



## Texas Rangers (61-49) at Oakland Athletics (63-46)

RHP Matt Garza (7-1, 2.95 AL/NL) vs. RHP Jarrod Parker (6-6, 4.07)

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The Rangers beat the A's 8-3 last night and are 1-0 on this 10-game, 11-day road trip to Oakland (1-0), Anaheim (3 G), and Houston (4 G) with an off day on Thursday...club has won 5 straight to match a season high (see below)...went 4-0 on homestand that preceded this trip...Rangers are 5-4 in last 9 and 6-5 in last 11, losing 9 of 16 and 12 of last 20, going 14-16 in last 30 games since a 9-2 stretch from June 17-28...have a 29-32 record beginning May 26...current 61-49 (.555) record is T5th-best in the A.L., T8th-best in majors...Rangers have lost 12 of 20 since reaching season-high 16 games above .500 following win on 7/9 at BAL, but have climbed to 12-over for first time since 7/19...team went 11-15 in July, just the second losing month in a span of 14 full months beginning June 2011 (9-14 in July 2012)...Texas won 17 games in both April and May, only MLB team with 17+ wins in season's first 2 months, just 3rd season ever for club to have back-to-back 17-win months (also 1977 and 1993).

**STREAKIN':** Rangers have won 5 in a row, matching longest win streak of the year (also June 19-23)...it has been over a year since the club won more than 5 straight, a 7-game run from June 15-22, 2012...current run is 3rd-longest active win streak in majors to only Atlanta (8) and Detroit (6).

**STANDINGS:** The Rangers are in 2nd place in the A.L. West, 2.5 games behind first-place Oakland...have gained 3.5 games in the division the past 4 nights, this after 32 days without gaining any ground in the West from June 24-July 29...current 2.5-game deficit is smallest since 7/20 (-2.0 GB)...club had a season-high 6.0-game deficit through games of both Sunday and Monday...team spent 28 days in second place without gaining on the division leader from July 2-29, 2nd-longest span in the division era (since 1969) behind only the 2009 Cubs (35 straight days in 2nd place, no gain)...prior to last weekend, Texas had not been 4.0-or-more GB in the West since ending the 2009 season with a 10.0-game deficit to the Angels...Texas had a season-high 7.0-game lead through games of 5/15 and 5/16...are currently tied with Baltimore for the 2nd A.L. Wild Card spot.

**ON THE ROAD:** Current 10-game, 11-day trip is longest of the year in both games and days...last night's win snapped a 4-game road losing streak, as team has still lost 7 of last 9 away games...club's 28-25 (.528) road record is 3rd-best in A.L....recent road games have followed a pattern...club was 8-1 on road from May 8-25, then went 1-7 from May 26-June 8, followed by another 8-1 span June 9-July 9, and are in a current 2-7 stretch beginning July 10.

**VS. OAKLAND:** This is the 2nd of 3 trips to Oakland for Rangers in '13... Texas has gone 7-4 vs. Oakland in '13, winning 6 of 7 and 7 of last 10... have gone 2-1-0 in first 3 series vs. A's, including taking last 2 of 3 in lone visit to the Coliseum from May 13-15...Rangers are 7-7 in last 14 G and 8-9 in last 17 G vs. A's dating to 2012...took 3 of 4 in last series, June 17-20 in Arlington...Texas leads all-time series 322-307.

**--At the Coliseum:** The Rangers have won 3 straight at O.co Coliseum after having dropped previous 5 straight...club has dropped 9 of 14 here beginning 9/22/11 and is 20-23 at the Coliseum beginning in 2009...the A's hold a 163-141 lifetime edge in the series in what ranks as T2nd-oldest park in the A.L.

**WINNING IN THE DIVISION:** Beginning July 29, the Rangers are in a stretch in which 13 of 14 and 19 of 22 games are against A.L. West opponents...club is 29-13 (.690) vs. West foes in '13, winning 7 of last 8, the highest intradivision winning pct. of any team in baseball...Oakland's record against the West ranks 6th.

**RON WASHINGTON** has 581 career wins as a manager, tying Bobby Valentine (581) for the most in Rangers history...Washington's .537 (581-501) career winning pct. as Rangers manager is the best in club history among managers with at least 2 full seasons...his win total ranks 4th among all managers since 2007, trailing only Charlie Manuel (604), Mike Scioscia (596), and Joe Maddon (588).

**SAY YOU'LL BE THERE:** The Texas offense scored 8 runs in last night's win and have 35 runs during the club's 5-game win streak (7.0 R/G), this after having been shut out in 3 of the 4 games preceding this win streak.

• Batters have hit multiple home runs in 5 straight, 2nd such streak of the season (also July 3-7)...the only other ML team with multiple HR in 5 straight in 2013 is Baltimore, done once: May 21-25...the Rangers club record for multiple HR in consecutive games is 6 straight, done 3 times, last from Aug. 2-7, 2005.

• Texas went 3-for-9 with RISP last night, improving to 33-2 this season when having 3+ hits with RISP.

**NO WALKS NEEDED:** Texas posted its first win of the season last night without a walk by batters, first such victory since 9/27/12 vs. OAK in Texas (9-7 win).

**I'LL BE YOUR BIG WAVE:** Texas has won the first 2 games in August by at least 5 runs, just the 2nd time all year to do so in 2 straight (also 3 straight, April 19-21)...from June 1-July 31, Texas won a total of 3 games by 5+ runs, and now have 2 such wins to begin August.

**BULLPEN DOES THE JOB:** Five Texas relievers combined for 5.0 shutout innings last night after Alexi Ogando's 4.0-inning start, finishing off a win... the Rangers bullpen features 3 of the A.L.'s top 10 relief ERA's in Neal Cotts, Joe Nathan, and Tanner Scheppers...relievers have permitted one run over 8.2 innings the last 3 games, and have gone scoreless in 16 of the last 23 contests with a 2.13 ERA (17 ER/71.2 IP) in that span to drop from 3.30 to 3.06, 4th-lowest in the A.L.

• Last night was the 5th time this season for the Texas bullpen to throw at least 5.0 IP in a win, 2 of those wins against the A's (other 6/17 at TEX).

**OFFENSE FROM THE BACKSTOPS:** During the current 5-game win streak, Texas starting catchers Geovany Soto (3 GS) and A.J. Pierzynski (2 GS) have combined to go 10-for-18 (.556) with 3 HR, a double, 10 RBI, and 4 R.

• Pierzynski has posted 3 RBI in consecutive contests for the first time in his career, just 2nd Ranger to do it in '13 (Cruz - April 23-24)...last longer streak with 3+ RBI by a Ranger was done by Alfonso Soriano - 3 straight, May 4-7, 2005...last Texas catcher w/ 3+ RBI in back-to-back starts was Mike Napoli, Sept. 27-28, 2011.

**RANGERS ON FOX:** Today marks 6th of 7 scheduled FOX Saturday appearances for Texas in 2013 (have gone 2-3: loss 4/6 vs. LAA; win 6/22 at STL; loss 6/29 vs. CIN; loss 7/6 vs. HOU, win 7/13 at DET)...game will be going to 39% of the country, the lead game on FOX today, as it will accordingly have the lead crew with Joe Buck and Tim McCarver joined by Ken Rosenthal on the field...it is the 2nd time this season for the Buck/McCarver tandem to call the Rangers (also 6/22 at STL)...while the duo called many Rangers postseason games in 2010-11, they had not called one of the team's regular season games together prior to this year since August 15, 1998 at Yankee Stadium, a 16-5 Texas victory.

**A HR BY THE DH:** Jurickson Profar homered last night from the 9th spot in the order while serving as the designated hitter...it was just the 23rd game in Rangers history for the DH to bat 9th, first since 8/14/12 at NYD (Mitch Moreland), just the 3rd game in which a 9th-place-hitting-DH hit a home run for Texas...the others were a 2-HR game by Dave Hostetler on 7/30/83 at BAL and Taylor Teagarden also did it on 9/12/08 here in Oakland...Profar is the 6th different Ranger to homer as the DH in '13.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** Elvis Andrus' current 15-game hit streak is longest active streak in MLB, tied for longest by a Ranger in '13, and one shy of matching his career high...Texas has used 40 players all year, and Adam Rosales would be no. 41 when he makes his Rangers debut...have already used more than last year (39)...last night was the 5th time to win a game in which the starter lasted 4.0-innings-or-less, the other 4 being starts by Justin Grimm (2) or Nick Tevesch (2).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#22 Matt Garza, RHP (7-1, 2.95 AL/NL)

TODAY: The 29-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 3rd start for Texas this afternoon in the middle game of this 3-game series in Oakland...is starting on regular 4 days' rest...is 6-0 with a 1.59 ERA (9 ER/51.0 IP) and 44 strikeouts in his last 7 starts, winning 6 in a row before a no-decision on Mon. vs. LAA (7.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R-ER, 3 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 107 pitches/68 strikes)...the 6 consecutive starts won and 6-game winning streak are both career bests...won his Texas debut on 7/24 vs. NYY with one unearned run over 7.1 innings...has earned a quality start in 8 consecutive starts, longest single-season streak of his career and T9th-longest streak in the majors this season...holding opponents to a .223 average (71-319), lowest mark of his career...has allowed 5-or-fewer hits in 4-of-5 and 6-of-8 starts...has not allowed a first-inning run in 13 starts this season...was acquired on July 22 from the Chicago Cubs in exchange for RHPs C.J. Edwards and Justin Grimm, INF Mike Olt, and a PTBNL...missed the beginning of this season after suffering a left lat strain on February 17, and did not make his first start with the Cubs until May 21...was in his third season with Chicago-NL after 3 years with Tampa Bay...at time of the trade, was one of 21 active starters (minimum 1000.0 innings) with a career ERA of 3.80-or-less and a WHIP of 1.28-or-less...made at least 30 starts in 4 consecutive seasons from 2008-11, and surpassed 200.0 innings in both 2009 and 2010 with Tampa Bay.

STREAKING: Has gone 6-0, 1.59 (9 ER/51.0 IP) with 44 strikeouts in his last 7 starts beginning 6/21, dropping season ERA from 4.98 to 2.95...is tied for the most wins and owns the 3rd-lowest ERA in MLB in that span (min. 39.2 IP)...won 6 straight starts for first time in his career, June 6-July 24, also his first career 6-game win streak...only Bartolo Colon (8, May 20-June 28) and Patrick Corbin (7, April 28-June 2) have longer streaks of consecutive starts won in '13.

LAST START: Took a no-decision in his 2nd start as a Ranger on Mon. vs. LAA in an ESPN Monday Night Baseball matchup with the Angels' Jered Weaver (7.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R-ER, 3 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 107 pitches/68 strikes)...allowed all 3 runs in the 5th on a solo HR by J.B. Shuck and a 2-out, 2-run single by Josh Hamilton...retired the final 7 batters he faced after Hamilton's hit...exited trailing 3-1, but Texas rallied for the first of 3 straight walk-off wins over the Halos, as Kinsler hit a sacrifice fly in the 8th, and A.J. Pierzynski and Geovany Soto hit solo homers in the 9th to win it.

TEXAS DEBUT: Earned win in Texas debut on 7/24 vs. NYY, a 3-1 victory in which only Yankee run resulted from Garza's own error (7.1 IP, 5 H, 1 R-0 ER, 0 BB, 5 SO, 0 HR, 95 pitches/66 strikes)...first 2 Yankees reached on singles in the first, but both were stranded and New York would go 3-for-last-25 vs. Garza...became just the 4th pitcher in Rangers history to start in his Texas debut and pitch at least 7.1 innings without allowing an earned run (also Dick Bosman in first game in Rangers history in 1972, Fergie Jenkins in 1974, John Burkett in 1996)...of the 4 pitchers on the list, only Garza and John Burkett were midseason acquisitions...it was his first start at Rangers Ballpark since 2010 ALDS Game 3 with Tampa Bay...according to Elias Sports Bureau, Garza was the first pitcher in MLB history to take the mound for a new team immediately after winning each of his last 5 starts for a previous club in the same season.

ROAD WARRIOR: Makes his first road start for Texas after going 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA (11 ER/44.1 IP) and 43 strikeouts in 7 road tilts with the Cubs...is unbeaten in a career-best 8 straight road starts dating back to last year...last road loss was 7/5/12 at ATL...has permitted one-or-zero earned runs in 5 of 7 road starts in '13...has held opponents to .196 average (32-163) away from home...did not walk a batter in his last road start on 7/8 at CWS, snapping a career-long streak of 37 consecutive road starts with at least one walk that began in August 2010, the 5th-longest such streak in the majors since the start of 2010...for his career, is 30-35 with a 4.26 ERA (256 ER/541.1 IP) in 92 road games/91 starts.

VS. OAKLAND: Owns a 2-3 record and 2.70 ERA (12 ER/40.0 IP) in 6 games/5 starts in his career against the A's...has made quality starts in each of his last 4 starts vs. Oakland...has won his last 2 starts against the A's, dating back to 8/22/10, with a 1.15 ERA (2 ER/15.1 IP) and just 8 hits allowed...has held Oakland to a .225 average (34-151), with just 6 XBH (3 2B, 3 HR)...has gone at least 5.2 innings with 2-or-fewer runs in 4 of the 6 games.

at O.co Coliseum: Is 2-1 with a 2.53 ERA (6 ER/21.1 IP) in 3 games/starts here in his career, including a win here exactly a month ago on 7/3, outdueling Bartolo Colon in 3-1 Cubs win (8.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R-ER, 1 HR, 3 BB, 5 SO, 114 pitches/71 strikes)...staked to a 2-0 lead through 3, he allowed just a solo HR to Brandon Moss in the 4th...had just two 1-2-3 innings in a season-high 8.0 innings...other than the HR, allowed just 2 runners to reach 2nd base...his first 2 starts here came as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays, as he took the loss on 4/25/09 (5.2 IP, 4 H, 4 R-ER, 4 BB, 6 SO), and earned win on 8/22/10 (7.2 IP, 4 H, 1 R-ER, 3 BB, 3 SO).

2013: Garza's teams are 10-3 in his 13 starts...has left with the lead in 10 of his 13 starts, taking no decisions in 3 games he left with a lead...his ERA, WHIP (1.10), opponents average (.223) and walks-per-9-innings (2.43) figures are all career bests...holding opponents to a .206 average (26-126) with runners on base and .242 (15-62) with runners in scoring position...first time through lineup: .174 (19-109); 2nd time: .212 (22-104); 3rd time: .283 (26-92); 4th time: .286 (4-14)...has not allowed a run in the first inning this season...spots 1-2 in lineup are hitting .182 (14-77), while 3-4 spots are hitting .288 (21-73)...batters leading off an inning are hitting .217 (18-83) with 5 walks and 23 strikeouts (.270 OBP).

WITH CUBS: Had 5 straight starts of 7.0+ IP, one-or-zero ER from June 15-July 8, longest streak by a Cubs starter since Mark Prior in 2003...went 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA (7 ER/29.1 IP) and .187 opp. avg. in 4 Interleague starts vs. A.L. clubs.

CUBS STARTS: Took a ND in season debut on 5/21 at PIT despite exiting with a 3-0 lead...allowed just one hit over 5.0 IP and contributed a career-high 2 RBI with the bat...issued season-high 4 walks in his shortest outing of the season on 5/26 at CIN...earned first victory in 7-2 win on 5/31 at ARI, his first win since 7/15/12 vs. ARI...eclipsed the 100-pitch mark for the first time on 6/5 at LAA, departing with a 5-4 lead, but taking a ND in 8-6, 10-inning win...allowed career-high 9 runs on 9 hits in lone loss of the season on 6/11 at CIN...left with a 3-0 lead after 7.0 shutout IP on 6/15 at NYM, but took a ND in 4-3 Chicago loss...began win streak on 6/12 vs. HOU, holding the Astros to one run over 8.0 IP...whiffed a season-high 10 batters in 7/2 win on 6/27 at MIL, winning 2nd straight...won 3rd straight start in 3-1 victory on 7/3 at OAK, allowing just 4 hits over a season-high 8.0 IP...did not issue a walk in win on 7/8 at CWS...final start w/ Cubs was 6-4 win on 7/13 at Wrigley vs. STL (6.2 IP, 10 H, 2 R-ER)...attempted to become the first Cubs pitcher in 61 years to go 6 straight starts of at least 7.0 innings
