WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the Diamondbacks 7-1 last night to finish 4-0 on a brief 4-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Arizona (1-0, makeup game from 5/29 postponement)...Rangers have won 4 in a row, 4th win streak of 4+ games in '13, longest since a season-best 5-game win streak from June 19-23...are 4-4 in last 8 and 5-5 in last 10, losing 9 of 15 and 12 of last 19, going 13-16 in last 29 games since a 9-2 stretch from June 17-28...have a 28-32 record beginning May 26... team's 26-29 (.473) mark since the beginning of June ranks 10th in A.L. and T17th in majors in that span...current 60-49 (.550) record is T6th-best in the A.L., T9th-best in majors, and club's fewest wins through 109 games since opening 56-53 in 2008...Rangers have lost 12 of 19 since reaching season-high 16 games above .500 following win on 7/9 at BAL...team went 11-15 in July, just the second losing month in a span of 14 full months beginning June 2011 (9-14 in July 2012)...Texas won 17 games in both April and May, only MLB team with 17+ wins in season's first 2 months, just 3rd season ever for club to have back-to-back 17-win months (also 1977 and

STANDINGS: The Rangers are in 2nd place in the A.L. West, 3.5 games behind first-place Oakland...have gained 2.5 games in the division the past 3 nights, this after 32 days without gaining any ground in the West from June 24-July 29...club had a season-high 6.0-game deficit through games of both Sunday and Monday...team spent 28 days in second place without gaining on the division leader from July 2-29, 2nd-longest span in the division era (since 1969) behind only the 2009 Cubs (35 straight days in 2nd place, no gain)...prior to last weekend, Texas had not been 4.0-or-more GB in the West since ending the 2009 season with a 10.0-game deficit to the Angels...Texas had a season-high 7.0-game lead through games of 5/15 and 5/16...currently half-game behind CLE for 2nd A.L. Wild Card spot.

ON THE ROAD: Tonight, the Rangers begin a 10-game, 11-day road trip against the A's (3 G), Angels (3 G), and Astros (4 G) with an off day on Thursday...it is the longest road trip of the season in both games and days...Rangers have lost 4 straight and 7 of last 8 away games...club's 27-25 (.519) road record is 3rd-best in A.L., 3rd time in last 4 seasons to be over .500 this late in the road schedule...recent road games have followed a pattern...club was 8-1 on road from May 8-25, then went 1-7 from May 26-June 8, followed by another 8-1 span June 9-July 9, and are in a current 1-7 stretch beginning July 10...current 4-game away slide matches longest losing streak in '13 (3rd time), last longer streak was 5 straight, June 11-16, 2011.

<u>VS. OAKLAND:</u> Texas makes the 2nd of 3 trips to Oakland this weekend... Texas has gone 6-4 vs. Oakland in '13, winning 5 of 6 and 6 of last 9...are 2-1-0 in first 3 series vs. A's, including taking last 2 of 3 in lone visit to the Coliseum from May 14-15...Rangers are 6-7 in last 13 G and 7-9 in last 16 G vs. A's dating to 2012...took 3 of 4 in last meeting, June 17-20 in Arlington...Texas leads all-time series 321-307.

--At the Coliseum: The Rangers have won 2 straight at O.co Coliseum after having dropped previous 5 straight...club has dropped 9 of 13 here beginning 9/22/11 and is 19-23 at the Coliseum beginning in 2009...the A's hold a 163-140 lifetime edge in the series in what ranks as T2nd-oldest park in the A.L.

<u>WINNING IN THE DIVISION</u>: Beginning July 29, the Rangers are in a stretch in which 13 of 14 and 19 of 22 games are against A.L. West opponents...club is 28-13 vs. West foes in '13, winning 6 of last 7, the highest intradivision winning pct. of any team in baseball...Oakland's record against the West ranks 3rd.

RON WASHINGTON has 580 career wins as a manager, needing just one win to tie Bobby Valentine (581) for the most in Rangers history...Washington's .537 (580-501) career winning pct. as Rangers manager is the best in club history among managers with at least 2 full seasons...his win total ranks 4th among all managers since 2007, trailing only Charlie Manuel (604), Mike Scioscia (595), and Joe Maddon (588).

NEW ADDITION: Today, Texas acquired INF Adam Rosales on a waiver claim from Oakland...the club will make a corresponding move for the 25-man roster prior to tonight's game.

YU PILES UP K'S: Yu Darvish earned the win last night, tossing 7.0 shutout innings with 14 strikeouts and no walks...the 14 K's matched his career high (4th time, all in '13), and in 3 of his 4 career 14-K games, he has issued no walks...according to Elias Sports Bureau, it makes Darvish just the 3rd pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) with 3 games of 14+ strikeouts and no walks in a season, joining Roger Clemens (1997 Blue Jays) and Randy Johnson (2001 Diamondbacks)...both of those pitchers would go on to win the Cy Young Award in those years...other notes on Darvish:

- Elias Sports Bureau says that Darvish has 407 career strikeouts through 50 games, 2nd-highest total by any MLB pitcher since 1900 through his first 50 career starts to only Dwight Gooden (418 K's in first 50 starts).
 Darvish has 16 career double-digit strikeout games in his first 50 games/
- Darvish has 16 career double-digit strikeout games in his first 50 games/ starts in MLB...according to Elias Sports Bureau, it is the 2nd-most in any pitcher's first 50 career games since 1900 (Dwight Gooden-20)
- He whiffed 10 of the first 13 batters he faced last night...according to STATS Inc., it made him just the 6th pitcher since 1974 to accomplish that feat, the only A.L. pitcher in that span to pull the trick (while it was vs. an N.L. club, the D-Backs did have the DH)...Darvish is the first Ranger to ever do it...others to do it since '74 (all 10 of first 13 BF, all w/ pitcher batting): FLA's Ricky Nolasco on 9/30/09, LAD's Brad Penny on 5/7/07, SD's Jake Peavy on 4/25/07, ARI's Randy Johnson on 5/8/01, and LAD's Ramon Martinez on 6/4/90.
- Darvish's 4 games of 14-or-more K's are the most in a single season in Rangers history, surpassing Nolan Ryan's 3 in 1990...owns 4 of the 14 games of 14+ strikeouts in club history, 2nd-most to Ryan's 7...also owns 4 of the 6 14+ strikeout games in the majors this season (Anibal Sanchez, 17 on 4/26 vs. ATL; Chris Sale, 14 on 6/14 at HOU).
- In 3 starts since coming off the DL on July 22, is 2-1 with a 0.47 ERA (1 ER/19.1 IP) and 29 strikeouts...Darvish has 6.0+ IP while allowing one-or-zero runs in all 3 starts, longest such streak by a Ranger since Matt Harrison had 3 straight from June 8-18, 2012.

ELVIS ANDRUS has a current 14-game hit streak at .333 (17-51) with 7 walks against 8 K's in that span, a .424 OBP and .836 OPS...it is the longest active hit streak in MLB, T2nd-longest hit streak of his career... only other streaks that long were 16 G (8/28/09-9/14/09), 14 G (4/28/10-5/14/10), and another 14 G (8/8-24/10)...it is also T2nd-longest hit streak by a Ranger in '13, trailing only Leonys Martin (15 G, 6/15-7/2).

DON'T YOU...FORGET ABOUT ME: A.J. Pierzynski started at catcher last night after Geovany Soto had started the first 3 games of the homestand behind the plate (Pierzynski DH'd those 3 G)...with Pierzynski's HR last night, the Texas starting catcher(s) have combined to go 8-for-14 (.571) with 3 HR, a double, 7 RBI, and 4 R during the 4-game win streak.

<u>A.J. PIERZYNSKI</u> homered and added a stolen base in his start behind the plate last night...only 2 other catchers in Texas history had a HR and SB in the same game: Ivan Rodriguez (6x, last 5/15/00 vs. TB) and Jim Sundberg (twice in 3-day span in 1977).

OFF DAYS ON THE WAY: Last night's game w/ Arizona, previously scheduled to be an off day, was a makeup for a May 29 postponement...the makeup date will result in Texas playing on the maximum 20 consecutive dates from All-Star break through Wed. (currently 6-8 since break)...club has 6 off days remaining in '13, falling on 6 consecutive Thursdays beginning on Aug. 8, followed by games for 17 straight days to end the campaign.

MISCELLANEOUS: Texas has won 8 straight games when hitting multiple home runs...since hitting a pair of 3-run HR on Tuesday, each of club's last 5 HR have been solo shots...Rangers have exactly 6 extra-base hits in 2 of the past 3 games, this after not having that many XBH since June 17 vs. OAK...last night was just 2nd time since May 16 (10-4 win vs. DET) for the Rangers to win a game by at least 6 runs, the other also being a 7-1 win on July 13 at DET.

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 13th start tonight in the opener of a 3-game weekend set in Oakland...is 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA (4 ER/9.2 IP) has a pair of starts since returning from the disabled...will be working on regular 4-day's rest after a 6-0 loss on Sunday at Cleveland...was on DL 6/9-7/22 with right shoulder inflammation and 5/16-6/4 with right biceps tendinitis...has been limited to 12 starts in 2013 due to injuries and has just 3 starts for the Rangers since May 16...has allowed more than 2 ER in just 3 of 12 starts but has thrown more than 6.0 IP just twice...last 6 starts for Texas since 4/23: 2-2, 2.93 (15 ER/46.0 IP) w/ 17 BB and 27 SO...has received one-run-or-less of support in 7 of 12 starts...will be making just his 14th start since 2011 after working almost exclusively out of the bullpen in 2012 (58 G/1 GS)... was named to the A.L. All-Star team in 2011, his only other year as a starter...among pitchers in Rangers history with at least 300.0 innings, Ogando is in the top 5 in WHIP (3rd, 1.13), ERA (2nd, 3.11), opponent batting average (3rd, .226), opponent on-base percentage (3rd, .287), opponent OPS (4th, .638), and opponent slugging (5th, .351).

LAST START: Took the loss in a 6-0 Texas defeat on Sunday in Cleveland (4.2 IP, 6 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 1 SO, 0 HR, 92 pitches/61 strikes)...allowed a baserunner in 4 of 5 innings, including multiple runners in 3 frames...retired first 2 batters in the 5th, but exited the game following a walk and 2 straight singles...had held the Tribe scoreless over this first 4 frames...7 of the 9 batters in the Cleveland lineup hit from the left side, going 5-for-16.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 1-1, 3.60 (10 ER/25.0 IP) over 16 games/2 starts in his career against the Athletics...was the winning pitcher in the Rangers' 6-2 victory on May 15 at the Coliseum (W, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 0 HR, 92 pitches/60 strikes)... had a no-hitter through 5 innings in that contest, despite a walk and hit batter, as first hit allowed was double to Eric Sogard to lead off the 6th...exited after leadoff single by Josh Donaldson in the 7th, after which Michael Kirkman allowed the inherited runner to score...Nelson Cruz hit a 3-run HR in the 5th to stake Ogando to a 6-0 lead before he permitted his 2 runs in that game.

ON THE ROAD: Has made 9 of 12 starts away from Arlington this season, going 2-3 with a 3.14 ERA (17 ER/48.2 IP)...despite missing 10 weeks, his 8 road starts are still T2nd-most on the club entering tonight...has won just one of his last 8 road outings...is 7-6, 3.14 (44 ER/126.0 IP) in 22 career road starts...has allowed 2 ER or fewer in 16 of 22 career road starts...has allowed a .226 opp. avg. and just 11 total HR in those road starts, 3 of which came in start 4/17/11 at NYY...allowed HR in 5 of last 7 on road (6 total HR)...was 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (12 ER/32.0 IP) in 30 road games/one start in 2012.

AS A STARTER: Has gone 17-11, 3.37 (88 ER/235.0 IP) in 42 career starts (29 in 2011, one in 2012, 12 in 2013)...the 3.40 ERA as a starter is 4th-lowest in club history among pitchers with at least 40 starts (B. Blyleven-2.74; G. Perry-3.26, J. Matlack-3.36)...has held opposition to a .233 average as a starter, 5th-lowest in club history to Hall of Famer Nolan Ryan (.197), teammate Yu Darvish (.207), and Hall of Famer Bert Blyleven (.228), and Charlie Hough (.232)...that figure also ranks 12th-best in baseball since 2011...reeled off 18.1-inning scoreless streak over a span of 5 regular season starts from 9/15/11 to 4/8/13 vs. TB...lone start last year was spot effort on 6/10 at SF, filling in for disabled Derek Holland (retired all 9 batters faced)...combined with 3 relievers on a 3-hit shutout of the Giants...sustained a groin injury while attempting to beat out a bunt in the 4th inning and was forced to exit the game, resulting in a one-month stay on the disabled list.

RIGHT STUFF: Has held opposing right-handed batters to a .211 (124-587) average in his career...righties are hitting .293 (29-89) against him this season, highest in his career by 90 points...his .179 (24-134) opp. avg. by right-handers in 2012 was 3rd-lowest in the A.L. and 6th-lowest in the majors (140+ PA's against).

VS. LEFT: Is limiting left-handed batters to a career-low .201 average (29-144) through 12 starts, the 4th-lowest figure among ML right-handers (min. 100 AB vs. LHB)...only lower figures are by NYM's Matt Harvey (.172), BOS' Clay Buchholz (.181), and MIA's Jose Fernandez (.197).

2013: His 2.91 run support average would be 2nd-lowest in the A.L. if he qualified... opposition is hitting .179 (5-28) w/ RISP in last 7 starts, .231 (12-52) w/ RISP for the year...holding batters to a .233 average (17-73) with 2 outs...first time through order: .214 (21-98), 2nd time: .231 (21-91), 3rd time: .296 (16-54)...with Pierzynski: 3-3, 3.04 (18 ER/53.1 IP) in 10 starts (incl. first 7)...with Soto: 0-0, 3.18 (2 ER/5.2 IP) in one start; with Chirinos: 1-0, 3,00 (2 ER/6,0 IP)...began the season with 3 consecutive qualifying starts (5.0+ IP) with one run or fewer allowed in each outing, joining Rick Honeycutt (3 starts, April 6-17, 1983) as the only 2 pitchers in club history to do it to start a season.
