#### A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's won the first meeting of 2013 last night...the only American League team the A's have not played is Minnesota...won the season series last year, 5-4...it marked the first time the A's won the season series since 2007...split six games in Oakland and won two of three in Toronto...the A's are 204-176 against the Blue Jays all time...that includes 100-91 in Oakland, 104-83 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has back-to-back three-hit games for the first time in his career (6 for 10, seven RBI)...is a .240 career hitter before the All-Star Break, .312 (98 for 314) after the break.

**Bob Melvin** has compiled a 697-671 record in 10 seasons as a manager...needs three more wins for 700 in his career...is 204-163 (.556) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is the seventh best record in the majors over that span.

**Brandon Moss** is 9 for 28 (.321) with two strikeouts over his last eight games.

Josh Reddick has four home runs and 15 RBI in 10 games against Toronto over the last two years.

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1901 Napoleon Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in 2000 Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

#### **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and seven of the last nine games to improve to a season-high 20 games over .500...the four game winning streak is the longest since May 31-June 3 when they also won four straight...are 7-4 since the All-Star Break and 63-43 for the season, which is tied with Tampa Bay the best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors...this marks the fourth time this year the A's have held a share of the best record in the AL (June 13, 14 and 16)...have not had the best record in the AL outright outside the month of April since Sept. 23, 2002...this is the A's best record after 106 games since the 1992 club was also 63-43 (won game 107)...lead the AL West by a season-high six games for the second consecutive day...that is the A's largest lead since Sept. 27, 2006 when they also led by six games...it is the second largest lead by a division leader in the majors (Atlanta, 9)...have not led by more than six games since Sept. 23, 2006 when they led by seven games...this marks the first time the A's have led by six games before the end of July since July 24, 1988 when they led by 6½ games...were in third place in the West on May 16 with a 20-22 record and trailed Texas by 7½ games...have gone a Major League best 43-21 (.672) since May 17 and have picked up 13½ games in the standings over that span...the last time the A's lost ground in the West because of a loss was June 23...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 24<sup>th</sup> consecutive day (since July 2)...those are the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...for the season, the A's have spent 49 days in sole possession of first, six days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**IN JULY:** The A's are 15-8 in the month of July, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and now have a winning record for the eighth consecutive month dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...rank last in the majors with a .223 (167 for 749) batting average this month...the lowest July batting average in Oakland history is .226 in 1977...have scored 91 runs in 23 games (3.96 runs per game)...however, the pitching staff has allowed just 74 runs for a 3.08 ERA (70 er in 204.1 ip), which is second lowest in the AL...also have the second fewest walks (57) this month.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 4-1 on this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1), Toronto (1-0) and Texas (three games)...have won 24 of the last 30 home games and are 34-16 (.680) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Atlanta, 35-15)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...also have a ninegame homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road.

**PITCHING:** The A's lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.294) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.46) and are tied for the lead in fewest walks (261)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...lead the American League in ERA (3.61), rank second in opponents batting average (.241), third in opponents slugging percentage (.381) and fourth in shutouts (9)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 83 consecutive games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 32-11 with a 3.16 ERA (145 er in 412.2 ip) and .228 (351 for 1540) opponents batting average over the last 64 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 46-32 with a 3.87 ERA (281 er in 653.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4) and innings pitched, are tied for second in complete games (4), ranks third in wins and fourth in ERA.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have collected at least 10 hits in three of the last four games...are batting .284 (38 for 134) with 28 runs in those four games (7.00 per game) after hitting .186 with 34 runs over the previous 13 contests (2.62 per game)...the A's lead the majors in walks (397) and are tied for third in the American League in doubles (194)...A's pinch hitters are batting .138 (12 for 87), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (102), are tied for the lead in walks (14) and tied for second in home runs (3) and RBI (11).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-12 (.636) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied with Arizona for the lead in one-run wins...are 7-3 (.700) in extra inning games...are tied with Kansas City for the AL lead in extra inning wins and have the third best record...have six "walk-off" wins, which is tied for third most in the AL...are 13-7 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...overcame a five-run deficit to win for the third time Sunday, the second time against the Angels (also April 29)...it marks the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 16-16 against the West since May 10 while going 29-9 against everyone else...are batting .260 (435 for 1674) with 253 runs (48 games, 5.27 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .230 (444 for 1930) with 226 runs (58 games, 3.90 runs per game) against the rest of baseball.

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list last Thursday, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 41-24 (.631) in night games, which is the best mark in the majors (Pittsburgh, 40-24)...are 22-19 (.537) during the day...have turned just 74 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...have been charged with 23 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the AL.

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has lost each of his two starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 20...has a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) and .326 (15 for 46) opponents batting average over that span...it marks just the second two-game losing streak of his career (May 10-15, 2013)...is now 5-2 with a 3.31 ERA (24 er in 65.1 ip) and .221 (53 for 240) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts after going 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Leads American League rookies in strikeouts (75) and innings pitched (91.1) and is tied for second in wins (6) and games started (16).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .232 opponents batting average and a .349 slugging percentage...the slugging percentage is ninth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings and the batting average is 10<sup>th</sup> lowest...has yielded a .188 (25 for 133) batting average the first time through the lineup, .229 (30 for 131) the second time and .312 (24 for 77) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is second lowest in the AL among pitchers with 90 or more innings...opponents are batting .344 (22 for 64) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth highest in the AL among pitchers with 90 or more innings...including .414 (12 for 29) with RISP and two outs, which is second highest...has issued 19 of his 28 walks to left-handed hitters.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 2-4 with a 6.32 ERA (33 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 4-0 with a 2.44 ERA (12 er in 44.1 ip) in seven starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 3-4 with a 5.84 ERA (45 er in 69.1 ip) in 13 starts against the West, 5-1 with a 2.49 ERA (17 er in 61.1 ip) in 10 starts against everyone else.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-3 with a 5.17 ERA (36 er in 62.2 ip) and .250 (60 for 240) opponents batting average in 11 starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .188 (19 for 101) opponents average in five starts during the day...has allowed all eight of his home runs at night.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-1 with a 2.86 ERA (16 er in 50.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-3 with a 6.35 ERA (29 er in 41.0 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA (21 er in 76.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-4 with a 6.75 ERA (41 er in 54.2 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed five home runs in his last six starts, snapping a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has surrendered eight home runs for the season...six have come on the road, six have been solo shots and five have come in the first two innings of a game.

**WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:** Had his winning streak snapped at a career-high five games July 20...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 9.

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA (7 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento June 23 as the A's had three days off over an eight-day stretch...returned July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Los Angeles last Thursday here in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Pujols in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a Trout sacrifice fly, a Hamilton RBI single and a Trumbo two-run double...left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-2.

**STRAILY vs. TORONTO:** Had a no decision in his only career start, his Major League debut on Aug. 3, 2012, a 5-4 A's win in 15 innings in Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just one run on a Davis sacrifice fly in the fourth inning...left with a 4-1 lead but Cook allowed a three-run home run to Mathis in the ninth inning for the blown save...Crisp had a walk-off sacrifice fly in the 15<sup>th</sup> inning for the win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared

AS A 40-YEAR OLD: Recorded his 14<sup>th</sup>

win of the season in his last start to set an Oakland record for wins by a 40-year old...broke the previous mark of 13 held by Don Sutton (1985)...the only Athletic with more wins is Jack Quinn (18 in 1928, 15 in 1927)...the last Major League 40-year old with at least 14 wins is Jamie Moyer in 2008 (16)...has tied Tom Candiotti's Oakland record of three complete games set in 1998...currently has a 2.54 ERA...the last American League 40-year old with an ERA under 2.88 is Johnny Niggeling of the 1944 Washington Senators (2.32)...won each of his first seven starts after turning 40 on May 24...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher in Major League history to win at least each of his first six starts in his forties...ages are based on a players age as of June 30<sup>th</sup>.

**14-GAME WINNER:** Became the third 14-game winner in the majors with a win in his last start on July 26...that was the earliest date an Athletic recorded his 14<sup>th</sup> win since Barry Zito did it on July 23, 2002...since 1974, the only Oakland pitchers with 15 wins before the end of July are Bob Welch (16 in 1990), Dave Stewart (15 in 1989) and Barry Zito (15 in 2002)...the 14 wins surpass Parker and Milone's team-leading total from a year ago...they are his most wins since 2005 when he went 21-8 for the Angels and won the Cy Young Award

**DON'T WALK:** Leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with an average of 1.14 walks per nine innings (Wainwright, 1.00)...the Athletics record for fewest walks per nine innings is 1.30 set by Catfish Hunter in 1974...has 10 starts this year without a walk...since 1975, the only other Oakland pitcher with 10 or more starts in a season without a walk is Mark Mulder (11 in 2001)...has issued 13 of his 18 walks to lefties

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for the American League lead in shutouts (3) and complete games (3), ranks third in wins (14), ERA (2.54), winning percentage (.824) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.64), tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (17), fifth in strikeout to walk ratio (4.28), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.278), ninth in opponents slugging percentage (.355) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in innings pitched (141.2)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning (14.0) and eighth fewest pitches per game (94.6)...has the sixth highest run support (6.35).

**ACTIVE LEADERS:** Ranks third among active pitchers in complete games (35), tied for fourth in shutouts (12), fifth in wins (185), sixth in games started (396), seventh in strikeouts (1910) and eighth in innings pitched (2535.0).

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 7-2 with a 3.21 ERA (26 er in 73.0 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 7-1 with a 1.83 ERA (14 er in 68.2 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 9-1 with a 2.14 ERA (20 er in 84.0 ip) in 12 starts at night compared to 5-2 with a 3.12 ERA (20 er in 57.2 ip) in nine starts during the day...leads the American League in night ERA...his one night loss came on July 3 against Chicago (NL), snapping an 11-game winning streak in night games dating back to July 28 of last year...in two seasons with the A's, he is 18-6 with a 2.55 ERA (53 er in 187.1 ip) in 28 starts at night compared to 6-6 with a 3.80 ERA (45 er in 106.2 ip) in 17 starts during the day.

**SHUTOUT:** Tossed his third shutout of the season July 26, which matches his career high from 2002...it is the most by an Athletic since Mark Mulder had four in 2001...is the first 40-year old with three shutouts in a season since Dennis Martinez in 1994...is the first Athletics 40-year old with three shutouts since Jack Quinn had four for the 1928 Philadelphia A's...the shutout came at the age of 40 years, 58 days and he has three of the top four oldest shutouts in Oakland history...only Don Sutton at 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago was older.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is 8-1 following an A's loss this year and has won each of his last seven decisions in those games...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005)...pitched the Sunday before the game and was replaced on the active roster...had 12 wins at the All-Star Break, which matched the most by an A's pitcher before the break since 1991 (Mulder 12 in 2004 and 2003)...they were his most ever before the All-Star Break (11-5 in 2005)...went 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June to win American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the fourth time in his career...led the AL in ERA and tied for second in wins...made his 400<sup>th</sup> career appearance July 14 against Boston.

**LAST START:** He extended his winning streak to three games in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles last Friday here in Oakland...allowed a single to Shuck to start the game and Trout followed with a home run...those were the only runs he would allowing in six innings...the A's scored once in the bottom of the first and three times in the fourth to take the lead for good.

  at age 37 in 1992, is second oldest...pitched the Sunday before the game and was replaced on the
  active roster.

#### RYAN COOK

 Allowed his first run of the season on the road May 26 at Houston, snapping a 22.2-inning scoreless streak on the road dating back to Aug. 11, 2012...the road scoreless streak is third longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

#### **COCO CRISP**

- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his
  eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...added two more
  on June 3 at Milwaukee and June 11 against New York (AL)...in Oakland history, only Rickey
  Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more...is tied for fourth in Athletics history with
  Max Bishop behind Henderson, Eddie Joost (19) and Campaneris (13).
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).
- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.
- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.
- His seventh inning RBI single July 13 against Boston was the 500th RBI of his career.
- Led off the game with a double July 22 at Houston to snap a career-high tying 21-game streak without an extra base hit and a career-high 35-game streak without a double...it was his first extra base hit since a home run June 21 at Seattle and his first double since June 3 at Milwaukee.

#### **JOSH DONALDSON**

- Had his first career game-ending RBI April 12 against Detroit, a home run in the bottom of the 12th inning...his second was a RBI single in the 11th inning July 14 against Boston.
- Was a perfect 4 for 4 April 27 against Baltimore, matching his career high in hits (August 17, 2012 vs. Cleveland)...also had four-hit games May 14 against Texas and May 25 at Houston.
- Was named American League Player of the Week for the week of April 22-28...it was his first career
  weekly honor...went 12 for 22 (.545) with four runs, seven doubles (.864 slugging percentage), 10
  RBI and seven walks (1 sf, .633 on-base percentage) in seven games.
- Had a career-high seven-game hitting streak from May 11-18 (12 for 26, .462).
- Made his Major League debut at shortstop in the ninth inning May 24 at Houston...had one appearance at shortstop in the minors with Triple-A Sacramento on Aug. 2, 2012.
- Hit his first career grand slam in the sixth inning June 7 at Chicago, turning a 3-0 deficit into a 4-3 win.

#### **SEAN DOOLITTLE**

Had a career-high tying 13.1-inning scoreless streak from April 29 to May 27.

#### **NATE FREIMAN**

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 3 against Seattle and had a RBI single
  off Joe Saunders in the second inning for his first ML hit...added another single in the fourth inning
  for his first multiple hit game.
- Hit his first Major League home run April 22 against Houston, a three-run shot off Erik Bedard in the first inning...it snapped a 0 for 11 streak.
- Was named American League Rookie of the Month for May after batting .351 with three doubles, one home run and nine RBI in 14 games.
- Had his second career three-hit game June 11 and both have come against the Yankees in games started by Sabathia (also May 3).
- Had his first career "walk-off" hit June 13 against New York, a RBI single in the 18th inning off Rivera.

#### **JOHN JASO**

- Is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2011; Seattle, 2012).
- Hit his first career pinch hit home run April 9 at Los Angeles, a three-run shot off Jepsen in the seventh to give the A's a 7-5 lead.
- Played first base May 24 at Houston, his second career appearance at first base (Aug. 25, 2010 at Los Angeles-AL).
- Had a career-high 17-game reaching base streak from May 21 to June 18...hit .345 with a .456 on-base percentage during the streak, which included a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25-June 13 (14 for 38, .368).

#### **JED LOWRIE**

- Had a career-high tying four RBI April 15 against Houston (fourth time, last: September 19, 2011 vs. Baltimore).
- Went 4 for 4 April 19 at Tampa, the third four-hit game of his career...added his fourth June 1 agaisst Chicago (AL).
- Went 2 for 9 in the 19-inning game April 29 against Los Angeles to tie the Oakland record for at bats in a game (11th time, last: Mike Heath at Texas, July 1, 1979).
- Set an Oakland record for hits in the month of April with 34...broke the previous mark of 33 held by Stan Javier (1994) and Ben Grieve (1998)...had 11 doubles, which tied the Oakland April record (Mark Ellis, 2003).
- Went a career-high 11 consecutive games without a RBI from June 4 to 15.
- Homered June 21 at Seattle to snap a career-high 62-game homerless streak.
- Hit safely in each of his first 12 interleague games, which tied for the third longest interleague hitting streak in Oakland history...had a 14-game interleague hitting streak dating back to last year.
- Had a career-high tying nine-game hitting streak from June 20 to 30 (also Aug. 4-21, 2010 and April 27-May 6, 2012)...hit .457 (16 for 35) during the streak.

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Matched his career high with five RBI April 10 at Los Angeles (also September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) after driving in four runs the night before.
- Had a career-high four strikeouts April 12 against Detroit...matched that figure April 29 against Los Angeles and May 12 at Seattle.
- Was on the paternity list from April 16 to 18 for the birth of his second son, Brody. (April 16).
- Went 0 for 4 April 21 at Tampa Bay to snap a 15-game road hitting streak dating back to Sept. 20, 2012...hit .463 (25 for 54) during the streak.
- Hit the game-ending home run in the bottom of the 19th inning April 29 against Los Angeles, his third career walk-off home run (last: September 29, 2012 vs. Seattle) and fifth career game-ending hit (also a double and single)...also homered in the sixth inning, his second career multi-homer game (June 12, 2012 at Colorado)...had 12 innings between home runs to become the 17th player in Major League history to go at least 12 innings between home runs in one game...is the second Athletic to do it...Reggie Jackson also went 12 innings between home runs June 11, 1969...had four strikeouts to become the second Major Leaguer since 1916 to have at least two home runs and four strikeouts in one game...Evan Longoria did it August 4, 2009 for Tampa Bay against Boston.
- Made his first career appearance in center field May 9 (also May 13).
- Hit the 7000th home run in Oakland history May 13 against Texas off Justin Grimm in the third inning...hit the 12,000th home run in Athletics franchise history June 5 at Milwaukee, a three-run homer off Michael Gonzalez in the seventh inning.
- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the
  other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base
  in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his
  career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the
  sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)...
  the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

#### **PAT NESHEK**

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
  going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
  Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
  1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).
- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

#### **JARROD PARKER**

- Began the season with a career-high four-game losing streak...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned five starts from April 2 to 25.
- Allowed a career-high four home runs in a 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...prior to that, had allowed
  more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two.
- Matched his career high by tossing 8.0 innings June 13 against New York (fifth time, third time against New York)...had a no decision in the 3-2, 18-inning win.
- Left his June 29 start against St. Louis after 3.2 innings with tightness in his right hamstring.

#### **SHANE PETERSON**

- Made his Major League debut with a start at first base April 16 against Houston and went 0 for 4.
- Singled off Xavier Cedeno in the fourth inning April 17 against Houston for his first Major League hit.

#### **JOSH REDDICK**

- Hit .139 in April, which was the third lowest April batting average in Oakland history (min. 75 PA)...Don Baylor hit .129 in 1976 and Ben Grieve hit .132 in 1999.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 7 to 30 with a sprained right wrist...it was his first career stint on the DL...went 3 for 14 (.214) with five runs, three walks, one strikeout and two stolen bases during a four-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (May 27) and Triple-A Sacramento (May 28-30)...appeared in two games in right field and two at designated hitter.
- Walked with the bases loaded in the 10th inning June 1 against Chicago to force in the winning run...it was the 25th "walk-off" walk in Oakland history, the first since Bobby Crosby did it in the 17th inning against Los Angeles (NL) June 17, 2006...it was his third career walk-off RBI (single, double).
- Snapped a career-high 30-game homerless streak with a solo shot in the seventh inning off Quintana June 6 at Chicago (AL).
- Had his third career four-hit game June 16 against Seattle.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 19 consecutive games from June 18 to July 13...
   hit .262 (17 for 65) with a .329 on-base percentage (7 bb, 1 sf) during the streak.
- Struck out a career-high tying four times July 14 against Boston.

#### **CHRIS RESOP**

 Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2006 with Florida, 2008 with Atlanta and 2011-12 with Pittsburgh).

#### **FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ**

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 23 with a sprained right elbow.
- Had successful UCL reconstruction surgery March 27...the procedure was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston, Texas.

#### **ADAM ROSALES**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was added to the 15-day DL March 26 with a strained left intercostal...hit .320 (8 for 25) with one home run and one RBI during a six-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton (April 17-19) and Triple-A Sacramento (April 21-24)...was reinstated April 25.
- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles (AL) and ended up
  going 1 for 6...he and Norris had six plate appearances, which match the most in Oakland history by
  a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12, 1992 vs. Texas).

- Struck out as a pinch hitter in the 10th inning June 13 against New York (AL) and ended up going 0 for 4 with a career-high four strikeouts...is the first player in Oakland history to strikeout four times in a game that he didn't start.

#### **SCOTT SIZEMORE**

- Doubled in the second inning April 3 against Seattle in his first game since September 28, 2011 at Seattle...that extended his hitting streak to six games dating back to September 24, 2011 (8 for 20, .400), which is the longest hitting streak of his career.
- Did not strike out May 5 in New York, snapping his career-high streak of 12 consecutive games with
  a strikeout (20 strikeouts total)...that included back-to-back four strikeout games last May 1 and 3...
  according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Athletic to strike out four times in back-to-back
  games...the four strikeouts match his career high (three times).

#### **SETH SMITH**

- Went 2 for 3 with a double April 1 against Seattle in his fifth consecutive Opening Day start (2009-10 in left field with Colorado, 2011 in right field with Colorado, 2012-13 at designated hitter with Oakland)...is 7 for 22 (.318) with two doubles, a home run and three RBI in his five openers...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers at designated hitter since Erubiel Durazo (2003-05).
- Matched his career-high with four hits April 11 at Los Angeles (third time, last: June 4, 2012 vs. Texas) after collecting three hits the night before.
- Hit his sixth career pinch hit home run May 24 at Houston, his first since May 27, 2010 against Arizona.
- Had a career-high four walks June 12 against New York.
- Started the game June 13 against New York (AL) 1 for 6 before singling in the 16th and 18th innings...is the third player in Oakland history to collect two hits in a game in the 16th inning or later...the others are Dick Green on June 4, 1971 against Washington (17th and 21st) and Bert Campaneris on Sept. 6, 1969 against Minnesota (16th and 17th).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 16 against Seattle off Iwakuma for his 500th career hit.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
- Had his first career three-hit game April 16 against Houston...his second came June 22 at Seattle.
- Had the first two-steal game of his career June 12 against New York.
- Stole a base in three consecutive games from June 5-13 (four stolen bases total) after stealing four bases over the first 115 games of his career.
- Homered July 7 at Kansas City to snap a career-high 90-game homerless streak...it was his first home run since April 27, 2012.

#### **DAN STRAILY**

 Struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in 6.2 innings (sixth time, last: Tim Hudson, Sept. 10, 1999 at Tampa Bay) in an 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...is the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter.

#### **STEPHEN VOGT**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento June 25
- Had a sacrifice fly in his first at bat as an Athletic June 25 against Cincinnati, his first career RBI.
- Snapped a career-opening 0 for 32 streak with a home run in the fourth inning June 28 against St.
  Louis off Joe Kelly...the hitless streak was the second longest career-opening hitless streak by a
  non-pitcher since 1973 (Chris Carter, OAK; 33 in 2010).

#### **CHRIS YOUNG**

- Is in his eighth season in the majors...the first seven came with Arizona...is on his seventh Opening Day roster.
- Made his A's debut April 3 against Seattle and homered in the seventh inning...became the 20th player in Oakland history to homer in his first game with the A's (last: Jonny Gomes, March 29, 2012 vs. Seattle at Tokyo).
- His sixth inning double April 11 at Los Angeles was the 200th of his career.
- Had his 11th career regular season multi-homer game April 24 at Boston (also has one in the post-season).
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from April 30 to May 17 with a strained left quad...it was his second
  career stint on the DL...made one rehab appearance with Triple-A Sacramento May 16 and went 1
  for 1 with two walks, a run and a stolen base in a start in center field against Oklahoma City.
- Had back-to-back three-hit games for the second time in his career May 24 and 25 at Houston (Aug. 16-17, 2007).
- Went 0 for 4 with four strikeouts June 26 against Cincinnati...it was the fifth four-strikeout game of his career, but his first since May 20, 2009 at Florida.
