A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 4-1 with two games remaining...are 0-1 in Baltimore and 1-3 in Oakland...it is their first season series loss to Baltimore since 1998...are 83-43 (.659) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 250-249 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 125-120 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 986-929 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

Coco Crisp recorded a careerhigh tying four hits last night (12th time)...also scored a season-high three runs, his 22nd career game of three or more runs.

Josh Donaldson is batting .304 (17 for 56) with nine runs scored, 11 RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 15 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1969 a doubleheader turns into a tripleheader as the A's need 18 innings to win the second game of the twinbill, 9-8...the doubleheader, which starts at 1:34, ends at 9:06 when Ted Kubiak's RBI single ends the 5 hour and 8 minute second game...in 2003 the A's set a franchise record and tie a major league record by hitting two grand slams in a 17-2 win at Toronto...Ramon Hernandez has a grand slam in the first and Miguel Tejada hits his sixth career slam in the sixth inning.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are on a three-game losing streak...it is their third three-game losing streak over the past 21 games (since July 30) and they are 8-13 over that span, which is the sixth worst record in the majors...prior to that, had not lost three straight since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five in a row...are 15-17 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...are in second place in the American League West for the 14th consecutive day and now trail Texas by 3½ games...those are the A's most games out of first since May 26 when they were 4½ out...currently have the second Wild Card spot, 2½ games behind Tampa Bay/Boston and two games ahead of third place Baltimore...have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 66 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors), 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in the majors), 19-9 from June 25 to July 29 (third best in the majors) and 1-6 from July 30 to August 7 (second worst in the majors)...are 7-7 since August 8 (tied for 11th best in the majors)...are 212-176 (.546) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is the 10th best record in the majors over that span.

PITCHING: The A's have a 4.92 ERA (29 er in 53.0 ip) and .240 (49 for 204) opponents batting average over the past six games...now have a 3.62 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have walked just 333 batters, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 425 batters...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.298) and the second lowest batting average (.242) and slugging percentage (.381)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 104 consecutive games, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 139-game streak from May 20, 1972-April 18, 1973...it is the second longest streak by an AL team since 1992 (Toronto, 136 from May 17, 2008-April 24, 2009)...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three or more runs in four of the past six games and are 1-2 with a 4.29 ERA (17 er in 35.2 ip) over that span...however, are 36-20 with a 3.33 ERA (197 er in 532.1 ip) over the last 85 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA over the first 42 contests...are 50-41 with a 3.88 ERA (333 er in 772.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (5), rank third in ERA and are fourth in wins...A's have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6)...the A's started a right-handed pitcher in 13 consecutive games from August 3-17, which was their longest such streak since July 21-Oct. 2, 1999 when they did it in 68 consecutive games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .266 (138 for 518) with 71 runs scored over the last 15 games (4.73 runs per game) after hitting .209 with 72 runs scored (3.13 per game) over the previous 23 contests...are batting .245 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...A's outfielders have combined for a Major League low .223 (331 for 1481) batting average...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...A's designated hitters are batting .211 (94 for 445), which is third lowest in the AL...it is currently second lowest in A's history (.203 in 1987)...have hit 23 home runs in the last 16 games after homering just twice over the previous seven contests...have 458 walks, which ranks third in the majors...have 18 sacrifice hits, which is third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 19 errors in the last 21 games, which has led to 14 unearned runs...made 61 errors over the first 106 games leading to 23 unearned runs...have turned 91 double plays, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (Cincinnati)...rank last in the majors in assists (1090).

CLOSE CALLS: Four of the A's last 10 games have been decided by one run and they are 2-2 in those contests...are 23-16 (.579) in one-run games for the season...rank third in the American League in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 7-5 (.583) in extra inning games...have seven "walk-off" wins...are 15-9 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the Major League lead with 13 wins when trailing after six innings (Pittsburgh)...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .139 (15 for 108), which is the lowest mark in the American League...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in strikeouts (33), rank second in plate appearances (126), home runs (4) and walks (16) and are tied for second in RBI (13)...the 16 walks are the most by an A's team since 2000 (21), the 124 plate appearances are the most since 2001 (128) and the home runs are the most since 2002 (5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game road trip to Baltimore (0-1) and Detroit (four games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (3-1) and are 32-31 (.508) on the road...went 4-5 on their last homestand against Houston (1-2), Cleveland (2-1) and Seattle (1-2)...are 39-25 (.609) in Oakland for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the American League...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 29 of 42 (July 25-Sept. 8) games at home...have a 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games), Texas (three games) and Houston (four games) beginning Aug. 30.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-11 in the month of August...went 15-10 in July and have posted a winning record in eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 19-22 against the West since May 10 while going 34-16 against everyone else...have used the disabled list 12 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...have used 40 players...have not used fewer than 48 players in a season since 2006 when they used 40...have used 17 pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (17)...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is currently second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season...the A's are 13-12 (.520) in his starting assignments this year and 30-24 (.556) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 18 of his 25 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 13 times and walked two batters or fewer 18 times

seven-game winning streak: Is 7-0 with a 2.59 ERA (29 er in 100.2 ip) and .204 (73 for 358) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 4, Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012) and the second longest active streak in the American League...it is one short of the A's season high of eight (Colón, May 20-June 28)...the 15-start unbeaten streak is tied for third longest in Oakland history...it is the longest since Dan Haren had a 16-start streak from April 13-July 1, 2007...the record is 17 by Catfish Hunter from June 2-September 3, 1973...his 2.59 ERA during the streak is fourth lowest in the AL over that span (since May 28)...went 2-6 with a 5.76 ERA and .294 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts...has held left-handed hitters to a .216 (45 for 209) batting average during

his winning streak after allowing a .325 mark over his first 10 starts.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game in his last start, the 55th of his career...it was his 54th start as an Athletic and the 53 consecutive starts without a complete game is the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...was the first A's pitcher to go the distance in a walk-off win since Mark Mulder on July 28, 2004, also against Seattle.

MONTHLY HIGHLIGHTS: Is 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA (7 er in 29.1 ip) over his first four starts in the month of August...has never won four games in one month...went 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of June...had the lowest opponents batting average in the American League in June and ranked third in ERA...was 1-4 with a 7.36 ERA and .350 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...the losses matched the most in Oakland history by a pitcher in the month of April (12th time)...the ERA was the fifth highest April ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of the 16 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision...is 2-6 with two runs of support or fewer and 7-0 with three runs or more...is now 18-0 in 26 career starts with run support of three or more...is 21-2 with run support of two or more.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks 10th in the American League with a .238 opponents batting average...is sixth with a .210 (25 for 119) average with runners in scoring position and seventh with a .216 (54 for 250) mark against right-handed hitters...the opponents cleanup hitter is batting .186 (13 for 70), which is fifth lowest in the AL...is fourth in fewest pitches per inning (15.0) and ninth in fewest pitches per game (93.3).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 6-3 with a 4.40 ERA (38 er in 77.2 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest and 3-3 with a 3.02 ERA (26 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 18 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...12 of the 18 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for eighth in the AL...12 have been solo shots.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed 17 runs in the first inning for a 6.12 ERA (25.0 ip)...has a 3.25 ERA (47 er in 130.1 ip) from the second inning on...opponents are batting .304 (31 for 102) with six home runs in the first inning compared to .223 (105 for 470) with 12 home runs from the second inning on.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors in his last eight starts after going errorless over his first 17 starts this year...his fourth errors are tied for the most in the majors among pitchers (Lincecum, SF).

SIX HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed eight hits in each of his last two starts, snapping a streak of 16 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer...tossed at least 3.0 innings in each start and his streak of 16 consecutive starts of three or more innings and six hits or fewer is second longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1916 (20, Trevor Cahill, May 5-Aug. 14, 2010)...allowed a .192 opponents batting average during the

INDECISIVE: Had a streak of six consecutive no decisions from June 23 to July 28, which matched the longest by an Athletics starter since at least 1916...the other are Mike Norris (June 1-Aug. 6, 1983), Rick Langford (July 17, 1983-June 25, 1985) and Carlos Reyes (June 10-July 17, 1994)...had a 3.50 ERA and .191 opponents batting average during the streak...the A's lost five of the six games...left with the lead in two of the no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (July 6 and 23).

LAST START: He tossed his first career complete game, an eight-hitter in the A's 2-1 win over Seattle last Monday in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...shutout the Mariners on three hits over the first six innings and had a 1-0 lead entering the seventh...allowed his only run on a Morales RBI single in the seventh...Moss homered with one out in the bottom of the ninth for the win

PARKER vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-1 with a 7.27 ERA (17.1 ip, 23 h, 14 r, 14 er, 5 bb, 18 so, 4 hr) in three career starts...the loss came in his only start this year, a 10-2 A's loss on April 25 in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the second inning to take a 2-0 lead but he allowed three runs in the third inning on RBI singles by McLouth and Markakis and a RBI double by Jones...also allowed a sacrifice fly to Markakis in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Davis in the sixth...left with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Resop allowed one of those runs to score...made two starts last year...the no decision came in a 14-9 A's win at Baltimore July 27...left after five innings with an 8-6 lead but the bullpen allowed three runs in the eighth inning...the win came in a 5-2 decision at Oakland September 15...allowed single runs in the second and third innings on a Reynolds RBI double and a McLouth solo home run.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (1-1, 1.44 ERA): Is scheduled to make the sixth appearance and fourth start of his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento August 10 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-1 with a 1.71 ERA (4 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts since his return...has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts...joins A.J. Griffin (June 24-July 4, 2012) as the only Athletics pitchers since 1916 to toss six or more innings and allow four hits or fewer in each of their first three career starts...the last Major Leaguer to begin his career with four consecutive such starts is Wayne Simpson (April 9-24,1970)...has not faced Baltimore in his career.

The A's bullpen has a 4.28 ERA (19 er in 40.0 ip) and .248 (39 for 157) opponents batting average over its past 13 games (since August 9) after posting a 1.78 ERA and .175 opponents average in its previous 19 contests...now has a 3.08 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the fewest walks (115) in the AL and third fewest strikeouts (326)...has allowed the fewest home runs (27)...ranks first in opponents slugging percentage (.344), second in on-base percentage (.292) and third in batting average (.229)...first batters faced are 69 for 320 (.216) with 20 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .264 on-base percentage)...has allowed the fewest first batter walks in the AL and has the second owest on-base percentage.

- Has not allowed a run in 17 of his past 19 games (3 er in 18.0 ip, 1.50 ERA) and is 13 of 14 in save opportunities over that span
- Ranks second in the American League in save percentage (96.9%), is sixth in saves (31) and eighth among AL relievers in ERA (1.84)...his 31 saves are the most by an A's pitcher since 2006 (Huston Street, 37).
- Now has 57 career saves with the A's, which ranks eighth in Oakland history...is four away from tying Jay Howell (61) for seventh place.
- Has recorded 499 career strikeouts and is one away from the 500th of his career.
- His opponents have a .192 batting average, which includes .170 (15 for 88) against left-handed hitters and .213 (19 for 89) against righties.
- Has a 1.14 ERA (4 er in 31.2 ip) in 33 games at night compared to 3.12 (6 er in 17.1 ip) in 18 day games.
- Is 2-1 with five saves, two blown saves and a 3.27 ERA in 32 games in his career against the Orioles (33.0 ip, 20 h, 12 r, 12 er, 15 bb, 32 so, 1
- Had two stints as the A's closer in 2012 and saved a team-leading 24 games in a team-high 75 appearances while posting a 2.53 ERA...was charged with just two blown saves and his save percentage of 92.3 ranked fourth in the American League...was 10th in saves.
