the fourth time in nine games since the All-Star Break an Athletic has homered in the seventh inning or later to give the A's the lead...10 of the A's last 14 home runs have either tied the game or put the A's ahead...43 of the A's 108 home runs this year have put the A's ahead, which is tied for third in AL...13 of those 43 have come in the seventh inning or later, which leads the majors...have 39 home runs overall in the seventh or later, which is second in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won when trailing after six innings yesterday for the 13th time this year, which is the most in the majors...are 21-12 (.636) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied with Arizona for the lead in one-run wins and are tied for third in the AL in one-run games...are 7-3 (.700) in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and have the third best record...are 13-7 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the AL in last at bat wins...have six "walk-off" wins, which is tied for third most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.87 ERA (71 er in 222.1 ip) over the last 25 games and now have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League...also lead the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.294) and fewest walks (250), rank second in opponents batting average (.242), third in opponents slugging percentage (.380) and fourth in shutouts (9)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 81 consecutive games, which is the longest such streak by an A's team since a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 31-11 with a 3.01 ERA (134 er in 400.2 ip) and .229 (342 for 1495) opponents batting average over the last 62 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 45-32 with a 3.79 ERA (270 er in 641.0 ip) for the season...lead the AL in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in innings pitched, tied for second in complete games (4) and third in ERA and wins.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .197 (94 for 477) with 43 runs scored over the last 15 games (2.87 runs per game)...however, are 9-6 over that span...are batting .243 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...lead the majors in walks (385)...A's pinch hitters are batting .138 (12 for 87), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (102), are tied for the lead in walks (14) and tied for second in home runs (3) and RBI (11).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (2-1), Toronto (three games) and Texas (three games)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of their next 25 games and 29 of their next 42 at home...also have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Boston and have won 22 of the last 28 home games...are 32-16 (.660) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Atlanta, 32-15)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 15-16 against the West since May 10 while going 28-9 against everyone else...are batting .259 (425 for 1640) with 243 runs (47 games, 5.17 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .229 (433 for 1894) with 217 runs (57 games, 3.81 runs per game) against the rest of baseball.

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list Thursday, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...the A's are 40-24 (.625) in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Detroit, 38-23)...are 21-19 (.525) during the day...have turned just 74 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...have been charged with 24 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season...the A's are 9-11 (.450) in his starting assignments this year and 26-23 (.531) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 14 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his last 10 games while tossing at least three innings in each start...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the longest is 11 by Rich Harden from April 9, 2006-April 15, 2007...Parker has held the opposition to a .175 (40 for 228) batting average during this stretch...has a .233 opponents batting average for the season, which ranks ninth in the American League...had a seven-start streak from May 28 to June 29 where he allowed five hits or fewer and two walks or fewer...that matched the longest such streak by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916 (Alan Wirth, May 6-Sept. 15, 1978).

INDECISIVE: Has a no decision in each of his last five starts, which is the longest streak by an A's starting pitcher sine Aaron Harang also had a five-game streak from June 26-Aug. 1, 2002...the Oakland record is six by Mike Norris (June 1-Aug. 6, 1983), Rick Langford (July 17, 1983-June 25, 1985) and Carlos Reyes (June 10-July 17, 1994)...has a 2.32 ERA (8 er in 31.0 ip) and .180 (20 for 111) opponents batting average during this five start stretch, all A's losses...his run support average is 3.48 (12 rs in 31.0 ip)...left with the lead in two of the no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 6 and 23).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.17 ERA (16 er in 66.1 ip) and .175 (40 for 228) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...the winning streak matches his career high from Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012.

LAST 13, FIRST SEVEN: Is 5-1 with a 2.39 ERA (23 er in 86.2 ip) and .178 (53 for 297) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts (since May 11)...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .172 (29 for 169) average over his last 11 starts after surrendering a .397 mark over his first seven

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors in his last three starts after going errorless over his first 17 starts this year...his three errors are tied for the most among American League pitchers.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in fewest pitches per inning (15.2) and seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.8)...has allowed a .207 (18 for 87) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in the AL...is also tied for ninth in wild pitches (7) and hit batters (7) and tied for 10th in grounded into double plays (14).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 16 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...vielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...12 of the 16 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for fifth in the AL.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 1-3 with a 2.88 ERA (21 er in 65.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-3 with a 4.88 ERA (30 er in 55.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of the 14 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision (25 rs in 81.1 ip, 2.77 RSA)...has four runs of support or more in five of his six wins.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-0 with a 2.21 ERA (5 er in 20.1 ip) in three starts in July...went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of June...had the lowest opponents batting average in the American League in June and ranked third in ERA...was 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA and .216 opponents average in five starts in May...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Houston last Tuesday...allowed three straight hits to start the bottom of the first, including a RBI single by Castro...did not allow another run until the fifth when Barnes reached second on a Parker error, went to third on a Villar sacrifice bunt and scored on an Altuve sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 4-2 lead but Balfour allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss.

PARKER vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-2 with a 3.16 ERA (37.0 ip, 41 h, 14 r, 13 er, 10 bb, 26 so, 0 hr) in six career starts...is 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA (10 er in 26.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 2.61 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts in Anaheim...is 1-0 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 5 so) in two starts this year...the no decision came in the A's 9-5 win at Los Angeles April 9...surrendered a career-high tying nine hits in just 3.1 innings...also walked three batters but yielded just two runs...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed RBI singles to Trumbo and Callaspo in the third...was relieved by Resop after loading the bases with one out in the fourth...Resop escaped the jam and the A's scored five times in the seventh for the win...the win came in a 10-6 A's victory in Oakland April 30...allowed an unearned run in the third inning on errors by Rosales and Donaldson...the A's scored two times in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run double to Trout in the fifth...the A's then scored three times in the bottom of the fifth and four more in the sixth to take the lead for good...walked Aybar to start the seventh and was relieved by Scribner, who allowed the run to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (9-7, 3.84 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season...is 3-1 with a 4.80 ERA and .270 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of July...has allowed seven home runs in his last four starts and has surrendered 23 for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...17 of the 23 home runs have been solo shots and 17 have come on the road...has allowed a .159 batting average the first time through the lineup, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's win at Houston last Wednesday (6.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 8 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (7.2 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so) in two career starts against Toronto, both last year.

The A's bullpen is 3-3 with 12 saves, two blown saves, a 2.29 ERA (14 er in 55 ip), .212 (43 for 203) opponents batting average and one home run allowed over its past 21 games...has a 3.12 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the fewest walks (89) and strikeouts (255) in the AL, ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.293) and has allowed the second fewest home runs (23)...first batters faced are 60 for 262 (.229) with 13 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .268 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL and are tied for the second lowest on-base percentage.

- Has recorded the save in back-to-back games after he was charged with a blown save Tuesday night...the blown save was his first since April 29, 2012 at Baltimore...it snapped his Athletics record streak of 44 consecutive saves...that is the sixth longest save streak in Major League history...his streak of 26 consecutive saves to start the season was the second longest streak in Oakland history (Dennis Eckersley, 36 in 1992).

- Did not walk a batter over his first three starts to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 to start the season with three consecutive games of five or more innings and no walks...had a four-game streak with no walks and at least five innings pitched dating back to 2012, which was the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Tossed a three-hit shutout in the A's rain-shortened 13-0 seven-inning win at Boston April 23...it
 was his 10th career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...the seven-inning shutout was
 third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971
 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by
 Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip).
- Walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, snapping a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.
- Did not strike out a batter May 14 against Texas, his eighth career start without a strikeout...it was
 the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings.
- Walked two batters May 20 at Texas, snapping a season-opening streak of eight consecutive starts
 with one walk or fewer and two innings or more...that was the longest season-opening streak by an
 Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Had an 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 20 to 31.
- Struck out nine batters May 26 at Houston in his first start after turning 40 to set an Athletics record
 for strikeouts by a 40-year old...the previous high was seven by Tom Candiotti (July 31, 1998 vs.
 Cleveland) and Don Sutton (April 22, 1985 vs. California)...is just the fourth pitcher in Oakland
 history to start a game at age 40...the other three are Tommy John (last start at 42 years, 126 days),
 Candiotti (last start at 41 years, 275 days) and Sutton (last start at 40 years, 155 days)
- Tossed a five-hit shutout May 31 against Chicago (AL) to become the second 40-year old in Oakland history with a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago).
- Had his career-high tying eight-game winning streak snapped July 3 by Chicago (NL)...also won
 eight straight from July 21-Sept. 10, 2005...had a 1.37 ERA and surrendered just one home run in
 59.0 innings during the streak, which spanned eight starts...it was the longest winning streak by an
 Athletic since Dan Haren had a 10-game winning streak from April 18-July 1, 2007...fell one short
 of the Oakland record for consecutive starts with a win.
- The loss to the Cubs was his first home loss of the season, snapping an eight-game winning streak
 in the Coliseum dating back to Aug. 2, 2012...that was the longest home winning streak by an A's
 pitcher since Mark Mulder won 10 straight from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...posted a 1.85 ERA
 during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts, and walked just seven batters (0.81 per nine
 innings).
- Was charged with a wild pitch July 3 against Chicago (NL), his first since May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL)...it snapped a streak of 443.0 innings without a wild pitch...it was his first wild pitch in 40 starts with the A's, which was the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 42 by Catfish Hunter (June 25, 1972-June 27, 1973).
- Went 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June to win American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the fourth time in his career...led the AL in ERA and tied for second in wins...it marked the third time in his career he won five games in a month (August 1999 and August 2005)...it was the fourth lowest single month ERA of his career (1.13 in May 2002, 1.39 in June 1998 and 1.72 in August 2005)...since 2006, the only other Oakland pitcher to win five games in a month is Gio Gonzalez (Sept., 2011).
- Was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005)...
 at the age of 40 years and 53 days, he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history...Dennis Eckersley,
 at age 37 in 1992, is second oldest...pitched the Sunday before the game and was replaced on the
 active roster.

RYAN COOK

 Allowed his first run of the season on the road May 26 at Houston, snapping a 22.2-inning scoreless streak on the road dating back to Aug. 11, 2012...the road scoreless streak is third longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his
 eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...added two more
 on June 3 at Milwaukee and June 11 against New York (AL)...in Oakland history, only Rickey
 Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more...is tied for fourth in Athletics history with
 Max Bishop behind Henderson, Eddie Joost (19) and Campaneris (13).
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).
- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.
- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.
- His seventh inning RBI single July 13 against Boston was the 500th RBI of his career.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had his first career game-ending RBI April 12 against Detroit, a home run in the bottom of the 12th inning...his second was a RBI single in the 11th inning July 14 against Boston.
- Was a perfect 4 for 4 April 27 against Baltimore, matching his career high in hits (August 17, 2012 vs. Cleveland)...also had four-hit games May 14 against Texas and May 25 at Houston.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of April 22-28...it was his first career
 weekly honor...went 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles (.864 slugging percentage), 10
 RBI and seven walks (1 sf, .633 on-base percentage) in seven games.
- Had a career-high seven-game hitting streak from May 11-18 (12 for 26, .462).
- Made his Major League debut at shortstop in the ninth inning May 24 at Houston...had one appearance at shortstop in the minors with Triple-A Sacramento on Aug. 2, 2012.
- Hit his first career grand slam in the sixth inning June 7 at Chicago, turning a 3-0 deficit into a 4-3 win.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

Had a career-high tying 13.1-inning scoreless streak from April 29 to May 27.

NATE FREIMAN

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 3 against Seattle and had a RBI single
 off Joe Saunders in the second inning for his first ML hit...added another single in the fourth inning
 for his first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run April 22 against Houston, a three-run shot off Erik Bedard in the first inning...it snapped a 0 for 11 streak.
- Was named American League Rookie of the Month for May after batting .351 with three doubles, one home run and nine RBI in 14 games.
- Had his second career three-hit game June 11 and both have come against the Yankees in games started by Sabathia (also May 3).
- Had his first career "walk-off" hit June 13 against New York, a RBI single in the 18th inning off Rivera.

JOHN JASO

- Is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2011; Seattle, 2012).
- Hit his first career pinch hit home run April 9 at Los Angeles, a three-run shot off Jepsen in the seventh to give the A's a 7-5 lead.
- Played first base May 24 at Houston, his second career appearance at first base (Aug. 25, 2010 at Los Angeles-AL).
- Had a career-high 17-game reaching base streak from May 21 to June 18...hit .345 with a .456 on-base percentage during the streak, which included a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25-June 13 (14 for 38, .368).

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying four RBI April 15 against Houston (fourth time, last: September 19, 2011 vs. Baltimore).
- Went 4 for 4 April 19 at Tampa, the third four-hit game of his career...added his fourth June 1 agaisst Chicago (AL).
- Went 2 for 9 in the 19-inning game April 29 against Los Angeles to tie the Oakland record for at bats in a game (11th time, last: Mike Heath at Texas, July 1, 1979).
- Set an Oakland record for hits in the month of April with 34...broke the previous mark of 33 held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...had 11 doubles, which tied the Oakland April record (Mark Ellis, 2003).
- Went a career-high 11 consecutive games without a RBI from June 4 to 15.
- Homered June 21 at Seattle to snap a career-high 62-game homerless streak.
- Hit safely in each of his first 12 interleague games, which tied for the third longest interleague hitting streak in Oakland history...had a 14-game interleague hitting streak dating back to last year.
- Had a career-high tying nine-game hitting streak from June 20 to 30 (also Aug. 4-21, 2010 and April 27-May 6, 2012)...hit .457 (16 for 35) during the streak.

BRANDON MOSS

- Matched his career high with five RBI April 10 at Los Angeles (also September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) after driving in four runs the night before.
- Had a career-high four strikeouts April 12 against Detroit...matched that figure April 29 against Los Angeles and May 12 at Seattle.
- Was on the paternity list from April 16 to 18 for the birth of his second son, Brody. (April 16).
- Went 0 for 4 April 21 at Tampa Bay to snap a 15-game road hitting streak dating back to Sept. 20, 2012...hit .463 (25 for 54) during the streak.
- Hit the game-ending home run in the bottom of the 19th inning April 29 against Los Angeles, his third career walk-off home run (last: September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) and fifth career game-ending hit (also a double and single)...also homered in the sixth inning, his second career multi-homer game (June 12, 2012 at Colorado)...had 12 innings between home runs to become the 17th player in Major League history to go at least 12 innings between home runs in one game...is the second Athletic to do it...Reggie Jackson also went 12 innings between home runs June 11, 1969...had four strikeouts to become the second Major Leaguer since 1916 to have at least two home runs and four strikeouts in one game...Evan Longoria did it August 4, 2009 for Tampa Bay against Boston.
- Made his first career appearance in center field May 9 (also May 13).
- Hit the 7000th home run in Oakland history May 13 against Texas off Justin Grimm in the third inning...hit the 12,000th home run in Athletics franchise history June 5 at Milwaukee, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning.
- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the
 other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base
 in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his
 career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the
 sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)...
 the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

PAT NESHEK

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

DEREK NORRIS

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
 going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
 Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
 1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).
- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

JARROD PARKER

- Began the season with a career-high four-game losing streak...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned five starts from April 2 to 25.
- Allowed a career-high four home runs in a 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...prior to that, had allowed
 more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two.
- Matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings June 13 against New York (fifth time, third time against New York)...had a no decision in the 3-2, 18-inning win.
- Left his June 29 start against St. Louis after 3.2 innings with tightness in his right hamstring.

SHANE PETERSON

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

JOSH REDDICK

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career
 stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases
 during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento
 (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).
- Snapped a career-high 30-game homerless streak with a solo shot in the seventh inning off Quintana June 6 at Chicago (AL).
- Had his third career four-hit game June 16 against Seattle.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 19 consecutive games from June 18 to July 13...
 hit .262 (17 for 65) with a .329 on-base percentage (7 bb, 1 sf) during the streak.
- Struck out a career-high tying four times July 14 against Boston.

CHRIS RESOP

 Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

ADAM ROSALES

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.
- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up
 going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by
 a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).
- Drew his first two walks of the season April 30 against Los Angeles, snapping a 28-game streak without a walk...his last walk prior to that was August 4, 2012.
- Started in the leadoff spot for the first time in his career May 3 at New York and hit Sabathia's first
 pitch of the game for his first career leadoff home run.
- Snapped a 0 for 24 streak with his eighth inning home run May 28 against San Francisco.
- Struck out as a pinch hitter in the 10th inning June 13 against New York (AL) and ended up going 0 for 4 with a career-high four strikeouts...is the first player in Oakland history to strikeout four times in a game that he didn't start.

SCOTT SIZEMORE

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with
 a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3...
 according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back
 games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

SETH SMITH

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

ERIC SOGARD

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.
- Homered July 7 at Kansas City to snap a career-high 90-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since April 27, 2012.

DAN STRAILY

 Struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in 6.2 innings (sixth time, last: Tim Hudson, Sept. 10, 1999 at Tampa Bay) in an 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter.

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St.
 Louis off Joe Kelly...the hitless streak was the second longest career-opening hitless streak by a
 non-pitcher since 1973 (Chris Carter, OAK; 33 in 2010).

CHRIS YOUNG

- Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.
- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).
- His sixth inning double April 11 at Los Angeles was the 200th of his career.
- Had his 11th career regular season multi-homer game April 24 at Boston (also has one in the post-season).
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 30 to May 17 with a strained left quad...it was his second
 career stint on the DL...made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento May 16 and went 1
 for 1 with two walks, a run and a stolen base in a start in center field against Oklahoma City.
- Had back-to-back three-hit games for the second time in his career May 24 and 25 at Houston (Aug. 16-17, 2007).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts June 26 against Cincinnati...it was the fifth four-strikeout game of his career, but his first since May 20, 2009 at Florida.
