RAY MATTER—Yesterday the Rays opened this 10-day West Coast road trip losing 4-3, their 3rd one-run loss in the last 6 days...the Rays have lost 2 in a row and 5 of their last 6 games while scoring 15 runs and batting .218 (42-for-193) including .208 (11-for-53) with runners in scoring position...they have hit only one HR dring that span...over those last 6 games, the Rays have fallen out of a first-place tie with Boston in the AL East to 3.5 games behind the Red Sox, their biggest deficit since end of play Aug 13 (4.0 GB)... last night the Rays also fell behind Oakland for the top AL Wild Card spot...the Rays have spent 28 of the last 31 days in second place in the AL East and 55 straight days in either first or second place.

- + The Rays are 1-3 since starting a stretch of 13 straight games vs. AL West teams (3 vs. LAA, 3 at OAK, 4 at LAA, 3 at SEA)...Rays are 12-8 (.600) vs. AL West clubs this season.
- + The Rays are playing 37 games in 38 days to finish the regular season (3-5 so far)...their only remaining off-day is Sep 9.
- While the Rays are 9-13 since Aug 4, they are 61-40 since May 8, best record in the AL.
- Of the Rays last 29 games, 18 are on the road and 16 are against teams currently within 5.0 games of a postseason berth.

ROSTER MOVES COMING—OF Delmon Young, RH Josh Lueke and C Chris Gimenez will travel to Oakland today and be added to the taxi squad, and will be added to the roster tomorrow when rosters can expand...DH Luke Scott, on the disabled list since Aug 18 with back spasms, will be evaluated today and could also be activated tomorrow.

- + Young, 27, was released by the Phillies on Aug 14 and last played in a major league game on Aug 8...he was signed to a minor league contract by the Rays on Aug 22 and has played in 7 games with Double-A Montgomery batting .233 (7-for-30) with 1 HR and 3 RBI... he homered last night in the Biscuits 6-2 win over Birmingham...Delmon was the first overall pick in the 2003 June Draft by Tampa Bay... he played 2 seasons for the Devil Rays (2006-07)...his last game with the Rays was Sep 30, 2007 and his last HR was Sep 23, 2007 off BOS Tim Wakefield.
- Lueke has had 3 tours with the Rays this season and appeared in 14 games (0-2, 4.91)...in 40 apps at Triple-A Durham he is 3-1 with 17 saves and a 0.63 ERA (57.1-IP, 4-ER).
- Gimenez has been at Durham all season and has batted .224 with 3 HR and 22 RBI in 94 games.
- Scott has appeared in 3 games on a rehab assignment at Durham this week and was 4-for-12 with no extra-base hits or RBI.

A.L.'S BEST - Since July 28, 2012, the A's (116-81, .589) and Rays (114-81) are the AL's two best teams.

ROAD RAYS - The Rays play 12 of their next 15 games on the road...between May 5 and July 29, the Rays had the best road record in the majors at 24-12, but they have lost 7 of 9 road games since...since 2010, the Rays have the majors' best road record at 166-140 (.542).

FIRST LOSING AUGUST SINCE 2006—After going 21-5 in July, the best month in club history, the Rays are 11-14 in August...last night's loss gauranteed them their first losing August since 2006, Manager Joe Maddon's first year as skipper of the Rays when they went 9-19...Rays have scored just 88 runs this month (3.5 R/G)...it will be their fewest runs scored in the month of August in club history...current low is 106 in 2006...the last time they failed to score 100 runs in a month was July 2009.

PRICE CHECK ON NUMBER 9—LH David Price allowed a 3-run home run to Kurt Suzuki last night...it was the 3rd time this season he has allowed a home run to the No. 9 hitter...prior to this season, he had allowed only 2 home runs to the 9th spot in the lineup in his career.

WEST COAST RARITY - This is the Rays 46th trip to the West Coast all time, but only the 2nd in which they have stopped in all three AL cities: Oak-

land, Anaheim and Seattle...in 2010 (May 4-12), the Rays visited all three and went 6-3...while the Rays are a combined 178-241 (.425) in these 3 ports all-time, they are 26-18 (.591) since 2010...this season they are 0-6 in the Pacific time zone (0-3 at LAD, 0-2 at ARI and 0-1 here).

RAYS vs. A'S—Rays lead the season series, 3 games to 1...they have outscored the A's 20-8, and held them to a .190 (24-for-126) average...Rays need one win to take their first season series from the A's since 2010...Rays have also won 6 of the last 9 games between the two since July 31, 2012... Alex Cobb has 3 of those wins...since 2007, the Rays are 30-28, but their overall mark of 53-87 (.379) is their worst against an AL opponent...Rays are 13-14 here since 2007, but were 8-34 prior.

ALEX COBB -- Is 4-0 with a 1.42 ERA (43.1-IP, 33-H, 9-R, 8-ER, 12-BB, 35-SO) in 6 starts against 2012 postseason teams...the Rays have won 5 of the 6 games (loss last start vs. NYY)...has not faced the Rangers...beat Oakland on April 19 this year (8-3 win).

+ In 10 starts following a Rays loss this season, he is 5-1 with a 2.86 ERA (66-IP, 21-ER)...the Rays are 7-3 in those starts.

THE ROAD IS A LONEY PLACE—James Loney is batting a major leaguehigh .357 on the road...the last AL player to finish a season with a road average that high was NYY Robinson Cano in 2006 (.364)...the Rays club record for one season is held by Carl Crawford (.342 in 2007).

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—On Aug 31, 2003, Rays RH Jeremi Gonzalez goes the distance in a 4-3 loss at Oakland and is ejected—while the Rays bat in the 9th inning-from the dugout...he becomes the first pitcher in ML history to throw a complete game and get ejected from the game.

ESPN IN THE HOUSE—ESPN has announced that it will televise two early-September Rays games...the Rays at Angels game on Sep 4 will air in most

of the country (not in Tampa Bay) and the Red Sox at Rays game on Sep 11 will be carried in all markets including Tampa Bay.

DEFENSIVE WIZARDRY—The Rays 49 errors are 2nd fewest in MLB history through 133 games behind this year's Orioles (39)... the Rays and Orioles are both on pace to

break the 2003 Mariners' mark for fewest errors in a 162-game season (65)...last year the Rays had 94 errors through 132 games, nearly twice as many...Rays have made only 15 in their last 57 games...Rays infielders have made only 29 errors...only the Orioles have fewer (28).

ZOBRIST STREAK COMES TO AN END—2B Ben Zobrist committed a throwing error in the 5th inning last night, snapping his club-record streak of 81 straight errorless games at 2B...it was his first error since May 13 vs. SD...it was his first throwing error since last Sep 24 (while at SS).


ESCOBAR TOPS ALL SHORTSTOPS IN AUGUST—Yunel Escobar is batting .329 (28-for-85) in August, the top avg. among all ML shortstops... he has reached 20 times in his last 44 trips to the plate (13-for-37, 7-BB).

DP COMBO-2B Ben Zobrist (3) and SS Yunel Escobar (6) have committed a combined total of 9 errors this season, fewest by a double play combination in the majors (among qualifiers, 2/3 of team's games at that position)...the fewest made by a DP combo in one season is 9 twice: 1999 Mets (Edgardo Alfonzo 5 and SS Rey Ordonez 4) and the 2010 Yankees (2B Robinson Cano 3 and SS Derek Jeter 6).

- Escobar has committed only 2 errors in his last 86 games.
- Since the All-Star break, Escobar is batting .316 and Zobrist .319, the top-hitting double play combo since the break.

ODDS & ENDS — The Rays are 2-for-their-last-11 with the bases loaded and are homerless in their last 5 games...the Rays have grounded into a double play in 9 of their last 10 games (16 total) and have bounced into 29 in August, tied for the major league lead with the Pirates and White Sox... Rays starters have allowed 3 ER or less in 11 of their last 14 games.

- + ALEXANDER MILLER COBB—The 25-year-old will make his 17th start of the year, 7th on the road...is 3-2 with a 2.77 ERA (39-IP, 12-ER) on the road this year compared to 5-0 with a 2.93 ERA (61.1-IP, 20-ER) in 10 starts at home...has received a run support average of 6.02 R/9 IP (61.1-IP, 41-RS) at home vs. 3.46 R/9 IP (39-IP, 15-RS) on the road.
- + LAST START—On Sun vs. NYY, allowed 2 runs in 5.2 IP but did not factor in the 3-2 loss opposite Ivan Nova...his line: 5.2 IP, 7 H, 2 R/ER, 3 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 100/64...allowed a solo home run to Robinson Cano in the 4th...left the game with runners on second and third base and Alex Torres struck out Lyle Overbay to end the inning.
- + SINCE HE RETURNED—In 3 starts since his return from the DL, is 2-0 with a 2.16 ERA (16.2-IP, 4-ER) with 16 SO and 13 hits, 9 BB and 2 HR allowed...the Rays have outscored their opponents, 16-8 but are 2-1.
- + AGAINST THE BEST—Is 4-0 with a 1.42 ERA (43.1-IP, 33-H, 9-R, 8-ER, 12-BB, 35-SO) in 6 starts against 2012 postseason teams...the Rays have won 5 of the 6 games (loss last start vs. NYY)...has not faced the Rangers...beat Oakland on April 19 this year (8-3 win).
- + COBBSTOPPER—In 10 starts following a Rays loss this season, he is 5-1 with a 2.86 ERA (66-IP, 21-ER)...the Rays are 7-3 in those starts.
- + RANKS—If he qualified, his 2.87 ERA would rank 3rd-lowest in the AL behind DET Anibal Sanchez (2.61) and TEX Yu Darvish (2.73)...ranked 11th-best in AL with 3.01 ERA when he was placed on the DL (June 15).
- + 3 OR LESS—Has allowed 3 ER or less in 14 of his 16 starts this year... has recorded 10 quality starts.
- **+ SINCE AUG 1, 2012**—Has gone 15-3 with a 2.96 ERA (167.1-IP, 55-ER), 149 SO and 49 BB while the Rays are 20-7.
- + BACK IN ACTION—His start on Aug 15 vs. SEA was his first in the majors since suffering a concussion after being hit by a line drive off the bat of Eric Hosmer on June 15 vs. KC...he missed 50 games while on the disabled list and the Rays went 31-19 in his absence.

- + REHAB STINT—Made 3 rehab starts with Class-A Charlotte, though his first outing on July 23 was cut short due to blisters on his throwing hand (only threw 2 pitches)...in his other 2 starts, went 0-1 with a 4.32 ERA (8.1-IP, 4-ER), 8 SO and 4 BB.
- + LAST ROAD START—On Aug 20 at BAL, gave up just 2 runs (1 ER) in 6 IP as he earned the victory in a 7-4 win opposite Miguel Gonzalez... left with the bases loaded and no outs in the 7th inning but Alex Torres allowed just 1 inherited runner to score (on a double play)...Cobb's line: 6 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 4 BB, 5 SO, 1 HBP, 92/55.
- + K's UP, WALKS DOWN—Has 92 SO in 100.1 IP this year (8.3 SO/9 IP)...averaged 6.8 SO/9 IP in 2011-12...has only 32 BB (2.9 BB/9 IP)... his strikeout-to-walk ratio has increased in each of his three seasons from 1.76 in 2011 to 2.65 in 2012 and 2.88 in 2013.
- + 5-PLUS STRIKEOUTS—Has struck out 5-plus batters in 12 of his 16 starts this year...for his career, has a 2.19 ERA (164.2-IP, 40-ER) when striking out 5 or more batters (25 starts) compared to a 5.27 ERA (124.2-IP, 73-ER) when striking out 4 or fewer (23 starts).
- + GROUNDED—His 73.5 groundball pct. would rank 1st in the majors if he qualified...since his 2012 debut (May 19) his 2.71 groundball-to-flyball ratio ranks 2nd in the majors behind MIN Samuel Deduno (2.86).
- + BUGS BUNNY—On June 5 at DET, did not allow a run in 7.2 IP vs. the majors highest-scoring offense in a 3-0 win opposite Doug Fister... his 7.2 IP is still the longest scoreless outing of any pitcher this season against the Tigers...after the game, 17-year veteran Torii Hunter said about facing Cobb: "You would think Bugs Bunny was pitching."
- + BAT BOY NO MORE—Alex served as a Dodgers bat boy during spring training in Vero Beach for three years in high school...Alex can recall getting a pair of batting gloves from visiting player BOS David Ortiz, his favorite player at the time...he still has the gloves today...he also was a bat boy for current teammate James Loney.

CAREER—Is 3-1 with a 2.93 ERA (27.2-IP, 9-ER) in 4 starts vs. OAK.

WINNING STREAK—Lost his first start vs. OAK on Aug 6, 2011 but has won his last 3 in a row, pitching at least 7 innings in each (1.54 ERA; 23.1-IP, 4-ER).

PLEASANT MEMORY—His only career shutout came against the A's on Aug 23, 2012 at TB (4-hitter)...last faced them on April 19 at TB, earning the win in a 8-3 victory...his line: 7.1 IP, 10 H, 3 R/ER, 1 BB, 3 SO, 1 HR...tied a season high with 10 hits allowed.

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2011) enters his 8th season as Rays skipper...owns a career 660-606 (.522) record with the Rays: 127-197 (.392) in his first two seasons (2006-07) and 533-409 (.567) since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival.
- Has four ejections this season and 31 as a Ray, a club record.
- + Signed a 3-year contract extension on Feb 15, 2012 that runs through 2015...at that time, he will be the longest tenured manager/head coach in Tampa Bay sports history, surpassing the Bucs' John McKay (1976-84).

- Hitting .275 (72-for-262) with all 6 of his HR and 29 of 30 XBH vs. RHP this season...owns a career .291 avg. with a .366 OBP vs. RHP.
- Has appeared in 94 games with 72 starts (65-CF, 6-LF, 1-RF) overall this season...is attempting to reach the postseason for the first time.

- Since the All-Star break, ranks 1st among major league shortstops (min. 60 AB) with a .316 avg. (36-for-114) and 1st with a .406 OBP in 34 games.
- Since April 17, is batting .289 (110-for-380) with a .358 OBP in 112 games (110 starts)...hit .089 (4-for-45) in his first 13 G (through April 16) this year. Had a club record streak of 53 consecutive errorless games by a Rays SS from May 21-July 22...his current .988 fielding pct. is on pace for a career

high (prev. .982 in 2012 with TOR) and a club record for a shortstop in franchise history...prev. best was .980 by Chris Gomez in 2002.
