#### THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: <u>Sept. 5</u>

1971 - In his ML debut, RHP J.R. Richard strikes out 15 in a 5-3 win in the 2nd game of a doubleheader vs. SF at Candlestick Park. His 15 K's ties the ML record for a debut. RHP Jack Billingham whiffs K'd 11 Giants in the opener, a 1-0 shutout. The combined 26 strikeouts sets a major league mark by one team in a twinbill.

1969 - Denis Menke hits a walk-off, 2-run HR in the 9th off RHP Gaylord Perry for a 2-0 win over the Giants in the Astrodome, Larry Dierker goes the distance, scattering 4 hits for his 18th win and fans 9 to pass 200 strikeouts for the season.

ROAD TRIP: Tonight's game is the 1st of a OBIE-WON: Rookie LHP Brett Oberholtzer 7-game road trip for the Astros...after this 4-game series in OAK (Thu-Sun), they will visit SEA for 3 games at Safeco Field (Mon-Wed).

HOMESTAND WRAP-UP: The Astros are coming off a 7-game homestand, during which they were 2-5 (1-3 vs. SEA, 1-2 vs. MIN, respectively).

VS. A's: The current series is the final one of the season vs. the Athletics...in 2013...HOU took two of three from the A's in the last series between the two clubs, 8/13-15 at O.co Coliseum.

NO REST: Tonight's game is the 14th game of a stretch of 20 games in 20 days (8/23-9/4) for the Astros...they are 5-8 thus far in that stretch.

TONIGHT'S GAME: RHP Brad Peacock (3-5) will make his 11th start of the season and his 3rd vs. the A's as he takes on RHP Sonny Gray (2-2)... since his recall from Triple A OKC on 8/4, he has posted a 3.93 ERA (16ER/36.2IP) in his five starts...was acquired by HOU from OAK along with Chris Carter and Max Stassi as part of offseason deal involving Jed Lowrie.

REHAB FOR CORPY: Catcher Carlos Corporan will begin a rehab assignment with Corpus Christi tonight...Corporan has been on the DL since 8/20 after sustaining a concussion on 8/19

WAIVER CLAIM: The Astros claimed OF Eric Thames off waivers from BAL today...Thames will report to Triple A Oklahoma City.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP: Trevor Crowe singled home Jonathan Villar in the bottom of the 9th inning yesterday afternoon to give the Astros a 6-5, walk-off win vs. MIN...LHP Erik Bedard (4-10) picked up the win in relief...RHP Jordan Lyles (6.1 IP, 3 ER) had ND as the starter...the Astros tallied 12 hits in the game...Villar (2x5), Crowe (2x5), Jose Altuve (2x4), Brett Wallace (2x4)and Chris Carter (2x3) all had multi-hit games.

IT'S A WALKOFF: Yesterday's 6-5 win over the Twins was the Astros 4th walkoff victory of the season...their last was a 5-4 win on 7/23 vs. OAK.

ROAD WARRIOR: Chris Carter has been one of the most productive hitters on the road in the AL in 2013...he has 16 RBI in his last 12 road games... overall, he ranks 4th in the AL in road HR (17), T-4th in road RBI (49) and 6th in road SLG (.564).

CASTRO UPDATE: An MRI done Tuesday on Jason Castro's right knee revealed a cyst in the medial aspect of the knee...he is considered dayto-day...Castro left Monday afternoon's game vs. MIN due to discomfort in his right knee.

ROOKIE STARTERS: The four rookie starters currently in the Astros rotation have pitched well over the past several weeks...since 7/12, RHP Jarred Cosart, RHP Brad Peacock, LHP Brett Oberholtzer and RHP Paul Clemens have a combined 2.59 ERA (39ER/135.1IP) in their 22 starts in that span.

continued his solid pitching with Sunday's 2-0 shutout vs. SEA...since joining the rotation on 7/31, Oberholtzer is 4-1 in his six starts with a 1.98 ERA (9ER/41IP)...his ERA is tops in the AL in that span, while his teammate, Jarred Cosart, ranks 3rd.

CATCHING ON: Iason Castro has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games at .432 (16x37) with four HR and 10 RBI with a .919 SLG...August: In August, Castro hit .338 (27x80) with five HR, 14 RBI and a 1.067 OPS, the latter ranking 3rd in the AL for the month.

YOUNGBLOODS: The Astros have the youngest roster in the Majors with an average age of 26.0...the club is currently carrying 16 rookies on their active roster... Houston has had 14 players make their Major League debuts this season.

**LAST START - 8/30 vs. SEA:** received the loss after allowing 5 runs on 7 hits in 4.2 innings in the Astros 7-1 loss to the Mariners... marked his shortest appearance since his return to the rotation.

- has posted a 3.94 ERA (13ER/29.2IP) and 29 strikeouts in his 5 starts since returning to the Astros...3 of those 5 starts have been quality starts (first 3 QS of his career).
- over his last 8 MLB appearances (5 starts), owns a 3.93 ERA (16ER/36.2IP)...has allowed a .251 (58x231) opponent's batting average and a .190 (19x100) mark aganst right-handed hitters.
- PEACOCKIN': 25-year-old right-hander is 1 of 4 rookies currently in the Astros rotation...was recalled from Triple A prior to his start on 8/4 at MIN...overall, will be making his 13th career MLB start (11th of the season).
- began the year as the Astros No. 4 starter before getting moved to the bullpen...made his 1st appearance on an Opening Day roster this season with Houston.
- this marks his 3rd stint with the Astros this year, also: Opening Day-5/1, 5/28-6/8, 8/4-current.
- GRAND RETURN: in his 1st start back with the Astros on 8/4 at MIN, tossed a career-high 7.0 innings while recording a career-high 10 strikeouts...ties as the most strikeouts by an Astros pitcher this season in a single game...marked the most strikeouts by an Astros rookie since RHP Roy Oswalt fanned 12 on 9/9/01 vs. MIL.
- AT OKC: went 6-2 with a 2.73 ERA (24ER/79IP) and 76 strikeouts in 14 appearances (13 starts) at Triple A this year...was excellent before his recent recall, going 5-0 with a 1.73 ERA (11ER/57.1IP) in 9 starts since getting optioned back to the club on 6/8...had 49 strikeouts and 12 walks over that span.
- THIS SPRING: pitched his way into the starting rotation this spring after posting a 2.78 ERA (7ER/22.2IP) in 8 appearances, including 4 starts...over his final 5 appearances, posted a 0.94 ERA (2ER/19IP).
- IN 2012: spent last season in Oakland's organization at Triple A Sacramento, registering a 12-9 mark in 28 games, 25 starts...had career-highs in games and matched his high in games started... his 12 wins were the most in the A's farm system and tied for 4th in the PCL...ranked 3rd in the PCL in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (9.10) and 7th in strikeouts.
- vs OAK: will be making his 3rd start this season opposite his former organization...was traded to the Astros by the A's on 2/4/13.
- FIRST YEAR ASTRO: was acquired by Houston from Oakland along with OF Chris Carter and minor league C Max Stassi on Feb. 2 in exchange for IF Jed Lowrie...was the top pitching prospect in the A's minor league system at the time of the trade, according to Baseball America.
- 41st ROUND: drafted by Washington as a "draft and follow" after his senior season in the 41st round of the June 2006 draft, but did not sign immediately... elected to attend Palm Beach Community College (currently known as Palm Beach State College), where he went 8-2 with 82 strikeouts in 75 innings with the PBCC Panthers...signed by Washington following that season.
