A's vs. TIGERS

The A's have won the season series as they lead 4-2 with one game remaining...have won the first three games in Detroit after losing two of three in Oakland in April...over the previous seven years, the A's have now won three season series, lost two and split two...are 31-26 against Detroit since 2007...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 243-234 against the Tigers...that includes 135-105 in Oakland, 106-127 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 30-21 (.588) at Comerica Park during the regular season, which is the **best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark** (Angels, .550)...all-time, the A's are 911-987 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Grant Balfour has allowed just one earned run over his past 11 games (11.0 ip, 0.82 ERA) and his opponents are batting .158 (6 for 38) over that span...has a 1.76 ERA for the season, which ranks eighth among AL relievers.

Jed Lowrie has hit safely in each of his last 10 games, which is the longest hitting streak of his career...is 16 for 41 (.390) with six multiple hit games during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1989** the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York...Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game...in **1998** the A's set an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 11-6 win at Cleveland...Ben Grieve ties the Oakland record with three doubles and Scott Spiezio adds two.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing four of the previous five games...have lost six of the last nine series...are 19-18 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...went 20-22 over the first 42 games and trailed Texas by 7½ games on May 16...then went a Major League best 43-21 from May 17 to July 29 to gain 13½ games in the standings and take a six-game lead in the American League West...are 12-14 since July 30 and have lost 8½ games in the West to fall 2½ games behind the Rangers...are in second place in the West for the 19th consecutive day...currently have the second Wild Card spot, ½ game behind Tampa Bay and four games ahead of third place Cleveland...have spent 57 days in sole possession of first, nine days tied for first, 72 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 216-177 (.550) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is the 10th best record in the majors over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high tying 14 runs (also: August 9 at Toronto) last night on a season-high 21 hits (previous: 19, June 3 at Milwaukee)...the 21 hits were the A's most in a game since July 28, 2009 when they also had 21 hits at Boston...are now batting .274 (188 for 685) with 104 runs scored over the last 20 games (5.20 runs per game) after hitting .209 with 72 runs scored (3.13 per game) over the previous 23 contests...are batting .247 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...A's outfielders have combined for a Major League low .225 (345 for 1536) batting average...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...A's designated hitters are batting .221 (102 for 462), which is currently third lowest in A's history...have homered in 10 straight games (16 home runs total) and have 31 home runs in August, which ranks third in the AL...rank second in the majors with 476 walks...have 18 sacrifice hits, which is tied for the fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: Tommy Milone won his 10th game of the season Tuesday night, giving the A's four 10-game winners (Colón, Griffin, Parker) for the first time since 2006 (Blanton, Haren, Loaiza, Zito)...the four 10-game winners are second most in the majors (Detroit, 5)...the A's have compiled a 5.73 ERA (42 er in 660.0 ip) over the last eight games...have surrendered 13 home runs and walked 32 batters over that span...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.300) and fewest walks (347) in the American League, the second lowest batting average (.243), are tied for the third lowest slugging percentage (.385) and have the fourth lowest ERA (3.66)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .300 was in 1972 (.284)...allowed a season-high tying 10 runs Sunday at Baltimore, snapping a 105-game streak in which they allowed fewer than 10 runs...that was the third longest streak in Oakland history and it was the longest since a 139-game streak from May 20, 1972-April 18, 1973...it was the second longest streak by an AL team since 1989 (Toronto, 136 from May 17, 2008-April 24, 2009)...prior to Sunday, the last time the A's allowed 10 runs in a game was April 25, also against Baltimore.

STARTING PITCHING: Tommy Milone tossed the A's sixth complete game of the season Tuesday night, which is second most in the American League...A's starters lead the AL with four complete game shutouts, are tied for third with 54 wins and tied for fourth with a 3.90 ERA (347 er in 800.0 ip)...are 40-21 with a 3.39 ERA (211 er in 559.2 ip) over the last 90 games (since May 17) after going 14-21 with a 5.09 ERA over the first 42 contests...have allowed 105 home runs, which is the most by A's starters since 2009 (114)...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 21 errors in the last 26 games, which has led to 16 unearned runs...made 61 errors over the first 106 games leading to 23 unearned runs...have just 95 double plays, which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...rank last in the majors in assists (1131).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are batting .143 (16 for 112), which is second lowest in the American League (Baltimore, .138)...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in strikeouts (35), rank second in plate appearances (130), home runs (4) and walks (16) and are tied for third in RBI (13)...the 16 walks are the most by an A's team since 2000 (21), the 130 plate appearances are also the most since 2000 (162) and the four home runs are the most since 2002 (5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this seven-game road trip to Baltimore (1-2) and Detroit (3-0)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Cincinnati (0-2) and Toronto (3-1) and are 36-32 (.529) on the road, which is the fourth best mark in the American League...went 4-5 on their last homestand against Houston (1-2), Cleveland (2-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 39-25 (.609) in Oakland, which is the fourth best home record in the AL...return home following the game today for a 10-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games), Texas (three games) and Houston (four games)...that will conclude a stretch where the A's play 29 of 42 games at home (July 25-Sept. 8).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 24-16 (.600) in one-run games...are tied for the American League lead in one-run wins and are tied for the third best record...are 7-5 (.583) in extra inning games, which is the fourth best record in the AL...have seven "walk-off" wins...are 16-9 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the Major League lead with 13 wins when trailing after six innings (Pittsburgh).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Josh Reddick on the disabled list Monday and have now used the DL four times in the last 36 days after a 77-day streak without placing a player on the DL...the 77-day streak is the second longest by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...currently have five players on the DL and have used it 13 times for the season...have not used the DL fewer than 15 times since 2005 (8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 12-12 in the month of August with three games remaining...need to win two of those games to keep their streak of consecutive months with a winning record alive...the streak is currently eight dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...are 47-6 when outperforming the opposition, which is the best mark in the majors...began the season by going 13-3 against AL West competition compared to 5-15 against all other teams through May 9...are 19-22 against the West since May 10 while going 38-17 against everyone else...are 14-7 on Sundays, which is tied with Tampa Bay and Atlanta for the best mark in the majors.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 25th start of the season and the 400th of his career...will become the 126th pitcher in Major League history to make 400 starts (source: Stats, Inc.)...the A's are 17-7 (.708) in his starting assignments this year and 31-17 (.646) over the last two years...his teams are 228-171 (.571) in his career...has tossed seven or more innings in 12 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 21 times.

THE DISABLED LIST: Was placed on the 15-day disabled list August 18 retroactive to August 14 with a strained left groin...it was his 11th career stint on the DL...was reinstated today.

RECENTLY: Has tossed four innings or fewer in each of his last two starts and is 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA (10 er in 6.2 ip) and .438 (14 for 32) opponents batting average over that span...however, is 11-2 with a 2.27 ERA (27 er in 107.0 ip) in 16 starts since May 20 and has allowed just four home runs in 107.0 innings...the ERA is the second lowest in the American League over that span among pitchers with 91.0 or more innings pitched (Scherzer, DET 2.18)...is tied for second in wins (Scherzer, DET 14)...went 3-2 with a 4.56 ERA and seven home runs in 47.1 innings over his first eight starts.

14-GAME WINNER: Is tied for second in the American League with 14 wins...the wins surpass Parker and Milone's team-leading total of 13 from a year ago and are his most wins since 2005 when he went 21-8 for the Angels and won the Cy Young Award...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he needs one more win to become the first pitcher in AL history with 15 wins with four different teams (Indians, White Sox, Angels).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the American League in ERA (2.97)...has logged an ERA under 3.00 just once in his career (2.93 in 2002)...is also tied for the AL lead in shutouts (3), ranks second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.46), tied for second in complete games (3), fourth in winning percentage (.737), sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.64) and seventh in opponents grounded into double plays (19)...is averaging the third fewest pitches per inning (14.4) and sixth fewest pitches per game (92.8)...has the ninth highest run support (6.01).

AS A 40-YEAR OLD: His 14 wins are an Oakland record for a 40-year old...the previous mark was 13 by Don Sutton (1985)...the only Athletic with more wins is Jack Quinn (18 in 1928, 15 in 1927)...the last Major League 40-year old with at least 14 wins is Jamie Moyer in 2008 (16)...has tied Tom Candiotti's Oakland record of three complete games set in 1998...is the first Athletics 40-year old with three shutouts since Jack Quinn had four for the 1928 Philadelphia A's...the last Major Leaguer with three shutouts is Dennis Martínez in 1994...currently has a 2.97 ERA...since 1953, the only American League 40-year old with an ERA under 3.00 is Nolan Ryan of the 1991 Texas Rangers (2.91)...won each of his first seven starts after turning 40 on May 24...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher in Major League history to win at least each of his first six starts in his forties...ages are based on a players age as of June 30th.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 9-2 with a 2.56 ERA (25 er in 88.0 ip) in 13 starts at night compared to 5-3 with a 3.53 ERA (26 er in 66.1 ip) in 11 starts during the day...his first night loss came on July 3 against Chicago (NL), snapping an 11-game winning streak in night games dating back to July 28 of last year...in two seasons with the A's, he is 18-7 with a 2.73 ERA (58 er in 191.1 ip) in 29 starts at night compared to 6-7 with a 3.98 ERA (51 er in 115.1 ip) in 19 starts during the day.

STREAK SNAPPED: Allowed five runs in 2.2 innings August 7 at Cincinnati, snapping his streak of 15 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...the streak was the longest by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1916, topping the previous high of 14 by Dan Haren from April 18-June 26, 2007...over the last 30 years, the only American League pitcher with a longer streak is Johan Santana (21, June 9-Sept. 24, 2004)...Colón was 11-1 with a 1.69 ERA and .248 opponents batting average during the streak...surrendered just four home runs and issued 20 walks in 106.1 innings.

ACTIVE LEADERS: Ranks third among active pitchers in complete games (35), tied for fourth in shutouts (12), fifth in wins (185), sixth in games started (399), seventh in strikeouts (1916) and eighth in innings pitched (2547.2).

DOMINICAN LEADERS: His 185 wins are third most among Dominican-born pitchers behind Juan Marichal (243) and Pedro Martínez (219)...also ranks third among Dominicans in games started (399), innings pitched (2547.2) and strikeouts (1916).

THIS AND THAT: Has a 4.09 ERA (43 er in 94.2 ip) and has yielded 10 home runs over the first four innings of a game...has a 1.21 ERA (8 er in 59.2 ip) and has surrendered just one home run from the fifth inning on...has allowed nine of his 11 home runs to a left-handed hitter...has yielded 48 of his 62 home runs over his last four seasons to lefties...is 8-2 following an A's loss...made his 400th career appearance July 14 against Boston...was named to the American League All-Star team for the third time in his career (1998, 2005).

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Houston in Oakland on August 13...allowed a two-run double to Barnes in the second, a Castro sacrifice fly and a Carter RBI double in the third and one more run in the fourth on a grounded into double play...was relieved by Chavez to start the fifth inning with the A's trailing 5-0.

COLÓN vs. DETROIT: Is 8-10 with a 5.52 ERA (151.2 ip, 193 h, 99 r, 93 er, 49 bb, 138 so, 22 hr) in 26 career appearances, including 25 starts...is 0-7 with a 7.29 ERA (57 er in 70.1 ip) over his last 13 games, 12 starts...has not defeated the Tigers since April 13, 2003...is 4-5 with a 5.50 ERA (46 er in 75.1 ip) in 13 games, 12 starts, in his home ballparks, 4-4 with a 5.76 ERA (45 er in 70.1 ip) in 12 starts at Comerica Park and 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA in one start at Tiger Stadium...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 4-3 A's win in 12 innings in Oakland on April 12...allowed all three of his runs in the third inning on a three-run home run by Fielder...the A's came back with single runs in the third, sixth and seventh to get him off the hook...allowed eight hits, all to the top four hitters in the order...the bottom five were 0 for 15.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jarrod Parker (10-6, 3.58 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 27th start of the season...is 8-0 with a 2.48 ERA (30 er in 108.2 ip) and .202 (78 for 386) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 4, Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012), matches the A's season high (Colón, May 20-June 28) and is tied for third longest in the American League for the season...has tossed at least eight innings in each of his last three starts and is 2-0 with a 1.07 ERA (3 er in 25.1 ip) over that span...is 0-2 with a 3.44 ERA (18.1 ip, 21 h, 7 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against Tampa Bay.
