**DOIN' IT ALL FOR MY BABY:** The Indians evened the series at one win apiece with a 7-1 victory over the Athletics last night...**UBALDO JIMENEZ** carried a no-hitter through 5.0 and allowed his only hit and only run of the contest on an RBI-single to the final batter he faced with 2 outs in the 6th (Donaldson)...Tribe got solo HR's from both **NICK SWISHER** and **MICHAEL BOURN**, while **JASON KIPNIS** and **ASDRUBAL CABRERA** matched Swisher for team lead with 2 RBI each...the Indians are 3-2 on this 10-day, 9-game road trip against Minnesota (2-1), Oakland (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3 games)...club is coming off a 1-6 homestand against the Tigers (0-4) and Angels (1-2).

**THE STANDINGS:** The Indians and Tigers (6-5, walk-off vs. KC) both notched wins last night, as **Cleveland holds 2nd place in the A.L. Central standings**, 6.0 games behind first-place Detroit (.585, 72-51)...the Tribe's largest deficit this season is 8.0 games...the latest 2012 calendar date for the Indians to have at least a share of first place was June 23...**the Tribe also sits 3.5 games out of an A.L. Wild Card spot**...Cleveland has been in 1st place for 16 days, 2nd place for 85 days, 3rd place for 15 days, 4th place for 12 days and 5th place for 10 days (2nd place for 58 of last 62 days).

**WINS AND LOSSES:** Cleveland is 15-13 coming out of the All-Star break after going 51-44 in the season's first "half" (T7th in A.L.), most wins for the Tribe at the break since posting a 52-36 mark prior to 2007 Mid-Summer Classic...despite losing 8 of their last 12, the Indians have still won 14 of 23, 19 of 32, 21 of 36, 36 of 60 and 61 of their last 108 games since April 20 (.565, 61-47), the 4th-highest winning pct. in the A.L. during that span and 9th-highest in Majors (see below)...Tribe started the season 5-10 from April 2-19...at 66-57 and 9 games above the .500 mark, Cleveland is 4 wins shy of the club's high-water mark for the season (+13G, 62-49 on Aug. 4) and sits 14 losses ahead of club's low-water mark (-5G, 8-13 on April 28)...Indians are 7-9 to begin August after going 11-13 in April, 18-12 in May, 15-13 in June and 15-10 in July...club has gone 40-25 this season following a win; 25-32 following a loss...the Tribe is 24-15 in games decided in the 7th inning-or-later and 8-2 in extra innings...Cleveland has been at or above .500 for 61 straight days; have not been below .500 since June 17 (34-35).

**SERIES STUFF:** Cleveland has won 4 of the club's last 6 series, including 2 straight on the road (club has not won 3 straight road series since winning first 4 road series of 2012)...the Indians have gone 20-15-5 in 40 series played thus far in 2013 (13-7-1 at home; 7-8-4 on the road)...Cleveland has gone 11-6-1 over the last 18 series played dating back to June 10.

**RUBBER SOUL:** The Tribe enters this afternoon's decisive tilt with an 8-2 record in rubber games this season (5-1 on the road), while the club is also 22-18 in series finales (11-8 on the road).

**WORKIN' FOR A LIVIN':** After playing 14 of previous 17 games in Cleveland (10-7 record; 8-6 at home), the Indians are on the front end of a stretch that has them set to play 15 of a possible 18 tilts on the road where the club has gone 28-32, 9th in the A.L. (7-7 in the 2nd "half")...that said, **the Tribe has won 16 of 27 (16-11) road games since June 11**...the Indians are averaging 4.83 runs-per-game on the road - 2nd-most in A.L. (BOS-4.94) and 3rd in Majors (StL-5.11) - however the pitching staff's 4.28 road ERA is 43 points higher than 3.85 home ERA and 5th-highest in the A.L...meanwhile, **Oakland has allowed the fewest total runs and runs-per-game at home of any A.L. team this season** (3.8 RPG, 227R/60G)...Cleveland is 3 road wins shy of matching 2012 total (31-50).

**IF THIS IS IT:** Cleveland snapped a 5-game losing streak here at the Oakland Coliseum last night...with a series split so far this weekend paired alongside the Tribe's 4-game sweep of the A's May 6-9 at Progressive Field, Cleveland now holds a 5-1 advantage in the 2013 season series...Tribe has outscored the A's 30-12, batting .265 with a 2.04 ERA (12 ER/53.0 IP) and .194 avg. against...Oakland had won 8 straight meetings entering this year (CLE 2-8 vs. OAK in 2012, incl. 2-4 at The Coliseum)...with a victory this afternoon, the Indians will have won 3 of the last 4 series played here in Oakland...the Indians are 99-137 all-time here at the Coliseum, as the club is seeking its 100th win at this venue.

**THE HEART OF ROCK & ROLL:** The Indians pitching staff has posted a 3.61 ERA (217ER/541.0 IP) over club's last 60 games dating back to June 11, 5th-lowest in the A.L. and 12th in MLB, which includes a **3.07 ERA** (109ER/320.0IP, 3rd-lowest in A.L., 6th in Majors) and just 15 home runs allowed in 35 games since July 8 - the Tribe is 20-15 in that span...**rotation is 12-9 w/ a 3.10 ERA (72ER/209.0 IP) and a .222 opponents avg. over those 35 G**, while bullpen is 8-6 with a 3.00 ERA (37 ER/111.0 IP), 12-for-16 in save opp's.

**'TIL THE DAY AFTER:** Cleveland has gone 26-16 (.619) in day games this season, good for the 4th-best such winning pct. in the Majors behind St. Louis (.658, 25-13), Boston (.647, 22-12) and Los Angeles-NL (.625, 20-12)...club also has the A.L.'s 3rd-lowest opponents' avg. in day games at .240...Tribe offense leads MLB with an .807 OPS in day games and owns the Majors' 3rd-highest team avg. at .275 behind Baltimore (.281) and Detroit (.280)...club also ranks among leaders in HR (T1st, 60), extra-base hits (3rd, 153) and steals (6th, 34).

**YOU CAN ONLY MOVE SOUTH DOWN THE COAST:** At the conclusion of this afternoon's contest, the Indians will head to Anaheim for a 3-game set against the Angels, this after dropping 2 of 3 to Los Angeles-AL on the club's most recent homestand...the Indians have gone 123-142 all-time at Angel Stadium, but have hovered around the .500 mark (45-44) since the start of the 1994 campaign.

**THIS DAY IN TRIBE HISTORY: 1962:** Tribe's game at Memorial Stadium in Baltimore is delayed twice when Indians' starting pitcher Pedro Ramos is asked to change his uniform, with the right-hander complying to the request by first changing his shirt, then returning to the clubhouse for a different jersey and hat...umpires suspect the Cleveland right-hander is doctoring the baseball...Indians went on to win 4-3.

**THIS DAY IN MUSIC: 1962:** Ringo Starr made his debut with The Beatles at the horticultural society Dance, Birkenhead, England, having had a 2-hour rehearsal in preparation...**1969:** Mick Jagger was accidentally shot in the hand during filming of Ned Kelly in Australia...**1977:** The Police made their live debut as a three-piece band when they played at Rebecca's Birmingham, England...**2008:** Pervis Jackson, bass singer and original member of The Spinners, passed away in Detroit, MI at the age of 70...**BORN ON THIS DAY:** (1951) John Rees, Men At Work; (1952) Patrick Swayze; (1957) Ron Stryker, Men At Work; (1969) Erik Schrodty, House of Pain & Everlast.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** The Indians improved to MLB-best 18-7 (.720) vs. A.L. West opponents with last night's win, outscoring teams 138-82 w/ 41 HR's in those 25 contests (Tribe has 8 G remaining vs. A.L. West)...Cleveland scored multiple runs in 1st inning last night for first time since 7/24 at SEA...**NICK SWISHER** is 4-for-8 w/ one HR, 3 RBI and 2 runs in this series...Roberto Clement was born on this date in 1934 (would've celebrated his 79th birthday today).

# 26 SCOTT KAZMIR

LHP

(7-5, 4.18)

**TONIGHT'S START:** The 29-year-old left-hander is set to make his 22nd start and appearance of this season in the finale of this 3-game set at Oakland, also the 201st start and 202nd appearance of his career...will be pitching on extended 8 days' rest after shouldering the loss in the Angels 5-2 win over the Tribe on Friday, August 9...had his season-high 4-game winning streak snapped in his last start...set to make his 19th career start and appearance against the A's, his second this season and first at O.co Coliseum since 2010.

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** In 5 starts since the All-Star Break, Kazmir has gone 2-1 with a 2.89 ERA (9 ER/28.0 IP)...with the exception of his outing on July 30 vs. Chicago-AL where he allowed 4 ER and his August 9 vs. Los Angeles-AL where he allowed 5 ER, Kazmir has worked 20.0 innings over three starts without allowing a single earned run.

**SEIZE THE DAY:** Kazmir is unbeaten in day games this season going 4-0 with a 2.65 ERA (10 ER/34.0 IP) in 6 tilts...his ERA is more than 2 runs higher this season during night games as he has compiled a 3-5 record and a 4.84 ERA (43 ER/80.0 IP) in 15 starts...for his career, is 25-15 with a 3.94 ERA (137 ER/313.1 IP) in 54 career starts and 55 career appearances during the day as opposed to 48-51 with a 4.27 ERA (390 ER/822.1 IP) in 146 career starts and appearances during the night.

**HISTORIC STRETCH:** Scott Kazmir has pitched at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 or fewer hits and no earned runs in a 3 of 4 start-stretch from July 19-August 4, becoming just the second AL pitcher since 1921 to accomplish such a stretch; New York's Ron Guidry pulled the trick from September 9-24, 1978...overall, Kazmir has tossed 6.0 or more innings in 11 of his 21 starts this season, going 7-2 with a 1.75 ERA (15 ER/77.1 IP) in those outings...in 9 of those tilts, he has allowed 2 ER or less, going 7-0 with a 0.96 ERA (7 ER/65.1 IP).

**KAZMIR OF LATE:** Over the course of his last 10 starts since June 15 vs. Washington, Kazmir is 4-1 with a 2.59 ERA (17 ER/59.0 IP), lowering his ERA from 5.89 to 4.18... was 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA (12 ER/56.0 IP) over a 9-start stretch from June 21-August 4.

**GET TO HIM EARLY:** Opponents have enjoyed the most success against Kazmir this season during the first 3 innings of his outings as the lefty has pitched to a 5.03 ERA (35 ER/62.2 IP) during innings 1-3...his ERA is more than 2 runs lower during innings 4-6 as he has compiled a 2.93 ERA (15 ER/46.0 IP) over those frames...has allowed just 3 ER in the 6 games that he has pitched at into the 7th inning.

**LAST START:** Suffered the setback in the Tribe's 5-2 loss vs. Los Angeles-AL on August 9 lasting just 3.0 innings (3.0 IP, 6 H, 5 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR, 63 pitches/40 strikes)...the loss marked his first of the season at Progressive Field and also snapped a season-high 4-game winning streak strung together from June 21-August 4...was the 200th start of his Major League career...was his shortest outing since lasting just 2.2 innings on June 15 vs. Washington...allowed all 5 of the runs to his former team in the first inning on a Mark Trumbo 2-run single and a Josh Hamilton 3-run homer...retired the last 8 batters he faced, but was pulled after completing the third inning...the Indians scored their 2 runs on solo homers from Michael Bourn in second and Asdrubal Cabrera in the fourth.

**VS. OAKLAND:** Is 10-5 with a 3.77 ERA (44 ER/105.0 IP) in 18 career appearances/starts against the Athletics...his 3.77 ERA against Oakland is his 5th-best mark against any Major League team with a minimum of 10 career starts trailing only Texas (3.09), Seattle (3.41), New York-AL (3.50) and Detroit (3.73)...faced the A's this season on May 9 at Progressive Field and earned the victory in the Tribe's 9-2 win striking out a season-high 10 batters and allowing just a solo homer in 6.0 innings (6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 10 SO, 1 HR, 103 pitches/72 strikes)...faced today's opponent Bartolo Colon in the start on May 9...is 6-4 with a 4.12 ERA (31 ER/67.2 IP) in 12 career starts and appearances at Oakland's O.co Coliseum...last pitched in Oakland on September 3, 2010 for Los Angeles-AL and suffered the setback in the Angels 8-0 loss (5.2 IP, 2 H, 2 R-ER, 6 BB, 3 SO, 101 pitches/51 strikes).

**LEFT OF CENTER:** Has held left-handers to a .228 clip (231-1011) and a .633 OPS (.293 OBP/.340 SLG) in his Major League career, compiling 244 strikeouts against 87 walks...has also allowed just 22 home runs to left-handers, an average of 46.0 at-bats per HR...has held lefties to a .213 average (29-136) this season, while righties are hitting .262 (79-301) against him.

**IT'S BEEN A WHILE:** Kazmir's start on August 4 at Miami was his first shutout effort since tossing 5.0 scoreless innings on October 3, 2009 for Los Angeles-AL at Oakland in a 4-2 Angels win (5.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 76 pitches/53 strikes).

**8TH WONDER OF THE WORLD:** His 8.0-inning effort on July 24 at Seattle was the first time he has pitched at least 8.0 frames in a start since June 6, 2008 for Tampa Bay at Texas as he notched a victory in Tampa's 12-4 win (8.0 IP, 6 H, 2 R-ER, 0 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 111 pitches/75 strikes).

**MR. "K"AZMIR:** His 8.68 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP ranks as the 7th-highest figure among all active MLB hurlers with a minimum of 1000.0 innings pitched from 2004-13, trailing Tim Lincecum (9.74), Clayton Kershaw (9.17), Jake Peavy (8.94), Yovani Gallardo (8.93), Johan Santana (8.78), and Erik Bedard (8.69).

**BEATING THE BEST:** Kazmir has traditionally enjoyed success against teams with winning records, as 39 of his 71 career wins have come against teams with a record of .500 or better...has a 3.87 career ERA (277 ER/643.2 IP) against teams with a record of .500 or better in 113 appearances and 112 starts...is 34-25 with a 4.57 ERA (250 ER/492.1 IP) in 88 career appearances/starts against teams that are under .500.

**ELITE COMPANY:** Kazmir entered his start on April 27 at Kansas City needing just 3 strikeouts to reach 1,000 for his career...in the bottom of the fourth, after retiring Jeff Francoeur and Salvador Perez on fly-outs, he struck out Miguel Tejada on a 2-2 pitch joining only 54 other active pitchers who have recorded at least 1,000 punchouts...the left-hander has now handed out 1,096 return slips to the dugout over 1136.0 career innings since making his MLB debut in 2004.
