Michael Morse is batting .833 (5x6) with 2 doubles, 1 home run and 1 RBI vs. A's starter A.J. Griffin.

Hisashi lwakuma ranks 8th in the American League with a 2.95 ERA.

Seattle is now 3-50 when trailing after 7 innings after last night's comeback; trailed 4-0 after 1, and won 7-4.

Home runs hit by **Kyle Seager**, one short of becoming the first player since **Raul Ibañez** (2005-2008) to hit 20 HR in back-to-back seasons with the Mariners.

Today is the 16th of 19 games between the Mariners and Athletics this season. the Mariners lead the season series 9-6, and have won 6 of last 9 vs. the A's...are 3-0-1 in series vs. the A's this season... trail the all-time series 233-310, going 101-173 at Oakland Coliseum (5-4 this season)...have not posted a winning record in Oakland since 2009 (6-4).

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude a 3-team, 9-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game series vs. the Athletics (1-1)...took 2 of 3 from the Rangers over the weekend and opened the trip losing 2 of 3 at Tampa Bay...have an off day tomorrow before opening a 6-game homestand vs. Los Angeles Angels (3 games) and Texas Rangers (3 games) on Friday...the Mariners are 15-15 since the All-Star break and 23-20 since July 1...today's game will be televised on ROOT Sports in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & the Mariners Radio Network

ODDS AND ENDS...won yesterday and have gone 4-4 during current road trip...dropped 14 of last 23 games, and are 10-15 following season-high 8-game winning streak (July 12-23)...30-26 vs. the AL West, 12-17 vs. AL East, 9-14 vs. AL Central and 7-10 in Interleague play...are 31-32 at Safeco Field and 27-35 on the road (13-10 over last 23 road games).

- K/9.0 IP Mariners relievers lead the AL averaging 9.68 K/9.0 IP...Danny Farquhar (4th, 13.50), Oliver Perez (6th, 12.76) and Charlie Furbush (9th, 12.42) are among AL leaders.
- Early & Late Homers Mariners have hit 50 HR in 7th inning or later, most in MLB...also hit a MLBbest 24 home runs in the first inning this season (8 leadoff) and 6 home runs in extra innings.
- Shutouts Mariners rank 3rd in the AL with 11 shutouts this season (CLE 15, TB 13).
- Tough Trip On this 9-G road trip the Rays/Rangers/A's have a combined record of 216-159 (.576).
- Batting Around Batted around for the 4th time this season in the 8th inning on 8/20 at OAK...11 PA in the inning tied a season-high with 5/15 at NYY (1st inning).
- O-Town Michael Morse has hit safely in 7 of 8 games this season at O.co Coliseum, batting .400 (12x30) with 7 runs scored, 3 doubles, 4 home runs and 6 RBI.

VS. THE AL WEST...the Mariners have a winning record (30-26) vs. the American League West (7-5 vs. HOU, 9-6 vs. OAK, 7-6 vs. LAA, 7-9 vs. TEX)...have not posted a winning record within the division since going 31-26 in 2009...are 4-1-0 in last 5 road series vs. the AL West.

RUBBER MATCH...the Mariners will be playing thier 14th rubber-match today...Seattle is 7-6 in rubber matches this season, including winning 4 of 8 rubber matches on the road (1-1 on current road trip).

BOMBS AWAY...INF Nick Franklin hit his 11th home run of the season with a 2-run blast with 2-outs in the 3rd innings last night...his 11 home runs in first 68 career games is currently T3rd (along with Ken Griffey Jr. ) in club history...Franklin leads the American League rookie class in home runs and ranks T3rd amongst ML rookies...the Mariners are 7-2 in games when Franklin hits a home run, including winning 6 straight when he homers.

LET'S GO STREAKING...OF Michael Saunders has reached base safely in 9 of his last 11 plate appearances...he is batting .750 (6x8) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 1 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base during current 3-game hit streak... Saunders matched his career high with 3 walks last night (also: 5/9/13 at PIT and 5/28/13 vs. SD).

SPEED AND POWER...3B Kyle Seager enters today's game with 28 doubles and 19 home runs...19 different Mariners have put together seasons of at least 30 doubles and 20 homers, including Kyle last season (35 doubles, 20 homers in 2012)...the 19 players, including Kyle, have done it 44 different times...Kyle could become just the 11th Mariners player to have more than one such season...Edgar Martinez did it seven times, the most of any Seattle player.

NO MARGIN FOR ERROR...58 of the Mariners 125 games this season have been decided by 2 or fewer runs...own a 30-28 record in these games, going 17-21 in 1-run games and 13-7 in 2-run games...6 of the Mariners last 7 wins have been by 2 or fewer runs.

LORD FARQUHAR...new closer Danny Farquhar has earned the save in each of the Mariners last 8 wins, the first saves of his Major League career...since becoming the closer on Aug. 3, Farquhar is 8-for-9 in save opportunities...since July 21, Farquhar he has lowered his season ERA from 7.61 to 4.79, going 0-1 with 8 saves and a 1.02 ERA (2 ER, 17.2 IP) in 14 relief appearances...he has also retired 37 of his last 44 batters faced (6 H. IBB).

STREAKING AWAY...Kendrys Morales has hit safely in 11 of his last 15 games on the road with 8 multi-hit games...since July 21, Morales is batting .387 (24x62) with 5 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 9 RBI...overall he batting .281 (66x235) with 22 runs scored, 10 doubles, 9 home run and 33 RBI in 59 road games this season.

HOME RUN DERBY...the Mariners rank 4th in the Majors with 148 home runs (BAL-167, TOR-150, ATL - 149, SEA-148)...Seattle is the only team with 8 players with 10+ home runs...also lead the Majors in percent of runs scored via the home run...Seattle has scored 501 runs this season, including 233 via the homer; that's 46.5% of its runs via homers, tops in the Majors...the Mariners are just 1 home run short of matching the season total from last season (149).

YOUNG UP THE MIDDLE...Brad Miller (SS) and Nick Franklin (2B), both rookies, have made 36 starts together this season in the middle infield...marks the 2nd-most starts by a rookie 2B/SS combination in club history, and most since the club's inaugural season in 1977 (Jose Baez-2B, Craig Reynolds-SS; 54 games & Julio Cruz-2B, Craig Reynolds-SS; 35 games).

AS YOU KNOW?...the Mariners scored 5 runs in the top of the 8th inning to erase a 4-run deficit and come-from-behind to defeat Oakland 7-4 last night...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...it is the first time since May 1, 2009 the Mariners have overcome a deficit of at least 4 runs vs. the A's...Seattle trailied 6-1 in the bottom of the 3rd inning before winning 8-7...it also marks the first time since April 11, 2004 the Mariners defeated the A's at Oakland (trailing 4-0 in the top of the 6th and winning 9-4 in 11.0 innings.

- Pronounced: he-sash-ee ee-wah-ku-mah
- Making his 27th 2013 start and 57th career MLB appearance/43rd start today vs. the A's.
- 107-69, 3.25 ERA (557 ER, 1,541.0 IP) in 226 G/225 GS w/Kintetsu (2001-04) & Rakuten (2005-2011) in the Japan Lg.
- Pitched in the 2004 Athens Olympics as a member of the Japan national team (bronze medal)...also part of gold medal-winning Japan squad in the 2009 WBC.
- Named 2008 Pacific League MVP & winner of Eiji Sawamura Award (Cy Young equivalent) going 21-4, 1.87 ERA (42ER, 201.2 IP) in 28 GS.
- Signed by Seattle as a free agent Jan. 5, 2012.
- 1 of 5 Mariners pitchers born in Japan, but is only the 2nd to make a start...
  the only other Japan-born pitcher to make a start for the Mariners was Mac
  Suzuki (9 GS, last: 5/17/99 vs. MIN).
- Named to first career All-Star Team July 6 along with teammate Felix Hernandez, but did not pitch due to starting final Sunday of first half.

AL LEADERS...heading into today's start is among the AL leaders in: WHIP (2nd, 1.00), ERA (8th, 2.95/56 ER, 171.0 IP), strikeouts-to-walk ratio (5th, 4.71), walks/9.0 IP (4th, 1.63), opponent average (3rd, .221/140x634), games started (T1st, 26), innings pitched (6th, 171.0), home ERA (6th, 2.48), quality starts (T11th, 17) & strikeouts (9th, 146).

**LAST OUTING...**earned win #11 in his last start Aug. 16 at Texas (7.0,4,1,1,3,8), allowing 1 run in 7.0 innings...left the game with the Mariners trailing 1-0, but Kyle Seager delivered a 2-run home run in the top of the 8th inning en route to the 3-1 victory...tied season-high with 3 walks, but also struck out 8... snapped a 2-start losing streak.

7.0 INNINGS, 1 RUN...recorded his 5th start of the season in which he threw at least 7.0 innings and allowed 1 run or less in his last start vs. the Rangers...ranks 3rd on the team in such starts behind Felix Hernandez (11) and Joe Saunders (6).

<u>VS. THE WEST</u>...has made 13 of his 26 starts this season vs. the AL West, combining to go 7-4 with a 2.76 ERA (26 ER, 84.2 IP).

TURNING IT AROUND...after going 0-3, 6.83 ERA (22 ER, 29.0 IP) in 5 GS (6/16-7/9), Iwakuma is 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA (15 ER, 46.2 IP) over his last 7 starts (since 7/14)...during this stretch he has limited opponents to a .238 average (43x181), while walking 13 (1 IBB) and striking out 40...he has also allowed only 2 home runs in his past 7 starts, after allowing 10 in his previous 5 starts.

PIN POINT CONTROL...Iwakuma has walked 0 batters in 10 of his 26 starts this season, which tied for the Major League lead with Bartolo Colon (min. 3.0 IP in GS)...his 10 starts with 0 walks is currently T2ndmost in franchise history (Moyer, 11 in 2002)...opened the season with 18.0 consecutive innings pitched without allowing a walk.

STILL A GOOD STREAK...Iwakuma allowed an earned run in the bottom of the 4th inning on June 17, snapping his streak of not allowing an EARNED run at 31.2 innings...it is the 2nd-longest streak in Mariners history, ranking behind Mark Langston's 34.0 consecutive innings without an earned run in 1988...prior to his June 17 start, Kuma had not allowed an earned run since the 2nd inning of his start on May 26 vs. Rangers.

PRETTY GOOD NUMBERS...since moving into the starting rotation on July 2, 2012 vs. Baltimore, Iwakuma has gone 19-10 with a 2.84 ERA (84 ER, 266.0 IP) in 42 starts...he has averaged 6 1/3 innings per start and recorded 25 quality starts...Iwakuma's 2.84 ERA since his first MLB start ranks 6th-best in the American League.

27-year-old right-hander is scheduled make his 27th start of the season Friday vs. the Angels...recorded L#6 in his last start 8/17 at Texas (5.0,5,5,5,5,4)... is 1-2 with a 5.50 ERA (11 ER, 18.0 IP) over his last 3 starts...ranks 3rd in the AL with a 2.62 ERA, 1st with 178.2 innings pitched, T3rd in quality starts (19) and 3rd in strikeouts (182) & T7th in wins...tossed scoreless inning in the All-Star Game...went 6-0 with a 2.11 ERA (20 ER, 85.1 IP) in 12 starts, May 30-Aug. 1...W#2 (#100 of his career) 4/22 at HOU w/6.0 IP of ShO ball (5 H, 9 SO)...W#1 on Opening Night at OAK, tossing 7.2 shutout innings in a 2-0 SEA win (7.2,3,0,0,1,8)...CAREER: Is 110-82 with a 3.14 ERA in 264 career starts...110 career wins is 3rd on the Mariners all-time list, tops among RHP...ranks 1st in franchise history in ERA (min. 30 GS)...since 2009, is 71-46, 2.78 ERA (347 ER, 1132.2 IP) w/1076 SO in 160 starts...has 54 career starts 8.0 or more IP and 1 or fewer runs allowed...tossed the 23rd PERFECT GAME in MLB history on Aug. 15 vs. TB (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...vs. LAA: is 8-12 with a 3.97 ERA (100 ER, 226.2 IP) in 33 career starts vs. the Angels (2-0, 3.00 this season).
