The A's have clinched the season series as they lead 11-3 with five games remaining...have lost each of the first two games of this series, marking the first time ever the A's have lost back-to-back games to the Astros...went 8-1 in Houston this year and are 3-2 in Oakland...the A's now lead the alltime series, 16-4...are 6-2 in Oakland and 10-2 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has homered four times in his last 14 games following a career-high 25-game homerless streak...now has 13 RBI in his last 15 games after driving in eight runs over his previous 36 contests.

Bob Melvin recorded his 700th win as a manager Sunday and is now 701-680 (.508) in his career...is 208-172 (.547) since taking over the A's June 9, 2011...that is the 10th best record in the majors over that span.

Eric Sogard is batting .328 (22 for 67) with 11 RBI in 20 games since the All-Star Break.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1907** Chief Bender wins his 11th consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 win over Cleveland...in **1976** Joe Rudi collects his 1000th hit as an Oakland Athletic in the A's 8-7 win against Boston...in **1980** Rick Langford pitches a six-hitter as the A's defeat Seattle 11-3...it is his club record ninth consecutive complete game victory...the win comes in the midst of a club record 22 consecutive complete games...in **2009** Adam Kennedy is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 8-1 loss to Chicago...it is Kennedy's second of two five-hit games in 2009

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and nine of the last 13 games...are 11-13 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...the loss last night dropped the A's two games behind Texas in the American League West for the first time since June 2...a loss today would give the A's their biggest deficit since May 31 when they were three back...dropped into the second Wild Card spot with the loss last night, ½ game behind Tampa Bay and 2½ games ahead of third place Baltimore...are in second place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day...held at least a share of first place in the West for 35 consecutive days from July 2-August 9...that included a streak of 32 consecutive days in sole possession of first from July 2-August 6...those were the A's most consecutive days in first since they spent the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...for the season, the A's have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 58 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of the first two games of this series by one run and now have a fourgame losing streak in one-run games...are 21-16 (.568) in one-run decisions for the season...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...fell to 7-5 (.583) in extra inning games with the loss last night but have the fourth best record...have six "walk-off" wins...are 14-9 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 17-20 against the West since May 10 while going 32-14 against everyone else...are averaging 5.00 runs per game (265 runs in 53 games) against AL West competition compared to 3.98 (263 runs in 66 games) against everyone else.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.67 ERA (40 er in 98.0 ip) over the first 11 games of August after logging a 3.06 ERA in July...have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.296)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...have issued just 299 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 407 batters for the season...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...are averaging 2.51 walks per nine innings...the last time the A's averaged fewer than 2.56 walks per nine innings was in 1944 (2.51)...rank second in the AL in opponents batting average (.242) and opponents slugging percentage (.382)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 96 consecutive games, which is the second longest streak by an AL team since 1976...had a 98-game streak from Aug. 19, 1988.June 7, 1989...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: The A's will start a right-handed pitcher today for the 11th consecutive game, which is the A's longest such streak since July 21-Oct. 2, 1999 when they did it in 68 consecutive games...the A's have used just seven starting pitchers, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...A's starting pitchers are 3-7 with a 4.90 ERA (45 er in 82.2 ip) and .275 (91 for 331) opponents batting average over the past 15 games (since July 28)...have tossed fewer than five innings five times over that span...however, are 34-18 with a 3.35 ERA (180 er in 483.2 ip) and .238 (434 for 1826) opponents batting average over the last 77 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA and .272 opponents average over the first 42 contests...are 48-39 with a 3.93 ERA (316 er in 724.0 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for third in wins and complete games (4) and rank fourth in innings pitched.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .227 (227 for 1002) with 111 runs scored (3.70 runs per game) over the last 30 games (since July 8)...are now hitting .244 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have 12 home runs in the last eight games after homering just twice over the previous seven contests...have 432 walks, which ranks second in the majors to Boston (443)...have 14 sacrifice hits, which is tied for the fewest in the majors with Boston.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .147 (15 for 102), which is the second lowest mark in the American League (Baltimore, .143)...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch plate appearances (119) and strikeouts (31) and rank second in home runs (4), RBI (13) and walks (15)...the four pinch hit home runs are the most by an A's team since the 2002 club had five...the 15 walks are also the most since 2002 (15)...the 119 plate appearances are the most since 2004 (120).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's ended their season-high streak of five consecutive games with an error last night...have committed 13 errors in the last 13 games, which has led to 10 unearned runs...made 61 errors over the first 106 games leading to 23 unearned runs...have turned 87 double plays, which is second fewest in the majors (Cincinnati, 83)...rank last in the majors in assists (1031).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Cleveland (three games) and Seattle (three games)...this homestand is part of a stretch where the A's will play 19 of 25 games (July 25-Aug. 21) and 29 of 42 (July 25-Sept. 8) at home...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles (3-1), Toronto (1-2) and Texas (1-2)...have another 10-game homestand from Aug. 30-Sept. 8...have lost six of the last seven home games but are 35-22 (.614) in Oakland for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the American League...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (3-1) and are 32-30 (.516) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 41-5 when outhomering the opposition, which is the best mark in the majors...are 42-29 (.600) in night games, which is the third best record in the American League, compared to 25-23 (.521) during the day...are 4-7 in the month of August...went 15-10 in July and have posted a winning record in eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...placed John Jaso on the 7-day disabled list on July 25, ending a streak of 77 consecutive days without placing a player on the DL...that was the second longest streak by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have now used the DL 10 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...are 13-6 on Sunday which is tied with Tampa Bay for the best mark in the majors.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento August 10 for his second stint with the A's this year...is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start since his

return...made his Major League debut during his first stint from July 10 to 18 and did not allow a run in two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts with Triple-A Sacramento...including 2-1 with a 6.19 ERA in three starts following his July 19 option.

IN RELIEF: Made his Major League debut July 10 in a relief appearance at Pittsburgh...entered the game in the fifth inning and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings...struck out Barmes and Liriano and got Marte to fly to right for a perfect fifth inning...allowed a leadoff single to Tabata in the sixth and then retired the next three batters he faced as he struck out McCutchen, got Martin to foul out to the catcher and Alvarez to fly to right...also tossed 2.0 shutout inning...got Kendrick to ground out, struck out Trumbo and walked Callaspo before retiring lannetta to end the inning...tossed a perfect seventh and then allowed a leadoff single to Pujols in the eighth before he was replaced by Blevins.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 5-4 A's loss at Toronto last Saturday...allowed a two-run home run to Bautista in the first inning, but the A's came back to tie the game with two in the second...then allowed a run to score in the bottom of the second on a fielder choice and another in the third on a Rasmus RBI single...left after six innings with the A's trailing 4-3.

GRAY vs. HOUSTON: Has never faced the Astros in his career.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 6-4 with a 2.69 ERA and .245 opponents batting average over his first 12 starts through June 6...then went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA and .280 opponents average over his final eight starts...the River Cats were 12-8 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times

AMONG THE LEADERS: At the time of his promotion to Oakland on August 10, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (118), tied for second in wins (10), tied for fourth in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (3.42), eighth in innings pitched (118.1) and tied for eighth in games started (20).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batted .259, which included a .244 (53 for 217) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (64 for 234) against right-handers...issued 26 of his 39 walks to left-handers.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed just five home runs in 118.1 innings (0.38 per nine innings)...four of the home runs came on the road and three were solo shots...did not allow a home run over his first eight starts and 47.2 innings.

BY INNING: Had a 4.74 ERA (30 er in 57.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 (9 er in 52.2 ip) from innings four through six and 6.23 (6 er in 8.2 ip) from the seventh inning on.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 17-17 with a 3.67 ERA in 53 games, all starts, over three professional seasons...has allowed just 13 home runs in 292.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...was rated as the A's third-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2011 season and was ranked fifth after 2012...was the A's first round pick (18th selection overall) in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft...is the first A's draft pick from 2011 to reach the majors.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (10-8, 3.88 ERA): Is scheduled to make his team-leading 25th start of the season...is 2-2 with a 4.70 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-6 with a 3.68 ERA and .234 opponents average before the break...has allowed 10 home runs in 30.2 innings since the break after allowing 18 in 122.1 innings before the break...leads the majors in home runs allowed (28)...ranks eighth in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.278) and ninth in opponents batting average (.231)...has allowed a .160 batting average the first time through the lineup, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-4 A's win at Toronto last Sunday (5.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 2 er, 6 bb, 2 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Indians, a start in the A's 4-3 loss at Cleveland earlier this year on May 8 (6.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

The A's bullpen has a 2.07 ERA (18 er in 78.1 ip) and .189 (53 for 280) opponents batting average over the past 25 games (since July 13)...now has a 2.94 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...has the fewest walks (102) and is tied for the fewest strikeouts (304) in the AL, ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.287) and has allowed the fewest home runs (26)...first batters faced are 63 for 302 (.209) with 18 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .255 on-base percentage)...has allowed the fewest first batter walks in the AL, the lowest on-base percentage and the third lowest batting average.

- Became the A's 14th different Opening Day starter in left field in the last 14 years April 1 against Seattle.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 13 with a strained muscle in his left hand...it was his second career stint on the DL as he was out from May 7-31 last year with a muscle strain in his left hand...went 3 for 9 (.333) with a home run and four RBI on a three-game rehab assignment with Sacramento...was reinstated April 28.
- Had his first career four-strikeout game April 29 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Had his first career four-RBI game April 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...matched that mark June 21 at Seattle and July 28 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Was hit by a pitch twice May 1 against Los Angeles (AL), tying the Oakland record (32nd time, last: Josh Willingham at Seattle, April 24, 2011).
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 16 streak with his third inning single May 12 at Seattle.

 was his 10th career shutout, his first since May 30, 2011 at Oakland...the seven-inning shutout was
 third shortest in Oakland history and the shortest since Vida Blue fired 6.0 innings April 9, 1971
 against Kansas City...the last complete game of fewer than eight innings by an A's pitcher was by
 Steve Ontiveros on May 16, 1995 against Chicago (5.0 ip).
- Walked Jacoby Ellsbury to lead off the sixth inning April 23 at Boston, snapping a streak of 32.0 innings and 121 batters faced without a walk dating back to his last walk on August 12, 2012 at Chicago (AL)...the 32.0-inning streak was the longest in Oakland history by a starter and second longest overall to Dennis Eckersley's streak of 50.1 innings from Aug. 17, 1989-June 12, 1990.
- Did not strike out a batter May 14 against Texas, his eighth career start without a strikeout...it was the first time in a game in which he pitched more than 4.0 innings.
- Walked two batters May 20 at Texas, snapping a season-opening streak of eight consecutive starts with one walk or fewer and two innings or more...that was the longest season-opening streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916.
- Had an 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 20 to 31.
- Struck out nine batters May 26 at Houston in his first start after turning 40 to set an Athletics record for strikeouts by a 40-year old...the previous high was seven by Tom Candiotti (July 31, 1998 vs. Cleveland) and Don Sutton (April 22, 1985 vs. California)...is just the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to start a game at age 40...the other three are Tommy John (last start at 42 years, 126 days), Candiotti (last start at 41 years, 275 days) and Sutton (last start at 40 years, 155 days)
- Tossed a five-hit shutout May 31 against Chicago (AL) to become the second 40-year old in Oakland history with a shutout (Don Sutton: 40 years, 85 days on June 26, 1985 against Chicago).
- Had his career-high tying eight-game winning streak snapped July 3 by Chicago (NL)...also won eight straight from July 21-Sept. 10, 2005...had a 1.37 ERA and surrendered just one home run in 59.0 innings during the streak, which spanned eight starts...it was the longest winning streak by an Athletic since Dan Haren had a 10-game winning streak from April 18-July 1, 2007...fell one short of the Oakland record for consecutive starts with a win.
- The loss to the Cubs was his first home loss of the season, snapping an eight-game winning streak in the Coliseum dating back to Aug. 2, 2012...that was the longest home winning streak by an A's pitcher since Mark Mulder won 10 straight from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...posted a 1.85 ERA during the winning streak, which spanned 11 starts, and walked just seven batters (0.81 per nine innings).
- Was charged with a wild pitch July 3 against Chicago (NL), his first since May 26, 2009 at Los Angeles (AL)...it snapped a streak of 443.0 innings without a wild pitch...it was his first wild pitch in 40 starts with the A's, which was the second longest streak in Oakland history...the record is 42 by Catfish Hunter (June 25, 1972-June 27, 1973).
- Went 5-0 with a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June to win American League Pitcher of the Month honors for the fourth time in his career...led the AL in ERA and tied for second in wins...it marked the third time in his career he won five games in a month (August 1999 and August 2005)...it was the fourth lowest single month ERA of his career (1.13 in May 2002, 1.39 in June 1998 and 1.72 in August 2005)...since 2006, the only other Oakland pitcher to win five games in a month is Gio Gonzalez (Sept., 2011).
- Was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005)... at the age of 40 years and 53 days, he is the oldest All-Star in Athletics history...Dennis Eckersley, at age 37 in 1992, is second oldest...pitched the Sunday before the game and was replaced on the active roster.

• Allowed his first run of the season on the road May 26 at Houston, snapping a 22.2-inning scoreless streak on the road dating back to Aug. 11, 2012...the road scoreless streak is third longest in Oakland history by a reliever.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his ninth Opening Day Roster (2004-09, 11-13), his third straight with the A's...made his eighth career Opening Start April 1 against Seattle, including three straight with the A's.
- Hit his ninth career leadoff home run April 5 at Houston, his seventh with the A's...added two more
 on June 3 at Milwaukee and June 11 against New York (AL)...in Oakland history, only Rickey
 Henderson (43) and Campy Campaneris (10) have more...is tied for fourth in Athletics history with
 Max Bishop behind Henderson, Eddie Joost (19) and Campaneris (13).
- Homered and doubled in all three games at Houston April 5-7 to become the second player in Oakland history with both a double and a home run in three consecutive games (Matt Stairs, August 14-16, 1997).
- Homered in a career-high four consecutive games from April 5-9...is the first leadoff hitter in Oakland history to homer in four straight games...the last Athletic to do it was Wally Moses (July 21-23, 1937).
- Had a 12-game hitting streak from April 3 to 19... went 20 for 51 (.392) with 18 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, nine walks and seven multiple hit games during the streak, which was his 11th of 10 or more games.
- Had the fourth "walk-off sacrifice bunt" in Oakland history April 28 against Baltimore...the last was by Marco Scutaro on April 16, 2005 against Anaheim...had two walk-off sacrifice flies last year, in addition to a single.
- Finished April with 24 runs scored to set an Oakland record for runs in April...broke the previous mark of 23 by Jose Canseco in 1988.
- Was on the 15-day disabled from April 30 to May 14 with a strained left hamstring...it was his seventh career stint on the DL, his fourth with the A's.
- His seventh inning RBI single July 13 against Boston was the 500th RBI of his career.

- Played third base for the second time as a professional May 24 at Houston in the ninth inning...the other time was in 2002 with the Red Sox affiliate in the Gulf Coast League...returned to third base in the 16th inning of the A's 18-inning game against New York (AL) June 13.
- Had his second two homer game of the season June 12 against New York (AL) and third of his career...the two homers gave him a streak where each of his last five hits were home runs...is the sixth player in Oakland history (10th time) to do that, the first since John Jaha (June 18-20, 1999)... the others are Jackson, McGwire (five times), Canseco and Giambi.

PAT NESHEK

- Did not allow a run in nine spring training appearances (8.1 ip) and has not allowed a run in 19 games (17.1 ip) over the last two springs.
- Is on his fifth Opening Day roster (2007-08 and 2010 with Minnesota, 2011 with San Diego).

DEREK NORRIS

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter in the seventh inning April 29 against Los Angeles and ended up
 going 0 for 5 with a walk...he and Rosales had six plate appearances, which match the most in
 Oakland history by a player not in the starting lineup (nine times, last: Jerry Browne on June 12,
 1992 vs. Texas).
- Had a career-high four RBI June 11 against New York (AL).
- Caught all 18 innings June 20 against New York (AL)...is the second A's catcher since 1973 to catch 18 innings in a game (Damian Miller, Aug. 8, 2004 against Minnesota)

JARROD PARKER

- Began the season with a career-high four-game losing streak...posted an 8.10 ERA and .374 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned five starts from April 2 to 25.
- Allowed a career-high four home runs in a 7-3 loss at Cleveland May 6...prior to that, had allowed more than one home run in a start just twice in his career and never more than two.

- Had a career-high five-game hitting streak from April 14 to 20 (7 for 16, .438)...matched that May 15-21 (6 for 15, .400).
