The A's trail the season series, 4-7...are 1-3 in Oakland and 3-4 in Texas...have lost the season series five times over the previous seven seasons and are 66-78 (.458) against the Rangers since 2006...are 307-322 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 165-149 in Oakland and 143-173 in Texas...including 76-85 at Rangers Ballpark...have an all-time record of 404-404 against the Rangers/Senators.

Ryan Cook has not allowed an earned run in his past 13 games and 14.0 innings.

Jed Lowrie has hit safely in each of the eight games this homestand...is 13 for 33 (.394) with four multiple hit games over that span.

Bob Melvin has compiled a 697-674 record in 10 seasons as a manager...needs three more wins for 700 in his career...is 204-166 (.551) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is tied for the seventh best record in MLB over that span.

Eric Sogard is on a career-high 10-game hitting streak (14 for 39, .359).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1998 Matt Stairs homers in his fifth consecutive game to tie what was then the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a home run...Kansas City's George Alusik set the record in 1962 and Dave Kingman matched it in 1986.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Are on a three-game losing streak, which is their longest since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five straight...are now 7-7 since the All-Star Break and 63-46 for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...have a 2½ game lead over Texas in the American League West, which is the second largest lead by a division leader in the AL (Cleveland, 3)...however, that is the A's smallest lead since July 20 when they held a two game lead...were in third place in the West on May 16 with a 20-22 record and trailed Texas by 7½ games...have gone a Major League best 43-24 (.642) since May 17 and have picked up 10 games in the standings over that span...remain in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 28th consecutive day (since July 2)...those are the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...for the season, the A's have spent 53 days in sole possession of first, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 16-17 against the West since May 10 while going 29-11 against everyone else...are batting .259 (442 for 1707) with 256 runs (49 games, 5.22 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .230 (460 for 2004) with 228 runs (60 games, 3.80 runs per game) against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.93 ERA (197 er in 451.2 ip) against the AL West compared to 3.44 (207 er in 541.2 ip) against everyone else.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-12 (.636) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the majors (Texas, 18-10)...are tied for the lead in one-run wins...are 7-4 (.636) in extra inning games...are tied for the AL lead in extra inning wins and are tied for the third best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 13-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...overcame a five-run deficit to win for the third time last Sunday, the second time against the Angels (also April 29)...it marks the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1), Toronto (1-2) and Texas (0-1)...have won 24 of the last 33 home games and are 34-19 (.642) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...also have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road...begin a six-game road trip on Tuesday to Cincinnati (two games) and Toronto (four games).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.295), fewest walks per nine innings (2.45) and fewest walks (268)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...are on pace to issue 398 walks for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.63) and opponents batting average (.242) and are third in opponents slugging percentage (.382)...have recorded the fourth fewest strikeouts (747)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 86 consecutive games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-3 with a 5.56 ERA (27 er in 43.2 ip) through the first eight games of this homestand...have walked 22 while striking out 26 and have yielded nine home runs...are now 32-13 with a 3.25 ERA (154 er in 427.0 ip) and .233 (374 for 1603) opponents batting average over the last 67 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 46-34 with a 3.91 ERA (290 er in 667.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (4), rank third in innings pitched (667.1), tied for third in wins and are fifth in ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .211 (138 for 654) with 67 runs scored over the last 20 games (3.4 runs per game)...are hitting .243 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have been shut out eight times this year...the A's lead the majors in walks (405) and rank fifth in the American League in doubles (198)...A's pinch hitters are batting .133 (12 for 90), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (105), rank second in walks (14), are tied for second in home runs (3) and tied for third in RBI (11).

IN JULY: The A's went 15-10 in the month of July, which tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and have now had a winning record for eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...batted .222 (183 for 823) in July, which was the lowest mark in the majors...scored 93 runs in 25 games (3.72 runs per game)...however, the pitching staff allowed just 84 runs for a 3.06 ERA (76 er in 223.1 ip), which was second lowest in the AL...allowed the third fewest walks (64).

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 41-26 (.612) in night games, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 40-23)...are 22-20 (.524) during the day...are 50-8 when scoring four or more runs compared to 13-38 when scoring less than four...are 43-30 (.589) when facing a right-handed starting pitcher and 20-15 (.571) against left-handers...have turned just 78 double plays, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...have sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning 20 times this year...did that just 22 times last year.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the season...the A's are 10-11 (.476) in his starting assignments this year and 27-23 (.540) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 14 of his 21 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his last 11 starts...that matches the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 among pitchers with at least three innings in an outing (Rich Harden, April 9, 2006-April 15, 2007)...opponents are batting .181 (45 for 248) during the streak...had a seven-start streak from May 28 to June 29 where he allowed five hits or fewer and two walks or fewer...that matched the longest such streak by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916 (Alan Wirth, May 6-Sept. 15, 1978).

INDECISIVE: Has a no decision in each of his last six starts, which matches the longest streak by an Athletics starter since at least 1916...the other starters with six consecutive no decisions are Mike Norris (June 1-Aug. 6, 1983), Rick Langford (July 17, 1983-June 25, 1985) and Carlos Reyes (June 10-July 17, 1994)...has a 3.50 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) and .191 (25 for 131) opponents batting average during this six start stretch...the A's have lost five of the six games...left with the lead in two of the no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 6 and 23).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.78 ERA (22 er in 71.1 ip) and .181 (45 for 248) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts...the winning streak matches his career high from Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012.

LAST 14, FIRST SEVEN: Is 5-1 with a 2.85 ERA (29 er in 91.2 ip) and .183 (58 for 317) opponents batting average over his last 14 starts (since May 11)...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .178 (32 for 180) average over his last 11 starts after surrendering a .397 mark over his first seven starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is averaging the sixth fewest pitches per inning (15.3) in the American League and seventh fewest pitches per game (91.9)...is tied for ninth in wild pitches (7) and hit batters (7).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 1-3 with a 2.88 ERA (21 er in 65.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-3 with a 5.37 ERA (36 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of the 15 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision...is 1-6 with two runs of support or fewer and 5-0 with three runs or more...is now 16-0 in 24 career starts with run support of three or more...is 18-2 with run support of two or more.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 17 runs in the first inning for a 7.29 ERA (21.0 ip)...has a 3.43 ERA (40 er in 105.0 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are batting .318 (28 for 88) with six home runs in the first inning compared to .214 (80 for 374) with 10 home runs from the second inning on.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors in his last four starts after going errorless over his first 17 starts this year...his three errors are tied for the most among American League pitchers.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 16 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...12 of the 16 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for sixth in the AL.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 0-0 with a 3.91 ERA and .194 opponents batting average in four starts in July...went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of June...had the lowest opponents batting average in the American League in June and ranked third in ERA...was 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA and .216 opponents average in five starts in May...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

LAST START: He had his sixth consecutive no decision in the A's 10-6 win over Los Angeles last Sunday here in Oakland...walked a career high seven batters in 5.0 innings...allowed four runs in the first inning, all with two outs...Kendrick and Trumbo had RBI singles and Callaspo had a two run single...also allowed a run in the second when Aybar tripled and scored on a fielders choice...the A's tied the game with three runs in the third and two in the fifth but he walked the first two batters in the sixth inning...was relieved by Chavez, who allowed one of the runs to score...the A's then scored five times in the bottom of the sixth to win.

PARKER vs. TEXAS: Is 4-1 with a 2.91 ERA (34.0 ip, 21 h, 11 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 4 hr) in five career starts...the four wins are his most against any team...is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (8 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts in Texas...is 1-1 with a 3.21 ERA (14.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the loss came in a 3-1 decision at Texas May 22...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run home run by Murphy and a solo home run by Beltre...then shut out the Rangers on three hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's were held to a run on four hits by Wolf and the Rangers bullpen...then picked up the win in the A's 6-2 victory at Texas June 18...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the third inning on a two-run single by Pierzynski...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit after the Pierzynski single and retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (10-7, 3.90 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season...went 4-1 with a 4.86 ERA and .252 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of July...tied for second in the American League wins in July...it marked the second time he won four games in a month in his career (Sept., 2012)...has allowed at least two home runs in each of his last three starts (eight home runs total), which is the longest streak by an A's pitcher since Mark Redman had a four-game streak from June 27-July 17, 2004...has allowed 26 home runs for the season, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill allowed 27 in 2009...is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (21.0 ip, 18 h, 8 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts against Texas, including 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 13 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Save/Save Opportunities: 31/42 (73.8%)

The A's bullpen is 4-4 with 12 saves, two blown saves, a 2.17 ERA (18 er in 74.2 ip), .205 (56 for 273) opponents batting average and one home run allowed over its past 26 games...has a 3.04 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has the fewest walks (93) and strikeouts (273) in the AL, ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.290) and has allowed the second fewest home runs (23)...first batters faced are 62 for 278 (.223) with 14 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .263 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL and are tied for the lowest opponents on-base percentage.

- Has not allowed a run in 22 of his past 24 games (5 er in 21.2 ip, 2.08 ERA) and is 17 for 18 in save opportunities over that span.
- Leads the American League in save percentage (96.6%) and is tied for fourth in saves (28)...his 28 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since Houston Street (37) in 2006.
- First batters faced are hitting .286 (12 for 42) but opponents are 6 for 32 (.188) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 1.21 ERA (4 er in 29.2 ip) in 31 games at night compared to 3.38 (5 er in 13.1 ip) in 14 day games.
- Has a save in three games against Texas this season (3.0 ip, 1 h, 4 so)...his four career wins against the Rangers are his most against any team.
- Has 54 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is seven away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place.
- Had his Athletics record streak of 44 consecutive saves snapped July 23...it was the sixth longest save streak in Major League history...his streak of 26 consecutive saves to start the season was the second longest streak in Oakland history (Dennis Eckersley, 36 in 1992).
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched a scoreless sixth inning in the game (1 bb, 1 so).
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
