The A's trail the season series 7-9 and need to win each of these three games in Texas to avoid losing the season series for the sixth time over the last eight seasons...are 4-5 in Oakland this year and 3-4 in Texas...are 69-80 (.463) against the Rangers since 2006...are 310-324 all-time against the Texas Rangers ...that breaks down to 167-151 Oakland and 143-173 in Texas...have an all-time record of 407-406 against the Rangers/S

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes is 18 for 43 (.419) with two home runs, 10 RBI and eight multiple hit games in 11 games in September.

**Coco Crisp** is batting .305 (25 for 82) with 23 runs, four doubles, one triple, nine home runs and 16 RBI over his last 20 games (since August 21)...the nine home runs are tied for the most in the majors over that span.

**Brandon Moss** is batting .344 (22 for 64) with 16 runs, eight home runs and 21 RBI over his last 22 games (since August 19)...the RBI are tied for second most in the majors over that span and the home runs rank third.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Rick Monday's 11<sup>th</sup> inning RBI single scores Catfish Hunter to give the A's a 2-1 win at Kansas City...Hunter pitches 10 innings, allowing a run on four hits, to become the A's second 20-game winner...in **2010** Bobby Cramer defeats the Kansas City Royals 5-3 in his Major League debut at the age of 30 to become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to start and win in his debut.

#### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the past six games, 10 of the last 13 and 13 of the last 17 to improve to a season-high 24 games over .500 at 85-61...have the second best record in the American League (Boston, 89-59) and are tied for fourth best in the majors...have a 3½ game lead in the AL West over Texas, which is the A's largest lead since August 3 when they also had a 3½ game lead...have clinched a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's have put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight...are 29-22 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...have a 6½ game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card race...went 20-22 over the first 42 games this year and trailed Texas by 7½ games on May 16...then went a Major League best 43-21 from May 17 to July 29 to gain 13½ games in the standings and take a six-game lead in the AL West...compiled a 12-15 record from July 30 to August 29 to lose nine games in the standings and fall three back of Texas...are 10-3 since August 30 and have picked up 6½ games on the Rangers...for the season, have spent 64 days in sole possession of first, 11 days tied for first, 78 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 226-181 (.555) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for the eighth best record in the majors over that span.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .284 (320 for 1125) with 49 home runs over the last 33 games (since August 9)...**lead the majors** in home runs, slugging percentage (.492) and extra base hits (127) over that span, rank second in runs (179), tied for second in triples (9) and are fourth in batting and doubles (68)...are tied for third in the majors with 63 home runs since the All-Star Break...for the season, rank second in the American League in doubles (273), third in walks (513) and extra base hits (459) and fourth in triples (25)...A's outfielders have combined for a .235 (397 for 1692) batting average, which is second lowest in the majors (Minnesota, ...33)...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...however, have 68 home runs, which is the most in the majors, and 227 RBI, which is tied for second...the A's recorded 18 runs and 22 hits on Wednesday...the runs were the A's most in a game since August 31, 2012, a 20-2 win vs. Boston...the hits were the most since July 20, 2009 when they also had 22 in a 14-13 win against Minnesota...tied Oakland record for most runs in a single inning (sixth time, last: June 18, 2000 at Kansas City).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.44 ERA (29 er in 107.0 ip) and .239 (97 for 406) opponents batting average over the past 12 games (since August 31)...now have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.300) and second lowest batting average (.244) and slugging percentage (.384)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .302 was in 1972 (.284)...have allowed just 383 walks for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League**...have four 10-game winners for the first time since 2006 (Blanton, Haren, Loaiza, Zito)...the four 10-game winners are tied for second most in the majors (Detroit, 5)...Dan Straily has won nine games and the Oakland record for 10-game winners in one season is five (1968, 1971, 2004, 2005).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 15-5 with a 2.84 ERA (54 er in 171.0 ip) over the last 28 games (since August 14) after going 4-8 with a 4.88 ERA over the previous 12 contests...are now 63-44 with a 3.75 ERA (369 er in 886.2 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in wins, ERA and complete games (6) and are fifth in innings pitched.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's rank last in the majors with 1261 assists and are on pace for 1399...the Major League record for fewest assists in a non-strike season is 1393 (San Francisco in 2008)...have just 105 double plays, which is also the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest double plays in a non-strike season is 115 in 1980.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** The A's are 7-3 on this season-ending stretch where they will play 19 of their final 26 games against American League West competition (the exceptions are seven games with Minnesota)...started the season by going 13-3 against AL West teams compared to 5-15 against everyone else through May 9...are 24-24 against the West since May 10 while going 43-19 against the rest of baseball.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on this six-game road trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2) and Detroit (3-1) and are 38-34 (.528) on the road, which is the fourth best road record in the American League...went 8-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-0), Texas (2-1) and Houston (3-1)...the eight wins were the A's most on a homestand since going 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from August 7-16, 2006...have clinched a winning record at home for the fourth consecutive season...are 47-27 (.635) in Oakland, which is the second best home record in the AL (Boston, 47-25).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have 34 players on the active roster...have used 44 players this year, marking the first time the A's have used fewer than 48 players in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 18 pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (17)...the 18 pitchers are tied for the fewest in the majors this year (Kansas City)...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6)...used the disabled list four times over a 33-day stretch from July 25-August 26 after a 77-day streak without placing a player on the DL...the 77-day streak is the second longest by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have used the DL 13 times for the season, which is the fewest since 2005 (8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-19 (.587) in one-run games...are tied for the American League lead in one run wins and have the fourth best record...A's pinch hitters are batting .136 (17 for 125), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch strikeouts (38) and rank second in plate appearances (144), home runs (4) and walks (16)...the plate appearances are the A's most since 2000 (162)...went 14-13 in August to extend their streak of consecutive months with a winning record to nine dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...it matches the longest active streak in the majors (Atlanta).

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 25<sup>th</sup> start of the season, his 11<sup>th</sup> since being recalled from Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year...the A's are 14-10 (.583) in his starting assignments this year and are 19-12 (.613) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 12 of his 24 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 14 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Leads American League rookies in games started (24), strikeouts (109) and innings pitched (134.1) and is tied for the lead in wins (9)...needs one more win to become the 11<sup>th</sup> rookie in Oakland history to win 10 games...his 109 strikeouts are tied for ninth most by an Oakland rookie.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (3 er in 18.0 ip) and .203 (13 for 64) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents average in his first seven starts after the All-Star Break...his five losses are tied for fifth most in the American League since the break...has tossed fewer than five innings in four of his 10 starts since the break.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .239 opponents batting average...his .204 (40 for 196) opponents average the first time through the lineup is fifth lowest in the American League...has issued 32 of his 47 walks to left-handed hitters.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-2 with a 3.46 ERA (25 er in 65.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA (37 er in 69.1 ip) in 13 starts on four days...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 2.98 ERA (30 er in 90.2 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-6 with a 5.31 ERA (49 er in 83.0 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received 16 runs of support in his last three starts after receiving six runs of support total in his first seven starts after the break...has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 24 starts for the season and is 5-7 in those games...is 4-0 with support of three or more runs

**THE LONG BALL:** Has allowed 13 home runs in his last 14 starts after a six-game, 40.0-inning homerless streak...has surrendered 16 home runs for the season...11 have been solo shots, 10 have come on the road and eight have come in the first two innings of a game.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA (12 er in 48.0 ip) and .181 (30 for 167) opponents average in eight starts during the day compared to 5-6 with a 5.21 ERA (50 er in 86.1 ip) and .267 (90 for 337) opponents batting average in 16 starts at night...has allowed 15 of his 16 home runs at night.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 4-4 with a 5.34 ERA (35 er in 59.0 ip) in 11 starts against American League West competition compared to 5-3 with a 3.23 ERA (27 er in 75.1 ip) in 13 starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 5-4 with a 5.21 ERA (47 er in 81.1 ip) in 15 starts against the West, 6-4 with a 3.12 ERA (32 er in 92.1 ip) in 16 starts against everyone else.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Had his career-high and A's season-high tying five-game losing streak snapped August 28 at Detroit...posted a 4.09 ERA and .300 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned six starts from July 20 to August 17...the losing streak came on the heels of a five-game winning streak from May 21 to July 9...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

**LAST START:** He won his third consecutive start in the A's 2-1 win over Houston last Saturday in Oakland...tossed seven shutout innings and allowed just two hits...Villar single with two outs in the third and Dominiguez double to lead off the fifth...retired each of the final nine batters he faced...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead and Otero allowed a run in the eighth.

**STRAILY vs. TEXAS:** Is 2-1 with a 4.23 ERA (27.2 ip, 22 h, 15 r, 13 er, 10 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in five career starts...is 1-0 with a 3.44 ERA (7 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts in Texas and 1-1 with a 5.79 ERA (6 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...is 2-1 with a 5.14 ERA (21.0 ip, 17 h, 13 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 12 so) in four starts this year...the loss came in a 6-2 decision in Oakland May 15...allowed a bases loaded two-run single to Berkman in the third inning and was charged with three of the Rangers runs in a four-run fifth inning...then combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Texas May 21...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...did not walk a batter to become just the second visiting pitcher at Rangers Ballpark to toss seven or more innings and allow two or fewer baserunners (Erik Bedard, July 7, 2007)...then had a no decision in the A's 8-7 loss at Texas June 17...allowed a career-high tying eight hits in 4.2 innings...allowed a Pierzynski two-run home run in the second and a Martin RBI double in the third...the A's then scored six times in the fourth to take a 6-3 lead but he allowed a solo home run to Cruz in the bottom of the fourth...allowed a RBI double to Pierzynski in the fifth and was relieved by Chavez, who allowed a two-run home run game-tying home run to Murphy in the fifth but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Bartolo Colón (15-6, 2.85 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 28<sup>th</sup> start of the season...ranks third in the American League in ERA (2.85) and is tied for fourth in wins (15)...the last A's pitcher with an ERA under 2.97 is Tim Hudson in 2003 (2.70)...has walked just 26 batters in 170.1 innings, an average of 1.37 per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the American League (Price, TB 1.24) and fourth lowest in the majors...is 19-8 with a 3.61 ERA (209.2 ip, 179 h, 92 r, 84 er, 55 bb, 172 so, 28 hr) in 32 career appearances, all starts, against Texas...the 19 wins are his most against any team and are **tied for the most by any pitcher against the Texas Rangers** (Bert Blyleven, Dennis Leonard and Jack Morris).

 Save/Save Opportunities: 44/62 (71.0%) strikeouts (371)...is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (37)...ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.301), fourth in slugging percentage (.362) and fifth in batting average (.239)...first batters faced are 79 for 361 (.219) with 24 walks and two hit by pitches (3 sf, .269 onbase percentage)...has issued the fewest first batter walks in the AL, has the second lowest on-base percentage and third lowest batting average and slugging percentage (.343)

- Has recorded three three-inning saves...is the second A's pitcher since 1992 with three three-inning saves in one season (Doug Jones, 1999).
