A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The A's evened the season series, 2-2, with last night's win...the Jays won 2 of 3 in Oakland July 29-31...won the season series last year, 5-4...it marked the first time the A's won the season series since 2007...split six games in Oakland and won two of three in Toronto...the A's are 205-178 against the Blue Jays all-time...that includes 100-93 in Oakland, 105-83 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's next win will be the 700th of **Bob Melvin's** managerial career...he has compiled a 699-677 record in 10 seasons as a manager...is 206-169 (.549) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is the eighth best record in MLB over that span.

Ryan Cook has not allowed an earned run in his past 15 games and 16.1 innings...not allowed a home run this season and his 49.2 innings pitched are the most among Major League relievers with no home runs.

Brandon Moss is 16 for 53 (.302) with two doubles, one home run, seven RBI, two walks and three strikeouts over his last 15 games.

Eric Sogard extended his hitting streak to 14 games last night, which is an ongoing career-high and the longest streak by an Athletic this year...is 20 for 51 (.392) with 11 runs scored, five doubles, a triple, a home run and 10 RBI over that span.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Applied the brakes to a three-game losing streak last night, beating Toronto, 14-6, behind a 17-hit attack and a season-high 14 runs and five homers...still have lost six of the past eight games...that includes two three-game losing streaks (August 4-present; July 30-August 2) during that stretch...prior to that, had not lost three or more consecutive games since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five straight...are now 9-10 since the All-Star Break, which is the sixth worst record in the American League...however, are 65-49 for the season, which is the fourth best record in the AL and seventh best in the majors...are tied with Texas for first place in the American League West for the third consecutive day...prior to that, had spent 33 consecutive days in sole possession of first place (July 2-August 6)...those were the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...were in third place in the West on May 16 with a 20-22 record and trailed Texas by 7½ games...have gone 45-27 (.625) since May 17, which is the sixth best record in the majors over that span, and have picked up 7½ games in the standings...for the season, the A's have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 53 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .229 (176 for 767) with 87 runs scored (3.78 runs per game) over the past 23 games (since July 10)...have been shut out four times over that span and nine times for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are now hitting .244 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...rank second in the majors in walks (419) and rank fifth in the AL in doubles (208)...A's pinch hitters are batting .134 (13 for 97), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (113), are tied for first in walks (15), rank second in home runs (4) and tied for second in RBI (12).

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.296), fewest walks per nine innings (2.44) and fewest walks (279)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...are on pace to issue 396 walks for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...rank second in the AL in opponents batting average (.242) and third in ERA (3.64) and opponents slugging percentage (.384)...have recorded the fourth fewest strikeouts (784)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 91 consecutive games, the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-6 with a 5.48 ERA (42 er in 69.0 ip) and .281 (79 for 281) opponents batting average over the past 13 games (since July 25)...however, are now 34-16 with a 3.36 ERA (169 er in 452.1 ip) and .236 (404 for 1709) opponents batting average over the last 72 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 48-37 with a 3.96 ERA (305 er in 692.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (4), tied for third in wins, tied for fifth in innings pitched and sixth in ERA.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-13 (.618) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the majors (Texas, 18-10)...rank third in the American League in one-run wins (Cleveland and Kansas City, 22)...are 7-4 (.636) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins and are tied for the third best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 13-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this six-game road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (0-1)....went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 30-29 (.508) on the road...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...have won 25 of the last 35 home games and are 35-20 (.636) at home for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the AL...the A's are batting .238 (438 for 1838) with 232 runs scored (55 games, 4.22 runs per game) at home and .250 (510 for 2044) with 276 runs (59 games, 4.68 runs per game) on the road...the pitching staff has a 3.41 ERA (198 er in 523.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.89 (218 er in 504.1 ip) on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 17-18 against the West since May 10 while going 30-13 against everyone else...are batting .258 (455 for 1766) with 260 runs (51 games, 5.10 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .232 (490 for 2116) with 248 runs (63 games, 3.94 runs per game) against the rest against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.81 ERA (195 er in 460.2 ip) against the AL West compared to 3.51 (221 er in 566.2 ip) against everyone else.

IN JULY: The A's went 15-10 in the month of July, which tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and have now had a winning record for eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...batted .222 (183 for 823) in July, which was the lowest mark in the majors...scored 93 runs in 25 games (3.72 runs per game)...however, the pitching staff allowed just 84 runs for a 3.06 ERA (76 er in 223.1 ip), which was second lowest in the AL...allowed the third fewest walks (64).

THIS AND THAT: The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 42-27 (.609) in night games, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 45-24)...are 23-22 (.511) during the day...are 45-33 (.577) when facing a right-handed starting pitcher and 20-16 (.556) against left-handers...have turned just 81 double plays, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 79)...have sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning 20 times this year...did that just 22 times last year.

fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times.

BRIEFLY: Was 8-5 with a Pacific Coast League leading 2.81 ERA in 16 games with Triple-A Sacramento when he was selected by the A's on July 10...also led the PCL in strikeouts (107), was tied for second in wins and ranked fifth in innings (102.1) at the time of his promotion...did not allow a run in two relief appearances and 4.0 innings with the A's before he was optioned to Sacramento on July 17...went 2-1 with a 6.19 ERA in three starts with the River Cats prior to being recalled to make his first career start tonight.

FIRST APPEARANCE: Made his Major League debut on July 10, a relief appearance at Pittsburgh...entered the game in the fifth inning and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings...struck out Barmes and Liriano and got Marte to fly to right for a perfect fifth inning...allowed a leadoff single to Tabata in the sixth and then retired the next three batters he faced as he struck out McCutchen, got Martin to foul out to the catcher and Alvarez to fly to right.

LAST APPEARANCE: Tossed 2.0 shutout innings in a relief appearance July 19 at Los Angeles...entered the game in relief of Griffin in the sixth inning...got Kendrick to ground out, struck out Trumbo and walked Callaspo before retiring lannetta to end the inning...tossed a perfect seventh and then allowed a leadoff single to Pujols in the eighth before he was replaced by Blevins.

GRAY vs. TORONTO: Has never faced the Blue Jays in his career.

MINORS: Was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 games, all starts, with the River Cats...that includes 4-3 with a 3.47 ERA in 10 starts in Sacramento and 6-4 with a 3.38 ERA in 10 starts on the road...was 2-1 with a 3.27 ERA in four starts in the month of April, 3-3 with a 2.38 ERA in seven May starts and 5-3 with a 4.28 ERA in nine starts since then.

BY INNING: Had a 4.74 ERA (30 er in 57.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 (9 er in 52.2 ip) from innings four through six and 6.23 (6 er in 8.2 ip) from the seventh inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batted .259, which included a .244 (53 for 217) mark against left-handers compared to .274 (64 for 234) against right-handers...allowed just five home runs in 118.1 innings (0.38 per nine innings)...opponents hit .248 (29 for 117) with runners in scoring position, including .240 (12 for 50) with RISP and two outs.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 17-17 with a 3.66 ERA in 53 games, all starts, over three professional seasons...has allowed just 13 home runs in 292.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...was rated as the A's third-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2011 season and was ranked fifth after 2012...was the A's first round pick (18th selection overall) in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (10-8, 3.91 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season...the A's are 13-10 (.565) in his starting assignments this year and are 25-13 (.658) when he starts in his career.... has allowed at least two home runs in each of his last four starts (10 home runs total), which is the longest streak by an A's pitcher since Mark Redman also had a four-game streak from June 27-July 17, 2004...the last A's starter with a longer such streak was Brian Kingman, who allowed at least two home runs in an Athletics record six consecutive starts from August 12-September 8, 1980...has allowed 28 home runs for the season, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since Dan Haren allowed 31 in 2006...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.273), tied for 10th in games starts (23), is eighth in opponents batting average (.231) and 10th in fewest walks per nine innings (1.95)...was charged with the loss in this last start Aug. 3, an A's 4-0 setback to Texas in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the first when Beltre singled home Kinsler, who reached on a fielding error by Céspedes...allowed a solo home run to Cruz in the second and a two-run homer to Moreland in the seventh before he was replaced by Blevins... is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (14.2 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 3 hr) in three career starts vs. the Blue Jays, iincluding 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 9 so) in one start in Terrorte.

The A's bullpen has a 2.12 ERA (15 er in 63.2 ip) and .187 (42 for 225) opponents batting average over the past 20 games (since July 13)...now has a 2.99 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the fewest walks (96) and strikeouts (286) in the AL . ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.287) and fewest home runs (25)...first batters faced are 63 for 293 (.215) with 15 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .256 on-base percentage)...have issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL, have the lowest opponents on-base percentage and rank third in lowest batting average.
