# THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: August 13

2008 - Three Astros batters are hit by a pitch in the 6th inning vs. San Francisco, which ties the modern MLB record...Humberto Quintero, Mark Loretta and Ty Wigginton become part of history,

1991 - The Astros tie a franchise record by coming back from a 7-run deficit to defeat the Padres at Candlestick by a score of 12-9...Houston trailed 9-2 after 4.0 frames but would score 10 unanswered runs to complete the comeback...LF Luis Gonzalez led the offense with a 2x5 game, including a homer and 4 RBI.

RADIO DIAL: KTRH, 740 AM, will simulcast eight ROOKIE STARTERS: The three rookie starters Astros games this season with their sister station KBME, 790 AM, beginning with tonight's game at OAK...tomorrow's game and Friday night's game will also be broadcasted by both stations...KTRH will air only the pregame show and the game, while KBME will pick up pregame, game coverage and the postgame show.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros will open up their nine-game road trip with the first of three in Oakland tonight at 9:05 p.m. CT...RHP Jordan Lyles (4-6) is looking to snap the club's six-game losing streak, but will have to do so against  $\ensuremath{\mathbf{RHP}}$ Bartolo Colon, who currently ranks fifth in the AL in ERA.

WESTERLY SWING: The Astros' nine-game, three-city road trip takes the club thru OAK, LAA and TEX...this marks Houston's second trip to Oakland (0-3) and Texas (1-2) and their third and final trip to Anaheim (5-2).

VS. THE A'S: This marks the Astros' third franchise series in Oakland, after having visited for three game series in 2002 (0-3) and in April of this season (0-3)...Houston's lone victory over Oakland this season came in dramatic fashion as Houston walked off with a victory by posting three runs in the 9th off All-Star closer RHP Grant Balfour...Balfour had entered that game by converting 44 straight save opportunities.

**HEALTHY RETURNS:** Houston and Oakland's offseason trade has worked out well for both clubs so far...the A's received IF Jed Lowrie in the deal and he's hit .286 with 48 RBI this season...Houston received IF/OF Chris Carter (21 HR, 54 RBI), RHP Brad Peacock (3.15 ERA over last five MLB games) and minor leaguer C Max Stassi (.284, 16 HR, 52 RBI with Double A Corpus Christi).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: The Astros dropped the final game of a four-game weekend series to the Rangers yesterday by a score of 2-1 in Houston... LHP Brett Oberholtzer (2ER/6.2IP) was the tough-luck loser for the Astros as he was outdueled by RHP Yu Darvish (1ER/8IP)...Houston picked up just one hit on the day, an 8th inning solo homer by C Carlos Corporan.

**OBIE-WON:** Rookie **LHP Brett Oberholtzer** is the 1st pitcher in Astros franchise history to hurl 7.0 or more scoreless innings in his first two ML starts...additionally, after his performance yesterday, he's now the second pitcher in franchise hitory to throw 6.2+ innings, while allowing less than three runs in their first three Major League starts, joining LHP Randy Niemann in 1979 (5/20-6/4).

**ROSTER MOVES:** During yesterday's game, the Astros announced that **LHP Wesley Wright** had been assigned to Tampa Bay in exchange for cash considerations...to take Wright's spot on the active roster, the Astros have selected the contract of RHP Philip Humber from Triple A OKC... Humber will join the club today in Oakland.

currently in the Astros rotation have each pitched well as of late...since 7/12, RHP Jarred Cosart, RHP Brad Peacock and LHP Brett Oberholtzer have a combined 1.48 ERA (11ER/66.2IP) in their 10 starts in that span.

YOUNGBLOODS: The Astros have the youngest roster in the Majors with an average age of 25.6... the club is currently carrying 14 rookies on their active roster, which are the most of any club in the Majors, and includes five rookie relievers... Houston has had 12 players make their Major League debut this season.

STREAKER: Jason Castro has hit safely in a career-high 10 straight games...he is hitting .358 (15x39) during the streak and is 6x12 (.500) in his last three games...the Astros season-high streak is 11 games, set by 2B Jose Altuve (5/29-6/10).

HOT ROBBIE: Since his recall from Triple A on 7/27, rookie Robbie Grossman has hit in 11 of his 14 games at .340 (18x53) with three homers, nine RBI and a .397 OBP.

IMPRESSIVE START: Last Wed. night vs. BOS, rookie RHP Jarred Cosart (5 IP, 2 R) became the first pitcher in Astros history to begin his career by going 5+ innings, while allowing two-or-fewer runs in each of his first five ML starts...the last ML pitcher to do so in the Majors was RHP Shelby Miller, who also did so in his first five career starts (10/3/12-4/22/13).

GRAND THEFT: The Astros 25 stolen bases since 7/27 are the most in the Majors in that span (TEX is 2nd with 21 SB)...since the All-Star break, the Astros rank first among all Major League teams with 31 steals...individually, SS Jonathan Villar ranks tied for first in the Majors in steals since the All-Star break with 11.

CATCHING ON: The Astros 19 combined HR from their catchers are first in the AL this season...the 19 HR are three behind the club record for catchers of 22, which was set in 2000.

ROAD HOG: IF/OF Chris Carter is hitting .260 (45x173) with 12 homers, 33 RBI and a .352 OBP in 50 games on the road this season...he ranks tied for 10th in the AL in road homers.

FARMING SUCCESS: Through 8/10, the Astros combined minor league record of 388-283 (.578) was tops among all organizations...in 2012, the Astros had the top combined winning pct. among domestic minor league clubs (were last overall in both 2010 and 2011).

ABOUT LYLES: 22-year-old right-hander will be making his 19th start of the year since joining the rotation in May.

- tonight will be his 1st career start/app. vs. OAK.
- prior to his last 4 starts, over an 11-game run from 5/17-7/10, posted a 3.11 ERA (23ER/66.2IP).
- allowed 2 runs or less in 7 straight starts from 5/17-6/18, which is tied for the longest such streak in the AL this season with Bartolo Colon (6/28-7/31) and Felix Hernandez (6/26-8/1).
- has been the youngest starter in the American League (min. 15 starts) at 22 years old.
- has held the opposition to 3 earned runs or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts this season.
- has been 3rd-toughest starting pitcher to homer off of in the AL, allowing 9 HR in 100.0 IP.

- $\textbf{IN 2012:} Set\ career\ highs\ in\ innings, starts, strike outs, quality\ starts$ and wins in what was his 2nd season in the Majors...spent the majority of the season as the youngest starting pitcher in the National League...made 25 starts across 4 stints with Houston.
- increased his groundball percentage from 53% in 2011 to 66.1%in 2012...his 1.95 (252GB/129FB) groundballs per flyball ratio ranked 9th in the NL among starters (min. 20 starts).
