The A's are 2-0 against the Reds this season...won both meetings June 25-26 in Oakland and conclude the season series with this four-game series in Cincinnati...prior to this year, the A's and Reds last met in 2010 when the A's were swept in a three-game series in Oakland, June 21-23...have lost four of the last seven games against the Reds after winning each of the first seven...the A's lead the all-time series, 10-4...are 7-4 in Oakland and 3-0 in Cincinnati.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has not allowed an earned run in his past 14 games and 15.0 innings.

Bob Melvin has compiled a 698-675 record in 10 seasons as a manager...needs two more wins for 700 in his career...is 205-167 (.551) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is the seventh best record in the majors over that span.

Brandon Moss is 14 for 40 (.350) with two doubles, one home run, seven RBI, two walks and two strikeouts over his last 12 games.

Eric Sogard is on a career-high 11-game hitting streak...is 15 for 41 (.366) with nine runs, four doubles, a home run and seven RBI during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1933** Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the Philadelphia A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in **2001** the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the past five games, including a three-game losing streak from July 30-August 2...the losing streak was their longest since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five straight...are now 8-8 since the All-Star Break and 64-47 for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...have a two game lead over Texas in the American League West, which is their smallest lead since July 20 when they also held a two game lead...were in third place in the West on May 16 with a 20-22 record and trailed Texas by 7½ games...have gone 44-25 (.638) since May 17, which is the second best record in the majors over that span, and have picked up 9½ games in the standings...remain in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 31st consecutive day (since July 2)...those are the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...for the season, the A's have spent 56 days in sole possession of first, six days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's conclude interleague play with this two-game series at Cincinnati...have the third best interleague record in the majors at 13-5 (Tampa Bay, 12-3; Boston, 9-3)...have clinched a winning record against the National League for the second consecutive year and 10th time in 17 seasons...the only time the A's have won more than 13 interleague games was in 2002 when they went 16-2...are 167-135 (.553) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best...rank fifth this year with a 2.97 ERA (53 er in 160.2 ip)...the A's offense ranks second in walks (65) and fourth in runs (80).

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out Sunday afternoon and have now been shut out four times over the past 20 games...are batting .218 (143 for 655) with 67 runs scored over that span (3.4 runs per game)...are now hitting .243 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the majors in walks (409) and rank fifth in the AL in doubles (199)...A's pinch hitters are batting .132 (12 for 91), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (106), rank second in walks (14), are tied for second in home runs (3) and tied for third in RBI (11).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.294), fewest walks per nine innings (2.44) and fewest walks (272)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...are on pace to issue 397 walks for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...rank second in the American League in opponents batting average (.241) and third in ERA (3.61) and opponents slugging percentage (.381)...have recorded the fourth fewest strikeouts (764)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 88 consecutive games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers went 4-4 with a 5.11 ERA (32 er in 56.1 ip) in 10 games on the last homestand...walked 25 while striking out 39 and yielded 12 home runs...are now 33-14 with a 3.25 ERA (159 er in 439.2 ip) and .233 (385 for 1653) opponents batting average over the last 69 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 47-35 with a 3.90 ERA (295 er in 680.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (4), are fourth in wins and innings pitched (667.1) and sixth in ERA.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-12 (.636) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the majors (Texas, 18-10)...rank third in the American League in one-run wins (Cleveland and Kansas City, 22)...are 7-4 (.636) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins and are tied for the third best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 13-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Cincinnati (two games) and Toronto (four games) tonight...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-27 (.518) on the road...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...have won 25 of the last 35 home games and are 35-20 (.636) at home for the season, which is the fifth best home record in the American League.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 17-18 against the West since May 10 while going 29-11 against everyone else...are batting .258 (455 for 1766) with 260 runs (51 games, 5.10 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .230 (460 for 2004) with 228 runs (60 games, 3.80 runs per game) against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.81 ERA (195 er in 460.2 ip) against the AL West compared to 3.44 (207 er in 541.2 ip) against everyone else.

IN JULY: The A's went 15-10 in the month of July, which tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and have now had a winning record for eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...batted .222 (183 for 823) in July, which was the lowest mark in the majors...scored 93 runs in 25 games (3.72 runs per game)...however, the pitching staff allowed just 84 runs for a 3.06 ERA (76 er in 223.1 ip), which was second lowest in the AL...allowed the third fewest walks (64).

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 41-26 (.612) in night games, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 40-23)...are 23-21 (.523) during the day...are 44-31 (.587) when facing a right-handed starting pitcher and 20-16 (.556) against left-handers...have turned just 78 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...have sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning 20 times this year...did that just 22 times last year.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, his fourth since being recalled from Sacramento July 20...the A's are 10-7 (.588) in his starting assignments this year and are 15-9 (.625) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in nine of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has lost each of his three starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 20...has a 5.06 ERA (9 er in 16.0 ip) and .313 (15 for 46) opponents batting average over that span...the three-game losing streak is the longest of his career...is now 5-3 with a 3.34 ERA (26 er in 70.0 ip) and .226 (59 for 261) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts after going 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Leads American League rookies in strikeouts (77) and innings pitched (96.0), is tied for first in games starts (17) and tied for second in wins (6).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .235 opponents batting average and a .362 slugging percentage...has yielded a .190 (27 for 142) batting average the first time through the lineup, .243 (34 for 140) the second time and .300 (24 for 80) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is second lowest in the AL among pitchers with 90 or more innings...opponents are batting .324 (23 for 71) with runners in scoring position, which is ninth highest in the AL among pitchers with 90 or more innings...including .387 (12 for 31) with RISP and two outs, which is third highest...has issued 21 of his 30 walks to left-handed hitters.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-4 with a 5.08 ERA (38 er in 67.1 ip) and .253 (66 for 261) opponents batting average in 12 starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .188 (19 for 101) opponents average in five starts during the day...has allowed all 10 of his home runs at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 5-1 with a 2.86 ERA (16 er in 50.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-4 with a 6.11 ERA (31 er in 45.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA (21 er in 76.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-5 with a 6.52 ERA (43 er in 59.1 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-4 with a 6.32 ERA (33 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 4-1 with a 2.57 ERA (14 er in 49.0 ip) in seven starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 3-4 with a 5.84 ERA (45 er in 69.1 ip) in 13 starts against the West, 5-2 with a 2.59 ERA (19 er in 66.0 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made three career interleague starts...is 3-0 with a 0.93 ERA (2 er in 19.1 ip) and .115 (7 for 61) opponents batting average.

WITH THE BAT: Had his first career plate appearances as a professional in a start July 9 at Pittsburgh...was 0 for 1 with a walk and a strikeout.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed seven home runs in his last seven starts, snapping a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has surrendered 10 home runs for the season...eight have been solo shots, six have come on the road and six have come in the first two innings of a game.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his winning streak snapped at a career-high five games July 20...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 9.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 0-3 with a 5.06 ERA (9 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento June 23 as the A's had three days off over an eight-day stretch...returned July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-0 loss to Toronto a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Bautista in the first inning and an unearned run in the fourth when Encarnacion scored on a Céspedes error...he then allowed three runs (one earned) in the fifth inning and left after 4.2 innings.

STRAILY vs. CINCINNATI: Has never faced the Reds in his career.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16 for 73) by right-handers...has allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Bartolo Colón (14-3, 2.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season...has tossed six or more innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 15 starts, which is the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 (previous: 14, Dan Haren, April 18-June 26, 2007)...is 11-1 with a 1.69 ERA (20 er in 106.1 ip) during the streak...is tied for the American League lead in shutouts (3) and complete games (3), tied for second in wins (14) and winning percentage (.824) and ranks third in ERA (2.50)...ranks second in the AL with an average of 1.28 walks per nine innings...is scheduled to pitch on six days rest...is 7-1 with a 1.83 ERA (14 er in 68.2 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more compared to 7-2 with a 3.08 ERA (27 er in 79.0 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest...is 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) in three career appearances, all starts, against Cincinnati...has not faced the Reds since June 14, 2007 with Los Angeles.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

Save/Save Opportunities: 32/43 (74.4%)

The A's bullpen has a 1.93 ERA (11 er in 51.1 ip) and .177 (32 for 181) opponents batting average over the past 17 games (since July 13)...now has a 2.99 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the fewest walks (94) and strikeouts (277) in the AL, ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.288) and has allowed the second fewest home runs (23)...first batters faced are 62 for 284 (.218) with 14 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .257 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL, have the lowest opponents on-base percentage and third lowest batting average.

- Has not allowed a run in 23 of his past 25 games (5 er in 22.2 ip, 1.99 ERA) and is 18 for 19 in save opportunities over that span.
- Leads the American League in save percentage (96.7%) and is tied for fourth in saves (29)...his 29 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since Huston Street (37) in 2006.
- Has 55 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is six away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place.
- Has recorded 492 career strikeouts and is eight away from the 500th of his career.
- First batters faced are hitting .279 (12 for 43) but opponents are 6 for 32 (.188) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 1.21 ERA (4 er in 29.2 ip) in 31 games at night compared to 3.14 (5 er in 14.1 ip) in 15 day games.
- Made the only appearance of his career against Cincinnati on July 23, 2007 (0.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb).
- Had his Athletics record streak of 44 consecutive saves snapped July 23...it was the sixth longest save streak in Major League history...his streak of 26 consecutive saves to start the season was the second longest streak in Oakland history (Dennis Eckersley, 36 in 1992).
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched a scoreless sixth inning in the game (1 bb, 1 so).
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.

- Has allowed nine runs in his past 15 appearances (8.0 ip, 10.13 ERA) and opponents are batting .303 (10 for 33) over that span...had a 1.93 ERA and .214 opponents average over his first 34 games.
- His first batters faced are 5 for 10 (.500) with three walks and a hit by pitch over his past 13 games...are now 13 for 40 (.325) with six walks, two sacrifice flies and a hit by pitch for the season (.408 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is sixth highest in the AL.
- Has allowed 13 of 28 (46.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the American League.
- Has 263 career appearances, which is three away from tying Catfish Hunter for ninth in Oakland history.
