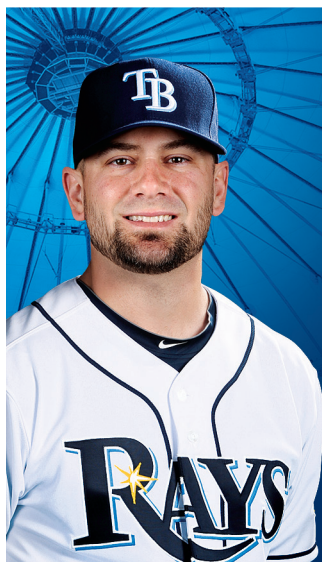

2012 SEASON

- + Recorded career bests in ERA (2.44), opponents' average (.171) and strikeouts per 9 IP (11.25) in his second season with the White Sox...appeared in only 51 games, his fewest since 2007 (18).
- + Among AL relievers, ranked 6th in opp avg. and 11th in SO/9 IP...right-handed batters hit just .129 (13-for-101) against him compared to .232 (16-for-69) for lefties.
- + Allowed just 20.8 pct. (5 of 24) of his inherited runners to score...opponents hit .163 (8-for-49) with RISP and .125 (3-for-24) with RISP and 2 outs.
- + Spent time on the disabled list from April 21-May 14 with a strained left oblique and again from June 24-July 21 with a right posterior shoulder strain.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + His 43 career wins as a reliever rank 3rd among active pitchers behind Mariano Rivera (73) and Octavio Dotel (50)...his 494 career appearances in the AL are 6th-most among actives behind Mariano Rivera (1,041), Matt Thornton (545), Joe Nathan (526), Jason Frasor (525) and Fernando Rodney (495).
- + Among Canadian-born pitchers, his 494 career appearances ranks 6th behind Paul Quantrill (841), Rheel Cormier (683), Fergie Jenkins (664), Ryan Dempster (547) and John Hiller (545).

- + In **2011**, set career highs in holds (24) and strikeouts (70) after signing with the White Sox as a free agent...his 8 wins were the most by a White Sox reliever since Antonio Osuna in 2002 (8) and his 24 holds were the most by a White Sox righthander since Barry Jones (30) in 1990.
- + Posted a 2.19 ERA (53.1-IP, 13-ER) from May 1 through the end of the season, 8th lowest among AL relievers in that span...had a 1.33 ERA on the road compared to 3.52 at home...held lefties to a .184 avg. (16-for-87) with no homers.
- + Pitched his final season for the Twins in **2010**, going 1-1 with a 3.04 ERA (68-IP, 23-ER)...his 71 appearances ranked 9th among AL relievers...held lefties to a .196 avg. (20-for-102), 3rd lowest among RH relievers in the AL...did not allow an earned run in 22 consecutive apps from June 10-Aug 4 (20.2-IP).
- + In **2009**, pitched to an 8.15 ERA (17.2-IP, 16-ER) from the start of the season through June 14 and was optioned to Triple-A Rochester...was recalled on July 23 and posted a 2.91 ERA (34-IP, 11-ER) through the end of the season.
- + Missed the final four months of the season in **2007** due to surgery to repair a torn labrum and rotator cuff in his right shoulder on May 29...only made 18 appearances before the injury.
- + Spent his second full season with the Twins in **2006** and ranked 9th among AL relievers with 76.2 IP...had a 1.93 ERA (37.1-IP, 8-ER) after the All-Star break.

- + In **2005**, set career highs in wins (12), appearances (75) and innings pitched (79.2) in his first full season in the majors...his 12 wins were the most by an AL reliever since TOR Jeff Musselman (12) in 1987 and have been matched by only one other ML reliever since 2000: SF Joe Nathan (12) in 2003...led AL rookies with 75 apps, establishing a Twins rookie record...set an AL record for consecutive wins to start a career as a relievers (11) on July 1 vs. TB...recorded his first career save on July 10 at KC...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 3 prospect in the Twins organization.
- + Spent his first time in the majors in **2004**, going 3-0 with a 2.00 ERA (27-IP, 6-ER) in 22 relief apps with Minnesota...had his contract purchased from Triple-A on Aug 1 and made his major league debut on Aug 5 vs. LAA...was optioned on Aug 29 and recalled for a second time on Sep 1, the night he earned his first major league win (vs. TEX).
- + Drafted out of the University of Houston, where he earned All-Conference USA honors as a shortstop and reliever in 2002...was a first-team All-America by Baseball America and Baseball Weekly and was selected to the Conference USA All-Academic Team...also attended San Jacinto (Texas) Junior College.
- + Is a 1999 graduate of Fairview (Colo.) High School, where he played baseball, basketball and football...was named Colorado High School Player of the Year as a senior.

X-RAY REPORT

- + David and his wife, Kim, created the David DeJesus Family Foundation to help families in crisis in Chicago, and in parts of the world where people lack basic human needs...he was nominated by the Cubs for the 2012 Roberto Clemente Award...was also one of 30 nominees for the MLB Players Alumni Association 2008 Heart and Hustle Award.

2012 SEASON

- + Played his first season with the Cubs after signing as a free agent in November 2011...appeared in 148 games and spent time at all three outfield positions (100-RF, 50-CF, 3-LF).
- + Led the Cubs with a .350 OBP, including a .358 OBP while hitting leadoff where he started 114 games...this ranked 3rd among NL leadoff hitters (min. 200 PA) behind COL Dexter Fowler (.389) and STL Jon Jay (.362)...drew 61 walks, his most since 2007 (64)...averaged 4.07 pitches per plate appearance, 7th highest in the NL.
- + Batted .289 (119-for-412) against right-handed pitching compared to a .149 (14-for-94) mark against lefties.
- + Logged 8 triples, which tied for 9th in the NL... hit 2 triples on May 28 vs. SD for the 2nd time in his career (Sep 30, 2006 at DET).
- + On May 11 at MIL, hit a pinch-hit grand slam off Kameron Loe, his first career pinch-hit homer and second career grand slam...it was the first pinch-hit slam by a Cubs player since Mike Fontenot on May 7, 2010 at CIN.

- + Had three 4-hit games, tying his career high for a game...on Aug 15 vs. HOU had 4 hits and 2 HR, his fourth career 2-homer game...on Sep 21 vs. STL went 4-for-6 with a walk-off RBI single in the 11th inning.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Has recorded 12 career leadoff home runs plus three inside-the-park home runs...according to Baseball Reference he is one of five active players with at least 3 inside-the-park home runs, along with Jimmy Rollins (4), Carl Crawford (3), Chase Utley (3) and Curtis Granderson (3).
- + His 48 triples over the last 7 seasons (2006-12) rank 8th in the majors.
- + Is a career .314 hitter (160-for-509) in inter-league play...this ranks 6th among active players (min. 500 AB), behind Albert Pujols (.341), Ichiro Suzuki (.332), Derek Jeter (.326), Joe Mauer (.325) and Michael Young (.318).
- + Has played 577 games in center field, 318 in right field and 292 in left field...owns a career .992 fielding pct. with 62 outfield assists...has made 8 consecutive Opening Day starts, 2005-08 in CF, 2009 in LF and 2010-12 in RF.
- + Spent the **2011** season with Oakland, his only season with the A's, after he was acquired by trade the previous November from the Royals...batted .270 (48-for-178) after the All-Star break, 50 points higher than his .220 mark (58-for-264) in the first half...played primarily right

- field (116 games, 114 starts) and also saw time in center (8 games, 6 starts).
- + After no multi-homer games in his first 8 seasons, had three multi-homer games in 2011: May 4 vs. CLE, May 24 at LAA and Aug 6 at TB... homered off Alex Cobb and Jake McGee in an 8-0 win over the Rays.
 - + Collected his 1,000th career hit on May 14 vs. CWS, a 5th-inning, 2-run triple.
 - + His error in right field on June 30 vs. FLA ended his streak of 305 games in the outfield without a miscue.
 - + In **2010**, his final season with the Royals, was batting a career-high .318 (112-for-352) when his season was cut short due to right thumb surgery...on July 22 at NYY attempted a catch at the center field wall and sustained a sprained right thumb, allowing an inside-the-park home run to Derek Jeter...underwent surgery on July 26 by Dr. Tom Graham at the Cleveland Clinic.
 - + Reached the All-Star break with a .326 avg. and 107 hits, 6th most in the AL.
 - + Recorded a career-high .384 OBP...hit .340 (88-for-259) against RHP and .258 vs. LHP...hit a major-league-best .287 with 2 strikes...hit .410 (41-for-100) in June, 2nd best in the majors to TEX Josh Hamilton (.454) and best June by a Royal since Clint Hurdle (.432) in 1980.
 - + Finished the season with 241 consecutive errorless games, the longest ever by a Royals outfielder, passing Amos Otis (165 in 1970-71).
 - + In **2009** with the Royals hit a career-high 13 HR and tallied 9 triples, tied for 3rd most in the AL...his .835 OPS from the leadoff spot ranked 5th in the majors (min. 350 AB).
 - + Hit .309 with 10 HR and 50 RBI in his last 91 games after hitting .231 with 3 HR and 21 RBI in his first 53 games through June 9...hit .316 in July, .324 in August and .320 in September.
 - + Compiled a 17-game hitting streak from Aug 30-Sep 18, his longest ever within one season and two shy of his career-high 19 (2004-05).
 - + Was one of four major league outfielders to not commit an error...his career-high 13 outfield assists tied BAL Nick Markakis for 2nd in the AL behind BOS Jason Bay (15).
 - + On Sep 11 at CLE he threw out the winning run at the plate twice: in the bottom of the 9th inning and again in the 11th in an eventual 2-1, 12-inning victory...became the first player in the majors to throw out the potential winning run at home plate in the 9th inning or later twice in one game since STL Bernard Gilkey on Aug 25, 1992 at HOU.
 - + In **2008** established career highs in several categories: hits (159), RBI (73), stolen bases (11) and slugging pct. (.452)...batted .307, his first time hitting .300 in his career...had 7 triples, tied for 6th most in the AL.
 - + Led the majors with a .419 batting avg. (.44-for-105) with RISP, 2nd-highest mark in Royals history (George Brett, .469 in 1980)...also set a Royals record with a .460 avg. with RISP prior to the All-Star break, topping Mike Sweeney's mark .438 in 2000...hit .359 with runners on base, 2nd in the AL and 4th in the majors.
 - + Sprained his left ankle on Opening Day at DET after one at-bat...missed 11 games.
 - + In **2007** played in a career-high 157 games...set career highs in at-bats (605), runs scored (101) and walks (64)...became the first Royals player to score 100 runs since Carlos Beltran in 2003 (102)...his 9 triples tied for 3rd most in the AL and set a career high (tied in 2009).
 - + Was hit by a pitch 23 times, breaking the previous club mark of 18 shared by Mike Macfarlane (1994) and Angel Berroa (2003)...DeJesus led the AL and ranked 2nd in the majors to PHI Chase Utley (25).
 - + In **2006** collected a career-high 36 doubles despite spending more than a month on the DL in April-May with a strained left hamstring...batted .295 on the season with 7 triples, tied for the team lead and tied for 7th in the AL...was hit by a pitch 12 times, tied for 6th in the AL.
 - + Named Royals Player of the Month in June, his first full month of the season...ranked 5th among all major leaguers with a .436 avg. in interleague play...posted 7 straight multi-hit games, June 28-July 4.
 - + Recorded 12 outfield assists, tied for 2nd in the AL behind LAA Juan Rivera (13).
 - + Enjoyed his first full season in the majors in **2005** with Kansas City...his .293 batting avg. ranked 4th among major league center fielders (min. 100 games) behind BOS Johnny Damon (.316), MIL Brady Clark (.306) and CIN Ken Griffey Jr. (.301).
 - + After the All-Star break led the Royals with 92 hits and 6 triples.
 - + Hit safely in his first 4 games of the season to cap a career-high 19-game hitting streak dating to 2004.
 - + Suffered a strained right shoulder on a diving catch on Aug 28 at NYY and made only one appearance in the team's final 30 games, as a pinch-runner Sep 21 vs. DET.
 - + In **2004** was named the Les Milgram Royals Player of the Year by the Kansas City Chapter of the BBWAA, joining Bob Hamelin (1994)

as the only rookies in club history to win the award...finished 6th in the AL Rookie of the Year balloting.

- + Recalled from Triple-A Omaha on April 24 and was optioned back to Omaha on May 11 after going 1-for-23 in his first 11 games...recalled for good on June 25 following the trade of Carlos Beltran and immediately took over as the starting center fielder and leadoff hitter.
- + His first career homer was a leadoff shot, July 16 vs. MIN off Brad Radke.
- + Recorded a pair of 15-game hitting streaks: July 30-Aug 15 and Sep 19 through season's end, establishing a club rookie record with each streak.
- + Saw his first major league action in 2003 as a September call-up, appearing in 12 games for the Royals club that would finish 83-79...entering 2013, this remains the only Royals club to post a winning record in the past 18 seasons.
- + Recorded his first major league hit on Sep 27 vs. CWS, a triple off Bartolo Colon.
- + Prior to his call-up, split the season between Double-A Wichita and Triple-A Omaha...his combined .308 batting avg. ranked 2nd among Royals minor leaguers.
- + Did not make his professional debut until 2002 with Class-A Wilmington, nearly two years after he was drafted...named the Royals Minor League Player of the Year after batting a combined .288 with 27 doubles, 8 triples, 6 HR, 56 RBI and 18 SB in 112 games between Wilmington and Double-A Wichita.

- + Missed the entire 2001 season due to Tommy John surgery...selected by the Royals in the 4th round of the 2000 June Draft despite a hairline fracture in his left arm sustained at Rutgers...the injury kept him from playing short-season ball in 2000.

PERSONAL & MISC.

- + He and his wife, Kim, have one son, David Kingston (3).
- + Grew up in Manalapan Township, N.J., and graduated from Manalapan High School in 1997...was drafted by the Mets out of high school (43rd round) but opted to attend Rutgers University in New Jersey.
- + Played three seasons at Rutgers...a hairline fracture of his arm ended his junior season leading up to the draft.
- + His brother, Michael, was a middle infielder selected by the Reds in the 15th round of the 2005 June Draft out of Coastal Carolina University.

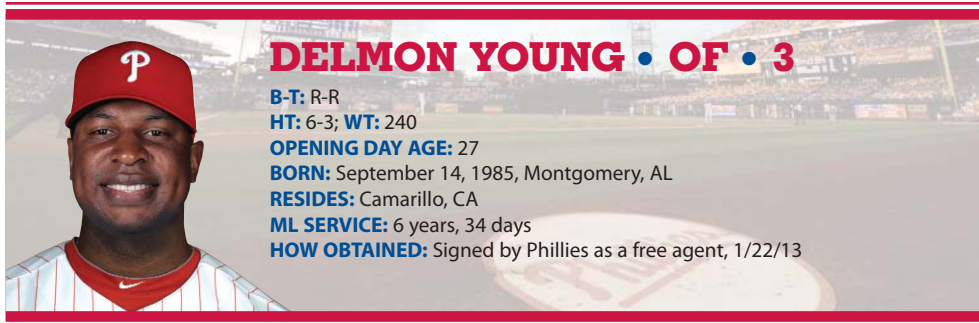
