WINS OF LATE: Texas has won 23 of 32, making this just the 3rd season in club history with a span of 23 wins in 32 games...club also did it in July/ August 1977 and June/July/August 1990.

DIVISION RACE: The Rangers have lost 3.0 games in the standings in the last 4 days and are tied with Oakland for the A.L. West lead with 25 games to play...Texas had held sole possession of first place for 23 straight days since the last tie with the A's on 8/9...club has held at least a share of the lead for 27 straight days beginning August 7...prior to that, Texas had not held at least a share of first place since 7/1...in the last 35 days, Texas has gained 6.0 games in the standings, coming back from a season high 6.0-game deficit on July 28-29...team spent 36 straight days in 2nd from 7/2-8/6 and has now held at least a share of the division lead for 91 days in 2013...Texas had a season-high 7.0-game lead through games of 5/15 and 5/16...beginning June 8, 2010, the Rangers have spent 555 of 638 days in 1st place.

The 27-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 27th start and appearance of the season in the finale of this 3-game series in Oakland tomorrow afternoon...finished August with 64 strikeouts, highest single-month total in club history, highest total for any pitcher since ARI's Randy Johnson in Aug. 2002 (70)...was defeated for the first time since July 27 in the Rangers' 3-2 loss to the Twins on Friday night in Arlington (6.2 IP, 3 H, 3 R-ER, 2 BB, 11 SO, 2 HR, 107 pitches/65 strikes)...did not allow a hit until a 2-run home run by Chris Herrmann in the 7th inning...surrendered a go-ahead home run to the next batter Justin Morneau...suffered the loss despite posting at least 6.0 no-hit innings for a 3rd time this season (others 4/2 at HOU and 8/12 at HOU)...Darvish and Mets' Matt Harvey both have 3 games of 6.0-or-more no-hit innings in 2013 after only one pitcher pulled that trick in 17 seasons from 1996-2012: Justin Verlander in 2011...has 11 games in 2013 of 6.0+ IP and 3-or-fewer hits (single-season club record), going just 6-3 in those contests (all quality starts)...he is the first pitcher in Rangers history to lose 3 games in a season in outlings of 6.0+ IP and 3-hits-or-less, with Texas scoring 3 total runs in those 3 defeats...has received 2 runs-or-less of support in 13 of 26 starts, all outings of 6.0+ IP...is 3-5, 2.17 (21 ER/87.0 IP) in those contests...236 strikeouts this season, 2nd-highest single-season total in Rangers history behind Nolan Ryan's 301 in 1989...Leads the majors in strikeouts and is averaging a ML high 12.16 strikeouts per 9.0 innings this season...last ML pitcher to average at least 12 strikeouts per 9.0 innings over a season with at least 20 starts was Randy Johnson with an ML record 13.4 K's/9.0 IP in 2001 (Elias)...in 8 starts since coming off the DL on July 22, is 4-2 with a 2.11 ERA (13 ER/55.1 IP) and 79 strikeouts...has ML-leading 5 starts this season with 14+ K's...his .189 opp. avg. is best in AL. and 2nd-lowest in the majors...holding right-handed batters to a ML-lo
