WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers lost to the A's 4-2 yesterday and are 1-1 on this 10-game, 11-day road trip to Oakland (1-1), Anaheim (3 G), and Houston (4 G) with an off day on Thursday...yesterday's defeat snapped a 5-game win streak that matched longest in 2013 (also 5 G, June 19-23)... went 4-0 on homestand that preceded this trip...Rangers are 5-5 in last 10 and 6-6 in last 12, losing 10 of 17 and 13 of last 21, going 14-17 in last 31 games since a 9-2 stretch from June 17-28...have a 29-33 record beginning May 26...current 61-50 (.550) record is T6th-best in the A.L., T10th-best in majors...Rangers have lost 13 of 21 since reaching season-high 16 games above .500 following win on 7/9 at BAL, now sit at 11-over...team went 11-15 in July, just the second losing month in a span of 14 full months beginning June 2011 (9-14 in July 2012)...Texas won 17 games in both April and May, only MLB team with 17+ wins in season's first 2 months, just 3rd season ever for club to have back-to-back 17-win months (also 1977 and 1993).

THE FINALE: Texas enters today with a 21-15 record in series finales, including an 8-9 mark on the road...team is 7-3 in rubber games this season with a 4-1 mark on the road, losing last road rubber contest on 7/14 at DET...team has dropped 3 straight games on Sundays, 10-8 mark on the Sabbath.

STANDINGS: The Rangers are in 2nd place in the A.L. West, 3.5 games behind first-place Oakland...dropped a game in the division with yesterday's loss, first time to lose ground since loss last Sunday at CLE...team had gained ground for 4 consecutive days (+3.5 G total) from Tuesday through Friday...went 32 days without gaining any ground in the West from June 24-July 29...club had a season-high 6.0-game deficit through games of 7/28-29...team spent 28 days in second place without gaining on the division leader from July 2-29, 2nd-longest span in the division era (since 1969) behind only the 2009 Cubs (35 straight days in 2nd place, no gain)... Texas had a season-high 7.0-game lead through games of 5/15 and 5/16... are currently tied with BAL, a half-game behind CLE for the 2nd A.L. Wild Card spot.

ON THE ROAD: Current 10-game, 11-day trip is longest of the year in both games and days...have dropped 5 of 6 and 8 of last 10 away games... club's 28-26 (.519) road record is T3rd-best in A.L...recent road games have followed a pattern...club was 8-1 on road from May 8-25, then went 1-7 from May 26-June 8, followed by another 8-1 span June 9-July 9, and are in a current 2-8 stretch beginning July 10.

VS. OAKLAND: This is the 2nd of 3 trips to Oakland for Rangers in '13, and this will be 2nd time in as many series here to play a rubber game...Texas has gone 7-5 vs. Oakland in '13, winning 6 of 8 and 7 of last 11...went 2-1-0 in first 3 series vs. A's, taking last 2 of 3 in other visit to the Coliseum from May 13-15...Rangers are 7-8 in last 15 G and 8-10 in last 18 G vs. A's dating to 2012...Texas leads all-time series 322-308.

--At the Coliseum: The Rangers have won 3 of 4 at O.co Coliseum after having dropped previous 5 straight...club has dropped 10 of 15 here beginning 9/22/11 and is 20-24 at the Coliseum beginning in 2009...the A's hold a 164-141 lifetime edge in the series in what ranks as T2nd-oldest park in the A.L.

WINNING IN THE DIVISION: Beginning July 29, the Rangers are in a stretch in which 13 of 14 and 19 of 22 games are against A.L. West opponents...club is 29-14 (.674) vs. West foes in '13, winning 7 of last 9, the highest intradivision winning pct. of any team in baseball...Oakland's record against the West ranks 5th.

RON WASHINGTON has 581 career wins as a manager, tied with Bobby Valentine (581) for the most in Rangers history...Washington's .536 (581-502) career winning pct. as Rangers manager is the best in club history among managers with at least 2 full seasons...his win total ranks 4th among all managers since 2007, trailing only Charlie Manuel (604), Mike Scioscia (597), and Joe Maddon (589).

COMPLETE GAME LOSS: Matt Garza took the complete game loss yesterday (8.0 IP, 4 R-ER)...it was the first complete game loss by a Texas starter since Matt Harrison took a 1-0 loss on 9/22/12 at SEA...it was Garza's 4th career CG loss, first since dropping a 1-0 game at Wrigley against the White Sox on 7/2/11...it was Garza's 9th career complete game overall (5-4 in those games), his 7th CG in the A.L...it was the 2nd complete game by a Ranger in '13 (Holland CG SHO on 6/27 at NYY), the first in which a Ranger permitted at least 3 runs in the first inning since Kenny Rogers on 8/18/00 at Boston, a 6-4 Texas defeat (CG, 8.0 IP, 11 H, 6 R-4 ER)...it was the first CG loss in MLB for a pitcher to allow 4+ runs since BOS' Jon Lester on 8/30/12 at LAA (8.0 IP, 5 R-ER).

GET IT BACK: Derek Holland enters today's series finale with a 6-1 mark and 2.89 ERA (24 ER/74.2 IP) in 11 road starts, the 6th-lowest away ERA in the A.L...in his last 8 road starts beginning 5/8: 5-0, 2.45 (15 ER/55.0 IP) w/ 20 BB, 50 SO, and one HR allowed...Holland is also 1-4 in 6 day starts despite a 2.64 ERA (13 ER/44.1 IP) that ranks 7th in the A.L., as Rangers have scored a total of 9 runs in those 6 starts...has quality starts in last 2 and 5 of 6 in daytime, lone win being his CG SHO on 6/27 at NYY...2 of his day losses have come in 2-0 Texas defeats.

ELVIS ANDRUS has a current 16-game hit streak at .339 (20-59) with 8 walks against 9 K's in that span, a .426 OBP and .833 OPS...it is the longest active hit streak in MLB, the longest by a Ranger in 2013, and matches the longest of Andrus' career (also 16 G, 8/28/09-9/14/09)...the only other Texas batter with a 16-game hit streak since the start of 2012 was Josh Hamilton (16 G, 4/27/12-5/16/12)...last longer hit streak by a Ranger was 19 games for Adrian Beltre, 7/16/11-9/15/11 spanning a DL stint in July and August...Andrus is the 12th player in Rangers history with multiple hit streaks of 16+ G in his career.

• A hit today would give Andrus the 4th-longest hit streak in the A.L. in '13, as only longer streaks were by BOS' Jacoby Ellsbury (19 G), BOS' Jose Iglesias (18 G), and CWS' Alex Rios (18 G).

THE LONG BALL: Ian Kinsler hit his 10th HR in the 5th inning yesterday, his 7th career season with 10+ home runs...he is the 7th player in club history with at least 7 different 10-HR seasons...record is held by Ivan Rodriguez and Juan Gonzalez (10 seasons each)...Kinsler is the 6th Ranger with a double-digit homer total in 2013, just the 3rd MLB team to make that claim this season, joining Seattle (8) and Atlanta (7)...Rangers have homered in 6 straight and rank 5th in MLB with 130 HR in '13.

BULLPEN RESTED: Yesterday was just the 2nd time in 2013 for the Texas bullpen to not be used in a game (also 6/27 at NYY), although Robbie Ross warmed up in the 8th...the Rangers bullpen features 3 of the A.L.'s top 11 relief ERA's in Neal Cotts (2nd, 0.78), Joe Nathan (T6th, 1.65), and Tanner Scheppers (11th, 1.79)...relievers have permitted one run over 8.2 innings the last 3 games, and have gone scoreless in 16 of the last 23 contests with a 2.13 ERA (17 ER/71.2 IP) in that span to drop from 3.30 to 3.06, 4th-lowest in the A.L.

YOU CAN ONLY MOVE SOUTH DOWN THE COAST: After today's game, the Rangers are scheduled to fly to Orange County for a 3-game series in Anaheim against the Angels...the series will wrap up a stretch of playing Halos in 6 of 10 games, as Texas won all 3 games from Monday through Wednesday in Arlington...Rangers are 7-2 vs. Angels in 2013, winning all 3 series openers and finales, as well as the middle game last week...have won 4 straight and 6 of 7 vs. Angels, with 4 straight wins being longest single season streak since winning last 4 meetings of 2011...last won 5 straight in one campaign from Sept. 1-26, 2007...have gone 12-5 vs. Angels beg. 8/1/12, and are 24-14 beg. 8/15/11...Texas took 2 of 3 in lone series at the Big A, April 22-24, and have won 4 of last 5 there, going 6-6 since start of '12.

LEWIS REHAB: RHP Colby Lewis made a rehab start for Frisco (AA) last night vs. San Antonio (5.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 86 pitches/59 strikes)

MISCELLANEOUS: Adrian Beltre has an RBI in 4 of 5 after none previous 6 games...yesterday was 38th time this season for Texas to score 2-runs-or-less, T2nd-most in the A.L. behind only Houston (39)...last 28 times Rangers have had one-or-zero hits w/ RISP since June 7, club has a 4-24 record.

TODAY: The 26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 23rd start in today's series finale in Oakland...has quality starts in 6 of last 7, going 3-2, 2.70 (15 ER/50.0 IP) in that span to drop season ERA from 3.43 to 3.18...has allowed 4 ER-or-less in 21 of 22 starts in 2013...will be working on regular 4 days' rest after taking no decision in Rangers' 14-11, 10-inning win on Tues. vs. LAA (see below)...snapped string of 6 consecutive quality starts that matched his career best (also Aug. 22-Sept. 19, 2012)... has gone 7.0+ IP with 2 or fewer runs in 9 of 22 starts...ranks among A.L. top-10 in strikeouts (7th, 135), innings (8th, 147.0), road ERA (6th, 2.89), and day ERA (7th, 2.64)...leads Texas staff with 15 quality starts, T9th in the A.L....has 14 starts w/n on HR allowed, tied for 2nd-most in the A.L...has permitted just 11 HR for the year, no more than 2 HR in any one start, and owns A.L.'s 8th-best HR/9 ratio (0.67)...has 4 of Texas' 7 starts of 8.0+ IP (Darvish-2; Garza-1), T8th-most starts of 8.0+ IP in A.L...pitched for Team USA in this year's WBC, starting win-or-go home matchup vs. Canada on 3/10 in Phoenix...signed a 5-year contract extension through 2016 with two club options for 2017 and 2018 on March 20, 2012.

LAST START: Took no decision in Rangers' 14-11, 10-inning win on Tues. vs. LAA despite exiting with a 6-4 lead in position to win (6.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 2 BB, 6 SO, 2 HR, 102 pitches/60 strikes)...Joakim Soria loaded the bases in the 8th and was charged with 3 R when Robbie Ross (blown save) allowed all 3 of Soria's inherited runners to score...it was Rangers' ML-low 3rd instance in '13 of starter leaving in position to win, but taking a no decision...in a wild finish that featured a combined 15 runs after Holland's exit, Leonys Martin hit a walk-off 3-R HR in the 10th off Daniel Stange to end it...was the 2nd of 3 consecutive walk-off HR for Texas in a series sweep of the Halos...ended Holland's run of 6 straight quality starts, matching longest such streak in his career.

VS. OAKLAND: Took no decision in only start vs. A's this season, in first series at Coliseum on 5/14, a 6-5 10-inning Texas win (ND, 5.2 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 0 HR, 98 pitches/62 strikes)...was staked to a 3-0 lead, but departed with the game tied at 3 and a runner on base in the 6th inning...an additional run was charged to his ledger when the go-ahead run scored against Robbie Ross...Adrian Beltre and Mitch Moreland hit back-to-back HR in the 10th inning...retired 12 of first 15 batters faced...is 4-1, 2.92 (17 ER/52.1 IP) in 9 career starts vs. A's, winning 4 straight decisions since losing first start vs. A's on 8/4/09 at OAK...is 2-1, 3.67 (14 ER/34.1 IP) in his 6 starts at the Coliseum... his 6 starts at this park are 2nd-most in any opposing facility (8 GS at LAA).
