A's vs. TWINS

The A's won the season series last year, 5-4...were 2-1 in Oakland and 3-3 in Minnesota...it was just their second season series win over the past seven years (also 2009) and the A's are 29-34 (.460) against Minnesota since 2006...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 278-289 against Minnesota...that includes 154-126 in Oakland and 124-163 in Minnesota...are 335-358 all-time against the Twins and have a 982-994 record against the

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes is 13 for 32 (.406) with two home runs, four RBI and six multiple hit games in eight games in September.

Josh Donaldson is batting .362 (17 for 47) with eight runs, eight doubles, one triple, two home runs, seven RBI and six multiple hit games over his last 13 games.

Brandon Moss is batting .339 (19 for 56) with 13 runs, eight home runs and 19 RBI over his last 20 games (since August 19)...the home runs are tied with Coco Crisp for the most in the majors over that span.

Dan Otero has yielded just two runs over his past 21 appearances (28.1 ip, 0.64 ERA) after allowing three runs in his first four games (3 er in 3.2 ip, 7.36 ERA).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1976 Vida Blue strikes out Danny Thompson of Texas for his 1140th as an Athletic, breaking Catfish Hunter's Oakland record...he would go on to strike out 1315 batters in his A's career which is still an Oakland record.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, eight of the last 10 and 11 of the last 14 to improve to a season-high 23 games over .500 at 83-60...that is the second best record in the American League (Boston, 87-58) and is tied for fourth best in the majors....have a two-game lead in the AL West over Texas, which is the A's largest lead since August 5 when they also had a two-game lead (led by 2½ on August 4)...have clinched a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's have put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight...are 27-21 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...have a six-game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card race...went 20-22 over the first 42 games this year and trailed Texas by 7½ games on May 16...then went a Major League best 43-21 from May 17 to July 29 to gain 13½ games in the standings and take a six-game lead in the AL West...compiled a 12-15 record from July 30 to August 29 to lose nine games in the standings and fall three back of Texas...are 8-2 since August 30 and have picked up five games on the Rangers...for the season, have spent 61 days in sole possession of first, 11 days tied for first, 78 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 224-180 (.554) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for the eighth best record in the majors over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .276 (279 for 1010) with 44 home runs over the last 30 games (since August 9)...lead the majors in home runs and slugging percentage (.479) over that span, rank second in extra base hits (110), fourth in runs (150), fifth in batting and doubles (59) and tied for sixth in triples (7)...rank third in the majors with 58 home runs since the All-Star Break...for the season, rank third in the American League in walks (506), tied for third in doubles (263) and fourth in triples (23) and extra base hits (442)...have the fifth lowest batting average (.249)...A's outfielders have combined for a .231 (383 for 1655) batting average, which is second lowest in the majors (Minnesota, .230)...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...however, have 66 home runs, which is tied for the most in the majors, and 216 RBI, which ranks fourth.

PITCHING: The A's had a 2.30 ERA (23 er in 90.0 ip) on the last homestand after posting a 5.88 ERA on the previous road trip...now have a 3.59 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.300) and second lowest batting average (.245) and slugging percentage (.383)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .302 was in 1972 (.284)...walked one batter or fewer in four consecutive games September 4-7, which matched the second longest streak in Oakland history...have just 373 walks for the season, which is the fewest in the AL...have four 10-game winners for the first time since 2006 (Blanton, Haren, Loaiza, Zito)...the four 10-game winners are tied for second most in the majors (Detroit, 5)...Dan Straily won his ninth game Saturday and the Oakland record for 10-game winners in one season is five (1968, 1971, 2004, 2005).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-5 with a 2.88 ERA (49 er in 153.0 ip) over the last 25 games (since August 14) after going 4-8 with a 4.88 ERA over the previous 12 contests...are 61-44 with a 3.77 ERA (364 er in 868.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in wins, ERA and complete games (6) and fifth in innings pitched.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's rank last in the majors with 1229 assists and are on pace for 1392, which would break the Major League record for fewest assists in a non-strike season (1393, San Francisco in 2008)...have just 102 double plays, which is also the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest double plays in a non-strike season is 115 in 1980.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are on a season-ending stretch where they will play 19 of their final 26 games against American League West competition (the exceptions are seven games with Minnesota)...started the season by going 13-3 against AL West teams compared to 5-15 against everyone else through May 9...are 24-24 against the West since May 10 while going 41-18 against the rest of baseball.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Texas (three games) tonight...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2) and Detroit (3-1) and are 36-33 (.522) on the road...went 8-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-0), Texas (2-1) and Houston (3-1)...the eight wins are the A's most on a homestand since going 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from August 7-16, 2006...have clinched a winning record at home for the fourth consecutive season...are 47-27 (.635) in Oakland, which is the second best home record in the American League (Boston, 47-25).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have used 44 players this year, marking the first time the A's have used fewer than 48 players in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 18 pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (17)...the 18 pitchers are tied for the fewest in the majors this year (Kansas City)...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6)...used the disabled list four times over a 33-day stretch from July 25-August 26 after a 77-day streak without placing a player on the DL...the 77-day streak is the second longest by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have used the DL 13 times for the season, which is the fewest since 2005 (8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-18 (.600) in one-run games...are tied for the American League lead in one run wins and have the fourth best record...A's pinch hitters are batting .138 (17 for 123), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch strikeouts (37) and rank second in plate appearances (142), home runs (4) and walks (16)...the plate appearances are the most since 2000 (162)...the A's went 14-13 in August to extend their streak of consecutive months with a winning record to nine dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...it matches the longest active streak in the majors (Atlanta).

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his career-high tying 29th start of the season...the A's are 16-12 (.571) in his starting assignments this year and 33-24 (.579) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 21 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 19 times.

NINE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 9-0 with a 2.59 ERA (35 er in 121.2 ip) and .205 (89 for 435) opponents batting average over his last 18 starts...the winning streak is a career high (previous: 4, Sept. 10-Oct. 1, 2012), an A's season high and is tied for second longest in the majors this year...it is the longest by an A's pitcher since Dan Haren won 10 straight from April 18-July 1, 2007...there have been seven winning streaks of 10 or more games in Oakland history...went 2-6 with a 5.76 ERA and .294 opponents batting average over his first 10 starts.

18-START UNBEATEN STREAK: His current nine-game winning streak includes nine no decisions and his 18-start unbeaten streak is the longest in Oakland history and the longest by an A's pitcher since Lefty Grove had a 21-start streak without a loss from April 22-August 19, 1931 (had 10 relief appearances during the streak, including one loss)...has left

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League with a .367 opponents slugging percentage and eighth with a .234 opponents batting average...is fifth with a .203 (27 for 133) average with runners in scoring position and sixth with a .209 (59 for 282) mark against right-handed hitters...the opponents cleanup hitter is batting .165 (13 for 79), which is third lowest in the majors...is fourth in the AL in fewest pitches per inning (15.0).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of the 17 games in which he took the loss or had a no decision...is 3-6 with two runs of support or fewer and 8-0 with three runs or more...is now 19-0 in 28 career starts with run support of three or more...is 23-2 with run support of two or more.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 3-3 with a 3.08 ERA (29 er in 84.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 8-3 with a 4.03 ERA (41 er in 91.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rect

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 19 home runs, which is an on-going career-high...yielded just 11 home runs in 181.1 innings last year, an average of 0.55 per nine innings...that was the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...13 of the 19 home runs he has allowed this year have come on the road, which is tied for eighth in the AL...13 have been solo shots.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has committed four errors in his last 10 starts after going errorless over his first 17 starts this year...his four errors are the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers.

IN AUGUST: Went 4-0 with a 2.23 ERA in six starts in the month of August...it marks the first four-win month of his career...tied for second in the American League in wins in August and ranked fourth in ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Had a streak of 16 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer from May 11 to August 9...tossed at least 3.0 innings in each start and his streak of 16 consecutive starts of three or more innings and six hits or fewer is second longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1916 (20, Trevor Cahill, May 5-Aug. 14, 2010)...allowed a .192 opponents batting average during the streak...had a streak of six consecutive no decisions from June 23 to July 28, which matched the longest by an Athletics starter since at least 1916...the others are Mike Norris (June 1-Aug. 6, 1983), Rick Langford (July 17, 1983-June 25, 1985) and Carlos Reyes (June 10-July 17, 1994)...had a 3.50 ERA and .191 opponents batting average during the streak...the A's lost five of the six games...tossed his first career complete game August 19 against Seattle, in the 55th start of his career...it was his 54th start as an Athletic and the 53 consecutive starts without a complete game is the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...was the first A's pitcher to go the distance in a walk-off win since Mark Mulder on July 28, 2004, also against Seattle...is was part of a three-game streak from August 14-24 where he tossed eight innings or more and allowed one run or fewer, matching the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 33 years.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to nine games in the A's 11-4 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Martin and a RBI single to Gentry in the third inning...blanked the Rangers on one hit over his final three innings...was relieved by Anderson to start the seventh with the A's leading 9-2.

PARKER vs. MINNESOTA: Is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 13 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 0 hr) in two career starts, both last year at Minnesota...the no decision came in the A's 3-2 loss at Minnesota May 29...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and four walks...left with a 1-0 lead but Fuentes allowed a three-run "walk-off" home run to Willingham for the blown save and loss...picked up the win in a 9-4 decision at Minnesota July 15...allowed a career-high tying nine hits in 6.0 innings but did not walk a batter for the first time in his career...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the bottom of the first...had a 6-1 lead when he allowed a Casilla sacrifice fly in the bottom of the second...had a 9-2 lead when he allowed runs in the sixth inning on a Doumit RBI double and a Dozier RBI ground out.

RHP Sonny Gray (2-3, 2.51 ERA): Is scheduled to make the ninth appearance and seventh start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento August 10 for his second stint with the A's this year...is 2-3 with a 2.77 ERA (12 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts since his return...has allowed 11 of his 15 runs this year in the first two innings of a game...has a 6.75 ERA (9 er in 12.0 ip) and .292 (14 for 48) opponents batting average in the first and second inning, a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) and .190 (8 for 42) average in innings three and four and a 0.00 ERA (19.2 ip) and .149 (10 for 67) average from the fifth inning on...is making his first career appearance against Minnesota.

- Is 3-2 with a 2.88 ERA in five games, all starts, in his career against the Twins (34.1 ip, 31 h, 11 r, 11 er, 2 bb, 25 so, 2 hr).
- Was placed on the 15-day DL May 1 with a sprained right ankle...was diagnosed with a navicular stress fracture of his right foot May 17 and was transferred to the 60-day DL June 14.
