## A's vs. BLUE JAYS

The season series is tied at three games each with today's game remaining...the A's are 2-1 in the first three games of this four-game set in Toronto after losing two of three in Oakland July 29-31...won the season series last year, 5-4...it marked the first time the A's won the season series since 2007...split six games in Oakland and won two of three in Toronto...the A's are 206-179 against the Blue Jays alltime...that includes 100-93 in Oakland, 106-84 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Bob Melvin recorded his 700<sup>th</sup> win as a manager yesterday afternoon...is now 700-678 in 10 seasons as a manager...is 207-170 (.549) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is the ninth best record in MLB over that span.

Josh Reddick hit five home runs in two games Friday and Saturday, which tied the Major League record for most home runs in a two-game span...is the first Athletic to hit five homers in two games since Mark McGwire, June 10-11, 1995.

Eric Sogard had his 14-game game hitting streak snapped yesterday afternoon, which was a career-high and the longest streak by an Athletic this year...was 20 for 51 (.392) with 11 runs scored, five doubles and 10 RBI during the streak.

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **2001** Jason Giambi hits his first career "walk-off" home run for his  $1000^{th}$  career hit as the A's defeat the Yankees, 4-2, for their  $11^{th}$  consecutive win.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost seven of the past 10 games...that includes two three-game losing streaks (August 4-7; July 30-August 2) during that stretch...prior to that, had not lost three or more consecutive games since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five straight...are now 10-11 since the All-Star Break, which is the sixth worst record in the American League...are 66-50 for the season, which is tied for the fourth best record in the AL...have spent the past two days in second place in the American League West and trail Texas by one game...it is the first time the A's have not held at least a share of first since July 1...were tied for first the previous three days after spending 33 consecutive days in sole possession of first (July 2-August 6)...those were the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...are tied with Tampa Bay for the first Wild Card slot, 1½ games ahead of Baltimore...for the season, the A's have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 55 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have recorded 10 or more hits in each of the past four games and are batting .320 (49 for 153) with 29 runs scored (7.25 runs per game) over that span...however, are batting .234 (197 for 841) with 97 runs scored (3.88 runs per game) over the past 25 games (since July 10)...have been shut out four times over the 25 games and nine times for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are now hitting .245 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the AL...rank second in the majors in walks (425) and fifth in the AL in doubles (213)...A's pinch hitters are batting .141 (14 for 99), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (115) and rank second in home runs (4), RBI (13) and walks (15).

**PITCHING:** A's pitchers allowed 11 walks yesterday afternoon, their most since August 25, 2011 when they walked 13...however, lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.296), fewest walks per nine innings (2.53) and fewest walks (293)...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.51 walks per nine innings was in 1904 (2.42)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...are on pace to issue 409 walks for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...are tied for second in the AL in opponents batting average (.242) and slugging percentage (.383) and rank third in ERA (3.64)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 93 consecutive games, the second longest streak by an A's team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988-June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 5.13 ERA (46 er in 80.2 ip) and .270 (88 for 326) opponents batting average over the past 15 games (since July 25)...however, are now 34-17 with a 3.36 ERA (173 er in 464.0 ip) and .235 (413 for 1754) opponents batting average over the last 74 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 48-38 with a 3.95 ERA (309 er in 704.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (4), tied for third in wins and tied for fifth in ERA and innings pitched.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors over the first three games of this series in Toronto and have now made at least one error in seven of the past 10 games (11 errors total)...have 72 errors for the season, which is sixth most in the American League...have turned just 83 double plays, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 80).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 21-14 (.600) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the American League...rank third in the AL in one-run wins (Cleveland and Kansas City, 23)...are 7-4 (.636) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins and are tied for the fourth best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 13-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors with 13 wins when trailing after six innings...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (2-1)....went 3-3 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and are 31-30 (.508) on the road...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 19 of 25 games (through Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (through Sept. 8) at home...have a nine-game homestand from Aug. 13-21 and a 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...have won 25 of the last 35 home games and are 35-20 (.636) at home for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the AL.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 17-18 against the West since May 10 while going 31-14 against everyone else...are batting .258 (455 for 1766) with 260 runs (51 games, 5.10 runs per game) against the AL West compared to .233 (511 for 2190) with 258 runs (65 games, 3.97 runs per game) against the rest against the rest of baseball...the pitching staff has a 3.81 ERA (195 er in 460.2 ip) against the AL West compared to 3.50 (227 er in 583.2 ip) against everyone else.

**CONSECUTIVE WINNING MONTHS:** The A's are 3-5 in the month of August after going 15-10 in July, which tied for the third best record in the American League...won 16 games in each of the first three months this year and have now had a winning record for eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending their streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 42-27 (.609) in night games, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 45-24)...are 24-23 (.511) during the day...have sent at least nine men to the plate in an inning 20 times this year...did that just 22 times last year.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 19<sup>th</sup> start of the season, his fifth since being recalled from Sacramento July 20...the A's are 10-8 (.556) in his starting assignments this year and are 15-10 (.600) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in nine of his 18 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has lost each of his four starts since he was recalled from Sacramento July 20...has a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) and .321 (27 for 84) opponents batting average over that span...the four-game losing streak is the longest of his career...is now 5-4 with a 3.41 ERA (28 er in 74.0 ip) and .234 (65 for 278) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts after going 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Leads American League rookies in games started (18), strikeouts (80) and innings pitched (100.0) and is tied for second in wins (6).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .240 opponents batting average and a .369 slugging percentage...has yielded a .205 (31 for 151) batting average the first time through the lineup, .243 (36 for 148) the second time and .300 (24 for 80) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is fourth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings...opponents are batting .320 (24 for 75) with runners in scoring position, which is ninth highest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings...including .375 (12 for 32) with RISP and two outs, which is third highest...has issued 22 of his 31 walks to left-handed hitters.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-5 with a 5.05 ERA (40 er in 71.1 ip) and .259 (72 for 278) opponents batting average in 13 starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.83 ERA (9 er in 28.2 ip) and .188 (19 for 101) opponents average in five starts during the day...has allowed all 11 of his home runs at night.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-2 with a 2.98 ERA (18 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-4 with a 6.11 ERA (31 er in 45.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 2.59 ERA (23 er in 80.0 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-5 with a 6.52 ERA (43 er in 59.1 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 2-4 with a 6.32 ERA (33 er in 47.0 ip) in nine starts against American League West competition compared to 4-2 with a 2.72 ERA (16 er in 53.0 ip) in nine starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 3-4 with a 5.84 ERA (45 er in 69.1 ip) in 13 starts against the West, 5-2 with a 2.70 ERA (21 er in 70.0 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed eight home runs in his last eight starts, snapping a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has surrendered 11 home runs for the season...nine have been solo shots, seven have come on the road and seven have come in the first two innings of a game.

**WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:** Had his winning streak snapped at a career-high five games July 20...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned nine starts from May 21 to July 9.

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 0-4 with a 4.95 ERA (11 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento July 2 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss in Cincinnati last Tuesday...allowed a solo home run to Bruce in the second inning and a RBI single to Phillips in the third...allowed six hits in four innings before he was removed for a pinch hitter (Smith) in the fifth inning.

**STRAILY vs. TORONTO:** Is 0-1 with a 2.53 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in two career starts, both in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 5-0 A's loss on July 30...allowed a solo home run to Bautista in the first inning and an unearned run in the fourth when Encarnacion scored on a Céspedes error...he then allowed three runs (one earned) in the fifth inning and left after 4.2 innings...had a no decision in his Major League debut on Aug. 3, 2012, a 5-4 A's win in 15 innings in Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just one run on a Davis sacrifice fly in the fourth inning...left with a 4-1 lead but Cook allowed a three-run home run to Mathis in the ninth inning for the blown save...Crisp had a walk-off sacrifice fly in the 15<sup>th</sup> inning for the win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared

to .219 (16 for 73) by right-handers...has allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Bartolo Colón (14-4, 2.75 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 24<sup>th</sup> start of the season...was charged with the loss last Wednesday in Cincinnati as he allowed five runs on seven hits in 2.2 innings...that snapped a streak of 15 consecutive starts in which he tossed six or more innings and allowed three runs or fewer, which was the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916 (previous: 14, Dan Haren, April 18-June 26, 2007)...is tied for the American League lead in shutouts (3) and complete games (3), tied for second in wins (14), fourth in winning percentage (.778) and fifth in ERA (2.75)...is 6-2 with a 3.02 ERA (59.2 ip, 56 h, 22 r, 20 er, 12 bb, 40 so, 7 hr) in nine career starts against Houston, including 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts this season.

Save/Save Opportunities: 33/44 (75.0%) The A's bullpen has a 2.22 ERA (17 er in 69.0 ip) and .184 (45 for 244) opponents batting average over the past 22 games (since July 13)...now has a 2.99 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the fewest walks (101) and strikeouts (293) in the AL , ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.288) and has allowed the fewest home runs (26)...first batters faced are 63 for 295 (.214) with 18 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .261 on-base percentage)...have the lowest first batter on-base percentage in the AL, are tied for the fewest walks and are third in batting average

- Inherited Runners/Scored: 6/5 First Hitters: 12-44 (4 bb) Has not allowed a run in 24 of his past 27 games (6 er in 24.2 ip, 2.19 ERA) and is 19 for 20 in save opportunities over that span. Leads the American League in save percentage (96.7%) and ranks fifth in saves (30)...his 30 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since 2006
  - (Huston Street, 37).
  - Has 56 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is five away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place. Has recorded 495 career strikeouts and is five away from the 500<sup>th</sup> of his career.

  - Has a 1.21 ERA (4 er in 29.2 ip) in 31 games at night compared to 3.31 (6 er in 16.1 ip) in 17 day games.

Save/Opportunities: 30-31

- Is 2-1 with a two saves and 3.64 ERA in 31 games in his career against Toronto (29.2 ip, 26 h, 12 r, 12 er, 9 bb, 39 so, 3 hr).
- Had his Athletics record streak of 44 consecutive saves snapped July 23...it was the sixth longest save streak in Major League history...his streak of 26 consecutive saves to start the season was the second longest streak in Oakland history (Dennis Eckersley, 36 in 1992).
- Was named to his first American League All-Star team and pitched a scoreless sixth inning in the game (1 bb, 1 so).
