TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 3-team, 9-game road trip today with the first of a threegame series vs. the Oakland Athletics...took 2 of 3 from the Rangers over the weekend and opened the trip losing 2 of 3 at Tampa Bay...have an off day Thursday and open a 6-game homestand vs. the Los Angeles Angels (3 games) and Texas Rangers (3 games) on Friday...the Mariners are 14-14 since the All-Star break and 21-19 since July 1...tonight's game will be televised on *ROOT Sports* in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday 4-3 at Texas to even record at 3-3 during current road trip... dropped 13 of last 21 games, and are 9-14 following season-high 8-game winning streak (July 12-23)...29-25 vs. the AL West, 12-17 vs. AL East, 9-14 vs. AL Central and 7-10 in Interleague play...are 31-32 at Safeco Field and 26-34 on the road (12-9 over last 21 road games).

- Monday, Monday the Mariners are 9-3 when playing on Monday's this season.
- K/9.0 IP Mariners relievers lead the AL averaging 9.64 K/9.0 IP...Danny Farquhar (5th, 13.39), Oliver Perez (6th, 12.76) and Charlie Furbush (11th, 12.31) are among AL leaders.

 Early & Late Homers – Mariners have hit 50 HR in 7th inning or later, most in MLB...also hit a MLB-
- best 24 home runs in the first inning this season (8 leadoff) and 6 home runs in extra innings.
- Shutouts Mariners rank 3rd in the AL with 11 shutouts this season (CLE 15, TB 13).
- Tough Trip On this 9-G road trip the Rays/Rangers/A's have a combined record of 211-158 (.572).
- Michael Saunders went 3-for-3 off Yu Darvish yesterday, becoming the 3rd player to go 3-for-3 or better vs. the Rangers right-hander (also: DeWayne Wise, 4/30/13 & Adam Lind, 6/8/13).

IT ALL STARTED HERE...Aaron Harang made his Major League debut on May 25, 2002 here at Oakland Coliseum...the then-24-year-old tossed 7.0 shutout innings against Tampa Bay, allowing 3 hits and striking out 10 batters...Harang is the only pitcher in A's history (dating back to 1916) to throw at least 7.0 scoreless innings with 10 or more strikeouts in an MLB debut.

VS. THE AL WEST...the Mariners have a winning record (29-25) vs. the American League West (7-5 vs. HOU, 8-5 vs. OAK, 7-6 vs. LAA, 7-9 vs. TEX)...have not posted a winning record within the division since going 31-26 in 2009...are 4-1-0 in last 4 road series vs. the AL West.

BEEN A WHILE IN ARLINGTON...the Mariners took yesterday's rubber-match vs. the Rangers, and won back-to-back series (of at least 3 games) in Arlington for the first time since Sept. 24-26, 2004 & April 26-28, 2005...the Mariners also won 2 of 3 at Rangers Ballpark earlier this season, July 2-4.

NO MARGIN FOR ERROR...57 of the Mariners 123 games this season have been decided by 2 or fewer runs...own a 30-27 record in these games, going 17-20 in 1-run games and 13-7 in 2-run games...each of the Mariners last 6 wins have been by 2 or fewer runs.

LORD FARQUHAR ... new closer Danny Farquhar has earned the save in each of the Mariners last 7 wins, the first saves of his Major League career...since becoming the closer on Aug. 3, Farquhar is 7-for-8 in save opportunities...he has retired 34 of his last 41 batters faced (6 H, IBB).

LATE INNING HOMERS...the Mariners lead the Major Leagues with 35 home runs hit in the 8th inning or later...the next closest team is Atlanta (34) and the 2nd-best team in the American League is Baltimore (29)... Kyle Seager has hit 8 of his 19 home runs in the 8th inning or later, while Justin Smoak has hit 7 of his 14 homers...Seattle is tied for the AL lead with 27 HR in "Close and Late" situations (7th inn or later ahead by one run, tied, or with the tying run on base, at-bat or on deck).

SMOAKIN'...Justin Smoak has recorded a hit in 14 of his last 17 games, batting .339 (20x63) with 3 doubles, 5 home runs and 11 RBI during this stretch...since coming off the DL on June 18 he has a quad-slash (avg/obp/slg/ops) of .295/.377/.534/.911 with 11 of his 14 home runs...here is a hitting breakdown of Smoak's first 46 and last 48 games this season:

HOME RUN DERBY...the Mariners rank 4th in the Majors with 147 home runs (BAL-165, TOR-150, ATL - 149, SEA-147)...Seattle is the only team with 8 players with 10+ home runs...also lead the Majors in percent of runs scored via the home run... Seattle has scored 493 runs this season, including 231 via the homer; that's 46.8% of its runs via homers, tops in the Majors...the Mariners are just 2 home runs short of matching the season total from last season (149).

YOUNG UP THE MIDDLE...Brad Miller (SS) and Nick Franklin (2B), both rookies, have made 34 starts together this season in the middle infield...marks the 3rd-most starts by a rookie 2B/SS combination in club history, and most since the club's inaugural season in 1977 (Jose Baez-2B, Craig Reynolds-SS; 54 games & Julio Cruz-2B, Craig Reynolds-SS; 35 games)...the 34 combined starts by Miller & Franklin are 2nd-most by an AL rookie middle infield combo dating back to 1995: Andy Fox & Derek Jeter (NYY, 35 GS in 1995).

AGE DEFYING...Raul Ibañez hit his 25th home run of the season Thursday night at Tampa Bay.. he became the 6th player (7th time) to hit 25 or more home runs in a season at age 40 or older...Raul has hit 35 home runs since turning 40 years old last season (6/2/12)...Raul hit only 28 home runs in 371 games prior to turning 30...Raul is the first Mariners player to hit 25 home runs in a season since Russell Branyan (31) and Jose Lopez (25) in 2009...Raul also became the 11th player in club history with multiple 25-HR seasons in a Mariners uniform (33 in 2006).

DID YOU KNOW?...that Kyle Seager is tied for 3rd in the American League with 5 go-ahead RBI in the 7th inning or later this season?...Seager plated the go-ahead (and game-winning runs) in the Mariners wins vs. the Rangers on Friday (8th inning 2-run HR) and Sunday (9th inning RBI double).

<u>ABOUT HARANG</u>...35-year-old right-hander is making his 21st start of the season and 320th appearance (314th start) of his career tonight vs. the Athletics.

- Acquired by Seattle from Colorado April 11, 2013 in exchange for AAA right-hander Steven Hensley.
- Originally selected by Texas in the 6th round of 1999 June Draft out of San Diego State University.
- Made MLB debut for Oakland 5/25/02, tossing 7.0 ShO IP for his first big league win in a 6-0 victory over Tampa Bay.
- Made 5 straight Opening Day starts for Reds (2006-10).
- Cincinnati's nominee for the Roberto Clemente Award in 2007 and 2009, the Branch Rickey Award in 2007 and the Marvin Miller Man of the Year Award from 2007-09.
- Established Dodger franchise record 4/13/12 at Dodger Stadium by striking out nine consecutive Padres hitters.
- Is 22-21, 4.43 ERA (159 ER, 322.2 IP) in 55G/54 GS in August.

LAST TIME OUT...ND in Mariners 4-5 loss at Tampa Bay Aug. 14...allowed an RBI single to James Loney in 4th...was lifted in the 6th after allowing a 2-run home run to Wil Myers, followed by singles from Loney and Yunel Escobar...overall allowed 3 runs on 7 hits while issuing 2 walks and striking out 5 in 5+ innings.

VS. THE AL WEST...Harang is 3-10 with a 5.15 ERA (58 ER, 101.1 IP) in 20 games (19 starts) in his career vs. the AL West, including going 1-4 with a 7.12 ERA (24 ER, 30.1 IP) in 6 starts this season...has 8 career quality starts vs. the West, including a 2-hit shutout on 6/11 vs. HOU.

<u>A LEADERSHIP POSITION</u>...Harang is one of only five AL pitchers (2 in NL) with at least 2 shutouts this season, joining Bartolo Colon (OAK - 3), Justin Masterson (CLE - 3), Chris Archer (TB - 2) and Jeremy Guthrie (KC - 2).

<u>GETTING THROUGH THE TOP OF THE ORDER...</u>Opponent's 1-3 hitters are batting .340 (54x159) with 11 doubles, 2 triples and 7 home runs off Harang this season...he has fared much better vs. batters 4-9 in the lineup, limiting them to a .236 (65x275) average.

K/BB...Harang has only walked 5.3 percent of batters he has faced this year (25/471), a career low, while striking out 16.3 percent of batters he has faced (77/471)...that combination has led to his highest K/BB ratio since 2009 (3.08 in 2013).

PIN POINT CONTROL...Harang has walked 0 batters in 7 of his 20 starts this season...he currently ranks 22nd amongst starters in the American League averaging 2.09 walks per 9.0 innings (25 BB, 107.2 IP)...Harang

did not allow a walk a season-high 21.1 innings (3rd inning on 6/1 at MIN-6/22)...longest stretch by a Mariners starter since Blake Beavan tossed 24.1 consecutive walkless innings, Sept. 4-27, 2011.

AUGUST: 3 GS. 0-1. 12.75

2 IS BETTER THAN 1...Harang tossed his 2nd shutout of the season on June 11 in Mariners 4-0 win over Houston (previous two-hitter was 8/29/07 at PIT)...matched a career low with 2 hits, while striking out 10 and walking 0...was his 15th career CG, 8th career shutout...1 of 5 AL pitchers to record at least 2 shutouts this season...has 2 shutouts in a single season for the 2nd time in his career (also: 2006 w/CIN).

WHAT A START...recorded his 14th career complete game and first since June 4, 2009 at STL w/CIN (9.0,3,0,0,0,9,HB) and his 7th career complete game shutout (last: 4/12/09 vs. PIT w/CIN) on May 27 vs. San Diego (9.0,4,0,0,2,8)...Harang became the 2nd Mariners starter to record a complete game this season (also: Joe Saunders, 4/29/13 vs. BAL)...he is also the first Mariners starter to recorded a complete game shutout since Felix Hernandez on Aug. 27, 2012 at MIN.

2013 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- Walked 25 batters, fewest among Mariners starters (min. 11 GS)...has 14 walks in last 7 starts, after walking only 11 in first 13 starts.
- Thrown 8 quality starts on the year and allowed 2 or fewer runs 8 times.
- Went 2-2 over 5-start stretch from May 1-June 1, posting a 3.52 ERA (12 ER, 30.2 IP) with 27 strikeouts.
- Over final 6 starts of the first half (since June 11), went 2-2 with a 3.79 ERA (16 ER, 38.0 IP), 6 walks and 22 strikeouts.
- Acquired on April 11 from Colorado in exchange for AAA RHP Steven Hensley.
- W #1 in Mariners 8-3 victory over BAL 5/1...tossed 5.0 ShO IP before allowing 2 runs in 6th...allowed just 4 H while striking out 5.

CAREER...Owns a career record of 110-114 with a 4.28 ERA in 319 games (313 GS)...earned his 100th career win on June 7, 2012 in Dodgers 8-3 win over Philadelphia at Citizen's Bank Park...from 2004-2012, ranked among the NL leaders in wins (95, T-5th) strikeouts (1,354, 2nd), innings (1,647.1, 2nd), starts (263, 1st) and complete games (13, T-8th).
