RAY MATTER-The Rays opened this 10day West Coast road trip losing a pair of one-run games here...they have now lost 4 one-run games in the last 7 days...the Rays have lost 3 straight games (while scoring 4 runs) and have lost 6 of their last 7 games while scoring 16 runs and batting .217 (49for-226) including .190 (12-for-63) with runners in scoring position...they have hit only one HR during that span...Rays starters have pitched to a 3.79 ERA (401-IP, 17-ER) over the last 7 games...over those last 7 games, the Rays have fallen out of a firstplace tie with Boston in the AL East to 4.5 games behind the Red Sox, their biggest deficit since July 12 (4.5 GB)...the Rays have also fallen 1.5 GB behind Oakland for the top AL Wild Card spot...the Rays have spent 29 of the last 32 days in second place in the AL East and 56 straight days in either first or second place.

- The Rays are 1-4 since starting a stretch of 13 straight games vs. AL West teams (3 vs. LAA, 3 at OAK, 4 at LAA, 3 at SEA).
- The Rays are playing 37 games in 38 days to finish the regular season (3-6 so far)...their only remaining off-day is Sep 9.
- While the Rays are 9-14 since Aug 4, they are 61-41 since May 8, best record in the AL.
- Of the Rays last 28 games, 17 are on the road and 15 are against teams currently within 5.0 games of a postseason berth.

ROSTER EXPANSION—The Rays today officially selected OF/DH Delmon Young (No. 15) from Double-A Montgomery, recalled RH Josh Lueke and C Chris Gimenez (No. 16) from Triple-A Durham and reinstated OF/DH Luke Scott from the disabled list...Scott had been on the DL since Aug 18 with back spasms...the Rays current roster now stands at 29 and includes 13 pitchers, 3 catchers, 5 infielders and 8 outfielders...in addition, RH Alex Colome (right elbow strain) has been placed on the major league DL effective June 29 and transferred to the 60-day DL...RH Jeremy Hellickson had his option transferred from Class-A Charlotte to Montgomery.

BULLPEN DAY—The Rays will start reliever Jamey Wright today...he will become just the 19th pitcher to start a game for the Rays since 2008...that's 4 fewer than any major league team over that span (San Francisco-23) and seven fewer than any other AL team (Minnesota-27)...this is the 3rd time under Joe Maddon the Rays have started a relief pitcher...they have won the other two occasions: June 24, 2012 in the second game of a doubleheader at Philadelphia...Rays won 7-3 as Cesar Ramos started and 3 others contributed...on Oct 2, 2010, Andy Sonnanstine and 7 others shut out the Royals at KC, 4-0, tying the major league record for most pitchers used in a 9-inning shutout.

SEPTEMBER BASEBALL—Since 2010, the Rays have a 51-36 (.586) record after Sep 1...that's the second-best record in the AL over that span trailing only Detroit (54-33, .621)...the Rays were 17-10 in 2011 and 19-11 in 2012...the Rays have posted a 3.75 ERA after Sep 1 over the past five years, lowest in the AL.

LABOR DAY—Since the Wild Card format began in 1995, 82 percent (119) of 146) of the teams that were in position to make the postseason on Labor Day, actually made the postseason...the Rays are 3-8 all-time on Labor Day...James Shields has all 3 Rays wins.

ROAD RAYS - The Rays play 11 of their next 14 games on the road...between May 5 and July 29, the Rays had the best road record in the majors at 24-12, but they have lost 4 straight and 8 of their last 10 road games since... since 2010, the Rays have the majors' best road record at 166-141 (.524).

ONE EXTREME TO ANOTHER-After going 21-5 in July, the best month in club history, the Rays went 11-15 in August, their worst month since July 2011 (also 11-15) and their first losing August since 2006, Manager Joe Maddon's first year as skipper of the Rays when they went 9-19...Rays scored just 89 runs in August (3.4 R/G), their

fewest runs scored in the month of August in club history and their fewest in amy month since July 2008 (87).

RAYS GET MAJOR LEAGUE 8TH-HIGH CG—Last night, Alex Cobb gave the Rays their 8th complete game of the season, tops in the majors...it was their 30th since the start of 2010, most in the majors...he also becomes the 5th Ray to throw a complete game this season...no other major league has had five pitchers throw 5 CGs...the last time the Rays had 5 starters with one or more CGs was 2003 when they had 6.

RAYS vs. A'S—Rays lead the season series, 3 games to 2...the Rays have held the A's to 10 runs and a .191 (29-for-152) average...Rays swept a 3-game series at home, April 19-21...Rays need one win to take their first season series from the A's since 2010...since 2007, the Rays are 30-29, but their overall mark of 53-88 (.375) is their worst against an AL opponent... Rays are 13-15 here since 2007, but were 8-34 prior.

UP NEXT, AT ANGELS—In Joe Maddon's first four years, the Rays were 1-13 at Angel Stadium and Joe was ejected 3 times...in three years since, they are 13-3 there... Evan Longoria has the 2nd-highest batting average among visiting active players with 50 or more ABs...the SoCal native is hitting .397 (25-63) with 16 runs, 6 HR and 17 RBI in 17 games,

THE ROAD IS A LONEY PLACE—James Loney is batting a major leaguehigh .362 on the road...the last AL player to finish a season with a road average that high was NYY Robinson Cano in 2006 (.364)...the Rays club record for one season is held by Carl Crawford (.342 in 2007).

DEFENSIVE WIZARDRY—The Rays 49 errors are 2nd fewest in MLB history through 134 games behind this year's Orioles (40)...the Rays and Ori-

oles are both on pace to break the 2003 Mariners' mark for fewest errors in a 162-game season (65)...last year the Rays had 94 errors through 132 games, nearly twice as many... the Rays have made only 15 in their last 58 games...Rays infielders have made only 29 errors, tied with the Orioles for the fewest in the majors.

DP COMBO—2B **Ben Zobrist** (3) and SS **Yunel Escobar** (6) have committed a combined total of 9 errors this season, fewest by a double play combination in the majors (among qualifiers, 2/3 of team's games at that position)...the fewest made by a DP combo in one season is 9 twice: 1999 Mets (Edgardo Alfonzo 5 and SS Rey Ordonez 4) and the 2010 Yankees (2B Robinson Cano 3 and SS Derek Jeter 6).

- + Escobar has committed only 2 errors in his last 87 games.
- On Friday, Zobrist committed a throwing error snapping his clubrecord streak of 81 straight errorless games at 2B...it was his first error since May 13 vs. SD...it was his first throwing error since last Sep 24 (while at SS).

ODDS & ENDS—The Rays are homerless in their last 6 games, matching the 3rd-longest streak in club history...the club record is 8...Rays also went 6 homerless games earlier this season (April 7-14)...the Rays have gone 210 ABs (57 innings) without a home run...the Rays have grounded into at least one double play in 10 of their last 11 games (17 total) and bounced into 30 in August, most in the majors.

- + "MYSTERY STARTER"—Was named as the starting pitcher for today after last night's game...for the 18-year veteran, it will be his first start since Aug 25, 2007 vs. SEA for the Rangers...has made 374 relief appearances in between...he will be the 9th pitcher to start for the Rays this season and only the 19th since the start of 2008.
- + STARTER vs. RELIEVER—For his career, is 69-101 with a 5.13 ERA as a starter compared to 23-25 with a 3.92 ERA as a reliever...opponents have put up a .288/.379/.446 line against him as a starter but only a .252/.340/.349 line against him as a reliever.
- + FAMILIAR ROLE—Pitched almost exclusively as a starter for the first nine seasons of his career, going 53-72 with a 5.08 ERA with the Rockies (1996-99, 2004), Brewers (2000-02), Cardinals (2002) and Royals (2003)...only made 3 relief appearances during that span...split his time between the rotation and the bullpen from 2005-07 and fully converted to his bullpen role on Aug 29, 2007.
- **+ WORKHORSE**—Since converting to the bullpen full-time in 2008, has a 3.99 ERA in 415.1 IP—most relief innings in the majors in that span.
- + HE'S DUE—Eighteen-year veteran is with his 10th major league team but is still seeking his first postseason game...no active player has gone longer without playing in the playoffs...this is the 6th straight season he made an Opening Day roster after going to camp as a non-roster invite.

- + 20 YEARS, FIRST IN FLORIDA—Signed with the Rays this past offseason as a non-roster invite...it was the first time in his 20-year pro career that he spent spring training in Florida...his previous 19 seasons had been spent with teams who train in Arizona...has three kids: 9-yearold daughter Presley Kile and sons Jett Alan (6) and Kingston Cash (4).
- + THIS YEAR—Has a 1.76 ERA (30.2-IP, 6-ER) over his last 30 apps, 26 of which have been scoreless...pitched to a 4.33 ERA (27-IP, 13-ER) over his first 24 apps.
- + SITUATIONAL—Of his 54 apps, the Rays have trailed in 31 of them or led by 3-plus runs in 13 of them...has only pitched with the Rays holding a 1-run lead once this season (Aug 20 at BAL)...the Rays have been tied in 7 of his apps and had a 2-run lead in the 2 others.
- + LONGEST RELIEF APP—Twice this year has thrown 3 innings of relief, his longest relief appearances of the season (May 24 vs. NYY and May 31 at CLE)...has thrown more than 1 inning in 15 of his 54 apps.
- + SPLITS—Right-handed batters are hitting .267/.323/.326 against him but lefties are hitting just .205/.300/.279.
- + vs. OAK—Is 2-1 with a 4.56 ERA in 35 career games (3 starts) against the A's, including a 2.28 ERA (23.2-IP, 6-ER) at the Coliseum...his last start against them came with the Rangers on July 16, 2007 here in this building...threw 7 scoreless innings in a 4-1 victory.

TOMORROW'S STARTER—RH CHRIS ARCHER (8-5, 2.81)

- + KING ARCHER—24-year-old makes his 18th start of the season, 8th on the road...for his career, is 6-3 with a 2.84 ERA at home compared to 3-5 with a 3.72 ERA on the road.
- + LAST START—On Wed vs. LAA, earned his 8th win as he threw 7 innings of 1-run ball in a 4-1 victory opposite Garrett Richards...his line: 7 IP, 5 H, 1 R/ER, 0 BB, 5 SO, 92/62...retired 20 of the 25 batters he faced, including 17 of 20 through the first 6 innings.
- + SALVAGING AUGUST—In his last 3 starts (Rays 3-0), is 2-0 with a 1.71 ERA (21-IP, 4-ER) and 13 hits, 2 BB and 1 HR allowed... in his first 3 starts of August (Rays 0-3), went 0-2 with a 6.59 ERA (13.2-IP, 10-ER) and 18 hits, 5 BB and 4 HR allowed.
- + 6 IS KEY—This year when he has pitched 6 or more innings in a start, the Rays are 10-1...when he doesn't last 6 innings, the Rays are 1-5...
- F IN CONTROL—Has had 5 starts this year in which he did not walk a batter, all coming in his last 10 starts overall...in those starts, he is 4-0 with a 0.47 ERA (38-IP, 2-ER)...of his 17 starts this year, he has had 10 outings with 2 BB or less and 7 outings with 3 BB or more...when he has walked 2 or less in a start, he is 6-1 with a 1.67 ERA (64.2-IP, 12-ER) and 5.8 H/9 IP...in the starts with 3 BB or more, he is 1-4 with a 4.78 ERA (37.2-IP, 20-ER) and 8.4 H/9 IP.
- vs. LAA—Makes his second career start against the Angels...see "Last Start" note to the left for info on his first.

#70 JOE MADDON, MANAGER

- + Two-time AL Manager of the Year (2008, 2011) enters his 8th season as Rays skipper...owns a career 660-607 (.521) record with the Rays: 127-197 (.392) in his first two seasons (2006-07) and 533-410 (.566) since the start of 2008...the Rays were 518-775 (.401) prior to his arrival.
- + Has four ejections this season and 31 as a Ray, a club record.
- Signed a 3-year contract extension on Feb 15, 2012 that runs through 2015...at that time, he will be the longest tenured manager/head coach in Tampa Bay sports history, surpassing the Bucs' John McKay (1976-84).

- + Hitting .272 (72-for-265) with all 6 of his HR and 29 of 30 XBH vs. RHP this season...owns a career .290 avg. with a .366 OBP vs. RHP.
- + Has appeared in 95 games with 73 starts (65-CF, 7-LF, 1-RF) overall this season...is attempting to reach the postseason for the first time.

- + Hit 2nd yesterday at OAK for the first time this season...started at leadoff Aug 6 at ARI, but has hit 5th or lower in the other 124 games.
- + Tied his career high Tue vs. LAA reaching base 5 times (4th time, last May 10, 2012 at MIN)...drew a career-high-tying 3 BB (7th time).
- + Since the All-Star break, ranks 2nd among major league shortstops (min. 60 AB) with a .305 avg. (36-for-118) and 1st with a .394 OBP in 35 games.
- Since April 17, is batting .286 (110-for-384) with a .355 OBP in 113 games (111 starts)...hit .089 (4-for-45) in his first 13 G (through April 16) this year.
 Had a club record streak of 53 consecutive errorless games by a Rays SS from May 21–July 22...his current .988 fielding pct. is on pace for a career high (prev. .982 in 2012 with TOR) and a club record for a shortstop in franchise history...prev. best was .980 by Chris Gomez in 2002.

- + Begins his first stint with the Rays this season...had 2 stints in the majors last year: April 15–May 28 and Sep 1 through season's end...after his second recall on Sep 1, hit .406 (13-for-32) with 1 HR, 5 RBI and 3 doubles...started the final 5 games of the season and hit .500 (7-for-14).
- + Hit .263 (30-for-114) in 35 games over the first 2 months of the season for Durham but hit .201 (39-for-194) in 60 games from June through August.
- + Has spent parts of 4 seasons (2009-12) at the major league level with 3 teams (Cleveland, Seattle and Tampa Bay) and owns a career .292 avg. (33-for-113) with a .375 OBP against left-handed pitching.
