The A's trail the season series 8-9 and need to win each of these two remaining games in Texas to avoid losing the season series for the sixth time over the last eight seasons...are 4-5 in Oakland this year and 4-4 in Texas...are 70-80 (.467) against the Rangers since 2006...are 311-324 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-151 in Oakland and 144-173 in Texas...have an all-time record of 408-406 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes is 19 for 47 (.404) with three home runs, 13 RBI and eight multiple hit games in 12 games in September.

Josh Donaldson extended his hitting streak to nine games last night, which is an ongoing careerhigh...is batting .457 (16 for 35) with 10 runs, six doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI during the streak.

Brandon Moss is batting .343 (23 for 67) with 17 runs, nine home runs and 22 RBI over his last 23 games (since August 19)...the home runs and RBI are tied for second most in the majors over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record for home runs.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, six of the past seven, 11 of the last 14 and 14 of the last 18 to improve to a season-high 25 games over .500 at 86-61...have the second best record in the American League (Boston, 90-59) and are tied for third best in the majors...have a 4½ game lead in the AL West over Texas, which is the A's largest lead since July 30 when they had a five game lead...have clinched a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's have put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight...are 30-22 since the All-Star Break after going 56-39 before the break...have a seven game lead over the third place team in the Wild Card race...went 20-22 over the first 42 games this year and trailed Texas by 7½ games on May 16...then went a Major League best 43-21 from May 17 to July 29 to gain 13½ games in the standings and take a six-game lead in the AL West...compiled a 12-15 record from July 30 to August 29 to lose nine games in the standings and fall three back of Texas...are 11-3 since August 30 and have picked up 7½ games on the Rangers...for the season, have spent 65 days in sole possession of first, 11 days tied for first, 78 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...are 227-181 (.556) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for the seventh best record in the majors over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .287 (334 for 1163) with 52 home runs over the last 34 games (since August 9)...**lead the majors** in home runs, slugging percentage (.497) and extra base hits (131) over that span, are tied for first in runs (188), third in doubles (70), tied for third in triples (9) and fourth in batting...rank second in the majors with 66 home runs since the All-Star Break (Washington, 67)...for the season, rank second in the American League in doubles (274), third in walks (520) and extra base hits (463) and fourth in triples (25)...A's outfielders have combined for a .235 (400 for 1705) batting average, which is second lowest in the majors (Minnesota, .232)...the lowest mark by A's outfielders since at least 1916 is .228 in 1979...however, have 69 home runs, which is the most in the majors, and 231 RBI, which ranks second...the A's recorded 18 runs and 22 hits on Wednesday...the runs were the A's most in a game since August 31, 2012, a 20-2 win vs. Boston...the hits were the most since July 20, 2009 when they also had 22 in a 14-13 win against Minnesota...tied Oakland records for doubles (8) and extra-base hits (11) in a game...scored 10 runs in the fourth inning, which tied the Oakland record for most runs in a single inning (sixth time, last: June 18, 2000 at Kansas City).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.87 ERA (37 er in 116.0 ip) and .239 (105 for 440) opponents batting average over the past 13 games (since August 31)...now have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.301) and second lowest batting average (.244) and slugging percentage (.383)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .302 was in 1972 (.284)...have allowed just 391 walks for the season, which is the **fewest in the American League**...Dan Straily became the A's fifth 10-game winner, which is tied for the most in the majors (Detroit) and the most in Oakland history (fifth time, last: 2005).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 16-5 with a 2.85 ERA (56 er in 176.2 ip) over the last 29 games (since August 14) after going 4-8 with a 4.88 ERA over the previous 12 contests...are now 64-44 with a 3.74 ERA (371 er in 892.1 ip) for the season...lead the American League in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in wins, ERA and complete games (6) and are fifth in innings pitched.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 8-3 on this season-ending stretch where they will play 19 of their final 26 games against American League West competition (the exceptions are seven games with Minnesota)...started the season by going 13-3 against AL West teams compared to 5-15 against everyone else through May 9...are 25-24 against the West since May 10 while going 43-19 against the rest of baseball.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game road trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (1-0)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (1-2) and Detroit (3-1) and are 39-34 (.534) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...went 8-2 on the last homestand against Tampa Bay (3-0), Texas (2-1) and Houston (3-1)...the eight wins were the A's most on a homestand since going 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle from August 7-16, 2006...have clinched a winning record at home for the fourth consecutive season...are 47-27 (.635) in Oakland, which is the second best home record in the AL (Boston, 48-25).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's rank last in the majors with 1267 assists and are on pace for 1396...the Major League record for fewest assists in a non-strike season is 1393 (San Francisco in 2008)...have just 105 double plays, which is also the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest double plays in a non-strike season is 115 in 1980.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 34 players on the active roster...have used 44 players this year, marking the first time the A's have used fewer than 48 players in a season since 2006 (40)...have used 18 pitchers, which is the fewest since 2004 (17)...the 18 pitchers are tied for the fewest in the majors this year (Kansas City)...have used just seven starting pitchers, which is their fewest since employing six in 2004...in the majors, only Detroit has used fewer starters this year (6)...used the disabled list four times over a 33-day stretch from July 25-August 26 after a 77-day streak without placing a player on the DL...the 77-day streak is the second longest by an A's team since 1990 (94, May 28-Aug. 30, 2005)...have used the DL 13 times for the season, which is the fewest since 2005 (8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-19 (.596) in one-run games...lead the American League lead in one run wins and have the third best record...A's pinch hitters are batting .134 (17 for 127), which is the lowest mark in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch strikeouts (38) and rank second in plate appearances (146), home runs (4) and walks (16)...the plate appearances are the A's most since 2000 (162)...went 14-13 in August to extend their streak of consecutive months with a winning record to nine dating back to last June...that is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history and the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...it matches the longest active streak in the majors (Atlanta).
