LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play Game #103, the fourth contest of a seven-game road trip (1-2) to Oakland (July 25-28; 1-2) and Texas (July 29-31)...Angels have dropped six of last eight on road (won previous seven road affairs)...Club is 2-5 in last seven games, 5-9 in last 14 games, 9-11 this month and 39-37 since a 9-17 April...Club is 4-5 since ASB...With Monday's loss, the club fell into fourth place...Halos sit a season-high **12.0 games back of division lead**...Club is six games under .500 this late in a season (thru July 27) for first time since 1999 (43-56 on July 27)...**LAA is 7-3-1 in last 11 series**...43 of club's 69 games (62%) in second half are against teams with .500 or better records.

PUJOLS TO D.L.: Albert Pujols is being placed on the D.L. today (retro to 7/27) with a partial tear of the plantar fascia in his left foot...OF Kole Calhoun has been recalled from Salt Lake...For Pujols, it marks his fourth career D.L. stint, first since 2011 (fracture in left wrist), and a likely end to his MLB record at 12 consecutive seasons to open a career with at least 30 home runs.

HI, MY NAME IS: With J.C. Gutierrez's appearance in Thursday's game, the club has used 41 different players (22 pitchers) this season...Halo record for pitchers used in a season is 29 in 1996.

SUCCESS VS. PARKER: Mike Trout is 6 for 17 in his career against Jarrod Parker while Erick Aybar is 8 for 13.

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2013 series 8-4...Two of the three longest games in Angels' history have come against the A's (April 29, 2013, 19 innings & July 9, 1971, 20 innings)...Halos have lost three straight season series vs. A's (2010-2012)...**Halos are 11-13 in last 24 games in Oakland, winning 10 of last 17 games here**...However, LAA has dropped 11 of last 15 to A's at Angel Stadium.

UP NEXT - @ TEXAS: These two teams meet for first time since late April and will play six times in next 10 days...Rangers lead 2013 series 4-2...Halos have dropped three of last four in Arlington...Angels claimed the 2012 season series (10-9)...**Angels have outscored the Rangers 70-34 in last nine victories**...From 2005-08, Angels held a 48-28 advantage over Texas...Since 2009, Rangers lead series 45-35...Since start of 2012, Mike Trout hit .338 with six HR and 17 RBI last season while Albert Pujols posted a .324 clip with five HR and 17 RBI.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS: On Wednesday, the Angels claimed RHP J.C. Gutierrez off of waivers from the Royals...Thursday, the club designated RHP Billy Buckner for assignment to add Gutierrez to 25-man roster...The Mets and Angels completed a minor trade Thursday...Mets received an international slot bonus amount in exchange for minor league OF Julio Concepcion and minor league RHP Andres Perez...Concepcion will be assigned to Orem and Perez will report to the AZL.

FAST FACTS: Eight of the Halos' last nine home runs have been solo shots...**Angels offense has been limited to 32 runs over last 12 games (2.6 per)**...Club has scored four runs or fewer in 11 of last 12 games...Ernesto Frieri has the best save percentage (91%) in Angels history among relievers with at least 45 saves (48/53)...With the July 19 win, Mike Scioscia became the 39th skipper (fifth active) in big league history to reach 1200 wins...23 of the 38 others are Hall-of-Famers.

GREAT SCOTT: Scott Downs had his scoreless games streak end at 29 yesterday (HR to D. Norris)...He fell one game shy of Angels' club record...Was first homer allowed by Downs since Sept. 25, 2012...The 29-game shutout streak equaled longest in A.L. this season (Jesse Crain)...Downs hasn't allowed an ER in his last 23 games at Angel Stadium (17.2 IP)...Only longer scoreless-games streak in Angel Stadium history: Scott Downs with 28 scoreless games (26 IP) from 2010-11.

BETTER BULLPEN: Halo relievers logged a 6-7 mark and a 4.23 ERA with seven saves and six blown saves in their first 41 games...Over last 61 games, Halo bullpen has an 8-6 record and a 3.74 ERA (180.1 IP – 75 ER) with 20 saves and three blown saves.

INJURED ANGELS: LHP Sean Burnett (D.L. with a left elbow impingement since May 28) threw from mound Tuesday (20 pitches)...Peter Bourjos is on the 15-day D.L. (retro to 6/30) with a right wrist fracture (HBP on 6/29)...Aiming to begin swinging a bat this week...Jason Vargas is on the 15-day D.L. (retro to 6/18) as the result of a blood clot found in his left armpit area (surgery on 6/26)...He threw a bullpen Tuesday for first time since procedure (30 pitches) and continues to throw off the mound every three days.

HOT HALOS: C.J. Wilson is 7-1 with a 1.96 ERA (55 IP – 12 ER) over his last eight starts...His 1.97 ERA in the span leads the A.L. (min. 7 starts)...Scott Downs has not allowed an earned run in 37 of his last 39 outings...Since June 8 (39 games), Mike Trout is hitting .370 (60/162) with 26 runs, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HRs, 27 RBI and nine SBs...Trout's career-best 15-game hit streak was snapped Wednesday...Over his last 13 games, Albert Pujols is batting .333 (17/51) with four HRs and 13 RBI.

AS JOSH GOES: Halos are 20-2 in last 22 games when Josh Hamilton has an RBI (14-1 in last 15 such games)...He has logged five home runs, five doubles, 14 runs & 18 RBI while hitting safely in 18 of his last 23 games...Halos have an 11-3 record in 2013 when Hamilton hits a HR.

THIS 'N' THAT: Albert Pujols owns a career .334 (1080/3228) average in the second half of the season, tops amongst active Major Leaguers and fifth-best in MLB history (min. 1800 AB)...Angels have played in a MLB-leading 33 one-run affairs (14-19)...25 of club's 53 losses have come by two runs or less...Mike Trout is one of three Major Leaguers this year with 15 home runs and 20 stolen bases...Angels signed 38 of their 39 2013 draft picks, best % in club history...LAA has committed 74 errors, second most in A.L...Halos lead MLB with 102 GDP, 10 more than any other A.L. team...15 different Halo pitchers have recorded a victory this season, tied for second-most in the Majors...Jered Weaver and wife Kristin welcomed the birth of their first child July 5th - son Aden David Weaver...The spelling of name is in honor of the late Nick Adenhart...Since July 3rd, Halos have struggled with RISP batting at a .194 clip (24/124).

FISH FACTS: Trout ranks second in A.L. with 54 extra-base hits and is on pace for 87 XBH...Club record for XBH in a season is 88 by Garret Anderson in 2002...Trout reached the 50 HR/50 SB career mark faster than any player in A.L. history (266 games)...Angels are 32-18 this season when Trout scores a run (15-36 when he plays and doesn't score)...Halos have gone 46-7 when Trout scores more than once in his career (13-4 this year)...He has scored 68 runs (4th in A.L.) and ranks 3rd in A.L. with 131 hits and 227 total bases...Leads American League with 40 multi-hit games...FIRST HALF: Trout's first-half totals rank in the top three in Angels history in: hits (119), doubles (29), triples (8), extra-base hits (52), total bases (209) and times on base (170)...First player in Angels history with 50 extra-base hits and 20 stolen bases in the first half and the first Halo with 55 RBI and 20 stolen bases before the Break... Only Angel ever with 29 doubles, eight triples, 15 HRs and 21 SBs in a season...Youngest player in MLB history with 15 HR and 20 steals in first half and the youngest since 1916 with at least 50 extra-base hits in the first half.

WEAVER TOMORROW: RHP Jered Weaver takes the mound tomorrow at Texas...He is 4-1 with a 1.32 ERA (41 IP – 6 ER) over his last six starts...Weaver had not surrendered a run over his last two starts (14.2 IP).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 28

(1964) Jim Fregosi became first Angels' player in club history to hit for the cycle in Angels' 3-1 win at New York; (1994) The Angels fall victim to Kenny Rogers' perfect game at Texas (4-0 score)...With Mike Witt's perfect game vs. Texas in 1984, the Angels and Rangers are the only major league teams to record perfect games against each other; (2004) Troy Percival becomes the 18th player in ML history to notch 300 saves in a 2-0 win over Texas, fifth fastest to reach the mark.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP TOMMY HANSON

4-2, 4.75 ERA

Making first road start since June 8 at Fenway Park

- Makes 11th start of regular season tonight and fourth on the road for the Angels...Second start vs. Oakland...Second start since being activated from the disabled list
- Missed 25 team games from June 21 – July 3 on the disabled list with a right forearm strain.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in return from disabled list on Tuesday vs. Minnesota...Allowed one run on four hits in 5.1 innings pitched while matching a season-high with eight strikeouts.
- **VS. OAKLAND/AT O.CO COLISEUM:** Only career game vs. Athletics was earlier this season on April 29 at the Coliseum...Allowed two runs (one earned) on four hits with six strikeouts in six innings...Did not factor in the decision as Athletics eventually won the game 10-8 in 19 innings.
- Angels are 2-1 in his road starts...Lone loss came in only start at Oakland.
- Missed 17 games on the restricted list from May 10-28...Missed an April start after being placed on bereavement list April 22nd.
- Recorded 600th career strikeout April 19th vs. Detroit fanning Victor Martinez in the 5th inning.
- Made Angels debut April 6 at Texas and earned the victory after tossing six innings and allowing three runs on six hits, while striking out four.
- Is in first season with Angels after four seasons with Braves...Acquired via trade in exchange for Jordan Walden Nov. 30, 2012.

CAREER NOTES:

- Has posted at least 10 wins in each of his first four MLB seasons (2009-12)...Led Braves in starts in two of his four full seasons with club.
- Despite not making his debut until June of 2009, ranked among N.L. rookie leaders in wins (3rd, 11) and strikeouts (2nd, 116) that season.
- Finished third in 2009 N.L. Rookie of the Year voting...His 2.89 ERA in 2009 was lowest for a Braves rookie since 1943.

#55 JOE BLANTON (RHP) 2013: .308 vs. LH, .324 vs. RH AGE: 32

- Pitched a perfect inning yesterday in first relief appearance for Angels.
- Made first 20 outings of season came as a starting pitcher...In his 20 starts, has a 2-13 record and 5.66 ERA...Led the American League in losses, hits (157), earned runs (73) and home runs allowed (24) at time of move to the bullpen.
- Has made just 10 career appearances out of the bullpen in 258 career outings...His teams have a 0-10 record in those games.
- Only career start vs. A's was earlier this season on April 10...Was the losing pitcher after allowing six earned runs on 10 hits in five innings pitched.
- Owns a 24-24 record and 3.77 ERA in 62 career games (60 starts) at the Coliseum.
- Played for A's for five seasons and had a 47-46 record and 4.25 ERA from 2004-08.
- Yesterday was first appearance out of bullpen since April 7, 2012 for Phillies.

- Allowed one run on one hit in 1.1 innings pitched yesterday afternoon...Just third game surrendering an earned run on the road this season (20 appearances).
- Ranks second among American League rookie relievers with 46 strikeouts.
- Led the Angels relief corps with 42 appearances and four wins in the first half.
- Was the winning pitcher in three of 10 Angels games from June 26 to July 6.
- In seven career appearances vs. A's (all in 2013) has allowed three runs in 6.2 innings pitched (4.05 ERA).
- Has not allowed a run in eight of last 10 games at home.

- Allowed season-high two earned runs on three hits in 0.1 innings pitched yesterday...Allowed two-run home run to Derek Norris on first pitch thrown.
- Took first career loss vs. Oakland in 43rd lifetime appearance against A's...Previously owned Major League record for most career games vs. Oakland without ever having a losing decision.
- Snapped streak of 29 straight scoreless appearances...Longest streak in A.L. this year and one shy of matching longest scoreless games streak in Angels history.
- In 43 career games vs. Athletics, has a 2-1 record and a 3.64 ERA (42 IP – 17 ER).
- Has not allowed an earned run in 37 of last 39 outings...Hasn't allowed an earned run in last 23 games at Angel Stadium (17.2 IP).
