ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday...the losing streak was their longest since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five straight...are now 8-7 since the All-Star Break and 64-46 for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...have a 3½ game lead over Texas in the American League West, which is the largest lead by a division leader in the AL and third largest in the majors...were in third place in the West on May 16 with a 20-22 record and trailed Texas by 7½ games...have gone a Major League best 44-24 (.647) since May 17 and have picked up 11 games in the standings over that span...remain in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 29th consecutive day (since July 2)...those are the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...for the season, the A's have spent 54 days in sole possession of first place, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 17-17 against the West since May 10 while going 29-11 against everyone else...are batting .259 (450 for 1736) with 260 runs (50 games, 5.20 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .230 (460 for 2004) with 228 runs (60 games, 3.80 runs per game) against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.89 ERA (199 er in 460.2 ip) against the AL West compared to 3.44 (207 er in 541.2 ip) against everyone else.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-12 (.636) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the majors (Texas, 18-10)...rank third in the American League in one-run wins (Cleveland and Kansas City, 22)...are 7-4 (.636) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins and are tied for the third best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 13-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...overcame a five-run deficit to win for the third time a week ago today...it marks the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-4 on this 10-game homestand against Los Angeles (3-1), Toronto (1-2) and Texas (1-1)...have won 25 of the last 34 home games and are 35-19 (.648) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...also have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road...begin a six-game road trip on Tuesday to Cincinnati (two games) and Toronto (four games).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.295), fewest walks per nine innings (2.45) and fewest walks (270)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...are on pace to issue 398 walks for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...rank second in the American League in ERA (3.62) and opponents batting average (.242) and are third in opponents slugging percentage (.382)...have recorded the fourth fewest strikeouts (756)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 86 consecutive games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 5.26 ERA (29 er in 49.2 ip) through the first nine games of this homestand...have walked 24 while striking out 32 and have yielded 10 home runs...are now 33-13 with a 3.24 ERA (156 er in 433.0 ip) and .234 (380 for 1627) opponents batting average over the last 68 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 47-34 with a 3.90 ERA (292 er in 673.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (4), are tied for third in wins and innings pitched (667.1) and are fifth in ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .214 (146 for 683) with 71 runs scored over the last 21 games (3.4 runs per game)...are hitting .243 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have been shut out eight times this year...lead the majors in walks (406) and rank fifth in the American League in doubles (199)...A's pinch hitters are batting .133 (12 for 90), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (105), rank second in walks (14), are tied for second in home runs (3) and tied for third in RBI (11).

IN JULY: The A's went 15-10 in the month of July, which tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and have now had a winning record for eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...batted .222 (183 for 823) in July, which was the lowest mark in the majors...scored 93 runs in 25 games (3.72 runs per game)...however, the pitching staff allowed just 84 runs for a 3.06 ERA (76 er in 223.1 ip), which was second lowest in the AL...allowed the third fewest walks (64).

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 41-26 (.612) in night games, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 40-23)...are 23-20 (.535) during the day...are 51-8 (.864) when scoring four or more runs compared to 13-38 (.255) when scoring less than four...are 44-30 (.595) when facing a right-handed starting pitcher and 20-15 (.571) against left-handers...have turned just 78 double plays, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...have sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning 20 times this year...did that just 22 times last year

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season...the A's are 13-9 (.591) in his starting assignments this year and are 25-12 (.676) when he starts in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 22 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 20 times.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 4-1 with a 4.86 ERA and .252 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of July...tied for second in the American League wins in July...it marked the second time he won four games in a month in his career (September, 2012)...allowed more home runs (11) than walks (6) in July...the 11 home runs tied the Oakland record for home runs allowed in any month (fifth Mark Redman last: 2004)...went 2-2 with a 4.65 ERA in five starts in April, 3-2 with a 3.55 ERA in six starts in May and 1-2 with a 2.60 ERA in five starts in June...had the seventh lowest June ERA in the American League and also ranked third with a .190 opponents batting average.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.276), is tied for ninth in games started (22), is 10th in opponents batting average (.233) and tied for 10th in wins

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least two home runs in each of his last three starts (eight home runs total), which is the longest streak by an A's pitcher since Mark Redman had a four-game streak from June 27-July 17, 2004...has allowed 26 home runs for the season, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill allowed 27 in 2009...19 of the home runs have been solo shots, which is also the most in the majors...17 have come on the road, which is tied for the most in the majors (Blanton, LAA)...has allowed two grand slams, which is tied for the ML lead.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .151 (28 for 185) batting average the first time through the lineup, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...has a .276 (97 for 352) opponents average after that...has allowed five home runs the first time through the lineup, 21 after that...his career numbers are .170 (52 for 305) the first time through the lineup, .269 (147 for 546) after that...opponents are batting .119 (5 for 42) with runners in scoring position and two outs, which is third lowest in the AL (min. 100 ip)

BY INNING: Has a 1.25 ERA (10 er in 72.0 ip) and six home runs allowed over the first three innings of a game, 7.31 (49 er in 60.1 ip) and 19 home runs in innings four through six and 0.63 (1 er in 14.1 ip) and one home run from the seventh inning on...has allowed 52 of his 64 runs this year (81.3%) in the fourth through sixth innings...has a 0.82 ERA (2 er in 22.0 ip) in the first inning this year and 1.22 (5 er in 37.0 ip) in his career...has a 10.38 ERA (20 er in 17.1 ip) in the sixth inning this year and 8.23 (25 er in 27.1 ip) in his

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his three-game winning streak snapped July 19...posted a 2.93 ERA and .219 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned four starts...that followed a three-game losing streak over a five-start stretch from May 30 to June 20 where he posted a 4.02 ERA and .227 opponents average.

2013 HIGHLIGHTS: Won each of his first two starts: an 8-2 win over Seattle April 4 in Oakland and an 8-1 win at Los Angeles April 11...walked a career-high four batters in six innings but struck out eight in a no decision against Houston April 16 in Oakland...left after six innings with the A's leading 3-2 but Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save...combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a six-hit 2-0 shutout at New York May 3...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all six of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Cleveland May 8...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10 inning loss at Milwaukee June 4...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just four hits while walking one...left after seven innings with a 3-0 lead but Doolittle allowed three runs in the eighth (Cook blown save)...lost his third consecutive decision in the A's 4-0 loss to Seattle June 15 in Oakland... Hernandez, Furbush and Medina combined to shutout the A's on six hits and two walks...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Texas June 20...left with a 2-1 lead, one out and a runner on second base in the sixth inning but Cook allowed the run to score for the blown save...tossed his first career complete game, a two-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Cincinnati June 26...is the first A's pitcher to allow two hits or fewer in a complete game since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010...combined with Balfour on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Boston July 13 in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed six of the hits...matched his career-high with 110 pitches.

LAST START: He won his 10th game of the season in the A's 9-4 win over Toronto last Monday here in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying three home runs for the fourth time in his career, the second time in his last three starts...retired each of the first 13 batters he faced before Lind homered with one out in the fifth...had an 8-1 lead when he allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a leadoff home run by Lawrie and a two-run home run by Encarnacion.

GRIFFIN vs. TEXAS: Is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (21.0 ip, 18 h, 8 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four career starts...is 0-0 with a 1.59 ERA (2 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in Texas and 1-0 with a 4.66 ERA (5 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...is 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 13 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year...the win came in a 5-1 victory in Oakland May 13...allowed a two-out solo home run to Moreland in the second inning but that was the only run he would allowed in seven innings...blanked the Rangers on four hits over his final five innings...then had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Texas June 20...shutout the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings...the A's scored a run in the fifth but he allowed a solo home run to Soto in the bottom of the fifth...Oakland scored another run in the sixth and he issued a leadoff walk to Kinsler in the sixth...was relieved by Cook after Kinsler was sacrificed to second and Cook allowed him to score on a wild pitch for the blown save.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Dan Straily (6-5, 4.41 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season...has lost each of his three starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 20...has a 5.06 ERA (9 er in 16.0 ip) and .313 (15 for 46) opponents batting average over that span...the three-game losing streak is the longest of his career...leads American League rookies in strikeouts (77) and innings pitched (96.0), is tied for first in games started (17) and tied for second in wins (6)...is scheduled to start on six days rest...is 5-1 with a 2.86 ERA (16 er in 50.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-4 with a 6.11 ERA (31 er in 45.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest...has never faced the Reds in his career.

INNINGS BY A RELIEVER

The A's bullpen is 4-4 with 13 saves, two blown saves, a 2.09 ERA (18 er in 77.2 ip), .201 (57 for 283) opponents batting average and one home run allowed over its past 27 games...has a 3.01 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...has the fewest walks (93) and strikeouts (276) in the AL, ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.288) and has allowed the second fewest home runs (23)...first batters faced are 62 for 281 (.221) with 14 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .260 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL and have the lowest opponents on-base percentage.

- Has not allowed a run in 23 of his past 25 games (5 er in 22.2 ip, 1.99 ERA) and is 18 for 19 in save opportunities over that span.
- Leads the American League in save percentage (96.7%) and is tied for fourth in saves (29)...his 29 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since Huston Street (37) in 2006.
- First batters faced are hitting .279 (12 for 43) but opponents are 6 for 32 (.188) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 1.21 ERA (4 er in 29.2 ip) in 31 games at night compared to 3.14 (5 er in 14.1 ip) in 15 day games.
- Has two saves in four games against Texas this season (4.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so)...his four career wins against the Rangers are his most against any team.
- Has 55 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is six away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place.
- Has recorded 492 career strikeouts and is eight away from the 500th of his career.
- Had his Athletics record streak of 44 consecutive saves snapped July 23...it was the sixth longest save streak in Major League history...his streak of 26 consecutive saves to start the season was the second longest streak in Oakland history (Dennis Eckersley, 36 in 1992).
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched a scoreless sixth inning in the game (1 bb, 1 so).
