WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers and A's conclude this series today... Texas snapped a 2-game losing streak on Tuesday with 1st win since Saturday vs. MIN...team has dropped back-to-back games just twice over last 33 contests...club has dropped 3 of 5 but has won 5 of 8, 9 of 14, 19 of 27, and 24 of last 33...the Rangers' **24-9 (.727) record beginning 7/29 is best in the A.L.** and 3rd-best in MLB to LAD at .794 (27-7) and ATL at .758 (25-8)...club went 3-12 from 7/10-28 before current 24-8 run...the Rangers went an A.L.-best 20-7 (.741) in August, T2nd-best in majors and just the 4th month of 20+ wins in team history...club has gone 42-29 since June 17...current 80-58 (.580) record is 3rd-best in the A.L. and is 6th-best in the majors, the 2nd-best 138-game record in club history (see charts)...team has been 20+ games over .500 for the last 15 days with season best 23 games over .500 twice, last on 8/31 (79-56)...club was 13-1 over 14 G from 7/29-8/12, just 3rd season in Texas history to win 13 of 14...season-high 8-game win streak from 8/4-12 is T7th-longest ever...since start of 2010, the Rangers have .575 (359-265) winning percentage, 2nd best record in ML in that span behind NYY (.579, 361-263).

WINS OF LATE: Texas has won 24 of 33, making this just the 3rd season in club history with a span of 24 wins in 33 games...club also did it in July/August 1977 and June/July/August 1990.

AND WINS FOR THE SEASON: The Rangers' next victory will their 81st of the season...it would be the 5th consecutive year that Texas has had a .500 or better record, extending its own club record...previous high was 3 twice, 1977-79 and 1989-91...of the ML teams who have already assured themselves of a .500 or better record in 2013, only Detroit (8th straight year) and Atlanta (6th straight year) have longer current streaks.

DIVISION RACE: The Rangers regained sole possession of 1st place in the A.L. West with Tuesday's win, the 1st time Texas has gained a full game in the standings since 8/23 (2.5 to 3.5 GA)...club has been alone in 1st for 24 of last 25 days and has held at least a share of the lead for 28 straight days beginning August 7...prior to that, Texas had not held at least a share of first place since 7/1...**in the last 36 days, Texas has gained 7.0 games in the standings**, coming back from a season high 6.0-game deficit on July 28-29 to the current 1.0 game lead...team spent 36 straight days in 2nd from 7/2-8/6 and has now held at least a share of the division lead for 92 days in 2013...Texas had a season-high 7.0-game lead through games of 5/15 and 5/16...beginning June 8, 2010, the Rangers have spent 556 of 639 days in 1st place.

IN THE A.L. WEST: The Rangers have won 7 of last 8 and 21 of 23 vs. the A.L. West with longer streak beginning July 4...Texas is 45-17 (.726) against the A.L. West Division in 2013, the highest winning percentage and most wins for any ML team in its own division...next-best on the list is Atlanta (40-21, .656 vs. NL East)...the 45 wins are the most by the Rangers vs. one division since 49 vs. the A.L. East in 1993 most vs. the A.L. West since 47 in 1996, both with a balanced schedule...in the Rangers' 24-9 stretch beginning July 29, the club is 20-4 vs. A.L. West opponents and 4-5 vs. all other foes...Rangers are 26-8 in A.L. West parks, winning 12 of 13.

ON THE ROAD: Texas has won 14 of its last 18 road games beginning August 2...at 41-29 (.586), the Rangers have the majors' 2nd best road record to LAD at .597 (40-27)...it matches the team's best 70-game road mark ever with 1977 (42-29 after 71 games)...this is the 3rd consecutive season that the Rangers have posted a winning record on the road, the longest such streak in team history...club was 44-37 in 2011 and 43-38 in 2012.

COMING-FROM-BEHIND: Tuesday was the Rangers' 43rd come-from-behind win of the season, the most in the majors (ATL-41) and the team's most n a year since a club-record tying 45 in 2007 (also 1986 and 1999).

VERSUS OAKLAND: Texas is 9-6 vs. the A's in 2013, winning 5 of 7 and 7 of the last 10 meetings, the longer span beginning May 22...the 9 wins vs. OAK are one more than all of 2012 (8-11)...Rangers have a 30-23 edge since 2011...Texas is 5-3 at the Coliseum in 2013 after losing 7 of 9 here a year ago...in the all-time series, Texas leads 324-309 overall with the A's having 166-151 edge in OAK...final series is 3 games in TEX, 9/13-15.

5 OR LESS RUNS ALLOWED: The Rangers have allowed 5-runs-or-less in 31 consecutive games beginning July 31, the longest such streak in the majors since 31 games for the L.A. Dodgers, 8/10-9/12/09...it is the A.L.'s best streak in the designated hitter era (beg. 1973):

MARTIN PEREZ extended his winning streak to 6 on Tuesday...notes:

- the 6 straight wins tie the 4th longest active win streak in the A.L. and is the longest winning streak overall by a Texas pitcher this season.
- Perez has won each of his last 6 starts, the 1st Texas pitcher to win at least 6 straight starts since Kenny Rogers won 8 in a row, 4/27-6/5/05...it is the longest current string of consecutive winning starts in the majors and ties the 2nd longest of the season, topped only by 8 for Bartolo Colon...it is the longest streak for an ML rookie since NYY's Ivan Nova won 8 starts in a row, 7/1-9/2/11 (Elias).
- Perez leads all A.L. rookies with 9 wins, tying Matt Harrison in 2008 for the most ever by a Ranger left-hander...only ML rookie LH with more wins is LAD's Hyun-Jim Ryu with ML rookie best 13.
- Perez' 9 wins since his recall on June 22 matches the 3rd most in the ML n that span: 11--Greinke; 10--Liriano; 9--Perez, Kershaw, and Scherzer.

THE LONG BALL: Home runs have accounted for 29 of 52 Texas runs (18 total HR) over the last 11 games (55.8%) after producing just 5 of 58 runs in the previous 10 contests (8.6%)...Texas is T4th in A.L. with 158 HR.

MITCH MORELAND homered for the 4th time in 8 games beginning 8/26 on Tuesday...is tied for the ML lead with 5 others for most HR in that span, a list that includes the A's Coco Crisp and Brandon Moss...Moreland's 21 HR while playing 1B are most for a Texas 1B since Mark Teixeira (33) in 2006.

DAY BASEBALL: This is 3rd day game in last 4 total games for Texas...club is 18-20 (.474) in day games in 2013, losing 2 straight and 4 of the last 5...team's 3.31 day ERA is 3rd best in the A.L. (BOS-3.11; KC-3.28) and current mark would be Texas' 2nd lowest ever in a full season (3.30 in 1989)...team is hitting .237 in daytime, 12th in A.L., a mark that would be 3rd lowest all-time in team history (.225 in 1972; .236 in 1988)...Rangers' 134 runs in day games are 2nd fewest in A.L. (HOU-125).

ON TO ANAHEIM: After an off-day on Thursday, the Rangers close this trip with 3 games against the Angels in Anaheim...Texas is 10-2 vs. LAA in 2013, winning the last 7 meetings since a loss on 4/23 at Anaheim...Texas has won 5 of 6 at Angel Stadium in 2013.

SHORTS: Ron Washington won his 600th game as Rangers manager on Tuesday, extending his club record...Texas rookies have 23 wins this season, 2nd most in ML behind STL (29)...Texas leads the A.L. with 27 pinch hits and is 2nd with .290 BA (27-93)...Rangers have lost their last 3 "rubber" games in a 3-game series since winning on 8/4 at OAK.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#11 Yu Darvish, RHP (12-6, 2.73)

TODAY: The 27-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 27th start and appearance of the season in the finale of this 3-game series in Oakland this afternoon...finished August with 64 strikeouts, highest single-month total in club history, highest total for any pitcher since ARI's Randy Johnson in Aug. 2002 (70)...was defeated for the first time since July 27 in the Rangers' 3-2 loss to the Twins on Friday night in Arlington (6.2 IP, 3 H, 3 R-ER, 2 BB, 11 SO, 2 HR, 107 pitches/65 strikes)...

RANK AND FILE: Leads majors with 236 strikeouts and 12.16 SO/9...his .189 opp. avg. is best in A.L. and 2nd-lowest in the majors (Kershaw-.186)...ranks among A.L. leaders in ERA (2nd), wins (T9th), win pct. (T7th, .706), opp. OPS (2nd, .597), opp. OBP (3rd, .265), opp. SLG (4th, .331), and WHIP (3rd, 1.02)...averages 110.1 pitches/game, 2nd-highest in majors (C.J. Wilson-110.2)...holding right-handed batters to a ML-low .153 average, lowest single-season mark in club history (Ryan, .157 in 1991).

QUALITY AND QUANTITY: Darvish has reeled off 8 straight quality starts, the 2nd-longest streak of his career (9, 8/12/12-4/2/13)...is longest by a Ranger this season and longest active streak in the A.L.

LAST START: Was defeated for the first time since July 27 in the Rangers' 3-2 loss to the Twins on Friday night in Arlington (6.2 IP, 3 H, 3 R-ER, 2 BB, 11 SO, 2 HR, 107 pitches/65 strikes)...did not allow a hit until the 2-run home run by Chris Herrmann in the 7th inning...surrendered a go-ahead home run to the next batter Justin Morneau...suffered the loss despite posting at least 6.0 no-hit innings for a 3rd time this season (others 4/2 at HOU and 8/12 at HOU).

ON THE ROAD: Is 11-9 with a 3.36 ERA (65 ER/174.1 IP) in 26 career road starts and is 5-2, 2.62 (22 ER/75.2 IP) in 11 road starts in 2013, 3rd in A.L. in road ERA...has allowed 3+ runs in 5 of last 8 road starts.

DISABLED LIST: Was on the 15-day disabled list from July 11 (retro July 7) to July 22 with a right trapezius strain...it was the first trip to the DL in his big league career.

VS. OAKLAND: Is 1-4 with a 4.22 ERA (15 ER/32.0 IP) in 5 career starts against the A's, including a loss in his lone career start at the O.co Coliseum on June 22, 2012 (5.1 IP, 6 H, 6 R-ER, 1 HR, 6 BB, 4 SO, 110 pitches/61 strikes)...has dropped 4 straight starts vs. Oakland, including both starts in 2013...allowed season-high 5 runs (4 ER) in 6-2 loss on 6/18 vs. OAK, 2 HR allowed after none in his previous 3 starts...suffered 1-0 loss on 5/21 vs. OAK, permitting only run of the game on a solo HR to Cespedes...of 6 runs allowed to A's this season, 3 have come via HR.

STRIKEOUTS: Leads the majors with 236 strikeouts (next-most: Scherzer, 209) and 12.16 SO/9 (next-highest: Scherzer, 9.88)...has struck out 33.9 percent of batters faced this season (236 of 697)...his 457 career strikeouts are the 4th-most by any pitcher in the first 2 seasons of a career, trailing only Dwight Gooden (544), Herb Score (508), and Hideo Nomo (470)...reached 207 strikeouts in his 23rd start this season, which Elias says is fewest starts to reach 200 K's since 2002, when D-Backs' Curt Schilling (22 GS) and Randy Johnson (23 GS) both did it...only other Texas pitcher to reach 200 K's in 23-or-fewer starts in a season was Nolan Ryan (211 K's in 23 starts in 1989)...has 19 G of 10+ K's in first 55 career outings, 2nd-most in a pitcher's first 55 career games since 1916, trailing only Dwight Gooden (22)...became just the 2nd pitcher in ML history to record at least 300 strikeouts in his 1st 37 career big league games, joining Gooden (319 in 1984-85)...his 457 career K's are the most in the majors since start of 2012...this year, became just the 4th pitcher in A.L. history with 105 K's through 11 starts in a season...first Ranger ever with 5+ K's in each of his first 18 starts in a season, joining Max Scherzer (24) this season as first A.L. pitcher to do that since NYY's Roger Clemens (19) in 2001...his 58 K's in April were most for a ML pitcher in any month since ARI's Randy Johnson had 62 in Aug. 2004...has set monthly club records for K's in April (58), May (47), and Aug. (64) this season, came within one of June mark with 46.

HIGH-K GAMES: Has 5 starts this season w/ 14+ K's; all other ML pitchers have a total of 3 G of 14+ K's...career-high 15 K's on Aug. 12 at HOU, 2nd-highest total in majors in 2013 (DET's Anibal Sanchez-17 K's, 4/26 vs. ATL)...it was his 4th start of 14+ K's and one-or-zero walks in '13, just the 3rd pitcher in the live ball era (since 1920) to accomplish that feat (Pedro Martinez-5 in 1999, and Randy Johnson-4 in 1999)...his 5 G of 14+ K's are most in a single season in Rangers history (Ryan-3 in 1990)...owns 5 of the 15 games of 14+ strikeouts in club history, 2nd to Ryan's 7...ML-best 11 games of 10+ SO in 2013, 5 in last 7 starts, and his 19 career are 3rd-most in Rangers history behind Nolan Ryan (34) and Bobby Witt (24)...those 19 games also lead the majors since the start of 2012 (next-most: 10-Scherzer, and Sale)...his 11 G of 10+ K's in '13 are 2nd-most in single season in Rangers history (Ryan-18 in 1989)...since the start of 2000, he is one of only 6 different pitchers to have 10 or more 10-K games in a season: 4-Randy Johnson (2000-01-02-04); 2-Curt Schilling (2001-02); 1-Pedro Martinez (2000); Kerry Wood (2003); Johan Santana (2004).

FIRST HALF K'S: Darvish's 157 strikeouts were the highest total prior to the All-Star break in club history, most in majors since 2002 (C. Schilling-186, R. Johnson-171), most in A.L. since 1999 (P. Martinez-184).

2013: Has ML-best 11 starts with 6.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer hits, most ever in a single season by a Ranger...opponents are batting .107 (42-391) w/ 23 BB, 4 HBP, and 236 K's in counts that reach 2 strikes...on 1st pitch: .308 (16-52), 5 HR...1st time thru lineup: .226 (48-212); 2nd time: .160 (34-212); 3rd time: .179 (33-184); 4th time: .200 (4-20)...batters leading off an inning are hitting .171 (27-158) with 19 BB (.268 OBP)...went his first 37.2 innings this season without allowing a HR...0 HR in first 5 starts, 14 HR in next 11 starts...8 HR last 10 starts...prior to May, had allowed multiple HR in a game just once in his first 35 career starts, but allowed 2+ HR in 5 of 11 starts in May/June...22 HR are 7 more than 2012 total...is 7-2, 1.67 (16 ER/86.1 IP) in 13 starts following a Texas loss.

APRIL: Was voted Rangers Player of the Month for April by media that cover the team on a regular basis...went 5-1, 2.33 (10 ER/38.2 IP) with 58 K's and 13 BB in 6 starts, allowing a .170 (23-135) opp. average...5 wins tied the April club record, 6th pitcher to do it, first since Aaron Sele and Rick Helling were both 5-0 in April 1998...his 58 K's led the majors.

HOUSTON, YU HAVE A PROBLEM: In club's 2-1 victory on 8/12 at HOU, Darvish tossed 5.2 perfect innings and 7.1 no-hit innings (W, 8.0 IP, 1 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, career-high 15 SO, 1 HR, 115 pitches), settling for a combined one-hitter with Joe Nathan (1.0 IP)...only hit was a solo HR to Carlos Corporan w/ one out in 8th...according to Elias, he is the only ML pitcher since 1900 to win 2 games in a career (4/2 at HOU & 8/12 at HOU) with 14+ K's, one-or-zero hits, and one-or-zero walks...Elias says Darvish is first pitcher in expansion era (since 1961) w/ multiple no-hit bids of 7+ IP against same team in a season...other notes: -Elias says the only other pitcher since 1900 to have a 15-strikeout game with a home run as only hit allowed was BOS' Pedro Martinez on 9/10/99 at NYY. -It marked first ML outing of 15+ K's, one-or-zero hits, and one-or-zero walks since ARI's Randy Johnson on 7/18/01 at SD. -Elias says the last Texas pitcher to have 2 no-hitters broken up in 8th-or-later in same season was Nolan Ryan in 1989 (5x) only other Ranger with multiple starts of 8.0+ IP and one-or-zero hits in a season was Ryan (3 in 1989). -His 15 K's were a career high, 2nd-highest total in MLB in 2013 (DET's Anibal Sanchez had 17 K's on 4/26 vs. ATL).

OTHER STARTS: Won 5th consecutive decision in 10-4 victory on 5/16 vs. DET (8.0 IP, 4 R-ER)...career-high 130 pitches, most by a Texas starter since R.A. Dickey, 131 on 5/2/04 vs. BOS...suffered 1-0 loss on 5/21 vs. OAK, permitting only run of the game on Cespedes solo HR...took ND in 5-4 loss on 5/27 at ARI (N), 2nd game of Memorial Day split DH (7.2 IP, 4 R-ER)...was 1st pitcher to take ND in a start of 14+ SO/0 BB since ARI's Randy Johnson (14 SO/0 BB) on 7/25/04 vs. COL...took ND on 6/2 vs. KC (7.0 IP, 3 H, 0 R)...exited with 1-0 lead before Cotts suffered blown save in 8th...pitched first 7.0 innings of 18-inning, 4-3 loss on 6/8 at TOR...permitted career-high 3 HR (Japan or MLB) in ND on 6/25 at NYY, a 4-3 Texas walk-off defeat (5.1 IP, 7 H, 3 R-ER, 3 HR)...took loss in Rangers' 1-0 shutout defeat, 7/27 at CLE, game's lone run a Bourn leadoff HR, first time Rangers had ever lost 1-0 on a leadoff HR...it was his 2nd 1-0 defeat of the year.

ALMOST PERFECT: Retired the 1st 26 batters he faced in his season debut April 2 at Houston before a single up the middle by Marwin Gonzalez (8.2 IP, 1 H, 0 R-ER, 0 BB, 14 SO, 0 HR, 111 pitches/78 strikes)...Elias notes: -Darvish was the 1st Ranger to ever lose a no-hitter as late as 8.2 innings, the first in the majors to do so since Detroit's Armando Galarraga on June 2, 2010 vs. CLE. DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN: Darvish was the 7th pitcher in major league history since at least 1916 to work at least 8.2 IP, allow one or fewer hits and no walks and fan at least 14.
