ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the past seven games...that includes two three-game losing streaks (August 4-present; July 30-August 2)...prior to that, had not lost three or more consecutive games since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five straight...are now 8-10 since the All-Star Break, which is the sixth worst record in the American League...however, are 64-49 for the season, which is the fourth best record in the AL and seventh best in the majors...are tied with Texas for first place in the American League West for the second consecutive day...prior to that, had spent 33 consecutive days in sole possession of first place (July 2-August 6)...those were the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...were in third place in the West on May 16 with a 20-22 record and trailed Texas by 7½ games...have gone 44-27 (.620) since May 17, which is the sixth best record in the majors over that span, and have picked up 7½ games in the standings...for the season, the A's have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, eight days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (159 for 725) with 73 runs scored (3.32 runs per game) over the past 22 games (since July 10)...have been shut out four times over that span and nine times for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are now hitting .242 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...rank second in the majors in walks (414) and rank fifth in the AL in doubles (204)...A's pinch hitters are batting .134 (13 for 97), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (113), are tied for first in walks (15), rank second in home runs (4) and tied for second in RBI (12).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.295), fewest walks per nine innings (2.45) and fewest walks (277)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...are on pace to issue 397 walks for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...rank second in the American League in opponents batting average (.242) and third in ERA (3.62) and opponents slugging percentage (.382)...have recorded the fourth fewest strikeouts (776)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 90 consecutive games, which is the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-6 with a 5.57 ERA (39 er in 63.0 ip) and .284 (73 for 257) opponents batting average over the past 12 games (since July 25)...however, are now 33-16 with a 3.36 ERA (166 er in 446.1 ip) and .236 (398 for 1685) opponents batting average over the last 71 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 47-37 with a 3.96 ERA (302 er in 686.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (4), are fourth in wins and sixth in innings pitched and ERA.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-13 (.618) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the majors (Texas, 18-10)...rank third in the American League in one-run wins (Cleveland and Kansas City, 22)...are 7-4 (.636) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins and are tied for the third best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 13-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (four games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 29-29 (.500) on the road...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...have won 25 of the last 35 home games and are 35-20 (.636) at home for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the American League...the A's are batting .238 (438 for 1838) with 232 runs scored (55 games, 4.22 runs per game) at home and .246 (493 for 2002) with 262 runs (58 games, 4.52 runs per game) on the road...the pitching staff has a 3.41 ERA (198 er in 523.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.85 (212 er in 495.1 ip) on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 17-18 against the West since May 10 while going 29-13 against everyone else...are batting .258 (455 for 1766) with 260 runs (51 games, 5.10 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .230 (476 for 2074) with 234 runs (62 games, 3.77 runs per game) against the rest against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.81 ERA (195 er in 460.2 ip) against the AL West compared to 3.47 (215 er in 557.2 ip) against everyone else.

IN JULY: The A's went 15-10 in the month of July, which tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and have now had a winning record for eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...batted .222 (183 for 823) in July, which was the lowest mark in the majors...scored 93 runs in 25 games (3.72 runs per game)...however, the pitching staff allowed just 84 runs for a 3.06 ERA (76 er in 223.1 ip), which was second lowest in the AL...allowed the third fewest walks (64).

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 41-27 (.603) in night games, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 45-23)...are 23-22 (.511) during the day...are 44-33 (.571) when facing a right-handed starting pitcher and 20-16 (.556) against left-handers...have turned just 80 double plays, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 79)...have sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning 20 times this year...did that just 22 times last year.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's trail the season series, 2-1...the three games were played in Oakland July 29-31...won the season series last year, 5-4...it marked the first time the A's won the season series since 2007...split six games in Oakland and won two of three in Toronto...the A's are 204-178 against the Blue Jays all-time...that includes 100-93 in Oakland, 104-83 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Cook has not allowed an earned run in his past 15 games and 16.1 innings...not allowed a home run this season and his 49.2 innings pitched are the **most among Major League relievers** with no home runs.

Bob Melvin has compiled a 698-677 record in 10 seasons as a manager...needs two more wins for 700 in his career...is 205-169 (.548) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is the eighth best record in MLB over that span.

Brandon Moss is 16 for 48 (.333) with two doubles, one home run, seven RBI, two walks and two strikeouts over his last 14 games.

Eric Sogard extended his hitting streak to 13 games on Wednesday, which is an ongoing career-high and the longest streak by an Athletic this year...is 18 for 47 (.383) with nine runs scored, five doubles, a triple, a home run and nine RBI over that span.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season...the A's are 11-11 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and 28-23 (.549) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 22 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times.

INDECISIVE: Earned the win in his last start last Saturday, snapping a streak of six consecutive starts where he did not record a decision...the streak of six consecutive starts without a decision matched the longest by an Athletics starter since at least 1916...the other starters with six consecutive no decisions are Mike Norris (June 1-Aug. 6, 1983), Rick Langford (July 17, 1983-June 25, 1985) and Carlos Reyes (June 10-July 17, 1994)...had a 3.50 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) and .191 (25 for 131) opponents batting average during the six start stretch...the A's lost five of the six games...left with the lead in two of the no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 6 and 23).

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Allowed six hits in his last start last Saturday, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive starts of allowing five hits or fewer...that matched the longest streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 among pitchers with at least three innings in an outing (Rich Harden, April 9, 2006-April 15, 2007)...had a seven-start streak from May 28 to June 29 where he allowed five hits or fewer and two walks or fewer...that matched the longest such streak by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1916 (Alan Wirth, May 6-Sept. 15, 1978).

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.79 ERA (24 er in 77.1 ip) and .188 (51 for 272) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts...the winning streak is a new career high (previous: 4, Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012.).

LAST 15, FIRST SEVEN: Is 6-1 with a 2.86 ERA (31 er in 97.2 ip) and .188 (64 for 341) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts (since May 11)...started the year 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA and .345 opponents batting average over his first seven starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .189 (36 for 190) average over his last 15 starts after surrendering a .397 mark over his first seven starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is averaging the eighth fewest pitches per game (92.6) and is tied for ninth in hit batters (7).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 2-3 with a 2.89 ERA (23 er in 71.2 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-3 with a 5.37 ERA (36 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of the 15 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision...is 1-6 with two runs of support or fewer and 6-0 with three runs or more...is now 17-0 in 25 career starts with run support of three or more...is 19-2 with run support of two or more.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 17 runs in the first inning for a 7.29 ERA (21.0 ip)...has a 3.44 ERA (42 er in 110.0 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are batting .315 (29 for 92) with six home runs in the first inning compared to .216 (85 for 394) with 11 home runs from the second inning on

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed three errors in his last five starts after going errorless over his first 17 starts this year...his three errors are tied for the most among American League pitchers.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 17 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...12 of the 17 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for seventh in the AL.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 0-0 with a 3.91 ERA and .194 opponents batting average in four starts in July...went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of June...had the lowest opponents batting average in the American League in June and ranked third in ERA...was 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA and .216 opponents average in five starts in May...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...it was the highest since Gil Heredia had a 9.24 ERA in 2001...the opponents batting average was fourth highest in Oakland history in April among pitchers with 100 or more batters faced...it was the highest since Heredia had a .360 mark in 2001.

LAST START: Earned the win in his last start, a 4-2 A's win against Texas last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the third inning and a solo home run to Kinsler in the fifth...those were the only runs he would surrender in six innings.

PARKER vs. TORONTO: He had a no decision his only career appearance, a 7-3 A's win on May 8, 2012 in Oakland...tossed seven innings but issued five walks...allowed his only runs on a two-run home run by Johnson in the third inning, the first home run he allowed in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (0-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make the first start of his career, his third career appearance...is 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 games, all starts, with the River Cats...was 8-5 with a Pacific Coast League leading 2.81 ERA in 16 games with Triple-A Sacramento when he was selected by the A's on July 10...also led the PCL in strikeouts (107), was tied for second in wins and ranked fifth in innings (102.1) at the time of his promotion...did not allow a run in two relief appearances and 4.0 innings with the A's before he was optioned to Sacramento on July 17...went 2-1 with a 6.19 ERA in three starts with the River Cats following his option...is 17-17 with a 3.66 ERA in 53 games, all starts, over three professional seasons in the minors...was rated as the A's third-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2011 season and was ranked fifth after 2012...was the A's first round pick (18th selection overall) in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

17-12, 2.93 ERA (331.2 ip, 283 h, 118 r, 108 er, 95 bb, 284 so, 23 hr) Save/Save Opportunities: 32/43 (74.4%)

The A's bullpen has a 1.78 ERA (12 er in 60.2 ip) and .175 (37 for 211) opponents batting average over the past 19 games (since July 13)...now has a 2.93 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the fewest walks (95) and strikeouts (284) in the AL, ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.286) and is tied for the fewest home runs (23)...first batters faced are 63 for 291 (.216) with 14 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .255 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL, have the lowest opponents on-base percentage and are tied for the third lowest batting average.

- Has not allowed a run in 23 of his past 25 games (5 er in 22.2 ip, 1.99 ERA) and is 18 for 19 in save opportunities over that span.
- Ranks second in the American League in save percentage (96.7%) and ranks fifth in saves (29)...his 29 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since 2006 (Huston Street, 37).
- Has 55 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is six away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place.
- Has recorded 492 career strikeouts and is eight away from the 500th of his career.
- First batters faced are hitting .279 (12 for 43) but opponents are 6 for 32 (.188) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 1.21 ERA (4 er in 29.2 ip) in 31 games at night compared to 3.14 (5 er in 14.1 ip) in 15 day games.
- Is 2-1 with a save and 3.58 ERA in 29 games in his career against Toronto (27.2 ip, 25 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 36 so, 3 hr).
- Had his Athletics record streak of 44 consecutive saves snapped July 23...it was the sixth longest save streak in Major League history...his streak of 26 consecutive saves to start the season was the second longest streak in Oakland history (Dennis Eckersley, 36 in 1992).
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched a scoreless sixth inning in the game (1 bb, 1 so).
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.

- Has not allowed an earned run in his past seven games and 5.2 innings after allowing nine runs over his previous 10 games (4.2 ip, 17.36 ERA).
- Has allowed 13 of 28 (46.4%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for second highest percentage in the American League.
- His first batters faced are 14 for 42 (.333) with six walks, two sacrifice flies and a hit by pitch for the season (.412 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are tied for sixth highest in the AL.
- Has 265 career appearances, which is one away from tying Catfish Hunter for ninth in Oakland history.
- His opponents have a .229 batting average...that includes .184 (16 for 87) against right-handers compared to .286 (20 for 70) against lefties.
- Is tied for second among AL relievers in wins (5) and tied for 10th in appearances (51)...the five wins match his career high (also 2012).
