A's vs. ORIOLES

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 4-2 with one game remaining...are 1-1 in Baltimore and 1-3 in Oakland...it is their first season series loss to Baltimore since 1998...are 84-43 (.661) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 251-249 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 126-120 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 987-929 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has allowed just one run over his past 10 games (10.0 ip, 0.90 ERA) and his opponents are batting .121 (4 for 33) over that span.

Coco Crisp has homered in each of the past three games, the third time in his career he has homered in three or more consecutive games...his career-high is four straight (April 9-13, 2013).

Josh Donaldson is batting .283 (17 for 60) with nine runs scored, 11 RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 16 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1986 Mark McGwire hits his first major league home run, a two-run shot in the fifth inning off Walt Terrell in the A's 8-4 win at Detroit...in 2006 Barry Zito takes a no-hitter into the eighth inning and wins the 100th game of his career in the A's 9-3 win at Texas.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday...it was their third three-game losing streak over the past 22 games (since July 30) and they are 9-13 over that span, which is fifth worst in the American League...prior to that, had not lost three straight since May 6-10 when they lost a season-high five in a row...are 16-17 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...are in second place in the American League West for the 15th consecutive day and trail Texas by 2½ games...currently have the second Wild Card spot, 2½ games behind Tampa Bay/Boston and 2½ games ahead of third place Cleveland...have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 67 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...went 12-4 over the first 16 games this year (second best record in the majors through April 18), 6-15 from April 19 to May 10 (tied for the worst in the majors), 20-6 from May 11 to June 7 (best in the majors), 6-9 from June 8 to 24 (tied for second worst in the majors), 19-9 from June 25 to July 29 (third best in the majors) and 1-6 from July 30 to August 7 (second worst in the majors)...are 8-7 since August 8 (tied for ninth best in the majors)...are 213-176 (.548) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is the 10th best record in the majors over that span.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.60 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have walked just 336 batters, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 425 batters...the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season is 415 in 1976...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.297) and the second lowest batting average (.241) and slugging percentage (.381)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...have allowed fewer than 10 runs in 105 consecutive games, which is the third longest streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 139-game streak from May 20, 1972-April 18, 1973...it is the second longest streak by an AL team since 1992 (Toronto, 136 from May 17, 2008-April 24, 2009)...have not allowed 10 runs in a game since April 25 against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 37-20 with a 3.30 ERA (198 er in 540.1 ip) over the last 86 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA over the first 42 contests...are 51-41 with a 3.85 ERA (334 er in 780.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), are tied for second in complete games (5), rank third in ERA, fourth in wins and fifth in innings pitched...A's have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6)...the A's started a right-handed pitcher in 13 consecutive games from August 3-17, which was their longest such streak since July 21-Oct. 2, 1999 when they did it in 68 consecutive games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .259 (142 for 548) with 73 runs scored over the last 16 games (4.56 runs per game) after hitting .209 with 72 runs scored (3.13 per game) over the previous 23 contests...are batting .244 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...A's outfielders have combined for a Major League low .222 (331 for 1490) batting average...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...A's designated hitters are batting .212 (95 for 449), which is tied for third lowest in the AL...it is currently second lowest in A's history (.203 in 1987)...have hit 24 home runs in the last 17 games after homering just twice over the previous seven contests...have 460 walks, which ranks third in the majors...have 18 sacrifice hits, which is third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 19 errors in the last 22 games, which has led to 14 unearned runs...made 61 errors over the first 106 games leading to 23 unearned runs...have turned 91 double plays, which is the fewest in the majors...rank last in the majors in assists (1098).

CLOSE CALLS: Five of the A's last 11 games have been decided by one run and they are 3-2 in those contests...are 24-16 (.600) in one-run games for the season...are tied for the American League lead in one-run wins and have the fourth best record...are 7-5 (.583) in extra inning games...have seven "walk-off" wins...are 16-9 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the Major League lead with 13 wins when trailing after six innings (Pittsburgh)...have won three games where they have overcome a five-run deficit, marking the first time the A's have done that three times in a season since 2002.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .139 (15 for 108), which is the lowest mark in the American League...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in strikeouts (33), rank second in plate appearances (126), home runs (4) and walks (16) and are tied for second in RBI (13)...the 16 walks are the most by an A's team since 2000 (21), the 124 plate appearances are the most since 2001 (128) and the home runs are the most since 2002 (5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game road trip to Baltimore (1-1) and Detroit (four games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (3-1) and are 33-31 (.516) on the road...went 4-5 on their last homestand against Houston (1-2), Cleveland (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 39-25 (.609) in Oakland for the season, which is the fourth best home record in the American League...are in the middle of a stretch where they will play 29 of 42 (July 25-Sept. 8) games at home...have a 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games), Texas (three games) and Houston (four games) beginning Aug. 30.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-11 in the month of August...went 15-10 in July and have posted a winning record in eight consecutive months dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...began the season by going 13-3 against American League West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 19-22 against the West since May 10 while going 35-16 against everyone else...have used the disabled list 12 times this year...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8)...have used 41 players...have not used fewer than 48 players in a season since 2006 when they used 40...have used 17 pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (17)...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is currently second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

Sacramento August 10 for his second stint with the A's this year...is 1-1 with a 1.71 ERA (4 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts since his return...made his Major League debut during his first stint from July 10 to 18 and did not allow a run in two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts with Triple-A Sacramento...including 2-1 with a 6.19 ERA in three starts following his July 19 option.

FOUR HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts...joins A.J. Griffin (June 24-July 4, 2012) as the only Athletics pitchers since 1916 to toss six or more innings and allow four hits or fewer in each of their first three career starts...the last Major Leaguer to begin his career with four consecutive such starts is Wayne Simpson (April 9-24,1970).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .136 opponents batting average over his first five appearances...opponents are 9 for 53 (.170) with the bases empty compared to 3 for 35 (.086) with runners on base...has yielded a .080 (2 for 25) batting average with two outs...has a .111 (4 for 36) average the first

IN RELIEF: Made his Major League debut July 10 in a relief appearance at Pittsburgh...entered the game in the fifth inning and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings...struck out Barmes and Liriano and got Marte to fly to right for a perfect fifth inning...allowed a leadoff single to Tabata in the sixth and then retired the next three batters he faced as he struck out McCutchen, got Martin to foul out to the catcher and Alvarez to fly to right...also tossed 2.0 shutout innings in a relief appearance July 19 at Los Angeles...entered the game in relief of Griffin to start the sixth inning...got Kendrick to ground out, struck out Trumbo and walked Callaspo before retiring lannetta to end the inning...tossed a perfect seventh and then allowed a leadoff single to Pujols in the eighth before he was replaced by Blevins.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his first Major League start, a 5-4 A's loss at Toronto August 10...allowed a two-run home run to Bautista in the first inning, but the A's came back to tie the game with two in the second...then allowed a run to score in the bottom of the second on a fielder choice and another in the third on a Rasmus RBI single...left after six innings with the A's trailing 4-3.

SECOND START: He combined with Otero on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Houston August 15 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed four hits while striking out nine...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings in one of the first four games of his career...the other three all had complete game shutouts, most recently John Henry Johnson in his third game on April 23, 1978 against Seattle...allowed only two base runners as far as second base...Corporan singled to start the seventh and went to second on a wild pitch and Villar doubled with one out in the eighth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss to Seattle last Tuesday in Oakland...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a two-run home run to Franklin in the third...then retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced and was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth...he allowed four straight hits for the blown save as the Mariners scored five times in the eighth inning.

GRAY vs. BALTIMORE: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 6-4 with a 2.69 ERA and .245 opponents batting average over his first 12 starts through June 6...then went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA and .280 opponents average over his final eight starts...the River Cats were 12-8 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times

AMONG THE LEADERS: At the time of his promotion to Oakland on August 10, he ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (118), tied for second in wins (10), tied for fourth in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (3.42), eighth in innings pitched (118.1) and tied for eighth in games started (20).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batted .259, which included a .244 (53 for 217) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (64 for 234) against right-handers...issued 26 of his 39 walks

BY INNING: Had a 4.74 ERA (30 er in 57.0 ip) over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 (9 er in 52.2 ip) from innings four through six and 6.23 (6 er in 8.2 ip) from the seventh inning on.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 17-17 with a 3.67 ERA in 53 games, all starts, over three professional seasons...has allowed just 13 home runs in 292.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...was rated as the A's third-best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2011 season and was ranked fifth after 2012...was the A's first round pick (18th selection overall) in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft...is the first A's draft pick from 2011 to reach the majors.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (10-9, 3.84 ERA): Is scheduled to make his team-leading 27th start of the season...is 4-3 with a 3.62 ERA (18 er in 48.2 ip), .218 (46 for 211) opponents batting average and 14 home runs allowed over his last nine starts...went 6-6 with a 3.95 ERA, .236 opponents batting average and 16 home runs allowed over his first 17 starts...has walked 15 batters in 16.2 innings over his last three starts after walking 10 batters in 58.0 innings over his previous nine starts...has allowed 30 home runs, which is the most in the majors...it is the most by an A's pitcher since Dan Haren allowed 31 in 2006...was charged with the loss in his only career start against the Tigers, a 12-2 A's loss on September 18, 2012 in Detroit...allowed five runs on eight hits in 4.2 innings and yielded home runs to Cabrera, Fielder and Peralta.

The A's bullpen has a 4.17 ERA (19 er in 41.0 ip) and .244 (39 for 160) opponents batting average over its past 14 games (since August 9) after posting a 1.78 ERA and .175 opponents average in its previous 19 contests...now has a 3.07 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...has the fewest walks (115) in the AL and third fewest strikeouts (328)...has allowed the fewest home runs (27)...ranks first in opponents slugging percentage (.343), second in on-base percentage (.291) and is tied for third in batting average (.229)...first batters faced are 69 for 321 (.215) with 20 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .263 on-base percentage)...has allowed the fewest first batter walks in the AL and has the second lowest on-base percentage.

- Is tied for third among AL relievers in wins (5)...the five wins match his career high (also 2012).
- His opponents have a .218 batting average...that includes .180 (18 for 100) against right-handers compared to .266 (21 for 79) against lefties.
- Has three wins in 11 career outings against Baltimore (12.0 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 16 so, 1 hr, 2.25 ERA).
