WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 6-game roadtrip this afternoon with 3 games each in Oakland and Anaheim...Texas lost 2 of 3 to Minnesota in its brief weekend homestand but has won 4 of the last 6 games...club has also captured 8 of 12, 10 of 16, 18 of 25, and 23 of last 31...the Rangers' **23-8 (.742) record beginning 7/29 is best in the A.L.** and T2nd-best in MLB...club went 3-12 from 7/10-28 before current 23-8 run...the Rangers went an A.L.-best 20-7 (.741) in August, T2nd-best in majors and just the 4th month of 20+ wins in team history...club has gone 41-28 since June 17 with a 47-40 record beginning May 26...current 79-57 (.581) record is T3rd-best in the A.L. and is T5th-best in the majors, the 2nd-best 136-game record in club history (see charts)...team has been 20+ games over .500 for the last 13 days with season best 23 games over .500 twice, last on 8/31 (79-56)...club was 13-1 over 14 G from 7/29-8/12, just 3rd season in Texas history to win 13 of 14...season-high 8-game win streak from 8/4-12 is T7th-longest ever...since start of 2010, the Rangers have .576 (358-264) winning percentage, one win behind than NYY (.577, 359-263) for best record in MLB in this span.

WINS OF LATE: Texas has won 23 of 31, making this just the 2nd season in club history with a span of 23 wins in 31 games...club also did it in July/August 1977, winning as many as 25 of 31 over those 2 months.

DIVISION LEADER: With Oakland's weekend sweep of Tampa Bay, the Rangers have lost 2.0 games in the standings in the last 3 days with current 1.0 game advantage over the A's being smallest since 8/19 (0.5 GA)...Texas has held sole possession of first place for the last 23 days and have held at least a share of the lead for 26 straight days beginning August 7...prior to that, Texas had not held at least a share of first place since 7/1...in the last 34 days, Texas has gained 7.0 games in the standings, coming back from a season high 6.0-game deficit on July 28-29...team spent 36 straight days in 2nd from 7/2-8/6 and has now held at least a share of the division lead for 90 days in 2013...Texas had a season-high 7.0-game lead through games of 5/15 and 5/16...beginning June 8, 2010, the Rangers have spent 554 of 637 days in 1st place.

LABOR DAY: According to the U.S. Dept. of Labor website, Labor Day "constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country"...as some of us spend this holiday at the ballpark, it's worth noting that the Rangers are 19-21 all-time on Labor Day, snapping a 4-game losing streak on 9/3/12 at KC...this is the 4th straight year that Texas has been on the road for Labor Day after doing so just 3 times between 1988 and 2009...only years club did not play a game on Labor Day were in 1994, 1997, 2001, and 2009...team played Labor Day doubleheaders in 1973, 1982, and 1999...Texas is 1-3 vs. the A's on Labor Day, the lone win coming in the last meeting on 9/4/06 at Oakland...losses were at the Coliseum in 1981 and 1987 and at Arlington Stadium in 1988.

IN THE A.L. WEST: The Rangers are 44-16 (.733) against the A.L. West Division in 2013, the highest winning percentage and most wins for any ML team in its own division...next-best on the list is Atlanta (38-21, .644 vs. NL East)...it is also the best winning pct. by a ML team against any division in 2013...current winning percentage would be best ever by an A.L. club vs. A.L. West in a full season, surpassing .727 (32-12) by BAL in 1997...the 44 wins are the most by the Rangers vs. one division since 49 vs. the A.L. East in 1993 most vs. the A.L. West since 47 in 1996, both with a balanced schedule...Texas has won 6 in a row and 20 of 22 vs. A.L. West since July 4...in the Rangers' 23-8 stretch beginning July 29, the club is 19-3 vs. A.L. West opponents and 4-5 vs. all other foes...Rangers are 25-7 in A.L. West parks, **winning 11 straight since a loss on Oakland on August 3.**

THE SCHEDULE: Texas has 26 regular season games remaining, 13 home and 13 road...team is in the middle of 12 of 15 on road through 9/8.

ON THE ROAD: Texas has won 3 in a row, 12 of 14, and 13 of its last 16 road games, the longer span beginning August 2...at 40-28 (.588), the Rangers **have the majors' best road record**...it matches the team's best 68-game road mark in club history with 1977 (41-28 after 69 games)...Texas needs one victory for its 3rd consecutive season with a winning road record, which would be a team first, after 44-37 in 2011 and 43-38 in 2012.

VERSUS OAKLAND: Texas is 8-5 vs. the A's in 2013, winning 4 of 5 and 6 of the last 8 meetings, the longer span beginning May 22...the 8 wins match Texas' total vs. Oakland in all of 2012 (8-11)...Rangers have a 29-22 edge since 2011...Texas is 4-2 at the Coliseum in 2013 after losing 7 of 9 here a year ago...Rangers have won 3 of 4 series in 2013, including both series in Oakland...in the all-time series, Texas leads 323-308 overall with the A's having 165-150 edge here in Oakland.

5 OR LESS RUNS ALLOWED: The Rangers have allowed 5-runs-or-less in 29 consecutive games beginning July 31, **the longest such single-season streak in team history**, longest in the MLB since 31 G for LAD, 8/10-9/12/09...it is the A.L.'s best streak in the designated hitter era (beg. 1973):

• Texas has a 3.05 ERA (88 ER/259.2 IP) in the past 29 games beg. 7/31 to drop season ERA from 3.77 to 3.62, 2nd in A.L. (KC-3.45) and team's lowest ERA through 136 games since 1983 (3.40).

OFFENSE: Rangers have scored 2 runs in 3 straight games, team's longest streak with 2 or fewer runs since 3 in a row, 7/10-12...team also has less than 3 runs in 5 of its last 8 contests, all 2-run games...Texas has totaled 24 runs in the other 3 contests in that 8-game stretch...the Rangers were 1-for-15 with RISP in the Twins series, the lone hit being Leonys Martin's walk-off single on Saturday.

• With a pair of solo homers on Sunday, home runs have accounted for 25 of 45 Texas runs (15 total HR) over the last 9 games after producing just 5 of 58 runs in the previous 10 contests.

BELTRE RANGERS PLAYER OF THE MONTH: Adrian Beltre has been selected as the Rangers August Player of the Month by the writers and broadcasters who cover the team on a regular basis, his 2nd consecutive monthly team award...he batted .381 (37-97) with 5 HR, 4 2B, 21 RBI, and 20 R in 27 games in August...it marks the 6th time overall that Beltre has been honored (Sept. '11; Aug. '12; Sept. '12; May '13; Aug. '13) and he is the 1st Ranger to win as many as 3 monthly awards in one season since Alex Rodriguez was Player of the Month 5 times in 2002.

USING THE ARM AND THE LEGS: Leonys Martin recorded his 12th outfield assist of 2013 on Sunday, his 7th in the last 20 games...he is tied with the Mets' Juan Lagares for the 2nd most in the ML, 2 behind the Royals Alex Gordon...it is the most OF assists for a Ranger since Ruben Sierra had 15 in 1991...club record is 19 by Mickey Rivers in 1980.

• Martin also recorded his 30th stolen base of the year on Sunday, T5th in A.L. and joining Elvis Andrus (35) to give Texas multiple 30-steal players for the 7th time ever, the last in 2011 (Andrus/Ian Kinsler).

DAY BASEBALL: Texas is 18-19 (.486) in day games in 2013...team's 3.31 day ERA is 2nd best in the A.L. (BOS-3.11) and current mark would be Texas' 2nd lowest ever in a full season (3.30 in 1989)...team is hitting .237 in daytime, 11th in A.L., a mark that would be 3rd lowest all-time in team history (.225 in 1972; .236 in 1988)...Rangers' 132 runs in day games are 2nd fewest in A.L. (HOU-119).

SHORTS: With his HR on Sunday, A.J. Pierzynski is hitting .556 (5-9) as a pinch-hitter this season, best of any A.L. player with more than 5 pinch AB...Texas has 2 pinch HR in last 9 games after none in previous 229 games over 2 seasons...Jim Adduci on Sunday became the 7th player to make his ML debut with Texas this season...singled in 1st ML plate appearance in 2nd inning, the 2nd Ranger to do in 2013 (Engel Beltre, 6/27 at NYY)...Neftali Feliz' outing yesterday was his 1st in the ML since a start on 5/18/12 at HOU...with Adduci and Feliz, Rangers have used 46 players in 2013, 22 position players and 24 pitchers (not counting David Murphy).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#45 Derek Holland, LHP (9-6, 3.00)

TODAY: The 26-year-old left-hander is slated to make his 28th start in the opener of this 3-game series against the A's here in Oakland on Labor Day afternoon...owns the 5th-lowest road ERA in the American League, going 7-1 with a 2.85 ERA (30 ER/94.2 IP) in 14 road starts, unbeaten in his last 11...will be working on extended 5-days' rest due for the 2nd straight start after he took a no decision in the Ranger 4-3, 10-inning victory on Tuesday in Seattle...went 1-0, 2.18 (8 ER/33.0 IP) in his 5 starts in August, holding opponents to a .191 avg w/ 32 K's to drop season figure from 3.18 to 3.00, 8th in the A.L. and 2nd-lowest by a LHP (Chicago-AL's Chris Sale, 2.99)...has quality starts in 11 of last 12, going 4-2, 2.49 (23 ER/83.0 IP) to drop from 3.43...has gone 7.0+ IP with 2 or fewer runs in 11 of 27 starts...has allowed more than 4 ER just once in 27 starts...has 5 of Texas' 10 starts of 8.0+ IP (Darvish-3; Garza-1; Perez-1), T6th-most in A.L...pitched for Team USA in this year's WBC, starting win-or-go home matchup vs. Canada on 3/10 in Phoenix...signed a 5-year contract extension through 2016 with two club options for 2017 and 2018 on March 20, 2012.

TOP 10: Ranks among the A.L.'s top 10 in ERA (8th), strikeouts (7th, 167), and innings (11th, 180.0)...leads Texas staff with 20 quality starts, T3rd in the A.L...has 16 starts w/ no HR allowed, T7th-most in the A.L...has permitted just 14 HR and owns A.L.'s 8th-lowest HR/9 ratio (0.70).

THE RECORD BOOKS: Will be making his 5th attempt to join Kenny Rogers as the only Texas lefties with 3 consecutive 10-win seasons...in addition to the wins mark, Holland is chasing several other club milestones...he needs 2 wins for 50 in his career, as his 48 wins are currently T12th in Rangers history (also Harrison/Millwood/G. Perry), 2 shy of tying Doc Medich for 11th on all-time list...his 117 starts rank 13th in club history, and 635 K's are 10th all-time and 3 shy of passing C.J. Wilson (9th, 637)...has a career high with 167 K's, surpassing previous high of 162 in 2011.

LAST START: Took a no decision in the Ranger 4-3, 10-inning victory on Tuesday in Seattle (6.0 IP, 6 H, 3 R-ER, 4 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 104 pitches/63 strikes)...allowed all 4 runs in the first 4 innings, including 2 in the opening frame, as he walked 2 of the first 3 batters he faced, which both ended up scoring...permitted 8 of the first 18 batters to reach base on 4 walks and 4 hits...leadoff batter reached safely in each of the first 4 innings...surrendered a solo home run to Franklin Gutierrez to lead off the 3rd, but allowed just 3 singles and a walk over the next 3 innings...Texas scored the go-ahead run on a balk in the 10th.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 5-2 with a 2.64 ERA (21 ER/71.2 IP) in 14 games/10 starts in his career vs. OAK...has gone 1-0, 2.63 (4 ER/13.2 IP) in a pair of starts against the A's this season, both at the Coliseum...is winless in 4 starts overall since his victory on Aug. 10 at Oakland (8.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 10 SO, 1 WP, 112 pitches/77 strikes)...all 4 hits were singles, and he did not allow a runner to reach 3rd base, while just 3 reached 2nd...took a no decision in the Rangers' 6-5, 10 inning win on 5/14 in Oakland (5.2 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 0 HR, 98 pitches/62 strikes)...was staked to a 3-0 lead, but departed with the game tied at 3 and a runner on base in the 6th inning...had retired 12 of the first 15 batters he faced, allowing single runners in the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th innings...last start was first QS vs. OAK since 9/20/11, a span of 3 non-QS...has won 5 straight decisions against the Athletics as a starter dating back to the start of the 2010 season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Is 7-1 with a 2.85 ERA (30 ER/94.2 IP) in 14 road starts...unbeaten in last 11 road starts at 6-0, 2.52 (21 ER/75.0 IP), 3rd-longest road unbeaten streak in club history (12--Charlie Hough, 9/15/86-6/19/87; 12--Gaylord Perry, 5/12-8/30/77)...ranks among A.L. road leaders in ERA (5th), strikeouts (T5th, 90), and wins (T7th)...has allowed just 4 HR on the road...has QS in 6 straight road starts and 8 of 9...has 3 road starts in '13 of 7.0+ IP, 0 R, 4-or-fewer hits, tied for most in majors with Justin Verlander, Francisco Liriano, and Madison Bumgarner.

WINS/LOSSES: Holland in 9 wins: 0.81 ERA (6 ER/66.1 IP), 70:17 K:BB; in other 18 starts: 4.28 ERA (54 ER/113.2 IP), 93:44 K:BB...has received just one run of support in his 6 losses...has 7.0+ IP and 3 ER-or-fewer in 4 of his 6 losses...Rangers are 18-9 in his 27 starts...his 37 wins since 2011 are 9th-most in the A.L.

VS. LEFT/RIGHT: Lefties are hitting 12 points better than right-handers in 2013 (.258 vs. LHB / .246 vs. RHB)...entering this season, career splits had RHB w/ .268 avg. and LHB at .241...LHB are hitting just .200 (19-95) over last 13 starts after hitting .344 (22-64) in his first 14 starts.

LONGBALLS: Has 16 starts w/ no HR allowed, T7th-most in the A.L...has permitted just 14 HR for the year and owns A.L.'s 8th-best HR/9 ratio (0.70)...entered 2013 with career 1.27 HR/9 ratio...has allowed 10 of the 14 HR at R.B.I.A...has 10 HR in last 18 starts...his 4 straight starts w/o a HR allowed from May 25-June 11 was 2nd-longest homerless streak of career (7 starts, Sept. 3, 2010-April 10, 2011); has 2 other streaks of 3 straight homerless games in '13...HR by Colby Rasmus on 6/16 vs. TOR (one HR by LHB in '13) snapped 12-month-long streak of 162 consecutive left-handed batters faced without allowing a HR (Dustin Ackley, 5/30/12)...also allowed HR to lefty Jason Castro on 8/21 vs. HOU...in 2012, set club records for HR allowed by a LHP (32, T5th-most in A.L.) and 30 HR allowed to RH batters.

2013: Has a 4.00 run support avg., 8th-lowest in A.L...has received 2-or-fewer runs of support in 9 of 27 starts...opponents batting .295 (74-251) w/ no outs, .221 (94-425) w/ one or 2 outs...opp. hitting .203 (30-148) w/ RISP, 5th-lowest in A.L...is 7-5, 2.90 (45 ER/139.2 IP) in 21 starts w/ A.J. Pierzynski, 2-1, 3.35 (15 ER/40.1 IP) in 6 starts w/ Geovany Soto...did not allow runs in 1st/2nd innings of first 13 starts...6 consecutive quality starts from June 27-July 25 matched career best (also Aug. 22-Sept. 19, 2012)...allowed 8+ hits in 4 straight starts, 5/31-6/16, 1st Texas pitcher since Scott Feldman (5 straight, 6/18/10-7/9/10)...had multiple walks in 6 straight starts from 6/21-7/19, T2nd-longest career streak...11 starts of 3+ walks, but one-walk-or-fewer in 10 starts...has been starting pitcher in 5 of the 8 games in which Texas bullpen has suffered a blown save in '13.

MAY: Was 4-0 with a 2.31 ERA (10 ER/39.0 IP) in May...his 4 victories matched his career high for wins in a month...set a new career high for strikeouts in a month (44)...was 2nd-highest K total in any month by a LHP in Rangers history (Cliff Lee, 47) in Aug. 2010...ranked among A.L. leaders for May in wins (T2nd), ERA (3rd), and K's (T4th).

OTHER STARTS: Took a ND in season debut in Rangers' home opener on 4/5 vs. LAA (7.0 IP, 2 R-ER)...took loss in Rangers' 2-0 defeat on 4/10 vs. TB (8.0 IP, 2 R-ER), club's first shutout defeat at home since 8/25/11 vs. BOS...lost 4/27 at MIN after 2-out, 2-R HR in 6th by Josh Willingham...5/3 vs. BOS was his 6th career outing with at least 8.0 SHO IP...recorded 11th start in Texas history with 10+ hits, one-or-fewer runs, and 7.0+ IP in 4-1 victory on 5/8 at MIL...took ND in club's 10-inning win 5/14 at OAK (5.2 IP, 4 R-ER) despite being staked to early 3-0 lead...took ND in Texas' walkoff loss on 6/6 at BOS (6.0 IP, 2 R-ER)...exited with a 3-2 lead but Rangers lost on 3-run walkoff HR in 9th by David Ortiz...in Rangers' 6-4 victory at STL on 6/21, gave up 3 runs in 1st but took ND (7.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R-ER)...Cards went 0-for-final-16 vs. Holland w/ 2 BB...threw 6th career CG SHO, a 2-hitter 6/27 at Yankee Stadium...earned win on 7/8 at BAL in matchup with Scott Feldman (6.2 IP, 10 H, 5 R-3 ER)...2nd win of '13 when allowing 10-or-more hits, first Texas starter to win more than one in a season since 2006 (A. Eaton, R. Tejeda)...ended Max Scherzer's 13-0 unbeaten start in 7-1 win at DET on 7/13 despite tying career high with 5 walks (7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-ER, 7 SO)...2nd

this season to allow 10 baserunners but only one run, both times completing 7.0 IP in a win...started the first game out of the All-Star break on 7/19 vs. BAL and took first loss since 6/16...suffered tough-luck defeat on 7/25 vs. NYY (7.1 IP, 2 R-ER)...took ND in Rangers' 14-11, 10-inning win on 7/30 vs. LAA despite leaving with 6-4 lead (6.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER)...in a wild finish, Leonys Martin hit a walk-off 3-R HR in the 10th, the 2nd of 3 consecutive walk-off HR for Texas in a series sweep of the Halos...earned 9th win with 8.0 shutout innings and 10 strikeouts in Rangers' 4-0 win in rubber game on 8/4 at OAK, with all 4 hits allowed singles and not a single runner reaching 3rd base...took ND on 8/10 at HOU despite quality start, as he was in line for the loss until Elvis Andrus' game-tying 2-run HR in the 7th...took ND in Rangers' 3-1 loss on Fri. vs. SEA (7.0 SHO IP, 2 H) after M's had a 2-R HR by Kyle Seager and solo HR by Justin Smoak vs. bullpen...3rd start of 7.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer hits in 2013, most such starts by a Texas pitcher in a single season since Nolan Ryan did it 4 times in 1991...it was just the 4th start in Rangers history for a pitcher to go 7.0+ IP, allowing no runs and 2-or-fewer hits, without recording the victory (last Esteban Loaiza on 4/16/00 at CLE)...took ND in Rangers' 5-4, walkoff win on 8/21 vs. HOU, 4th time in '13 that Holland has left in position to win.

The 22-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 15th start and appearance in the middle game of this series tomorrow...tied for most wins among A.L. rookies (also TB's Chris Archer-8)...had **A.L.-best 5 wins in August**, tied for the ML lead last month and most ever in any single month by a Texas rookie...first Texas rookie ever to win 5 consecutive starts...went 5-0, 3.06 (12 ER/35.1 IP) w/ 11 BB and 26 SO in his 5 August starts and is 5-0, 2.74 (13 ER/42.2 IP) his last 6 starts to drop season figure from 4.37 to 3.58...last 3 wins have come in matchups against Felix Hernandez (twice) and Chris Sale...earned win in last start on Wed. at SEA, a 12-4 Texas victory (6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R-ER, 2 BB, 3 SO, 2 HR, 100 pitches/62 strikes)...gave up a pair of solo HR, both to LHB (Dustin Ackley and Kyle Seager), this after permitting just 2 HR to LHB in his career entering that start...the win secured a series sweep for Texas, as Felix Hernandez was charged with a career-high 9 R (8 ER) in 3.0+ innings...is 8-2 with a 3.48 ERA (32 ER/82.2 IP) in 13 starts since his most recent call-up on 6/22...his 8 wins in that span lead the club, 3 more than Yu Darvish...Perez is the first Texas pitcher to win 5 straight starts (zero no decisions) since Ryan Dempster won 5 in a row, Aug. 20-Sept. 12, 2012...only other Texas starter this season with even a 5-game win streak (including no decisions) was Yu Darvish (5, 4/19-5/16)...has not faced Oakland in 2013, as all 3 starts came last year: 1-2, 9.90 (11 ER/10.0 IP) in 3 G/GS...lone win vs. A's came in first career start (2nd career appearance) on 6/30/12 in Arlington (5.1 IP, 2 R-ER), a 7-2 Texas victory over Tommy Milone which gave Texas a 13.0-game lead on Oakland...only career start at the Coliseum was 10/1/12 at OAK (L, 4.0 IP, 6 H, 4 R-ER), a 4-3 Texas defeat that trimmed club's division lead to 1.0 game with 2 to play...served as Rangers' 26th man for split doubleheader on 5/27 at ARI, starting and losing the day game...went 5-1 with a 1.75 ERA (7 ER/36.0 IP) and 28 SO against 8 BB in 6 starts with Round Rock...was vying for a spot in Opening Day rotation in March, but began the year on the Rangers' 15-day disabled list with a fractured bone in his left forearm (hit by Brad Miller line drive on 3/3 in Surprise) and stayed in Arizona when the club broke camp.
